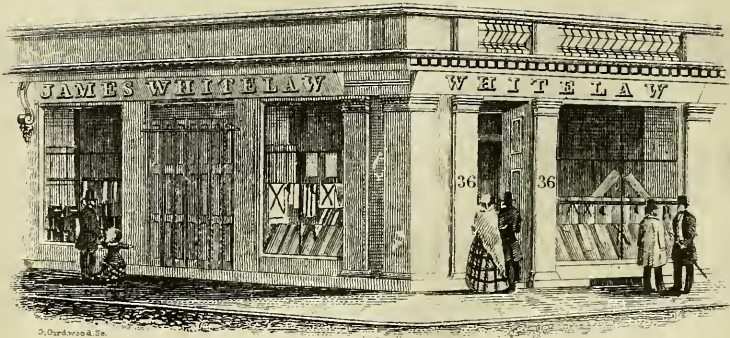

*Abstract of the Regulations enacted by the Magistrates.*

## STANDS.

On the High Street in front of the Town House—four cabs.

On Nethergate Street, opposite top of Union Street

On Panmure Street -along south side thereof—west from Murraygate.

On West Side South Union Street.

On West end Arbroath Station, Dock Street.

## FARES.

That the following and no higher fares shall be charged:—

For any distance betwixt places within the town, not lying beyond the Lilybank toll-bar and Taybank gate on the east; Blackness and Logie toll-bars on the west; or Somerville Place, Head of Bonnet-hill, and Stobswell (at crossing of Forfar and Murroes Road, Lunatic Asylum) on the north, One Shilling.

For any distance beyond the said bounds, but within the limits of the extended Royalty, (besides payment of Tolls,) One Shilling and Sixpence.



If required to go from a place situated to the westward of Small's Wynd, Hunter Street, or Blinshall Street, to a place lying to the north of the road in front of Somerville Place, or Ann Street, Hillbank, or the eastward of St Roque's Lane, Dens Brae, or Wellington Street, or betwixt places lying beyond the limits stated, sixpence extra shall be charged.

For any distance beyond the extended Royalty, not exceeding one mile, a farther sum of one shilling; for every mile or part of a mile thereafter, ninepence additional, unless by agreement.

When engaged by the hour, the fare shall be, per hour, Two Shillings, (besides Tolls.)

When required to ply after eleven o'clock p.m.: to one o'clock a.m., a fare and a half, as aforesaid, to be charged; after one o'clock a.m. to five o'clock a.m., double fares: after five o'clock a.m. till seven o'clock a.m., one and a half fare to be charged.

If a carriage be required to take up two or more parties, or to go out of the ordinary route betwixt two places, so that it be detained more than ten minutes by doing so, sixpence extra may be charged.

Luggage, not exceeding in weight 56 lb shall be taken free of charge; above that weight it shall be liable to a charge of sixpence extra.

Half-fares to be charged for returning by the same carriage, (when not engaged by time,) but the carriage not to be detained beyond fifteen minutes, unless by agreement.

It shall be in the option of the party requiring the carriage to take any one he may prefer, no priority of turn being allowed.

**MRS MARGARET PETRIE OR MORTON'S—1827.** The interest of the bulk of her fortune is destined for the maintenance of aged and indigent persons belonging to the town and parish of Dundee, those of the name of Petrie and Wighton having a preference, who each receive £4 and upwards per annum. There are at present 85 pensioners on the roll. Patrons, Alex. Kay, George Duncan, James Powrie, Wm. Carr, Geo. H. Baxter, James Soot, Patrick Anderson, Thomas Bell, and William Lowson. Factor, David Barrie, writer.

**GEORGE BROWNE'S—1695.** The annual income of certain heritable subjects in the Overgate, is divided equally among ten poor children, not less than six years of age, born of parents in communion with the church, and resident in the parish of Dundee. From circumstances this charity is not in the meantime available. Patrons, the Provost, Bailies, Ministers, and Kirk Treasurer. Factor, Thos. Neave, writer.

**CAPTAIN JOHN RAMSAY'S—1774.** The stock of this mortification at present amounts to £523 14s 9d, (£1200 having been paid at Martinmas last in aid of the Poor-house). The interest is applied to an annual payment of £4 for the preaching of a sermon on the Wonders of Providence, and to the education of boys, and the

support of aged persons. Patrons, the Magistrates, Dean of Guild, Town Treasurer, and Clerk, the Ministers of St Mary's, the Murraygate and Overgate districts, and five members of the Kirk Session. Factor, Rev. J. Robertson.

ALEXANDER WHYTE'S—1799. Twenty-two boys or girls (seamen's children having a preference), have annually for 5 years £4 each, and education at the Sessional School. Patrons, the Kirk Session. Factor, Rev. J. Robertson.

CHARLES ANDERSON'S—1820. Thirteen old men receive six shillings monthly, being half the revenue of the fund. The other half (about £50) is paid annually to the Indigent Sick Society. Patrons, the Kirk Session. Factor, Rev. J. Robertson.

REV. DAVID FERGUSON'S—1695. The interest of £2359 is applied to the education and maintenance of two boys as bursars, (the name of the mortifier being preferred), at the grammar school, till fourteen years of age, and at College of St Andrew's, for four years. Patrons, James Webster of Balmuir, the Heirs of the late R. Graham of Fintry, the Heirs of Sir James Kinloch of Kinloch, and the Provost of Dundee. Factor, Thomas Neave.

WILLIAM STEVEN OR STEPHEN'S—1720. The interest of nearly £1900 annually applied to the education and maintenance of seven boys of the name of Stephen and Garden, or sons of decayed merchants. Patrons, the Provost, the Minister of St Paul's, and the Lairds of Blackness and Dunnichen. Factor, Thomas Neave.

JAMES WEBSTER'S—1789. The interest of £6000 lent on landed security, and about £500 in bank, is applied for the education of twenty-one boys at the Academy. Twenty-five boys and twenty-five girls attend Mr Fisher's school. Factor, Thos. Neave, writer.

