Our object, however, is to make up the deficiency on single transactions by a very large increase in the number of Suits sold. In other words; to make the scheme profitable, we must sell Ten Suits at £4 18s for every One which could be sold at the large profit price, and we see no reason why our endeavours should not be crowned with a complete success.
