

#### STAMP DUTIES.

INLAND BILL, DRAFT, or ORDER, after the 10th October, 1853, for the payment of any sum of money to the bearer, or to order on demand, 1d. And the following instruments shall be deemed and taken to be drafts or orders for the payments of money within the intent and meaning of this Act, and of any Act or Acts relating to the stamp duties on bills of exchange, drafts or orders, and shall be chargeable accordingly with the stamp duties imposed by this Act or any such Act or Acts, viz. —All documents or writings usually termed letters of credit; or whereby any person to whom any such document or writing is or is intended to be delivered or sent, shall be entitled or be intended to be entitled to have credit with or in account with, or to draw upon any other person for or to receive from such other person any sum of money therein mentioned.

EXEMPTIONS.—Any draft or order drawn by any banker upon any other banker, not payable to bearer, or to order, and used soley for the purpose of settling or clearing any account between said bankers. Any letter written by a banker to any other banker, directing the payment of any sum of money, the same not being payable to bearer or to order, and such letter not being sent or delivered to the person to whom payment is to be made, or to any person on his behalf.

INLAND BILL, DRAFT, or ORDER for the payment of any sum of money, though not made payable to the bearer or to order if the same shall be delivered to the payee, or some person on his or her behalf, the same duty as on a Bill of Exchange for the like sum payable to bearer or to order.

INLAND BILL, DRAFT or ORDER for the payment of any sum of money weekly, monthly, or at any other stated periods, if made payable to the bearer, or to order; or if delivered to the payee, or to some person on his or her behalf, where the total amount of the money thereby made payable shall be specified therein, or can be ascertained therefrom, or shall be indefinite, the same Daty as on a Bill payable to bearer or order on demand.

PROMISSORY NOTE for the payment of any sum of money by instalments, or for the payment of several sums of money at differdays or times, so that the whole of the money to be paid shall be definite and certain, the same duty as on a Promissory Note, payable otherwise than to the Bearer on demand, for a sum equal to the whole amount of the money to be paid.

The Duties will be the same whether the Bills be drawn in the United Kingdom or abroad.

The Rates remain unaltered in respect of sums not exceeding £100. But on Bills payable otherwise than on *Demand*, drawn for sums of £100 and upwards, the rate is one shilling for every £100 and for any fractional part of £100.

There is no separate duty on Bills drawn in sets: one Bill only of a Set need be stamped—the duty payable being that above mentioned.

FOREIGN BILLS OF EXCHANGE drawn in but payable out of the United Kingdom, when drawn single same as Inland Bill.

By act 17 and 18 Vict. cap. 80, it is enacted that a birth be registered within 21 days, a Marriage within 3 days, and a Death within 8 days respectively thereafter. It is usual, and saves considerable trouble to parties, to get a Death registered previous to interment. Penalties are eligible if the above rules are not complied with.

The number denotes the Registration District in which each Street is situated.

To avoid jostling in meeting, Passengers should observe the general rule—"Keep to the Right"—that is, to allow those you meet to pass on your teft hand.

# RATES OF POSTAGE AND CONDITIONS OF TRANSMISSION.

A letter exceeding the weight of 12 oz. is liable to a postage of 1d for every ounce, beginning with the first ounce. A letter, for example, weighing between 14 and 15 ounces must be prepaid fifteen-pence.

2. A letter posted unpaid is chargeable on delivery with double postage: and a letter posted insufficiently prepaid is chargea with double the deficiency. On re-directed letters the charge for re-direction is the same whether prepaid or collected on delivery (see paragraph 111).

3. No letter may exceed the dimensions of one foot six inches in

length, nine inches in width, and six inches in depth.

# Addresses to the Queen and Petitions to Parliament.

5. Petitions and addresses to Her Majesty, forwarded direct, are exempt from postage; and such petitions and addresses, as also petitions to either House of Parliament, if sent to a member of either House, are likewise exempt, provided they do not weigh more than two pounds, and are either without covers or are in covers open at the sides. No letter or other enclosure, however, must be inserted; and if one be found, such enclosure, unless it bear the proper number of postage stamps, will be charged as an unpaid letter.