JOHN LAWSON'S—1728. The interest of 2000 merks Scots, or £111 sterling, is applied to the maintenance of one bursar, of the name of Lawson or Gray, at St Andrews. Patrons, the Town Council. Factor, the United College of St Andrews or their Factor.

GEORGE WEBSTER'S—1839. The interest of £105 is applied towards the education of fourteen or fifteen children at the Sessional Schools. Patrons, the Provost and Bailies. Factor, the Town Chamberlain.

DR WILLIAM GUILD'S—1656. The interest of a sum equal to £240 is applied to the maintenance of two bursars at the United College, St Andrews. Patrons, the Town Council. Factor, the Town Chamberlain.

LORD PANMURE'S—1840. The interest of £1000, given to the Town by the late Lord Panmure, is paid annually to the Royal Infirmary.

MRS GIBSON'S.—The interest of £100 is applied for the preaching of a sermon yearly against cruelty to animals. Patrons, the Provost, Dean of Guild, Parish Minister, and the first master of the Academy. Factor, the Town Chamberlain.

JOHN GRIEVE'S—1806. The sum of £393 1s 8d, mortified for the maintenance of an indigent lunatic in the Dundee Asylum. Patrons, the Kirk Session. Factor, Treasurer of Dundee Asylum.

MRS MARGARET HUGHES'S—1825. The interest of £100 is applied for educating one poor girl, (the names of Kirkaldy and Patullo having preference), till she is 12 years of age. Patrons, the Kirk Session. Factor, Rev. John Robertson.

REV. JAMES PATON'S—1726. Ten guineas are annually paid for the education of a girl or girls at the Public Schools of Dundee. They must belong to the parish of Kettins. Patrons, the Laird of Pitcur and the Minister of Kettins. Factor, Robert Newton, Hallyburton.

MISS JANET HENDERSON'S—1848. The stock is £1500. Fifteen old women each receive an annual allowance of £5 from the revenue. Menial servants are strictly prohibited, by the Mortifier's will, from sharing in the benefits of the trust. Patrons, Rev. Dr Adie, Rev. Jas. Ewing, and G. H. Newall. Factor, David Rollo, writer.

JAMES PULLAR'S—1804. The sum



of £3000 affords annually £10 to the Infirmary, £5 to the poor of the Nine Trades, and £5 to the poor of the parish. The remainder of the annual rent being for the maintenance and education of ten poor boys, and the support of ten old men and women. Patrons, the Minister of the Overgate district, twenty members of Kirk Session, Convener and Deacons of Trades, and their immediate predecessors in office. Factor, David Rollo, writer.

**WILLIAM HENDERSON'S** — 1742. The interest of £444 8s 10d is applied to the education of from thirty to forty poor boys and girls at the Sessional School. Patrons, the Provost, Bailies, Town-Clerks, and Ministers. Factor, John Symers.

**MISS ELIZABETH HALLYBURTON'S** — 1826. The interest of £1034 7s 1d is annually divided amongst three, four, or five maiden ladies. Patrons, the Town Council. Factor, the Town Chamberlain.

**GEORGE MARSHALL'S.** The interest of £600 is divided annually among five old seamen. Patrons, the Master and Committee of the Trinity House. Factor, James M'Ewen, writer.

**OGILVIE'S HOSPITAL & MORTIFICATION FOR JUVENILES.**—1808. The present amount of the stock is about £4000. The trust will not come into operation until one hundred years after the death of the mortifier, which took place on the 19th April, 1825. Patrons, the Kirk Session. Factor, William Thoms.

**WEBSTER, SPEID WATT, and JOHNSTON'S**—1855. The interest of £5375 applied in annuities to blind men and women, and in educating blind boys and girls; failing whom, to boys and girls having their sight, but always limited to the names of "Webster, Speid, Watt, and Johnston." The annual income is upwards of £180. Patrons, the Provost, Sheriff-Substitute, Parish Minister, Dean of Guild, and Convener of Nine Trades. Factor, William Thoms. By a Supplementary Fund the benefits of this charity are now extended to a certain number of blind men and women, and

blind children of other names, of whom the trustees may approve.

From a report on the educational and charitable mortifications in town, presented to the Town Council on the 27th July, 1854, the stock of the Mortifications is as follows :

## I.—RATES OF POSTAGE.

### Inland Letters.\*

The rate of postage on all inland letters is regulated by weight, irrespective of distance, and (with the exceptions afterwards mentioned) is as follows:—

\* Inland Letters are those which pass between places in the United Kingdom, including the Isle of Man, the Orkney, Shetland, Scilly, and Channel Islands.

and so on ; twopence being charged for every additional ounce.

**Unpaid Letters.**

As a general rule, the postage, if not paid in advance, is double the foregoing ; and if the payment in advance be insufficient, double the deficiency is charged. An inland letter, for example, weighing more than half an ounce, and not exceeding one ounce, if bearing a penny stamp only, is, on delivery, charged twopence. The unpaid *additional* postage on re-directed letters, however, is not doubled, being the same as if such postage were prepaid. Unless three quarters, at least, of the postage of a letter weighing more than 4 oz. be prepaid, the letter is not forwarded, but a notice of its detention is forwarded to the sender, or failing him, to the person to whom it is addressed.

**Colonial and Foreign Letters.**

The rates of postage on letters to foreign countries and the colonies are entered in the Table of Colonial and Foreign Postage at page 62.

**Addresses to the Queen and Petitions to Parliament.**

Petitions and addresses to Her Majesty, forwarded direct, are exempt from postage ; and such petitions and addresses, as also petitions to either House of Parliament, if sent to a member of either House, are likewise exempt, provided they do not weigh more than two pounds, and are without covers, or are in covers open at the sides. No letter, or other inclosure, however, must be inserted, and if one be found, such enclosure, unless it bear the proper number of postage stamps, will be charged as an unpaid letter.

**Newspapers and other periodical Publications bearing the Newspaper Stamp circulated inland.**

Although provision is made for forwarding newspapers, books, and money through the post, it is not compulsory on any one to employ this mode of transmission ; everything except letters may be sent in any other way.

