The Post Office early in the nineteenth century was at 31 and 33 Friars' Vennel. Prior to 1830 it was removed to 12 Castle Street. Afterwards the business was conducted in a little shop in High Street, on the site of Messrs Cooper & Co.'s premises. Thence it was removed to English Street, to a house nearly opposite the

head of Queen Street, and known as "The Docot." Its next location (from 1853) was in Queen Street, in the same premises as the present branch office. New offices in Buccleuch Street (of which a print, kindly lent by Mr Allan, chemist, is given above) were opened in 1889.

#### GENERAL REGULATIONS.

#### INLAND SERVICE.

#### Letter Post.

A letter posted unpaid is chargeable on delivery with double postage, and a letter posted insufficiently prepaid is chargeable with double the deficiency.

No letter may exceed 2 feet in length, 1 foot in width, or 1 foot in depth.

#### Post-cards.

The prepaid rate of postage on every post-card is ½d, and on every reply post-card 1d. An unpaid post-card is charged 1d.

Cards used as post-cards must be made of ordinary cardboard, not thicker than the material used for the thickest official card, and not thinner than the material used for the thinnest. They may not exceed  $5\frac{1}{2}$  inches by  $3\frac{1}{2}$  inches in size, or be less than 4 inches by  $2\frac{3}{4}$  inches.

#### Halfpenny Packet Post.

This post can be used only for packets not exceeding 2 oz. in weight, and is intended chiefly for the transmission of printed and partly printed documents.

The special conditions under which circulars, invoices, deeds, &c., may be sent as halfpenny packets are given on pages 11-14 of the Post Office Guide, which may be obtained at any Post Office.

#### Newspaper Post.

For each registered Newspaper ... Postage ½d.

A newspaper should be so folded as to admit of the title being readily seen. It must be posted either without a cover or in a cover entirely open at both ends.

No parcel exceeding 11 lb. in weight can be sent by Parcel Post. The size allowed for an Inland Postal Parcel is—

Greatest length ... ... ... ... 3 ft. 6 in. Greatest length and girth combined ... 6 ft. 0 in.

Parcels should be marked "Parcel Post," and presented at the counter of a Post Office. They should on no account be deposited in a letter box. The sender's name and address should be written either inside the parcel or on the cover.

#### Articles which must not be sent by Post.

Nothing indecent, explosive, or dangerous, no living creature, nor anything likely to injure the contents of the Mails or an officer of the Post Office, is allowed to be sent by Post.

#### Make-up of Correspondence.

Everything sent through the Post must be so packed or made up as to preserve the contents from loss or damage in the Post, and to prevent injury to other correspondence.

Liquids or semi-liquids, such as jellies, pickles, paint, varnish, must be put into bottles or cases securely stoppered, and the bottles or cases must be packed in boxes of wood, leather, or metal. The edges or points of sharp instruments, such as chisels, razors, needles, or forks, must be carefully protected. A packet with fragile or perishable contents should be conspicuously marked "Fragile, with care," or "Perishable."

#### Re-direction.

Letters, post-cards, halfpenny packages, and newspapers are not charged when re-directed to the addressee by an officer of the Post Office or by an agent of the addressee, provided that in the latter case they are re-posted not later than the day after delivery (Sundays and public holidays not being counted). Any which appear to have been opened or tampered with before being re-posted are charged as unpaid. Parcels are, however, subject, when re-directed, to an additional postage at the prepaid rate for each re-direction, except where the original and the second address are both within the delivery of the same Post Office, and the parcels are re-posted within the period of free re-direction allowed for letters.

#### Poste Restante.

Correspondence addressed "Post Office, to be called for," or "Poste Restante," is delivered at the Head Post Office, and at Country Sub-Offices. The address should show clearly at which Office it will be applied for. The Poste Restante is intended solely for the use of strangers or travellers, and even they may not use

the Poste Restante for more than three months. Letters addressed to initials or to fictitious names at Post Offices are not taken in at the Poste Restante, but are sent to the Returned Letter Branch for disposal.

Parcels addressed to a Post Office to be called for are not kept at the Poste Restante more than three weeks, after which time, if not called for, they are returned to the sender.

#### "Blind Literature" Post.

Papers and books impressed for the use of the blind can be sent at the following rates of postage:—

#### Registration and Compensation.

The ordinary registration fee for all classes of correspondence, including parcels, is 2d in addition to the postage.