# NEWSPAPERS.

# (I). Inland.

6. By the "Post Office Act, 1870," the use of the Inland Revenue impressed stamp denoting the stamp duty, under which Newspapers and other periodicals had been previously transmissible by post within the United Kingdom, was abolished, and a postage of one halfpenny was fixed for each transmission of any Newspaper coming within the definition laid down in the Act.

<sup>\*</sup> Inland Letters are those which pass between places in the United Kingdom, including the Isle of Man, the Orkney, Shetland, Scilly, and Channel Islands.

<sup>+</sup> If the weight be exceeded to the smallest extent, even though the balance be merely turned, the letter becomes liable to a higher postage. The same rule applies to letters going abroad. To provide, therefore, for errors in scales, &c., it is well to allow a little margin, or to pay the postage of the next greater weight.

Inland Newspapers are subject to the following regulations:-

1st. To have the privilege of passing as a Newspaper, the publication must first have been accepted as a Newspaper by the Postmaster-General, and have been placed on a Register at the General Post Office; † from which it is liable to be removed, either through the non-renewal of the registration year by year, or in consequence of any change which may deprive it of the characteristics of a Newspaper.

Registration for inland circulation includes registration

for transmission abroad.

2nd. It must be printed and published in the United Kingdom, must be published in numbers at intervals of not more than seven days, and must be printed on a sheet or sheets unstitched.

3rd. The full title and date of publication must be printed at the top of the first page, and the whole or part of the title and the date of publication at the top of every subsequent page; and this regulation applies to "Tables of Contents" and

"Tndices."

4th A Supplement must be unstitched, must in every case be published with the Newspaper, and must have the title and date of publication of the Newspaper printed at the top of every page; or, if it consist of engravings, prints, or lithographs,

at the top of every sheet or side.

5th. For each Newspaper whether posted singly or in a packet, the postage, when prepaid, is one halfpenny; but a packet containing two or more registered newspapers is not chargeable with a higher rate of postage than would be chargeable on a book packet of the same weight, viz., one halfpenny for every 2 oz. or fraction of 2 oz.

6th. A Newspaper posted unpaid, and a packet of newspapers posted either unpaid or insufficiently paid, will be treated as an unpaid or insufficiently paid book packet of the same weight.

7th. The postage must be prepaid either by an adhesive stamp or

by the use of a stamped wrapper.

Sth. No newspaper can be sent through the post a second time for the original postage, for each transmission a fresh postage must be pre-paid, except that in the case of re-direction the

amount chargeable may be collected on delivery.

9th. Every newspaper or packet of newspapers must be posted either without a cover or in a cover entirely open at both ends, and in such a manner as to admit of easy removal for examination. If this rule be infringed, the newspaper or packet will be treated as a letter.

10th. Every newspaper must be so folded as to admit of the title

being readily inspected.

11th. A newspaper whether posted singly or in a packet, which contains any enclosure except the supplement or supplements

<sup>\*</sup> The conditions of admission to the Register may be ascertained on application to the Secretary to the Post Office.

belonging to it, will be charged as a letter; unless the enclosure be such as might be sent at the Book Rate of Postage, and the entire packet be sufficiently prepaid as a Book Packet, in which case it may be allowed to pass.

12th. A newspaper which has any letter, or any communication of the nature of a letter, written in it or upon its cover, will be

charged as an unpaid or insufficiently paid letter.

13th. No packet of newspapers must exceed 14 lbs. in weight, nor may it exceed two feet in length or one foot in width or depth.

## III .- POSTAGE STAMPS.

17. Every Head Postmaster is required to keep, for sale to the public, a sufficient stock of halfpenny Post Cards, of the various postage labels in use, and of envelopes with the penny stamp embossed. The labels are of the respective values of  $\frac{1}{2}$ d,  $1\frac{1}{2}$ d, 2d, 3d, 4d, 6d, 9d, 10d, 1s, 2s, and 5s. Sub-postmasters are required to keep half-penny and penny labels, and halfpenny Post Cards only; but they can procure any stamps of other values, or embossed envelopes which may be required. The envelopes are made of four sizes, viz.,  $5\frac{1}{4}$  ins. by  $3\frac{3}{2}$  ins.,  $5\frac{1}{4}$  ins. by  $3\frac{3}{2}$  ins. They are sold at the following prices:—

Head Postmasters are also required to keep Newspaper Wrappers bearing an impressed halfpenny stamp, of three different sizes, and to sell them at the following prices:—

# PARLIAMENTARY PROCEEDINGS.

8. Printed Votes or Proceedings of the Imperial Parliament, sont without covers or in covers open at the ends, may circulate within the United Kingdom at the rate of one halfpenny for every 2 ez. or fraction of that weight.