All periodical publications, including newspapers published in the United Kingdom, at intervals not exceeding thirty-one days, and which bear an impressed stamp or stamps denoting the stamp duty (of the kind formerly confined chiefly to newspapers), may be transmitted and re-transmitted through the post within the United Kingdom free of postage under the following regulations, viz. :—

1st. They are subject to the same restrictions with regard to the number of sheets and superficial extent as were formerly applicable only to newspapers properly so called. These restrictions are shown in the following Table :—

2d. No publication, or portion thereof, can pass through the post unless the impressed stamp which it bears be a stamp of the value at least of one penny.

3d. The title and date of the publication must be printed at the top of every page.

4th. The publication must be folded in such a manner that the whole of the stamp or stamps, denoting the full duty, shall be exposed to view, and be distinctly visible on the outside, except that where there are more than two publications in the same cover it will be considered sufficient if the stamps be so arranged that they can readily be examined.

5th. It must not be printed on pasteboard or cardboard, or on two or more thicknesses of paper pasted together, nor must any pasteboard, cardboard, or such pasted paper be sent with it as a back or cover thereto, or otherwise.

6th. It must be posted within fifteen days from the printed date of issue.

7th. It must have either no cover or a cover open at the ends.

8th. It must not contain any enclosure.

9th. It must have no writing or other mark thereon, but the name and address of the person to whom it is sent, nor anything on the cover but such name and address, the printed title of the publication, and the printed name and address of the publisher or vendor who sends it. Thus if a newspaper franked by a newspaper stamp, after having had the address of one person written upon the paper itself, be sent to another person, the first address must be cut off (obliteration not being sufficient), otherwise the paper will be charged as an unpaid letter.

10th. If the publication be addressed to any person within the free delivery of the place where it is posted, it will become liable to a postage of one penny, which must be prepaid by affixing a postage stamp.

11th. When a newspaper, &c., is so folded as not to expose the stamp or stamps, a postage of one penny is charged in addition to any other postage to which the publication, if properly folded, would be liable; and if the newspaper, &c. be addressed to any person within the free delivery of the place where it is posted, and do not bear a penny postage label, it is charged 2d.

12th. In case of any other irregularity the publication is dealt with as an unpaid letter.

13th. It is suggested that every publication should have a notice to purchasers conspicuously printed, pointing out the necessity of exposing the stamp or stamps to view whenever the publication is sent through the post.

14th. Unstamped publications, and stamped publications which have been issued more than fifteen days, can be forwarded within the United Kingdom and to the colonies under the regulations of the book post.

### Newspapers sent abroad.

Newspapers sent abroad are liable to the same regulations as newspapers passing (under the newspaper privilege) between different parts of the United Kingdom, except as regards size, and that, before going abroad, the name of the newspaper must have been registered at the General Post Office, and that, instead of requiring to have an impressed stamp (by which is meant the stamp specially used for newspapers), each newspaper, if sent to a British Colony, is liable to a postage of 1d (which must be prepaid by a postage label or in money\*), together with an additional postage (as shown in the Table of Colonial and Foreign Postage) when the newspaper has to pass through a foreign country. In the same table will be found the postage of newspapers sent to foreign countries. In all cases of newspapers going abroad the impressed stamp stands for nothing. Publications registered for transmission abroad, although not strictly newspapers, are in all respects treated as such, so far as their transmission by the British office is concerned.

### Parliamentary Proceedings.

Printed proceedings of the Imperial Parliament, sent without covers, or in covers open at the ends, may circulate within the United Kingdom at the following rates of postage ;—

and so on ; one penny being charged for every additional quarter of a pound or fraction of a quarter of a pound.

The words Parliamentary Proceedings must be written or printed on the cover of the packet, otherwise it will be liable to the letter rate of postage.

Prepayment, when the circulation is within the United Kingdom, is optional ; and if it be made in part, the simple difference only is charged.

Parliamentary proceedings may be sent, under the Book Post privilege, to all the colonies, and to those Foreign States between which and this country there is a book post (see pages 54, 62, 74, & 75.)

\* Newspapers posted unpaid are retained at the Returned Letter Office for one week, and then, if the postage still remain unpaid, are destroyed.



### Inland Book Post.

1st. Rates of Postage ;

and so on, 2d being charged for every additional half pound or fraction of a half pound.

2d. The postage must be prepaid in full, by means of postage stamps affixed outside the packet or its cover.

3d. Every packet must be sent either without a cover, or in a cover open at the ends or sides ; so as to admit of the enclosures being removed for examination. For the greater security of its contents, the packet may be tied at the ends with string ; but in such case the Postmaster is authorised to cut the string, although he is required to refasten the packet.

4th. A book-packet may contain any number of separate books or other publications (including printed letters and printed matter of every kind), prints, or maps, and any quantity of paper, parchment, or vellum. And the books or other publications, prints, maps, &c., may be either printed, written, or plain, or any mixture of the three. Further, all legitimate binding, mounting, or covering, of a book, &c., or of a portion thereof, will be allowed, whether such binding, &c. be loose or attached ; as also rollers, in the case of prints or maps ; markers (whether of paper or otherwise), in the case of books ; and, in short, whatever is necessary for the safe transmission of literary or artistic matter, or usually appertains thereto ; but no patterns, or books of patterns, (unless these consist merely of paper) can be allowed.

5th. No book-packet may contain any written letter, closed or open, or any enclosure sealed or otherwise closed against inspection ; nor must there be any letter, nor any communication of the nature of a letter written in any such packet or in or upon its cover. Entries however, merely stating who sends the book, &c., or to whom it is given, are not regarded as a letter. Indeed as respects the name and address of the sender, not only is the writing permitted but recommended ; so that if the cover come off or for any other reason the packet cannot be forwarded, it may be returned.

6th. No book-packet must exceed two feet in length, width, or depth.

7th. Any packet which shall not be open at the ends or sides, or shall have any written letter or any communication of the nature of a letter written in it, or upon its cover, will be charged with the “unpaid” letter postage. :

8th. If a packet be found to contain any written letter, whether closed or open, or any enclosure sealed or otherwise closed against inspection, or any other unauthorised enclosure, the letter or

enclosure will be taken out and forwarded to the address on the packet, charged with the full postage, as an unpaid letter, together with an additional rate (1d); and the remainder of the packet if duly prepaid with stamps, will then be forwarded to its address.

