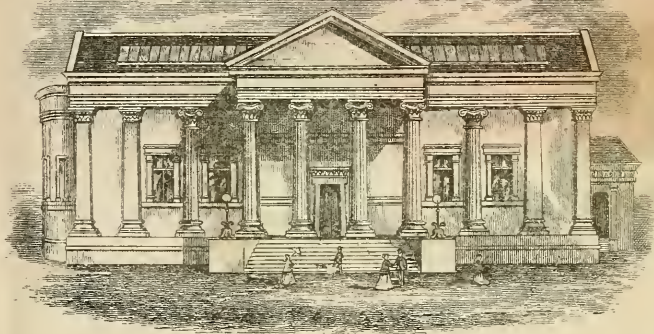



REGULATIONS AND TABLE OF FARES

FOR THE PAISLEY PORTERS.

No person shall be permitted to ply or work on the streets of Paisley for hire, as a Porter, without first entering his name and place of residence, in a book for the purpose, in the Town Clerk's Chamber, and without giving bond for the faithful and honest discharge of his duty, under such penalty as to the Magistrates shall seem proper, and without having a Badge or Ticket containing his number.

Persons wishing to be admitted as Porters, must apply to the Magistrates, by petition, stating their place of nativity, age, residence, and former employments, and produce satisfactory certificates as to character. On being admitted, and before being allowed to ply, each Porter must implement the above enactment, and he shall thereafter strictly conform to, and observe the following Regulation:—

1st. He shall renew his Bond at the expiry of three years, and on the decease of the Cautioner, or his removal from the Town; which decease and removal he shall, within eight days, intimate in writing to the Town Clerk, and he shall also, in the same manner, and within the said time, intimate his own removal or change of residence.

2d. He shall wear his Badge or Ticket conspicuously on the left breast of his coat, which Badge shall be of brass, and have inscribed the words *Robert Heir No 1* and the Number in the order of his admission, and he shall also have a transcript of said inscription painted legibly on the right side of his barrow or hurley.

3d. He shall not, when unengaged, refuse employment when offered, whether on his station or not; and if he alledge previous engagement, he shall, when required, specify the nature and time of his engagement.

4th. He shall not demand higher fares than those specified in the subjoined Table; a copy of which Table, with these Regulations, and also a small plan of the Town, divided into Sections of half a mile, he shall always have in his possession, and produce to persons employing him when required.

5th. No Porter shall appear on his station intoxicated. All Porters are prohibited from standing on the pavement, or crossings, to the obstruction or annoyance of the lieges; as also from smoking, when upon their stations, or in any manner giving offence. In general, they are enjoined to conduct themselves orderly among themselves, and discreetly towards the public.

6th. Porters contravening, or not conforming to these Regulations, will subject themselves to a penalty not exceeding thirty shillings, which penalty shall be awarded, and the regulations enforced in a summary manner by the Sitting Magistrate, who may dismiss from said employment, and deprive of their Badge such as shall offend.

DIRECTIONS

For the Recovery of the apparently Drowned or Dead.

BY THE PAISLEY HUMANE SOCIETY.

IN APPARENT DEATH three objects are constantly to be kept in view; 1st, to remove every hurtful cause; 2d, to regulate the temperature of the body; 3d to restore breathing. For these purposes

the following directions may be usefully employed, till medical assistance arrive, which ought instantly to be sent for in every case.

In a case of Drowning.

Remove as quickly as possible all wet clothes from the body, dry it well, wrap it in any warm woollen covering, and convey it, with the head and breast moderately raised, to the nearest house, where none but useful assistants ought to be admitted. Let the body now be laid in a warm bed, or upon a warm blanket near a fire, *but not exposed to a strong heat.* Let the lost heat be restored by rubbing the surface with warm cloths or hands, by wrapping a piece of warm flannel or blanketting round the waist, and by applying warm substances, *first and chiefly* to the trunk and head, *next* to the limbs. The most convenient for this purpose are bottles or flasks filled with warm water, and bags or stockings filled with hot grains, chaff, bran, salt, or sand. Large glysters of warm water should also be exhibited. To restore the breathing, let a person firmly compress the nostrils with the fingers of one hand, then apply his mouth across the mouth of the body, and blow forcibly; let him now lift his head, and the air will escape. This operation is to be commenced as soon as possible, and continued till natural breathing return, or till the case appear hopeless. If water in the mouth and nostrils prevent inflation of the lungs, it ought to be discharged by blowing into the mouth while the nostrils are left open.

In a case of Strangling.

Remove every thing tight from the neck and breast, then proceed to inflate the lungs and restore heat, as directed above.

In a case of Suffocation from Impure Air.

Admit fresh air, inflate the lungs, and if the body be cold, restore heat as directed above; if, as sometimes happens, it be warmer than naturally, reduce the heat by dashing the head, neck, and breast smartly with cold water.

In a case of Apparent Death from Lightning.