Subject to certain conditions, this fee secures compensation in the event of loss or damage up to £5. Subject to the same conditions, compensation up to £400 may be secured on payment of the proper fees. The fees (which in each case include the ordinary registration fee of 2d) are as follows:—

No compensation is given in respect of money unless it is sent by Letter Post in one of the registered letter envelopes sold by the Post Office, and certain other conditions are complied with; and in no case does the compensation given in respect of coin exceed £5.

If it be desired to secure compensation for damage to a packet

(other than a parcel\*), the packet must bear the words "Fragile, with care."

Compensation up to a limit of £2 is given in respect of the loss or damage of unregistered parcels, provided that, in case of loss, a certificate of posting was obtained at the time of handing in, and that certain other conditions were complied with. No compensation is given in respect of money enclosed in any parcel, or in respect of jewellery enclosed in an unregistered parcel.

#### Advice of Delivery.

The sender of a registered packet may, on payment of a further fee of 2d, either at the time of posting or subsequently, obtain advice of its deliver.y

#### Enquiry as to Loss.

Enquiry as to the alleged loss or non-delivery of a registered packet should also be accompanied by a fee of 2d, and should, if possible, be made upon the form used in applying for an advice of delivery. If it is found that the Post Office is in fault the enquiry fee will be refunded.

#### Express Delivery of Letters and Parcels.

1. Express throughout (Local Service).

The charge is 3d for every mile or part of a mile from the Office of delivery to the address, together with a further fixed charge of 1d for each article beyond one. A weight fee of 3d is charged upon packets over 1 lb. in weight.

A reply is charged for at the same rates, unless it is for an address on the messenger's homeward route or within half a mile of his office, in which case the charge for mileage is half the ordinary rates.

If it is necessary to employ a special conveyance, the cost must be paid by the sender, in addition to the ordinary express fee. The weight fee is not charged in this case.

2. Express delivery after transmission by ordinary Post.

Correspondence posted in the ordinary way can, when the sender so desires, be delivered by express messenger either from the Head Office or from the usual delivery office immediately on arrival. The fee is 3d a mile or part of a mile in addition to the ordinary postage. The words "Express Delivery" must be boldly and legibly written on the cover, and in the case of a letter the cover must be marked with a broad perpendicular line from top to bottom both on front and back.

<sup>\*</sup> That is, a packet sent by Parcel Post. But whenever a parcel requires, to be treated with special care the nature of its contents should be indicated on the cover.

On Sundays in London, Express Correspondence of all kinds (except parcels) for places in the London Postal District arriving on Sunday mornings by the Night Mails from the Provinces or posted in London too late for Express Delivery on Saturday nights but in time for the last collection, will be delivered from the General Post Office, provided that it is marked with a thick perpendicular line from top to bottom, and with the words "Express Delivery on Sunday," and an express fee is prepaid at the rate of 3d a mile or part of a mile, calculated from the General Post Office.

3. Express delivery at request of addressee (week days only).

The addressees of letters and parcels not marked for Express Delivery may have them delivered by special messenger in advance of the ordinary delivery by postmen, on making application in proper time on a form provided for the purpose and prepaying the usual express fee of 3d a mile on the first packet, and a further fixed charge of 1d for every additional ten or less number of packets.

For regulations respecting Express Letters sent by Telephone, see page 14.

#### Single Post Letters by Railway.

Single post letters, not exceeding 4 oz. in weight, are accepted by most railway companies to be sent by the next available train or steamship. They may either be called for at the station of address, by the addressee or by a Post Office Express messenger, or will be transferred from the station by a railway official to the nearest post office letter box. The postage must be prepaid in stamps, and a fee of 2d in cash must be paid to the railway company.

#### Private Boxes and Bags.

The charges made for the use of private boxes and bags may be ascertained on application to the Postmaster. Fees for the use of private boxes and bags are payable in advance. The letters are delivered on presentation at the private box office of the check card furnished to the renter by the Postmaster, or on presentation of a written order signed by the renter.

#### Private Posting Boxes.

Arrangements are made for special collections of letters from private posting boxes at offices or private residences. Particulars may be obtained of the Postmaster.

#### Prepayment in Money.

The postage on every kind of correspondence, other than newspapers, when it amounts to £1 and upwards, can be paid in money at the Head Office between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. The letters, postcards, or packets should be tied in bundles representing a postage of 5s each (or, in the case of exceptionally bulky packets, 2s 6d each), with the addresses arranged in the same direction, but this requirement does not apply to parcels prepaid in money.