The words "Parliamentary Proceedings" must be written or printed on the cover of the packet, otherwise it will be treated as

an ordinary Book Packet.

Prepayment, when the circulation is within the United Kingdom, is optional; and if it be made in part, the simple difference only will be charged.

Parliamentary Proceedings may be sent, under the Book Post privilege, to all the Colonies, and to those Foreign States between which and this country there is a book post (see Tables of Rates).

# BOOK POST .- (1.) Inland.

- 9. A Book-Packet may contain not only books, paper, or other substance in ordinary use for writing or printing, whether plain or written or printed upon (to the exclusion of any written letter or communication of the nature of a letter), Photographs, when not on glass or in frames containing glass or any like substance, and anything usually appertaining to such articles in the way of binding and mounting, or necessary for their safe transmission by post, but also Circulars, -i.e., letters which appear from internal evidence to be intended for transmission in identical terms to several persons, and the whole or the greater part of which is printed, engraved, or lithographed.
  - 1st. The postage is one halfpenny for every two ozs. or fraction of that weight.
  - 2nd. The postage must be prepaid either by adhesive stamps or by means of a stamped wrapper, or by a combination of the two; except at the Chief and District Post Offices and the Branch Offices at Lombard Street and Charing Cross in London, and at the Chief Offices in Edinburgh and Dublin, where, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., it may be prepaid in money, provided the postage amount to not less than 1 lb, in any one case, and provided the packets are posted in bundles each representing a postage of 5s.

3rd. A packet posted wholly unpaid will be charged with double the book-postage; and if posted partially prepaid, with

double the deficiency.

4th. Every book-packet must be posted either without a cover or in a cover entirely open at both ends, and in such a manner as to admit of the contents being easily withdrawn for examination: \* otherwise it will be treated as a letter.

5th. A book-packet may not contain any letter, or communication of the nature of a letter (whether separate or otherwise), not being a circular letter or not wholly printed, nor any enclosure sealed or in any way closed against inspection, nor any other enclosure not allowed by section 9. (Entries, however, merely stating who sends the book, &c., or to whom it is given, are not regarded as a letter.) If this rule be infringed, the entire packet will be charged as a letter. †

6. No book-packet may exceed 5 lbs. in weight, or one foot six inches in length, nine inches in width, and six inches in depth.

\* In order to secure the return of book-packets which eannot be delivered, the names and addresses of the senders should be printed or written outside, thus, "From - of -."

<sup>+</sup> It is the duty of Postmasters, whenever they have ground for suspecting an infringement of any of the above conditions, and occasionally, even when there is no ground for suspicion, to open and examine book packets posted at, or passing through, their office.

#### Post CARDS.

12. Post Cards, which bear a halfpenny impressed stamp, are available for transmission between places n the United Kingdom

only.

Ist. The front (or stamped side is intended for the address only. There must be nothing else written, printed, or otherwise impressed on it, nor must there be any writing or printing across the stamp. On the reverse side any communication, whether of the nature of a letter or otherwise, may be written or printed; but such communication must not extend to the front side. Nothing whatever may be attached; nor may the card be folded, cut, or otherwise altered. If any of these rules be infringed, the Card will be charged 1d on delivery.

2nd. No card other than one of those issued by the Government will pass under a halfpenny stamp, if it bear on it a written

communication of the nature of a letter.

# General Regulations.

13. When, owing to a great and unusual influx of letters, books, &c., the transmission or delivery of the letters would be delayed if the whole mail were dealt with without distinction, book packets and Post Cards may be kept back until the next despatch or de-

livery.

14. It is forbidden to forward by post any indecent or obscene print, painting, photograph, lithograph, engraving, book or card, or any other indecent or obscene article, or any letter, newspaper, publication, packet, or card having thereon any words, marks, or designs of an indecent, obscene, libellous, or grossly offensive character. Anything posted contrary to this prohibition will be stop-

ped and sent up to the Returned Letter Office, London.