Besides using the same means as for suffocation, give large glysters of salt and water, and use friction over the whole body.

In a case of Apparent Death from Intense Cold.

Avoid placing the body *at first* near the fire, use friction rather than apply heat for a time; in other respects act as for drowning.

In a case of Excessive Intoxication.

If the breathing be suspended, act as for drowning, give large glysters of salt and water, endeavour to bring up the contents of the stomach by tickling the throat with feathers; for the same purpose when the power of swallowing is restored, give copious draughts of warm water.

To prevent Death from Loss of Blood.

If from a wound, apply firm pressure to the wound by the finger or a small pad, till medical assistance can be procured. If from a limb, twist a handkerchief tightly round the limb, nearer to the

heart than the wound. If fainting has taken place, lay the patient in the recumbent position, and apply hartshorn to the nostrils. If the bleeding is from an internal part, apply cold wet cloths, and avoid all stimulants.

A Medical Apparatus lies in the Town's Hospital, another in the House of Recovery.

Besides a weekly market, held on Thursday, Fairs each of three days' duration, annually begin on the third Thursday of May and of February—the second Thursday of August and of November.—But the August Fair, called the Paisley St. James' Day Fair is the most considerable; being distinguished by horse-racing, attended by numerous shows, and observed as holiday time by all ranks of the people. These races are run annually on the Friday and Saturday of the St. James' Day Fair. For some years past a number of gentlemen in and about Paisley, have interested themselves to render these sports more attractive and safe, and have now completed a new Course of 36 to 40 feet broad, and upwards of a mile in length, (and clear of the public high way,) on ground near the old Course, west side of Greenock road, taken from the Community on a 19 year's lease; repaired at considerable expense, by public subscription, and finished in such a style, that no course in the West of Scotland equals, or at least surpasses it. Being staked and roped round, a greater degree of safety is ensured to horse and rider, and also to the spectators, and must give satisfaction to the lovers and encouragers of these sports. The whole is completed in such a manner as reflects the greatest credit upon the gentlemen who have taken an interest in it. The contractor, Mr Robert M'Creath, Elderslie, has finished the work in a superior syle.

ACT ANENT THE SILVER BELL.

April, 1608. Item, it is concluded that ane silver bell be made of 4 oz. weight, with all diligence, for ane Horse race yearly, to be appointed within this burgh, and the bounds and day for running thereof, to be set down by advice of My Lord Earl of Abercorn, Lord Paisley and Kilpatrick.

Act setting downe ane hors Raiss.

Apud Paisslay, decimo tertio de mensis maij, 1620.

The quhilk day Andro Crawford and Jon. Algeo, zounger, baillies of ye burghe thair of, with the counselle of the samyn, being convenit in the tolbuith of the said burt., with advyse of ane nobill and potent erle, James, erle of Abercorn, &c., proveist of the said burghe, for ordour taking with sundrie thingis concerning the com-moune weill of the samyn, and namelie, anent the conclusion of thair bell race and esterschot, quhilk was of auld set doune and not

effectuat. Thairfoir, It is now concludit and ordainit be the saidis baillies and counsell, with advyse and consent foirsaid, That zeirlie in tyme cuming, thair bell raice salbe rwne on the saxt day of Maij in manner following, viz. to be start at the gray stane callit St. Connalis stane, and fra that richt eist to the lytill house at the calsayend of Renfrew, and fra that the hie Kingis way to the Walnuik of Paisley, and quhat horse first comes over a scoir at [] Renfrew sall have ane dowbill aingell, and the horse and maister yairof that first comes over the scoir at the said Walneuk of Paislaye, sall have the said bell with the said burghe's airmes yairvponn, for yat zeir. Togidder with the rest of the gold that salbe gevin in with the said bell, In manner following (except ane dowbill aingell that salbe given to the secund horse and his maister yat comes nixt over the scoire to the foirmest; and to that effect the saidis baillies and counsell present and to come, with advyse of thair said lord proveist, obleist yame to give in zeirlie with the said silver bell, the pieces of gold following, viz. the said lord proveist ane dowbill aingell, the saidis bailleis and counsell ane vther dowbill aingell. Lyikas the noblemen haifand lands within the parochin of Paislay, as my lord Sempill, ane singell aingell, my lord Rose, my Lord of Blantyre, [] everie ane of thame ar willing, for the vphalding of the said bell race, zeirlie to give in ane single aingell yairvnto, and every awner of the horse that rwnes to produce ane singill aingell of gold to the said Bailleis before the horse be drawn out lyikas all the awnneries of the horses that sall happen to ryne zearlie salbe obleist to be present within the burt. of Paislaye, dayes at leist befoir the said raice day, and thair to be ready, with thair ryderis befoir ten houris befoir nowne, and the rydaris to be weyit at the trone of the said burt. of Paislaye, [] stane wecht; quhair the maisters or vtheris haifand power of thame, salbe present with the rydaris in the tolbuthe of the said burghe for gifing up thair names, casting of the dyce for their places in outleiding and the wandhandis. And becaus this present zeir is so far spent, it is concludit be the said Lord Proveist and vther noblemen, with advise of the said Bailleis and Counsell of yis burt. That the said bell raice be rune the first day of Junij nixtocum, fra the gray stane, callit St. Connallis stane, to the said lytill house, and fra yat to the Walneuk of Paislaye, as said is haifand yair horse always dyetit in the said burt. in manner foirsaid. And quha happens to won the said bell keipand yair wecht in manner above written, being weyit againe at the said trone, sall have the silver bell hung at his horse heid, and ye gold foirsaid. With this provisioone, that the maister of the horse, or ony vtheris haifing power of him, salbe actit as principall, with ane sufficient burgess man, as cautioner for him, conjunctlie and severallie, for productiounne of the said bell to the saidis baillies of Paislaye, als gudc as he sall resave the samyn, with what augmentatiounne pleist him to adde yairto zeirlie apoun the said saxt day of Maij, befoir nyne houris in the morning, and quhat ever horsse beis not keepit and