9th. If a packet be not sufficiently prepaid with stamps, but nevertheless bear a stamp of the value of one rate (1d) it is forwarded, charged with the deficient book-postage, together with an additional rate; but any packet which bears no postage stamp is charged with the "unpaid" letter postage.

10th. In every case in which the postage chargeable under these regulations is greater than the letter rate, the latter postage is substituted.

### Colonial Book Post.

At the following charges, and on the same conditions as the foregoing (except that no packet weighing more than three pounds can be sent to the East Indies or to New South Wales), book-packets can be forwarded to every British Colony:—

To India, Ceylon, New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania (Van Diemen's Land), South Australia, Western Australia, New Zealand, Mauritius, and Hong Kong, the charge is as follows:—

### Precautions against Fraud, &c.

The Head Postmaster who first receives a book-packet is required, whenever he has ground for suspecting an infringement of any of the above conditions, and occasionally, even when there is no ground for suspicion, to open and examine the packet; and every book-packet which is not open at the ends or sides, or which exceeds two feet in length, width, or depth, or which has any written letter or any communication of the nature of a letter written in it or upon its cover, or which does not bear postage stamps equal to a single book-rate, is sent to the Returned Letter Branch of the Circulation Office, Edinburgh; but in the case of any other infringement of the

\* For the Foreign Countries to which there is a book-post, and for the conditions and rates of charge, see pages 62 to 71.

regulations, the packet is dealt with in accordance with the above regulations.

To prevent obstacles to the regular transmission of letters, any Head Postmaster may, when necessary, delay forwarding a book-packet for a period not exceeding twenty-four hours beyond the ordinary time.

---

## II. REGISTRATION.

By the prepayment of a fee\* of sixpence any letter, newspaper, book, or other packet on which the postage has been prepaid in stamps, may be registered to any place within the United Kingdom. Book packets and newspapers can also be registered to the colonies under the conditions mentioned at page 77. To foreign countries *letters only* can be registered. The registration of a packet makes its transmission more secure by rendering it practicable to trace it, when inland, from its receipt to its delivery; and when colonial, if not to its delivery at least to the port of despatch. The Post Office does not guarantee the safe delivery of the letter, &c., though the officers are of course responsible to the Postmaster General, who will call to strict account any one neglecting his duty on this point, and, if his Lordship think proper, will require him to make good any loss that may be sustained thereby.

The postage and registration fee of registered letters must be prepaid; and if the letter be inland, such prepayment must be by stamps.

Every letter to be registered should be presented at the window, and a receipt obtained for it, and must on no account be dropped into the letter-box. If, contrary to this rule, a letter marked "Registered" be dropped into the letter-box, it will, *if directed to any place in the United Kingdom*, be liable to a registration fee of one shilling, instead of the ordinary fee of sixpence. No Letter-Carrier or Rural Messenger is required to take letters from the Public for the purpose of registering them.

The latest time for posting registered letters is half an hour before the time for posting ordinary letters.

---

## III. DELIVERY:

Letter Carriers and Rural Messengers are prohibited from distributing any letters, newspapers, &c., whether before beginning their rounds, whilst on their rounds, or after they have completed them, except such as have passed through a Post Office. Nor are they allowed to receive any payment beyond the postage for the delivery or collection of any letter or newspaper, nor to deviate from the route laid down for them. The prohibition, however, from receiving payment in addition to the postage does not extend to Christmas gratuities.

\* This fee in the case of a letter addressed to a place abroad, may be paid either in money or stamps; but in all other cases it must be paid in stamps.

### Delivery at Window.

Letters are delivered at the window after the arrival of every mail (within office hours) as soon as they can be sorted. In all cases, however, when there is a corresponding delivery by Letter Carriers, the window delivery (whether to the holders of private boxes or to the public generally) does not begin till the Letter Carriers have left the office, nor is it allowed in any way to delay the departure of the Letter Carriers.

In order to prevent the additional trouble which is sometimes caused by letters being directed to a Post Office, although for persons residing within a free delivery from such office, but who have no private box, a Postmaster is authorised, when such letters arrive by a mail for which there is a delivery from house to house, to refuse to deliver them at the window, and to send them out by the Letter Carriers, except such as are addressed to the military in barracks.

### Private Boxes and Bags.

Any person can have a private box who is willing to pay the appointed fee. Where this fee goes to the Revenue, it is generally fixed at one guinea per annum to be paid in advance, and for a period of not less than a year; and where it goes to the Postmaster, he may demand the same terms, though he may, at his option, take less. The same also, in most cases, are the terms for a private bag, except that in addition there is the cost of the bag itself, and a charge for conveyance, the maximum of the latter being half a guinea per annum if by a foot messenger, and two guineas if by a mounted one. As the service of a private bag, however, may possibly delay the despatch of the general bag, none are allowed without the permission of the Surveyor.

---

## IV. MONEY ORDERS.

The public are recommended, when applying for Money Orders, to use printed "Application Forms," which save time, and afford greater security, than verbal messages, against mistakes. These Forms are sold by Postmasters at the rate of ten for one penny, or of five or any smaller number for a halfpenny.

The commission on a money Order not exceeding £2 is three-pence, and on one above £2 it is sixpence; no order being granted for more than £5.

No order is allowed to contain a fractional part of a penny.

With the subjoined exceptions, no Money Order can be issued unless the applicant furnish, in full, the surname and at least the initial of one Christian name, both of the remitter (the person who sends the order) and the payee (the person to whom the money is to be paid), together with the remitter's address:—

1. If the remitter or payee be a peer or a bishop, his ordinary title is sufficient; and if a firm, the usual designation of such firm will suffice\*, except a company trading under a title which does not

\* The mere term "Messrs," however, is not sufficient.



consist of the names of the persons composing it, as the "Carron Company," to which kind of company the above privilege does not extend.