15. Postmasters are instructed not to receive any letter which there is good reason to believe contains anything likely to injure the contents of the mail bag, or the person of any officer of the Post Office. If such a packet be posted without the Postmaster's knowledge, or if at any time before its despatch he should discover any such packet, he is directed not to forward it, but to report the case, with the address of the packet, to the Secretary. The following are examples of the articles referred to:

A glass bottle, or glass in any form; razors, seissors, needles, knives, forks, or other sharp instruments; leeches, game, fish, meat, fruit, or vegetables; bladders, or other vessels containing liquids; gunpowder, lucifer matches, or anything

which is explosive or liable to sudden combustion.

## MONEY ORDERS.

45. The public are recommended, when applying for Money Orders, to use printed "Application Forms," which save time, and afford greater security, than verbal messages, against mistakes. These Forms are supplied gratuitously at all Money Order offices.

# POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANKS.

49. Every Post Office Savings Bank, which is also a Money Order Office, is open for bank business during the same hours as

for Money Orders.

50. Deposits of One Shilling, or of any number of shillings, or of pounds and shillings, may be made by any person at the Post Office Savings Panks, provided that such depositor shall not make deposits amounting to more than 30l in any year ending the 31st December, or make any further deposit when the amount standing in his name exceeds 150l, exclusive of interest. When any Depositor's principal and interest amount together to 200l, all interest will cease so long as the balance of the account continues to amount to the said sum of 200l.

51. On making his first deposit, every person must give his Christian and surname, and state his occupation and residence, and must sign the following declaration, to be witnessed by the

<sup>\*</sup>Owing to the present low rate of Exchange between England and Germany the commission on money orders drawn upon Germany has temporarily increased by one third part.

Postmaster or by some person known to the Postmaster or by the Minister or a Churchwarden of the parish in which the Depositor dwells, or by a Justice of the Peace; and if such declaration or any part thereof shall not be true the Depositor making the same will forfeit all right to his deposits.

## GOVERNMENT INSURANCES AND ANNUITIES.

52. The Postmaster-General is empowered, under the Act 27 & 28 Victoriæ, cap. 43, to insure the lives of persons of either sex, between the ages of 16 and 60, for not less than 20/ or more than 100/. He is also empowered under the same Act to grant Immediate or Deferred Annuities of not more than 50/ on the lives of persons of either sex, and of the age of 10 years and upwards. The persons whose lives are insured, or to whom Annuities are granted, by the Postmaster-General, have direct Government security for the payment of the money, at the proper time. Full particulars as to Rates, &c., may be had at any Post Office.

Greenock Seamen's Friends' Society—Instituted 1820.—Archd. Adam, president; Andrew Carmichael, treasurer; John M'Ilvain, secretary; U. Walton, assistant secretary; with forty-eight directors; D. Brotchie, chaplain. Walter Sinclair, officer. This society has a chapel, seating 350, in which Divine service is conducted three times each Lord's day. The Greenock Academy, situated in Nelson Street, was opened in September, 1855, and is intended to provide a good general education for boys and girls. It contains twelve spacious and well-aired class-rooms, with teachers' room, &c., and a large hall in which all the pupils may be assembled; there is also an extensive play ground attached, with covered sheds for exercise in wet weather. The curriculum for the senior classes embraces a wide and varied course of study, extending over five years, and the arrangements are such as to allow a selection of classes to be made, suitable for those intending afterwards to pursue their studies at any of the Universities, as well as for those wishing to qualify themselves for the public service or for mercantile pursuits.

There are two Bursaries in connection with the Academy, the holders of which are entitled to attend all the ordinary classes gratis:—The Macfie Bursary, founded by the late Wm. Macfie, Esq., of Langhouse, which is competed for annually, and is open to boys from any school -5 boys. 2. The Fairrie Bursary, founded by the late Thomas Fairrie, Esq., Greenock. One boy is appointed each year by Mr Fairrie's Trustees—5 boys.

Regulations for the Macfie Bursary.—1. The Directors shall select annually, after competitive examination, one boy to be admitted to the Classical Department, and to be educated in all the accompanying branches. There shall be no appointment in place of Bursars who may be prevented from completing the curriculum.

2. The competition shall be open to boys not under eight nor above twelve years of age, from the Academy or any other school approved of by the Directors; and due advertisement shall be made accordingly.