ARTICLES LIABLE TO CUSTOMS DUTY are admissible only by Parcel Post. If sent otherwise they may be stopped, subjected to fine, or confiscated

PRINTED AND COMMERCIAL PAPERS AND SAMPLES must be open to inspection and may not contain actual correspondence.

#### Magazine Post for Canada and Newfoundland.

Duly registered British Newspapers, Magazines, and Trade Journals intended for despatch to Canada by Direct Canadian Packet and to Newfoundland by direct Packet or via Canada by direct Canadian Packet may be sent under certain conditions at a reduced postage rate of 1d per pound.

#### Parcel Post.

Parcels must be strongly packed; they are liable to be opened for Customs examination in the country of destination, and the contents are subject to Customs duty. The destination and the nature and value of the contents must be described on special forms provided at all Post Offices. By the rules of various countries many articles may not be sent by Parcel Post.

#### Cash on Delivery.

This arrangement for collecting from the recipient for remittance to the sender by Money Order or Postal Order the value of articles sent by Post extends in general to parcels, and in many cases to insured letters, and registered packets exchanged between the United Kingdom and certain British Possessions, certain British Post Office Agencies abroad, and Egypt.

#### Re-direction.

Re-direction, within the specified period, is free throughout the Postal Union except for parcels. Additional postage must, however, be paid on packets re-directed to countries for which the postage is higher than that originally paid.

#### Registration and Insurance.

Compensation for registered letters is paid only for total loss. Letters (containing documents only) and parcels for most European and some other countries may be insured (generally up to £400) against loss or abstraction of contents. Small packets of jewellery, etc., may be sent to certain countries as insured boxes. These are subject to Customs examination, and must be accompanied by the special forms used for parcels.

#### Express Delivery.

In many countries there are arrangements for express delivery similar to those in this country.

#### Reply Coupons.

Coupons exchangeable for stamps of the value of 25 centimes  $(2\frac{1}{2}d)$  each in any country participating in the arrangement can be purchased at any Money Order Office at the price of 3d. Coupons received from other countries may be exchanged for postage stamps at any Money Order Office.

Further information with regard to the regulations of the Foreign or Colonial Post may be obtained at any Post Office or from the Post Office Guide, pages 52-84, 710-837, and 862-3.

#### TELEGRAPHS.

#### INLAND.

#### Charges.

The charge is 6d for the first 12 words, including the address, and ½d for each additional word.

Groups of figures are counted at the rate of five figures to a word.

#### Delivery.

Telegrams are delivered free of charge within three miles of the Telegraph Office nearest the address, or within the town postal delivery of the terminal office, if a Head Office, when that delivery extends beyond three miles. When the addressee resides beyond the free delivery, porterage is charged at the rate of 3d a mile or part of a mile, during the ordinary office hours, reckoning from the boundary of the free delivery. A telegram handed in late at night may, at the request of the sender, be held over for delivery on the following morning.

#### Prepaid Replies.

The cost of a reply not exceeding forty-eight words may be prepaid; and a reply form will then be delivered to the addressee, who may send his reply from any Telegraph Office or use the form to prepay any message within two months.

#### Addresses.

The address of a telegram should be sufficiently full to enable it to be delivered without difficulty, and without reference to directories or other sources of information. In telegrams for towns, the name of the street and the number of the house should be given when the address is not registered.

An address ordinarily used for letters is not necessarily correct or sufficient for telegrams.

#### Abbreviated Telegraphic Addresses.

Any person may register an abbreviated telegraphic address on payment of a fee of one guinea per annum. Applications should be made to the Chief Office.

#### Repetition.

If the receiver of a telegram doubts its accuray, he may have it repeated by depositing half the amount paid for its transmission. The money will be refunded to him if it is found that the telegram has been inaccurately transmitted. The sender may have a telegram repeated back from office to office on payment of an additional half rate at the time of handing in; but in this case no copy of the repetition is given to the sender.

#### FOREIGN.

Foreign Telegrams may be written in plain language or in secret language. Secret language comprises code language and figure or letter cypher.

In plain language the length allowed for a single word is 15 letters, additional letters being charged for at the rate of 15 letters to a word.

Words in plain language in the text of a mixed telegram (that is, a telegram containing words in plain language and words in code language) are charged for at the rate of 10 letters to a word, any excess being charged for at the rate of 10 letters to a word.