2d. When the remitter notifies in writing that the order is to be paid through a bank, it is left to his option to give or withhold the name of the payee; and he may, if he wish it, substitute for the name of the payee any other designation or any modification of the name, as for example:—"The Cashier of the Bank of England,"—"The Chief Clerk of the Foreign Office,"—"The Publisher of the Times,"—"Messrs Longman & Co."

When application is made for a Money Order payable in London, or at any other town where there is more than one Money Order Office, the remitter should say at which of such offices he wishes it to be paid, otherwise the order can be cashed at the Head Office alone. It is not incumbent on a Postmaster to supply such information relative to local or provincial offices.

An order once issued cannot be cancelled; and should repayment or transfer to a different office or alteration of name be required, the remitter must apply to the Metropolitan Office.

When an order is presented for payment (otherwise than through a bank) the Postmaster has first to see that the signature of the payee be as full as the name given in the advice, and be not in any way inconsistent therewith. He has then to call on the applicant to give the name of the remitter, and if the reply be correct, the order will be paid, unless the Postmaster have good reason for believing that the applicant for payment is neither the rightful claimant, nor deputed by him. When an order is paid through a bank it is sufficient that it be receipted (without regard to any discrepancy between the signature and the name in the advice, or to whether the receipt is given by the payee himself or by another person), and that it be presented (crossed with the name of the receiving bank) by some person known to be in the employment of the bank.

The holder of a Money Order is always at liberty to direct, by crossing it, that the order be paid through a bank, even though its payment was not originally so restricted; and when the order is thus crossed, the question put on the presentation of an ordinary Money Order is dispensed with.

Money Orders do not require a receipt stamp

Payment of an order must be obtained before the end of the second calendar month after that in which it was issued (for instance, if issued in January it must be paid before the end of March), otherwise the order becomes lapsed, and a new order will be necessary, for which a second commission will be charged. Any person presenting a lapsed order will be furnished with a copy of a printed notice headed "Lapsed Money Orders," containing directions how to proceed. If the order be not paid before the end of the twelfth calendar month after that in which it was issued (for instance, if issued in January, and not paid before the end of next January,) all claim to the money will be lost.

No application can be entertained for compensation for alleged injury from the nonpayment of a money order at the expected time; and after once paying a money order, by whomsoever presented, the Office is not liable to any further claim. The Public are therefore strictly cautioned,—

1. To guard against the loss of the money order.
2. Never to send the money order in the same letter with the information required on payment thereof.
3. To be careful on applying for a money order to state correctly the surname and at least the initial of the Christian name of the person in whose favour it is to be drawn.
4. To see that the name of the person taking out the order is correctly known to the person in whose favour it is drawn.

Under no circumstances can payment of an order be demanded on the day of issue; and, as respects orders granted at minor offices, time must be allowed for the advice to pass through the Metropolitan Office.

In case of the miscarriage or loss of a money order, a duplicate is granted on a written application (with the necessary particulars) to the Controller of the Money Order Office of the kingdom where the original order was issued; and by a similar application to the same officer, who (except as regards a temporary power to stop payment) can alone act in such cases, authority can be obtained to transfer the payment of an order from one office to another, or to stop payment, or to correct any error in the name of the remitter or payee, or to repay the money to the remitter. Every such application, however, must contain, in postage stamps, a second commission (namely, threepence for an order not exceeding £2, and 6d for an order above that sum), though one commission will suffice even when, in the same application, more things than one, relating to the same order, are asked for; as both an alteration in the name of the payee and payment at another office. Unless a sufficient reason be given for an exception, the application must be either from the remitter or payee. Whenever on complaint being made, it is found that the necessity for an application entailing the payment of a fresh commission is attributable to the Post Office, the stamps transmitted in payment of the commission will be returned; and when it can be ascertained where the blame lies, the officer in fault will be required to pay the additional commission.

A Postmaster is required to give information how to apply for a duplicate order, &c., and must furnish the applicant with the prescribed form of application. Moreover, if payment of an order be refused in consequence of the replies to the questions respecting the remitter not corresponding with the entries in the advice, or of a difference in the name in the receipt, the Postmaster is instructed to advise the applicant for payment to communicate with the remitter, and request him to apply to the Controller of the Metropolitan Money Order Office of the kingdom in which the order was

issued, enclosing in his application the additional commission (in postage stamps) chargeable for the alterations required.

No Letter Carrier or other servant of the Post Office is bound to procure a Money Order for any person, or to obtain payment for one; but such services are not forbidden.

No money order business is transacted on the Sunday; neither in England, Scotland, or Ireland, is any transacted on Christmas Day or Good Friday, nor, in Scotland, on the Sacramental Fast Days; but for the convenience of the labouring classes the provincial offices are kept open on the Saturday night till eight o'clock (or as near that hour as the despatch of the mail will allow), except where the Surveyor of the district considers such an arrangement unnecessary.

Money Orders are issued and paid at the Chief Offices in London, Dublin, and Edinburgh daily, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., except on Saturdays, when the hours of business are from 10 a.m. till 1 p.m. Orders are issued and paid at most provincial offices from 9 in the morning till 6 in the evening, and the time is never less than from 10 till 4. A Postmaster, however, is in some cases allowed to suspend the business during the time he is making up his letter bags, &c., provided a notice of the intervals be placarded at his Office.

The agents of the Post Office in Malta and Gibraltar are authorized to *issue* Money Orders on the several Money Order Offices in the United Kingdom; but no orders can be drawn upon the above mentioned places.

#### IV.—MISCELLANEOUS REGULATIONS.

With the following exceptions no letter, &c. can be forwarded by the post which is more than two feet in length, breadth, or depth nor any unpaid packet which weighs more than four ounces, unless three quarters of the postage have been paid. The exceptions are:—

- 1st. Packets to or from places abroad.
- 2d. Packets to or from any of the Government Offices or departments, or Public Officers.
- 3d. Petitions or addresses to the Queen, whether directed to Her Majesty, or forwarded to any member of either House of Parliament.
- 4th. Petitions to either House of Parliament, forwarded to any member of either House.
- 5th. Printed Parliamentary proceedings.

No information can be given respecting letters which pass through a Post Office\* except to the persons to whom they are addressed; and in no other way is official information of a private character allowed to be made public.

