Summer Session commences on the first Thursday of May, and ends on the last Thursday of July. Winter Session commences on the first Thursday of October, and ends on the last Thursday of March. There is a recess of not exceeding 15 days at Christmas.

Commissary business is disposed of on same day as Sheriff-Court. Small Debt and Debts Recovery Courts are held weekly on Thursday during Session at Twelve o'clock noon.

Small Debt Circuit Courts are held at Kirriemuir on the third Monday, at Brechin on the third Tuesday, and at Montrose on the third Friday of the months of January, March, May, July, September, and November.