Code words must not contain more than 10 letters. They may be real words or pronounceable groups of letters having the appearance of real words. The real words must be drawn from one of the following languages:—English, French, German, Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, Dutch, and Latin; the groups of letters must be pronounceable according to the current usage of one of those languages.

In cypher language, which comprises groups of figures or letters having a secret meaning, the groups are counted at five figures or letters to a word. Figure and letter cypher cannot be combined in one group.

Words incorrectly spelled, so as to reduce the number of letters below the maximum, or incorrectly joined together contrary to the usage of the language, are inadmissible.

A reply of any length can be prepaid to a foreign telegram. The amount paid for a reply is refunded to the sender of the original telegram if no reply is sent, provided that application is made within three months. Foreign reply forms are only available for six weeks.

The receiver of a telegram can obtain the correction of passages which are doubtful by paying a sum calculated by multiplying the number of words to be repeated by the rate per word to the place from which repetition is to be obtained. The minimum charge is 10d. The amount is refunded if the telegram has been inaccurately transmitted.

If the repetition shows that the repeated words were not all inaccurately transmitted in the first instance, a proportionate part only of the amount paid for repetition will be refunded.

The Postmaster-General is not liable for any losses sustained or expenses incurred in consequence of the inaccurate transmission, delay, or non-delivery of a telegram.

#### WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY.

Radiotelegrams are accepted at any Telegraph Office for transmission from various Coast Stations in the United Kingdom and abroad to certain ships equipped with wireless telegraph apparatus. Further particulars can be obtained from the Post Office Guide (quarterly edition), pages 864-869, or at any Telegraph Office.

#### TELEPHONES.

#### Trunk Telephone Lines.

The scale of charges for three minutes' conversation is as follows:—

For distances not exceeding 100 miles, 3d for each 25 miles or fraction thereof.

For each additional 40 miles or fraction thereof, 6d.

When a Trunk conversation is between a subscriber to the National Telephone Company's system and a caller or subscriber of the Municipal Exchange at Portsmouth, a "terminal fee" has also to be paid.

The ordinary period of conversation is limited to three minutes, but any person may secure the uninterrupted use of a trunk line for six minutes by prepaying a double fee, or may extend a three minutes' conversation to six minutes on demand at the end of the first period. The latter privilege can be exercised at Call Offices only if a deposit has been made by the caller in the first instance to cover the fee for the second period of three minutes. This deposit is refunded if the call is not extended.

Callers are required to pay a Call Office fee of 2d on inward Trunk calls, and also, in addition to the Trunk fee, on calls originated at Call Offices.

Between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. the charge for a six minutes' conversation is the same as for a single period of three minutes during the day. During the same period, for a three minutes' conversation, for which the day charge is 9d, a reduced fee of 6d is charged, and half the usual day charge is made where the ordinary fee is 1s or more.

#### Express Letters and Telegrams sent by Telephone.

Any subscriber to a Telephone Exchange may telephone messages (except those for transmission at Press rate) to most of the Post Offices which can be reached through the local Exchange System, or by means of the Post Office trunk wires, in order that the messages may be written down and dealt with as telegrams, or express letters, or ordinary letters. Messages intended to be forwarded by telegraph should be telephoned as a rule to the Head Telegraph Office of the district. Many public Telephone Call Offices, or private telephone lines to Post Offices, may also be used in this way.

An ordinary letter or express letter telephoned to a Post Office is delivered for the usual postage fee or express delivery fee if it does not contain more than 30 words, including the address; and each additional 30 words or fraction thereof is treated, for purposes of charge, as a separate letter or express letter, as the case may be.

The charge for the use of the telephone is the same as in the case of an ordinary call.

Any person receiving an Express Letter in this way may send another Express Letter back to the Post Office to be telephoned to the sender of the original message on payment of the appropriate Express and Telephone fees.

Telegrams may also be delivered to the addressees by telephone in lieu of delivery by messenger. Persons renting circuits from the National Telephone Company, or from a corporation licensed to carry on telephonic business, and desiring these facilities, shou'd apply in the first instance to the company or corporation, as the case may be. Further particulars can be obtained of the Postmaster.

Any subscriber to a Telephone Exchange may obtain the services of an express messenger by telephoning to the nearest Post Office which is connected with his Exchange.

# Telephonic delivery in London on Sunday of messages from the provinces.

Anyone residing in the country may send by post to London by the last despatch available for a Sunday arrival a message for delivery to a telephone subscriber in the London Telephone area on Sunday.

