### REGULATIONS.

**ORDINARY BUSINESS.**—All the year round this Office is on Week Days open to the Public for Ordinary Business at 6.45 a.m. It is always closed at 8 p.m. On Sunday the Office is open from 9 a.m. till 10 a.m., and from 12.30 p.m. to 1.30 p.m., but the letter box remains open as on other days.

**MONEY ORDERS.**—The public are recommended, when applying for Money Orders, to use printed “Application Forms,” which save time, and afford greater security, than verbal messages, against mistakes. These forms are supplied gratuitously at all Money Order Offices.

No order is allowed to contain a fractional part of a penny.

No Money Order can be issued, unless the applicant furnish, in full, the surname and at least the initial of one Christian name, both of the remitter and the payee, together with the remitter's address.

A Money Order, when once issued, cannot be cancelled.

No Money Order or Savings Bank business is transacted on a Sunday or Sacramental Fast Day.

**APPLICATIONS TO RETURN LETTERS.**—A letter, when it has once been posted, cannot be returned to the writer, but must be forwarded to the person to whom it is addressed.

**CHANGE AND BAD MONEY.**—No Postmaster is bound to give Change, or is authorised to demand Change; and when any money is paid at this office, whether as change or otherwise, no question as to its right amount, goodness, or weight can be entertained after it has been removed from the counter.

### POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANKS.

Every Post Office Savings Bank is also a Money Order Office, and is open for bank business during the same hours as for Money Orders.

Deposits of one shilling, or of any number of shillings, or of pounds and shillings, may be made by any person at the Post Office Savings Banks, provided that such depositor shall not make deposits amounting to more than £30 in any year ending the 31st December, or make any further deposit when the amount standing in his name, exclusive of interest, exceeds £150. When any depositor's principle and interest amount together to £200, all interest will cease so long as the balance of the account continues to amount to the said sum of £200.

Interest, calculated yearly at the rate of £2 10s per cent. per annum, will be allowed on every complete pound deposited, reckoned from the first day of the calendar month next following the day on which a complete pound shall have been deposited or completed up to the first day of the calendar month in which the moneys are withdrawn.

### INLAND LETTERS.

A letter above the weight of 12 oz. is liable to a postage of 1d for every ounce, beginning with the first ounce. Thus, a letter weighing between 14 and 15 oz. must be prepaid 1s 3d.

A letter posted unpaid is chargeable on delivery with double postage; and a letter posted insufficiently prepaid is chargeable with double the deficiency.

#### ADDRESSES TO THE QUEEN AND PETITIONS TO PARLIAMENT.

Petitions and Addresses to her Majesty, forwarded direct, are exempt from postage; and such petitions and addresses, as also



petitions to either House of Parliament, if sent to a Member of either House, are likewise exempt, provided they do not weigh more than two pounds, and are without covers, or are in covers open at the sides. No letter, or other enclosure, however, must be inserted, and if one be found, such enclosure, unless it bears the proper number of postage stamps, will be charged as an unpaid letter.

---

### INLAND NEWSPAPERS.

For each inland newspaper, whether posted singly or in a packet, the postage, when prepaid, is one halfpenny; but a packet containing two or more registered newspapers is not chargeable with a higher rate of postage than would be chargeable on a book packet of the same weight, viz., one halfpenny for every two oz. or part of that weight.

A newspaper posted unpaid, or a packet of newspapers posted either unpaid or insufficiently paid, is treated as an unpaid or insufficiently paid book packet of the same weight.

The newspaper wrappers, which are of three different sizes, are sold at twelve for 6½d.

The Post Cards are not sold singly, but in packets of twelve for 6½d.

---

### INLAND BOOK POST.

The following are the regulations for the Inland Book Post:—

The postage is one halfpenny for every 2 oz. or part of that weight.

A packet posted wholly unpaid is charged with double the book postage; and if posted partially prepaid, with double the deficiency.

A book packet may be posted either without a cover (in which case it must not be fastened, whether by means of gum, wafer, sealing wax, postage stamp, or otherwise), or in a cover entirely open at both ends, so as to admit of the contents being easily withdrawn for examination; otherwise it is treated as a letter. For the greater security of the contents, however, it may be tied at the ends with string; Postmasters being authorised to cut the string in such cases, although, if they do so they must again tie up the packet.

CIRCULARS—i.e., letters which are intended for transmission in identical terms to several persons, and the whole or the greater part of which is printed, engraved, or lithographed—may also be sent by book post.

---

### REGISTRATION.

The fee for registering a letter, newspaper, or book packet passing between any two places in the United Kingdom is fourpence.



The same fee is chargeable for the registration of letters, newspapers, book packets, and patterns to the British Colonies, United States, Germany, Italy, Switzerland (via Belgium and British Post Offices in Egypt and Constantinople).

Every letter to be registered should be presented at the counter, and a receipt obtained for it, and should on no account be dropped into the letter box. If, contrary to this rule, a letter marked "Registered" be dropped into the letter box, it will, "if directed to any place in the United Kingdom or the British Colonies," be liable to a registration fee of 8d, instead of the ordinary fee of 4d.

The registration of a packet makes its transmission much more secure, inasmuch as, under ordinary circumstances, a registered packet can be traced through its whole course; and thus the loss of a registered packet is a rare occurrence.

---

### POST OFFICE TELEGRAPHS.

The charge for the transmission of an Inland Message, that is a message going from one part of the United Kingdom to another, is uniformly, and without regard to distance, one shilling for the first twenty words, exclusive of the address, for which no charge is made, and 3d for each additional five words, or part of five words. Any additional information which the public may require with regard to the charges on, and regulations for, the transmission of Inland or Foreign Messages, may be obtained at any Postal Telegraph Office.

Telegraph business is transacted from 6.45 A.M. till 8 P.M. on Week Days, and on Sundays from 9 A.M. till 10.30 A.M., and from 12.30 to 1.30 P.M.