3. A boy may be selected to enter in any year of the classical curriculum, according to the judgment of the examinators; the parents or guardians of the Bursar undertaking that he shall complete the curriculum. 4. An examination of the Bursars shall be made annually; and the Bursaries shall be continued only on proof being given of regular and satisfactory progress.

The Fairrie Bursary was founded by the late Thomas Fairrie, Esq., and he stipulated by his deed of settlement, that in return for the bequest made by him to the Academy, the Directors should present a gratis education to one boy of promise in each year of the Latin curriculum, along with the free enjoyment of all the accompanying classes, who should be recommended by his Trustees, and failing them, by the superintendent of the schools endowed by Mr Fairrie.

In addition to the ordinary class prizes, the following are competed for annually, at the close of the session:—I. The Stewart Gold Medal.—Open to Boys and Girls of the Third, Fourth and Fifth Years attending the Academy during the Session in which the medal is given—£5. Competitors may select any six of the following ten subjects (one at least being a language)—Mathematics, Arithmetic, Latin, Greek, French, German, English, Literature, and Analysis, English Grammar and Composition, History and Geography, Scripture Knowledge. 2. The Brown Society's Prize.—Open to Boys in the Classical Department during the Session—£10. 3. The Campbell Prize.—A Case of Mathematical Instruments to the best scholar in the Mathemetical Department—£5. Two prizes for Scripture Knowledge.—Open to all pupils of the fourth and fifth years.

Buchanan Bequest-By Codicil and Deed of Foundation, dated 4th December, 1862, Mr James Campbell Buchanan, of Bagatelle, Greenock, bequeathed £4000 in trust to his Trustees, viz :- Messrs John Graham, Peter M'Naughtan, Colin Lamont, jun., James Reid, Thomas Oliphant Hunter, and William Clark, in conjunction with Mr Alexander Rodger, the Provost of Greenock, the Sheriff-Substitute at Greenock, and the President of the Greenock Seamen's Friends' Society, all for the time being, along with two or more persons to be appointed by the Town Council and Police Board, for the purpose of founding "an Asylum in Greenock, to afford shelter during night to poor persons without a home, and to supply them with a nourishing meal on entering and on leaving the Asylum." In terms of the Codicil, the Town Council and Police Board appointed Trustees of the Asylum. A building is now erected in Captain Street, in which persons are accommodated according to the testator's wishes.

Scott Bequest—By will, dated 8th January, 1836, Mr Wm. ### PUBLIC STANDS.

1. Steamboat quay.

2. East end of Cathcart street.

3. Cathcart street, near Railway station.

4. Cathcart square.

5. West Burn street, north of Hamilton street.

#### FARES.

It shall be in the option of the hirer to engage any hackney carriage either by time or distance, provided this be done at the time of hiring.

#### FARES BY DISTANCE.

When a party, not exceeding four grown-up persons, with luggage not exceeding 56 lb. weight, enters a carriage at a stand, or when driving along disengaged, they shall be driven to any point within the places after referred to at the following rates, viz:—

#### SHILLING FARES.

From any of the public stands to any place within Cartsburn on the east, Roxburghisticet on the south, and Margaret street on the west.

#### ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE FARES.

From any of the public stands to any place within Ratho Street on the east, and Wellington Street on the south, and Martha Brae on the west.

#### TWO SHILLING FARES.

From any of the public stands to any place within Ladyburn on the east, Drumfrochar Road on the south, and Berryburn on the west.

#### GENERAL RATES OR FARES.

Where the point to or from which the carriage is driven shall be beyond the limits of the preceding special fares, the fare shall be regulated by the following table. The charge in the table shall include going from the nearest stance to the hirer's residence and waiting ten minutes, but if detained more than ten minutes, to receive sixpence for each additional ten minutes:—

When parties return (which they shall have the option of doing), and the fare going is one shilling, the carriage shall wait ten minutes without any charge for waiting; when one shilling and sixpence, fifteen minutes; when two shillings and upwards, twenty minutes. If the carriage be detained longer, a charge shall be allowed for waiting, at the rate of sixpence for every twenty minutes or part thereof, commencing at the period when the free waiting expires.

When a carriage is called but not used, a charge of sixpence shall be allowed, if the place to which it is called be under half a mile from the stance, and one shilling if beyond that.