Postmasters are not allowed to return any letter, &c. to the writer

\* The term "Post Office" applies to all Post Offices, whether Head Office, Sub-Office or Receiving Office. A "Head Office" is an office subordinate only to a Metropolitan Office. Both Sub-Offices and Receiving Offices are under Head-Offices; but at Receiving Offices letters are *received* only, not delivered.



or sender, or to any one else, or to delay forwarding it to its destination according to the address, even though a request to such effect be written thereon; as every letter, &c. must be delivered to the person to whom it is directed, and to him alone.

Late letters, &c.\* are received till within five minutes of the despatch of the mails, except where the Surveyor may deem a longer interval necessary, and excepting that no office is to be kept open merely for this purpose after ten o'clock at night.

No late letters, &c., are forwarded by the mail preparing for despatch unless prepaid, and that in stamps, so as to include both the ordinary postage and the late-letter fee.

With the subjoined exceptions, every re-directed letter or other postal packet will be liable to an additional postage (at the prepaid rate) unless the re-direction be not only made by an Officer of the Post Office, but be to a place within the district belonging to the same Head Office. Thus, on a paid or unpaid letter re-directed by an Officer of the Post Office to any other postal district in the United Kingdom, and weighing not more than half an ounce, an additional postage is levied of one penny; or if the weight be more than half an ounce but does not exceed an ounce, of two-pence; and so on. Upon a book thus re-directed to any other postal district in the United Kingdom, and weighing not more than four ounces, an additional postage of one penny is levied, or, if the book weigh more than four ounces but not more than eight ounces, an additional postage of twopence; and so on. Newspapers and books, &c. received from abroad and reposted to any other place abroad with which there is no Book Post, are chargeable with Letter postage. A registered letter when re-directed is not subject to a greater additional charge than an ordinary letter. Letters which have once been posted addressed to commissioned officers in the army, navy, or ordnance employed on actual service in any of Her Majesty's colonies, or on any foreign station, or who, before receiving the letters may have started on their return home or to another station, may be re-directed to such officers when removed *upon service*, and will be delivered to them for the same postage that would have been chargeable had the letters been delivered at their original address. The same privilege extends to the letters of soldiers and seamen, (see page 73) except as regards foreign postage, which must be paid. No such privilege, however, is allowed with regard to letters for a commissioned officer when such officer is in the United Kingdom, and was so when the letters were posted.

During the time the office is open on Sunday (*viz.* from 9 to 10 in the morning), the public are allowed to prepay foreign and colonial letters, to purchase postage stamps, and to have letters registered; and all other duties are performed as usual, except the issue and payment of Money Orders, which, on that day are wholly suspended.

\* The term "Letters, &c.," is meant to include everything sent by the post; whether letters, newspapers, books, or aught else. "Late letters" are such as are posted after the ordinary time, and which cannot therefore be sent forward by the mail then in preparation, unless extra payment be made.



At no office is there more than one delivery on the Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday, nor, in Scotland, on the Sacramental Fast Days; and any person is at liberty to prevent even this, so far as relates to himself, as shown in the following regulations:—

1st. Any person can have his letters, &c. retained in the Post Office on Sunday by addressing to the Postmaster, a written request, duly signed, to that effect.

2d. Such request will be held to include newspapers, and all other postal packets, even such as may be marked "immediate," as no distinction can be allowed.

3d. No letters, &c. the non-delivery of which by the Letter Carrier on Sunday has been directed, can be obtained from the Post Office window on that day.

4th. Private box-holders have the option of applying for letters at the office while it is open for delivery on Sunday, or of abstaining from so doing, as they may think proper; but no person can be permitted to engage a private box for Sunday only.

5th. To prevent the inconvenience and confusion which would arise from frequent changes in these instructions, no request can be entertained unless it extend to a period of at least three months, nor be withdrawn, even after the lapse of that time, without a week's notice.

No postmaster is bound to give change, or is authorised to demand change; and when money is paid at a Post Office, whether as change or otherwise, no question as to its right amount, goodness, or weight can be entertained after it has been removed from the counter.

Except as regards foreign and colonial letters about to be prepaid in money, a Postmaster is not bound to weigh any letters or other packets for the public, though he may do so if his duty be not thereby impeded.

Postmasters are instructed not to receive any Letter, &c., which there is good reason to believe contains anything likely to injure the contents of the mail bag or the person of any officer of the Post Office. If such a letter, &c. be posted without the Postmaster's knowledge, or, if at any time before its despatch he should discover any letter, &c., of the above description, he is directed not to forward it, but to report the case, with the address of the Letter, &c., to the Secretary. The following are examples of the articles referred to.

A glass bottle, or glass in any form; razors, scissors, needles, knives, forks, or other sharp instruments; leeches, game, fish, meat, fruit, or vegetables; bladders or other vessels containing liquids; gunpowder, lucifer matches, or anything which is explosive or combustible.

When any letters, &c. remain undelivered, owing to the residences of the persons to whom they are addressed not being known, a list of the addresses is affixed in the window of the Post Office to which they may have been sent, during the time (one week) they are allowed to remain there.

**Optional or Compulsory Prepayment.**

The asterisk prefixed to a division (as that of Letters or Newspapers) indicates that in such case Prepayment is compulsory. In other cases Prepayment is not compulsory unless the Letter be registered. When a Letter or Newspaper, addressed to go by a route that requires Prepayment, is posted unpaid, and there is some other route where Prepayment is not required, it is sent by that route; but if there be none, it is sent to the Returned Letter Office, to be returned to the writer.

**Distance to which the Postage carries the Letter, &c.**

“*d.*”—The letter “*d.*” prefixed to any division (as that of Letters or Newspapers) shows that the Postage there entered carries the Letter, &c., from the place where it is posted in the United Kingdom to its place of destination. In all other cases the postage carries it only part of the way.

**Mails when due.**

The dates given in the Table are those when the Mails are due in London, excepting Mails from the United States and British North America via Liverpool, and from the West Coast of Africa via Plymouth. In these two cases the dates given are those on which the Mails are due at the ports just mentioned.

