

on inside or in the cover, at the rate of 3d and 4d under 4 oz. to British

Colonies.

The British registration fee on every registered letter posted in the United Kingdom addressed to any British Colony or Foreign Country is now 4d.

The same reduction has taken place in the fee chargeable on any newspaper or book packet addressed to a British Colony or to the Kingdom of

Italy, which the senders may desire to register.

Registered letters, however, addressed to France, or to any Foreign Country, the correspondence of which is sent in the French mail, will continue chargeable with a registration fee of the same amount as the postage to which they are liable.
