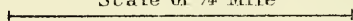

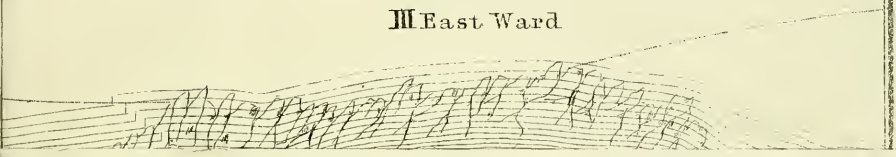
PLAN OF

Scale of $\frac{1}{4}$ Mile



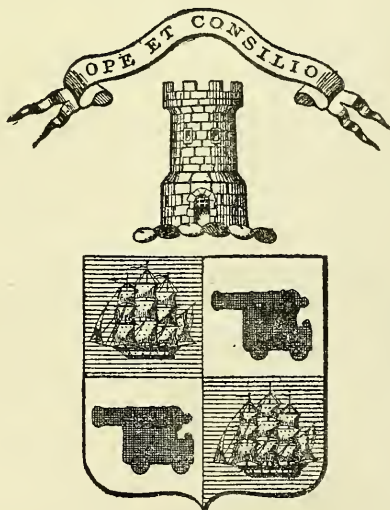
- I West Ward.

REGISTERED LETTERS.—Fee in addition to postage as above (both postage and fee must be prepaid) 2d.

N.B.—A payment of 2d additional insures to the value of £10.

BOOK PACKETS.—For every 2 oz. or part of that weight, ½d. Registration fee in addition to the postage, 2d. No Book Packet to be above 5 lbs in weight, or 1 foot 6 inches in length, 9 inches in width, and 1 foot in depth.

NEWSPAPERS.—For each Newspaper, ½d. No packet of Newspapers to be above 14 lbs in weight, 2 feet in length, 1 foot in width, and 1 foot in depth.

Newspaper Wrappers are sold at the following prices:—Bearing ½d stamp, 1, ¾d; 2, 1½d; 7, 4d; 14, 8d; and so on. Bearing 1d stamp, 1, 1½d; 2, 2½d, 8, 8½d; 16, 1s 5d; and so on.

POST CARDS.—With impressed ½d stamp, single, ¾d; Thin, 7d per dozen; Thick, 8d per dozen; Double, or Reply, 1½d.

N.B.—All Parcels not handed in at the Post Office are liable to a fine of 1d. in addition to any deficient postage.

INSURANCE AND COMPENSATION:—

I. Where no fee except postage is paid the Postmaster-General will give compensation to an amount not exceeding £1.

II. Where in addition to the postage an insurance fee of 1d. is paid, the Postmaster-General will give compensation to an amount not exceeding £5.

III. Where in addition to the postage an insurance fee of 2d. is paid, the Postmaster-General will give compensation to an amount not exceeding £10.

Telegraph Rates.

INLAND TELEGRAMS.—12 words, 6d.; every additional word, ½d. Every word telegraphed is charged for, whether in address or text. Figures count at the rate of five to a word.