**Moldavia and Wallachia via Belgium.**

In the case of Letters for any other places than Botuschany, Galatz, and Jassy, in Moldavia, or Bucharest and Ibraila, in Wallachia, forwarded via Belgium, the writers should specify on the address to which of the above towns they desire their letters should be forwarded, and the rate as far as that town *must then be paid in advance.*

**Letters for Non-Commissioned Officers, Soldiers,  
and Seamen in Her Majesty's Service.**

“*S.*” Subject to the subjoined regulations, non-commissioned officers, private soldiers, or seamen, serving on board Her Majesty's Ships on sea or land (in foreign Parts), as also enrolled pensioners in Canada, can send and receive letters by direct Packet or Vessel of War, for a postage of 1d.



1st. The Person claiming the privilege must at the time be actually employed in the service of Her Majesty, or of the East India Company, and must not be either a commissioned or warrant officer, midshipman, or master's mate, the privilege not extending to these officers.

2nd. If the letter be posted within the United Kingdom, the penny must be prepaid, as must any foreign postage that may be chargeable; and if sent by private ship the gratuity of one penny or twopence, as the case may be, to the captain must also be prepaid. If posted abroad, prepayment is not compulsory, but if the letter be sent unpaid, it is on delivery charged twopence, together with any foreign postage or gratuity to a sea captain that may be due.

3rd. The Letter must not weigh more than half an ounce.

4th. It must relate entirely to the private concerns of the soldier or seaman.

5th. The name of the soldier or seaman, with his class or description, must appear in the direction, and the officer having the command must sign his name, and specify the ship or regiment, corps, or detachment to which the soldier or seaman belongs; the name of the ship or regiment being entered in full. The foregoing particulars must be given in one of the following forms:—

If either of the foregoing regulations be violated, the Letter is charged with the full Letter Rate.

**Officers' Letters.**

The postage on Letters addressed to naval officers on board Her Majesty's ships on Colonial or Foreign Stations is as follows:—

East India Station. See India.

China Station. See Hong Kong.

Mediterranean. See Malta.

West Coast of Africa. See Sierra Leone.

West Indies. See Barbadoes.

South Africa (or Simon's Bay). See Cape of Good Hope.

The postage in the following cases must be paid in advance:—

The River Tagus and Lisbon—6d not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz, and so on. Newspapers 1d each.

Pacific, South Seas, and West Coast of South America—1s not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz, and so on. Newspapers 3d each.

Brazils, River Plate, and East Coast of South America—6d not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz, and so on. Newspapers 1d each.

**Routes.**

When the route by which a Letter, &c., is to go is not marked on it, it will, under ordinary circumstances, be sent by the route immediately following the name of the place. Thus, a Letter or Newspaper directed to India, with no route marked on it, will be sent via Marseilles, and charged the higher postage attendant thereon. For information respecting a Foreign rate of postage, as distinguished from the combined British and Foreign rate (which will be found in the foregoing Table) application should be made to the Secretary of the Post Office. No Foreign postage is chargeable on Letters to or from India via Southampton.

No packet of books or newspapers, however, can be sent to the Austrian dominions via Sardinia if it weighs more than 1 lb.

The term "printed papers" includes Parliamentary Proceedings, Books of every kind, whether printed, engraved, or lithographed, Sheets of Music, Prints, and printed or engraved Maps, with any binding, mounting, or covering (whether loose or attached), belonging to any Book, &c., and any cases or rollers of prints, or of printed or engraved Maps, together with Bookmarkers, Pencils, Pens, or other articles usually appertaining to any such Book, &c., or necessary for its safe transmission. But no such Book, &c., must contain any writing or manuscript mark of any sort, and no packet must exceed 18 inches in length, width, or depth (except those addressed to Sardinia, Tuscany, Parma, Modena, and the Austrian Dominions, which must not exceed 24 inches), otherwise it will be detained and sent to the Returned Letter Office charged with letter postage.

To all parts of Belgium, to Sardinia, Tuscany, Parma, Modena, and the Austrian Dominions, France, Algeria, and to those places in Turkey, Syria, and Egypt, where France maintains post offices, the above rates carry the packet to its destination; no charge being made on delivery. At the same rates (although subject to a further charge on delivery) newspapers and other printed papers may be sent to those countries not mentioned in the foregoing Section, the correspondence for which is forwarded as a rule by way of France, (as shown in the Table of Colonial and Foreign Postage),

and (when so addressed) to other countries via France. As regards packets sent *through* France (except to the countries enumerated in the two foregoing Sections) the term "printed papers" does *not* include cases or rollers, or maps, book-markers, pencils, pens, &c., but *does* include parliamentary proceedings, books of every kind, sheets of music, and prints. In these latter cases the rates paid in the United Kingdom free the newspapers or other printed papers through France, but not beyond.

The foreign rates of postage on Newspapers to parts of Turkey, &c., via Belgium, specified in the table, as *exceptional rates*, are as follows:—Not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz,  $1\frac{1}{2}$ d;  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz and not exceeding 1oz., 3d; 1oz and not exceeding  $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz,  $4\frac{1}{2}$ d;  $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz and not exceeding 2 oz 6d; 2 oz and not exceeding  $2\frac{1}{2}$  oz,  $7\frac{1}{2}$ d; and so on,  $1\frac{1}{2}$ d being charged for every succeeding  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz or fraction of  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. Besides this Foreign postage there is a British postage of 1d for each Newspaper. Both rates must be prepaid.

Newspapers for India weighing above 4 oz and not exceeding 8 oz are chargeable with two single rates; above 8 oz and not exceeding 12 oz with three single rates, and so on.

"B." The privilege of the Book Post to and from India and New South Wales is limited to packages not exceeding 3 lbs in weight; any package weighing more than 3 lbs is liable to letter rate of postage.

