**SECOND WARD.**—All within a line drawn from a point in Greenhill road opposite to the centre of the north end of Well street, along the middle of the Greenhill road, Underwood road, and St. James street, to a point opposite the centre of the street called Stoney brae, thence by the centre of Stoney brae till it joins Oakshaw street, thence along the centre of the road leading round the High Church wall to the Churchhill, thence along the centre of Churchhill to New street, thence along the centre of New street to a point opposite the centre of Shuttle street, thence along the centre of that street to George's place, by the west and south of George's Church to a point in George street opposite the north end of Wardrop street, thence along the centre of that street to Canal street, thence along the centre of that street to a point opposite to the centre of the road leading to Canal basin, thence along the centre of that road to the Canal, thence along the centre of the Canal westward to the east boundary of the First Ward, then northward along the said boundary to the point first described. The conversion of the Canal into a Railway, and of the Canal basin into a Railway station, may have some effect on these boundaries not yet realised.

**THIRD WARD.**—All within a line drawn from the point where the Burn called St. Mirren's Burn enters the River Cart, up the centre of the River Cart until it reaches the extremity of the Parliamentary boundary of the Burgh at or near the junction of the Hawkhead Lade with the River Cart, thence along the Parliamentary line until it reaches the intersection of Espedair Burn at or near Haircraigs, thence along the east Boundary of First Ward till it reaches the Canal, thence along the centre of the Canal till it reaches the street leading from Canal street to the Canal basin, thence along that street till it reaches Canal street, thence eastward along Canal street to the bottom of Wardrop street, thence along Wardrop street to a point in George street at the north end of Wardrop street, thence by the south and west sides of George's Church to a point at the north end of the church opposite the south end of Shuttle street, thence along Shuttle street to the centre of New street, thence by the centre of New street till it reaches the centre of Causeyside, and from thence down Causeyside until it reaches the said burn called St. Mirren's Burn, and thence along the burn to the point first described.

**FOURTH WARD.**—All within the Parliamentary boundary to the west of the centre of the River Cart, which is not included in any of the preceding Wards.

**FIFTH WARD.**—All within the Parliamentary boundary of the Burgh situated on the east of the centre of the River Cart.

Committee Meetings to pass Plans of and sanction New Buildings, &c., held on the Friday evening immediately preceding each Monthly Meeting of Commissioners.

The Rates of Police Assessments for the year 1886-87 are—

**POLICE ASSESSMENTS.**—At 5½d. per £1 when rented or valued under £3; 8¼d. per £1 at £3 and under £5; and 11d. per £1 at £5 and upwards.

**ASSESSMENT IN LIEU OF PETTY CUSTOMS.**—At 2-16ths per £1 when rented or valued under £3; at 3-16ths per £1 at £3 and under £5; and 5-16ths per £1 at £5 and upwards.

The Assessment under the Public Health Act is 1d. per £ on Landlord and 1d. per £ on Tenant. When the fractional part of £1 of the assessable yearly rent or value of Lands or Premises does not amount to 10s., it is not assessed at all; and when such fractional part amounts to or exceeds 10s., it is assessed as £1.

The following Lands or Premises are assessed on one-fourth of their annual value entered in the Valuation Roll, viz.:

1. All Lands or Premises used exclusively as a Canal or Basin of a Canal, or Towing-path for the same, or as a Railway constructed under the powers of any Act of Parliament for public conveyance, excepting the Stations, Depots, and Buildings, which are assessable to the same extent as other Lands and Premises within the Police Bounds.

2. All the Underground Gas and Water Pipes or Underground Works of any Gas or Water Company.

3. All Woodland, Arable, Meadow, or Pasture Ground, or other Ground used for Agricultural purposes.

No Inland Letter must exceed 18 inches in length, 9 inches in breadth, and 6 inches in depth. Re-directed letters are liable to new rates of postage, but though the new postage should not be paid on the reposting the letter, it will, on delivery, be charged only the prepaid rate.

Newspapers for Foreign parts and Colonies, if posted later than 8 days after publication, are charged *book postage*.

## Parcels Post.

1. In order that a packet may go by Parcel Post, it must be tendered at a Post Office for transmission as a parcel. The words "Parcel Post" should be written or printed on the left-hand side, immediately above the address.

2. The Rates of Postage are, for a parcel—Not exceeding 1 lb. in weight, 3d.; every additional 1 lb., 1½d. *No Parcel can be sent exceeding 11 lbs. in weight.*

3. The dimensions allowed for an Inland Postal Parcel are—Greatest length, 3 ft. 6 in.; greatest length and girth combined, 6 ft. For example—A Parcel measuring 3 ft. 6 in. in length may measure as much as 2 ft. 6 in. in girth. A shorter Parcel may be thicker; thus, if it measure no more than 3 ft. in length, it may measure as much as 3 ft. in girth—*i.e.*, round its thickest part.

4. The full postage must be *prepaid*, by means of ordinary postage stamps, which must be affixed by the sender.

5. Parcels must not be posted in a letter-box, but must be handed over the counter of a Post Office to the proper officer, by whom the size, weight, and postage of each parcel will be tested before it is accepted. Any packet or parcel marked "Parcel Post," and posted contrary to this regulation, will, unless admissible and fully prepaid at the letter or book post rate, be charged on delivery with a fine of 1d. in addition to any deficient postage at the parcel rate.