The message, together with the name, exchange, and telephone number of the addressee and the name and address of the sender, must be written upon a sheet of paper and posted in an envelope addressed to the Central Telegraph Office, London, E.C., and marked conspicuously "For telephone delivery on Sunday." A broad perpendicular line must also be drawn by the sender across the centre of the front and back of the envelope from top to bottom.

The letters may be handed in at a Post Office or posted in any letter box, and the charges for the services are:—

(1) The ordinary postage on the letter to be paid by stamps

affixed to the envelope, and

(2) A fee of 3d for a message not exceeding 30 words, and 3d for each additional 30 words or portion thereof, to be paid in stamps affixed to the sheet of paper on which the message is written.

One letter may contain a message or messages for several telephone subscribers, but a separate message fee must be paid in respect of each message to be telephoned.

The sender may state the approximate time at which the message should be telephoned on Sunday. In the absence of such indication messages will usually be telephoned in the order of their receipt at the Central Telegraph Office beginning about 8.30 a.m.

If the attention of the London subscriber cannot be gained, the message will be delivered by post on Monday with a statement as to the attempts made to deliver it on Sunday.

#### Private Wires.

Private wires to Post Offices for the purpose of obtaining the foregoing facilities, or private wires between different premises of the same firm or the premises of different firms, can be provided by the Post Office. The terms and conditions may be ascertained of the Secretary, General Post Office.

FOREIGN AND COLONIAL.—Telegraph Money Orders are exchanged with most European countries, Egypt, Canada, United States, and Newfoundland.

The charges for Orders issued in the United Kingdom are as follows:—

- (1) Money Order poundage at the ordinary rate for Foreign Money Orders.
- (2) A charge for the Telegram of Advice at the ordinary rate for telegrams addressed to the country of payment.
- (3) A supplementary fee of 6d for each Order.

PRIVATE MESSAGES FOR PAYEES OF TELEGRAPH MONEY ORDERS.— The remitter of an Inland or Foreign Telegraph Money Order is allowed, on paying for the additional words required, to add to the official Telegram of Advice any short communication which he may wish to send to the payee.

ADVICES OF PAYMENT.—The remitters of Inland Money Orders and Orders payable at most places abroad can obtain Advices of Payment by paying an additional fee for each Order. The fee is 2d in the case of an Inland Order, and 2½d in the case of an Order payable abroad.

#### POSTAL ORDERS.

Postal Orders for the following fixed amounts are issued and paid at almost all Post Offices in the United Kingdom.

Broken amounts, but not fractions of a penny, may be made up by the use of British postage stamps not exceeding three in number or fivepence in total value affixed to the face of any one Postal Order in the space provided for the purpose.

British Postal Orders are also issued and paid in practically all parts of the British Empire (except Australia), in Egypt, and at the British Agencies in Turkey and Morocco, and at Panama. They are paid, but not issued, at certain Offices in Canada.

In most cases local postage stamps affixed to Postal Orders by the senders in accordance with the regulations will be paid up to the value of 5d. Postage stamps of British Agencies overprinted in local currency are not recognised for this purpose.

#### POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANK.

Deposits of one shilling or more (excluding pence) will be received to the extent of £50 in one year ending 31st December, and £200 in all. A person may also replace the amount of one withdrawal during the year. The limits mentioned are irrespective of any sums deposited for immediate investment in Government Stock or for purchase of Annuities or Life Insurances. Interest at the rate of £2 10s per cent. per annum is allowed on deposits.

Full directions as to the opening of accounts, the making of deposits, etc., can be obtained at any of the 15,000 Post Offices transacting Savings Bank business. Persons desiring to save by means of penny postage stamps may obtain the necessary forms at any Post Office. Any sum up to £1 may be withdrawn without previous notice.

#### Government Stock.

Investments in Government Stock may be made by depositors through the agency of the Post Office in "Two and a half per cent. Consolidated" Stock, "Two and a half per cent." Annuities, "Two and three-quarters per cent." Annuities (1905), Local Loans "Three per cent." Stock, "Guaranteed 23 per cent." Stock, and "Guaranteed 3 per cent." Stock. Printed forms of application and other information may be obtained at any Post Office transacting Savings Bank business.

# Government Insurance and Annuity Business.

Tables of Premiums may be seen and information obtained at any Post Office transacting Savings Bank business. The premiums are payable by deductions from deposit accounts in the Post Office Savings Bank.
