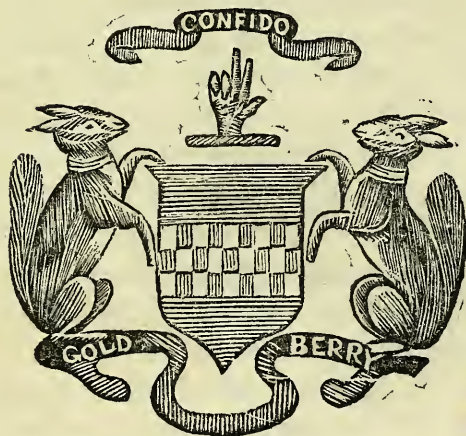

P R E F A C E.

—000—

KILMARNOCK though now the greatest manufacturing town in Ayrshire is of no note in history; even of him from whom it derives its name tradition furnishes us with but a frail memorial. St. Marnock is said to have died here about the beginning of the fourth century. But Kilmarnock is unnoticed in the annals of our country until nearly a thousand years later, and even then it is mentioned, not as a town, but as a territorial possession, conferred by Robert Bruce on his devoted follower Sir Robert Boyd. Prior to this it had been the property of Balliol, Edward's nominee to the Scottish throne, on whose fall it was thus gifted by his more successful and more patriotic competitor.

The first Charter erecting Kilmarnock into a Burgh of Barony was granted in 1591, in favour of Thomas, the fifth Lord Boyd. A second was obtained in 1672, in favour of William, the first Earl of Kilmarnock, whose Grandson, the third Earl, in 1700, gave a Charter to the Town of the whole Common Good, Customs, &c. Since that period, but more especially since about the close of the last century, Kilmarnock has gradually risen into its present importance as a manufacturing town.

The principal departments of its manufactures are Weaving, Muslin, and Carpet, in the latter, as also in the Bonnet making, it is known to excel—who has not heard of the far-famed Kilmarnock Bonnets! There is likewise a very extensive trade carried on in Calico Printing, and Shoe making, of which large quantities are annually exported to all parts of the world.

We have said that Kilmarnock is unnoticed in early history, it will not, therefore, be expected to contain many very interesting relics of antiquity, nor indeed does it; almost the only object of interest in this respect is the Dean Castle, the ancient seat of the Boyd family. Its mouldering walls tell the tale of other days. The Castle consists of two edifices, of different styles of building, one apparently very ancient, the other comparatively modern. It was accidentally burned in 1735; ten years after, Earl Kilmarnock was involved in the unsuccessful rebellion of 1745, and expiated on the scaffold the criminality of the rash act. But though not rich in historical reminiscence there is one circumstance, which to the lovers of old Scotia, sheds over Kilmarnock an interest far surpassing aught with which hoar antiquity could invest it. Here were first published the immortal lays of him

Who seized his Country's lyre,
With ardent grasp and strong;
And made his soul of fire,
Dissolve itself in song,

We need not say that it is the Ayrshire Bard, Robert Burns, that is here referred to. The fact that the Kil-

marnock press first gave to the world the deathless works of our National Bard imparts to our Town an interest infinitely transcending any which the mouldering remains of feudal greatness could throw over it.

Kilmarnock is now the principal manufacturing town in Ayrshire, and judging from the numerous Railways which are about to intersect it; from the New Works which are about to be erected; and from the increased demand for Coal, of which it can at all times command a plentiful supply, there is every probability that Kilmarnock will still further increase in wealth and population, and become a formidable rival to the famed "Metropolis of the West."

A Post-Office Directory for Kilmarnock and Neighbourhood, has long been felt to be a desideratum, and strangers have often expressed their surprise that such a spirited town should not be possessed of that which is a necessary appendage to every great commercial community. The Letter-Carriers in presenting this first fruit of their labours to the public, would solicit the indulgence of all, not only for the long time they have taken to collate it, but also for any little inaccuracies which may have crept into it, on account of its being their first attempt at Editorship.

Should the Public deem their work necessary, and worthy of patronage, they will endeavour, as in every large town in the kingdom, to publish one yearly, and perhaps on a scale more worthy of support.

The practice of Sealing Letters passing to and from the East and West Indies, and other warm Climates, with Wax is attended with much inconvenience, and frequently with serious injury to the Letters, in consequence of the melting of the Wax, and adhesion of the Letters to each other,

In the case of Mails received from India, considerable delay is occasioned; and notwithstanding the greatest care is taken in separating the Letters, which, owing to the cause already mentioned, adhere closely together, many are much damaged and torn; the public are therefore recommended in all cases to use Wafers in preference to Wax in securing the Letters sent to India, or

other warm Climates, and also to advise their Correspondents in those Countries to pursue the same course.

6, Bankers' Parcels despatched from London, and specially delivered at the General Post Office, under certain regulations.

With these exceptions, all Packets above the weight of Sixteen Ounces, will be forwarded to the Dead Letter Office.

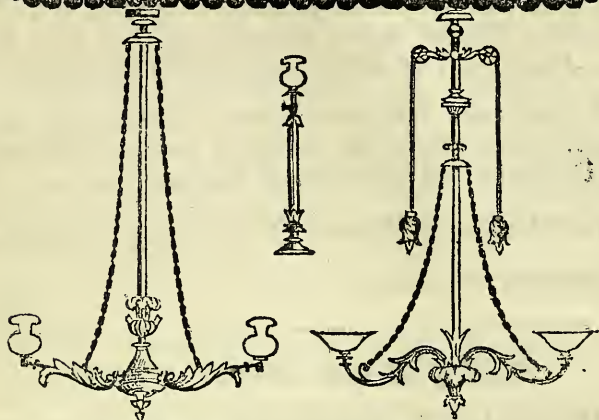