*Prohibited Parcels.*

6. Parcels bearing or containing writing or marks of an offensive or indecent character; or containing gunpowder, cartridges, lucifer matches, or other combustible material, live animals, offensive or filthy matter, or any substance likely to cause injury to other parcels, or to the Officers of the Post Office, may not be sent through the post.

7. Parcels may not contain any letter or packet intended for delivery at an address other than than that borne by the parcel itself.

*Parcels requiring Special Precautions.*

8. Parcels containing ripe fruit or eggs, fish, meat, or other animal matter; or knives and other sharp instruments; can only be sent if so packed as to prevent all risk of injury to other parcels. Liquid matter must be sent in bottles, cases, or cans securely stoppered, and bottles and other glass articles must be so packed as to be secure from breakage.

*Parcels addressed to a Post Office to be called for.*

9. Parcels may be addressed to and obtained at Post Offices under the same regulations generally, as letters.

10. Parcels addressed to a Post Office to be called for will be kept (unless containing perishable articles) for three weeks. After they have remained in the office one clear day, they will be charged 1d. a day for demurrage until called for.

## INSURANCE AND COMPENSATION.

*This scheme of Insurance and Compensation does not apply to Foreign and Colonial parcels.*

11. The Postmaster General will (not in consequence of any legal liability, but voluntarily, and as an act of grace), subject to the rules hereinafter mentioned, give compensation for the loss and damage of inland parcels according to the following scale, *viz.*:—1. Where no fee except postage is paid, the Postmaster General will give compensation to an amount not exceeding £1. 2. Where in addition to the postage an insurance fee of 1d. is paid, the Postmaster General will give compensation to an amount not exceeding £5. 3. Where in addition to the postage an insurance fee of 2d. is paid, the Postmaster General will give compensation to an amount not exceeding £10.

In no case will a larger amount of compensation than £10 be paid. The compensation given in case of damage will be in proportion to that which would have been given had the parcel been lost.

No legal liability to give compensation in respect of any parcel will attach to the Postmaster General, either personally or in his official capacity, and whether or not an insurance fee has been paid. Accordingly, the decision of the Postmaster General as to all questions of compensation will be final.



**RULES AS TO INSURANCE AND COMPENSATION.**

*Posting and Packing of Parcels.*

1. The parcel must be posted in the manner prescribed for the posting of parcels by the regulations for the time being, and the postage must be prepaid.
2. Where no insurance fee is paid, but it is desired to secure compensation, a certificate of posting should be obtained from the officer receiving the parcel. This certificate must be filled up by the sender and handed to the officer of the Post Office, who will sign and return it to him. Forms of certificate can be obtained at any Post Office and from any rural postman.
3. In order to insure a parcel—(1.) The insurance fee must be prepaid. (2.) A certificate of posting, bearing thereon a receipt for the insurance fee, must be obtained on the prescribed form. This certificate must be filled up by the officer of the Post Office receiving the parcel. (3.) The insurance fee must be paid at a Post Office. Rural postmen and mail cart drivers have no power to give a receipt for such fee.
4. The contents of the parcel must be securely packed and enclosed in a reasonably strong case, wrapper, or cover, securely fastened, and of a nature calculated to preserve the contents from loss or damage in the Post.

*For exemptions and further particulars, see the Post Office Handbook and Post Office Guide.*

**Book Postage.**

Printed Books, Pamphlets, Magazines, Reviews, &c., whether British, Foreign, or Colonial, may be forwarded by post between places in the United Kingdom (made up in the same manner as newspapers), if prepaid in stamps, at the following rates:—

Under 2 oz.,  $\frac{1}{2}$ d.; under 4 oz., 1d.; under 8 oz., 2d.; and  $\frac{3}{4}$ d. for every additional 2 oz. No parcel to exceed 18 inches any way, but may contain any number of separate Books, Maps, or Prints, and any quantity of Paper, Vellum, or Parchment, and may be either printed, written, or plain.

Books, if prepaid in stamps, are also forwarded by packet, if unwritten on inside or in the cover, at the rate of  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. for every 2 oz., to Canada, United States of America, and the Continent.

**Registration.**

The British Registration Fee on every letter posted for delivery in the United Kingdom, or addressed to any British Colony or Foreign Country, is now 2d.

The same reduction has taken place in the fee chargeable on any newspaper or book packet, addressed to a British Colony or to the Kingdom of Italy, which the sender may desire to register.

**A** FRENCH Scientific Gentleman, who has directed his attention to the subject of Coffee Roasting, says:—I have found that Coffee is better roasted, and more of the aroma retained, when a double cylinder is used—the air between the interior and exterior cylinders acting as a non-conductor of heat. It is done more uniformly, while the essential oil on which the aroma depends is less liable to be dispersed than when exposed to the fierce heat of a fire in a single cylinder.

In the double rotary globular method of roasting, as practised at Messrs. MINTO'S Works, Græme Street, Glasgow, the above principle is acted upon, in as much as the globe (which has superseded the cylinder since the application of steam power to this branch) revolves in a medium of heated air, which experience has shown best prevents the dispersion of the essential oil aroma.