Periodical works not of daily publication, issued in the shape of pamphlets, may be sent to Bremen and Hamburg by private ship, to Prussia via Belgium and by private ship, to the United States by packet, and to Holland via Belgium and by private ship, (to which latter country Parliamentary Proceedings may also be sent,) at the following rates: not exceeding 2 oz, 1d; 2 oz and not exceeding 3 oz, 6d; 3 oz and not exceeding 4 oz, 8d; with an addition of 2d for every additional ounce up to 16 ounces, above which weight the privilege does not extend, *except in the case of parliamentary proceedings to Holland, the weight of which is unlimited.* At the same rate of postage, any pamphlet not weighing more than 8 oz. (even though it be not a periodical publication) may be sent to the United States. The periodical works or pamphlets must always be sent in a cover open at the ends, (not more than one being sent in a single cover,) and the postage must be prepaid. Other printed papers or books (except those specified above) addressed to the places above-named are liable to letter rate of postage.

"G.U." According to the regulations of the German Customs Union, no letter exceeding 50 grammes ( a little more than  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz.) in weight, and containing any other enclosure than paper, can be allowed to circulate by the post. Any letters, therefore, forwarded in the mail to Prussia above that weight, and containing any other enclosure than paper, will be liable, on their arrival at the Prussian frontier, to be stopped, and sent to the Custom House for delivery as *freight*.



### Registration of Letters, &c.

By the prepayment of the ordinary postage and the usual British registration fee of 6d, Letters, Newspapers, and Book-packets can be registered irrespective of weight between this country and the British West Indies, British North America, Sierra Leone, Gold Coast, St Helena, Cape of Good Hope, Natal, Mauritius, South Australia, Western Australia, Malta, Gibraltar, and Ceylon; and *Letters* may on the same terms be registered to Belgium, Luxemburg (via Belgium), Holland, and countries through Holland, Sardinia, the United States, India, and Liberia.

By the prepayment of a fee of 9d irrespective of weight, and of the usual postage, Letters may be registered to Prussia and to those countries the correspondence of which is, as a rule, sent through Belgium or addressed "via Belgium," except Holland and Luxemburg; and by the prepayment of a fee of 11d, irrespective of weight, and of the usual postage, Letters may be registered to Tuscany, Parma, and Modena, as also to Venetian Lombardy and to other parts of the Austrian dominions when addressed "via Sardinia."

By the prepayment of the postage and of a registration fee equal to the postage, Letters may be registered to France and (except Sardinia, Tuscany, Parma, Modena, and Venetian Lombardy, for which see above,) to countries the correspondence for which is, as a rule, sent through France and can be paid to destination. The countries to which letters sent via France, *cannot* be paid to destination are Spain, Portugal, the Ionian Islands, and those parts of Syria and Egypt where France does not maintain Post Offices.

Letters for Russia not otherwise addressed are sent via Belgium and Prussia and can be registered by that route by the prepayment of the postage; together with a registration fee consisting of a fixed sum of 9d, and also of  $3\frac{1}{2}$ d for every half-ounce or fraction of a half-ounce. Thus the prepayment to be made for a Letter not exceeding half an ounce to Russia, is—Postage  $11\frac{1}{2}$ d, and Registration Fee, 1s  $0\frac{1}{2}$ d; together equal to 2s.

By the prepayment of the ordinary postage and British registration fee of 6d a Letter for any other place can be registered to the port of despatch, and entered upon the Letter Bill, it being left in these cases to the postal authorities of the colony or foreign country to continue the registration if they think proper.

### Letters, &c., by Private Ships.

To most of the places entered in this table, Letters may, if so marked, be sent by (*British*) Private Ship, even when there is no entry to that effect in the table. Letters may be sent by Private Ship, also, to many other places; the Table of Colonial and Foreign Postage being chiefly limited to those with which there is postal communication by regular packets. To insure any letter, &c. being sent by Private Ship, the words "By Private Ship," or "By Ship," should be distinctly written above the address. Except where

otherwise specified in the table, the postage on a letter by a Private Ship is six times the Inland prepaid rate (equal in the case of a letter not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. to 6d) which postage must generally be prepaid: though to the following places Ship Letters may be sent unpaid; viz.—Bermuda, Canada, Cape of Good Hope, Gold Coast, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, St Helena, Barbadoes, Trinidad, Turks Island, Sierra Leone, East Indies, Ceylon, and Mauritius. Newspapers by Private Ships are charged 1d each.

### Warm Climates.

The practice of Sealing Letters passing to and from the *East* and *West* Indies, and other warm climates, with Wax (except such as is specially prepared) is attended with much inconvenience, and frequently with serious injury to the letters, in consequence of the Melting of the Wax and Adhesion of the Letters to each other.

The public are therefore recommended in all such cases to use either prepared Wax or Wafers, and also to advise their correspondents in the Countries referred to to pursue the same course.

### Prepayment.

Letters addressed to places abroad may be prepaid in this country either in money or stamps, though not partly in one and partly in the other, but such payment must be wholly in stamps or wholly in money. Book packets must always be prepaid. Newspapers also must always be prepaid, though the payment may be either in stamps or money. The only admitted evidence of the prepayment of a letter, &c., *inwards*, is the mark agreed upon with the particular foreign country or colony; except in the case of Letters posted at Malta, Gibraltar, or Constantinople. Naval officers and seamen also serving abroad are allowed to prepay such of their letters as are conveyed in their ship's bag, with English postage stamps. When prepayment is optional any outward letter (that is, a letter posted within the United Kingdom, and addressed to some place out of it) posted with an insufficient number of stamps is charged with the deficient postage in addition; unless the letter have to go to a country through France, Holland, or the United States, in which case it is treated as wholly unpaid, the postal conventions with the latter countries not allowing the recognition of partial prepayment. When prepayment, however, is compulsory, a letter or aught else posted with an insufficient number of stamps is sent (by the first post) to the Returned Letter Office. Unpaid letters addressed to or received from places in Turkey, Egypt, and Syria, at which France maintains Post Offices, will, on delivery, be charged a rate of 9d per  $\frac{1}{4}$ oz., instead of 6d the prepaid rate. Unpaid Letters addressed to or posted in Sardinia will, on delivery, be charged with a sum of 6d over and above the ordinary postage as a fine.

Break the joints by every succeeding ring, and slightly tallow each before placing it. The gland need only be slightly screwed down to keep steam tight.