dyettit within the said burgh, the space foirsaid befor the said day, and led fra Paislaye to the starting place, they sall not be sufferit to runne in tyme cuming, and quhatevir horse winnis the said silver bell three zieris togither, the maister owner yairof sall have the said silver bell to himself conforme to the manner of vther burrowes.

Item, it is concludit be the saidis bailleis and counsell of the said burt. with advyse of my said lord proveist, That ane efterschot raisse sall be run zeirlie in all tyme cuming, fra ane scoir at the sclaittis of Ellirslie to ane vther scoir at the Calsayheid of the said burt. (now head of Lady Lane) of Paislaye, be horse of the price of ane hundredth mercs, Ryddand with the wecht foirsaid, for ane furnischeit sadill, Qubilk salbe zeirlie presentit be the saidis bailleis of Paislaye, present and to cum, at the scoir at the said calsayheid. And quhilkis of the saidis horses that sall happin to cum first over the said scoir at the said calsayheid, the awner yairof sall have the said sadill, stok yairof, and covering; and the awner of the secund horse that sall happin to cum secundlie over the said scoir sall have the furnischeing of the said sadill then presentit. It was stated by one of the Judges at the Dinner, that the Show was superior to the one of last year at Ayr, before the Highland Society. The award of the Judges was not given till after the most mature investigation, and it certainly afforded us a good deal of satisfaction to find their award when announced, agreeing in so many instances with the opinions previously expressed by experienced farmers and country gentlemen outside of the ring.

Johnstone Cross, nearly opposite to the Black Bull Inn, is distant from the Cross of Paisley, 3 miles, 5 furlongs, 34 poles. Fairs are held on the Thursday following the second Monday of July and on the last Thursday of October, for cattle; also, on the last Friday of December for horses.

Although this market is not generally known, being but lately established, yet, from the excellent supply of cattle brought forward, promises to be one of the most numerous attended Fairs in the West of Scotland. The market place is spacious and very extensive, affording accommodation rarely to be met with.

PARLIAMENTARY BOUNDARIES.

By the bill to regulate the boundaries of Scotch towns, returning, or joining to return Members to Parliament, under the new regime, the following are the boundaries assigned to Paisley and Renfrew. They are certainly ample, and will not be complained of as cutting too closely on the outskirts.

PAISLEY.

From the summit of Byres Hill, on the north east of the town, in a straight line to the point near Knockhill, at which the Renfrew road is joined by a road from Glasgow; thence in a straight line to the summit of Knockhill; thence in a straight line to the northern gable of the Moss toll house on the Greenock road; thence in a straight line in the direction of the chimney of Linwood cotton mill to the point at which such straight line cuts the Candren burn; thence up the Candren burn to the point at which the same is joined by the Braidiland burn at the bridge over the same on the Johnstone road; thence up the Braidiland burn to a point which is distant five hundred yards (measured along the Braidiland burn) above the said bridge; thence in a straight line to Meikleridge bridge over the Candren burn; thence in a straight line to the point at which the old Neilston road leaves the new Neilston road; thence in a straight line to the summit of Dykebar hill; thence in a straight line to a point which is one hundred yards due north-east of the summit of Bathgo hill; thence in a straight line to the point first described.

RENFREW.

From the Milburn bridge over the Pudzeoch burn on the Glasgow road in a straight line to a point up the Pudzeoch burn, which is distant three hundred yards in a straight line from the said bridge; thence in a straight line to a point on the Greenock road, which is distant two hundred and fifty yards (measured along the Greenock Road) from the point at which the same leaves the Paisley road; thence in a straight line to a point on the river Clyde, which is distant three hundred yards (measured along the river Clyde) below the point at which the same is joined by the Canal; thence along the river Clyde to the point at which the same is joined by the Canal; thence along the Canal to the point at which the same is joined by the Pudzeoch burn; thence along the Pudzeoch burn to the bridge aforesaid.