#### FARES BY TIME, &c.

For shoping, making calls, and where the driver is not continuous, the charge shall be one shilling for the first half-hour, and sixpence for every additional quarter of an hour.

Whether the fares are by distance or by time the hirer pays

tolls.

If there be more than four grown-up persons driven, a charge of sixpence extra shall be made for each additional grown person, and a charge of sixpence for every two children above six years of age. No additional charge for one child above six or children under six.

4d per 56 lbs over the first 56 lbs may be charged for all luggage which requires to be put outside. The driver shall assist in loading and unloading in all cases when required, but shall not be bound to leave his carriage for the purpose.

From eleven o'clock at night till twelve o'clock midnight, fare and a half, and from twelve o'clock till six morning, double fare to

be eligible.

## FARES MAY BE WITHHELD.

Any party shall be entitled to withold pryment of fare-1st, When the name and number are not painted outside, or when there is no plate inside. 2d. When the reference ticket is not given on demand. 3d. When the bye-laws and table of fares are not shown on demand; and 4th, When an overcharge is made.

Drivers not to be entitled to any gratuity.

Driver to give hirer a reference ticket, and produce bye-laws and table of fares when demanded.

## TABLES OF RATES OR FARES TO BE EXACTED BY LICENSED BOATMEN AT THE PORT AND HARBOURS OF GREENOCK.

1st. Boat hire from any of the quays, piers, harbours, or the Esplanade, to any ship or vessel lying in the roadstead, between the Tail of the Bank buoy on the west, and Garvel Point on the east, said vessel not being at a greater distance than a mile and a half from the shore of Greenock between these two points :- If one passenger, 1s 6d; two passengers, 2s; every additional passenger, 6d.

2d. Boat hire from any of the above mentioned stations to any ship or vessel lying at the anchorage, termed the Tail of the Bank: -If one passenger, 2s; two passengers, 2s 6d; every additional

passenger, 6d.

3d. Boat hire from any of the above-mentioned stations to the powder anchorage ground :- If one passenger, 3s 6d; every ad-

ditional passenger, 6d.

4th. Boat hire from any of the above-mentioned stations to the hill of Ardmore, or Helensburgh, Kilcreggan, or point of Rosneath, or Row, or any other point on the opposite shore :- If one passenger, 5s; two passengers, 6s; three passengers, 7s; every

additional passenger, 6d.

5th. Boat hire from any of the above-mentioned stations to any ship or vessel lying in Gourock Bay :- If one passenger, 3s 6d; two passengers, 4s 6d; and every additional passenger, 6d. For these rates or fares the boatmen shall be obliged to wait 30 minutes, and bring back the passengers. If detained beyond 30 minutes, one shilling to be paid for each half-hour, or part of halfan-hour after the first.

The above rates or fares shall include luggage, if under one hundred weight; but all luggage above that amount shall be

charged for every additional cwt., 4d.

Vessels in harbour shifting passing lines, up to 300 tons, 7s 6d;

ships, 10s; if boatmen employed by time, 12s 6d per day,

For the above rates the boatmen shall be obliged to furnish four oars and men, when from the state of the weather this is required to enable them to make the passage; but when required to do so by the hirer himself, for expedition or otherwise, one-half fare to be paid in addition to the above rates. The harbour master to be sole judge in case of dispute between the boatmen and the hirer as to the state of the weather, and as to the necessity for four oars.

From a line drawn between the Cloch Light and Dunoon Pier to Port-Glasgow or any intermediate place, or from any intermediate place, or to any other intermediate place, one halfpenny per ton.

N.B.—The same chargeable for like distances outwards. Fractional tonnage to be charged and paid in proportion.

Two-thirds only of the above rates exigible in respect of vessels

towed by steam.

From Greenock, or off Greenock, to Garelochhead, including detention in swinging the vessel, one half penny per ton; and the same rate in returning; but no pilot will be obliged to pilot a vessel to the Garelochhead and back for a less sum than fifteen shillings each way.

For every day the pilot is kept on board after the compasses

are adjusted he shall be entitled to charge five shillings.

For piloting vessels up and down the Leven, to or from Dumbarton, the pilots shall not be entitled to charge more than four shillings in addition to the rate of piloting such vessels on the Clyde; and four shillings for each additional tide he may be detained after the first.

Any pilet, whether deep-sea or river, who may be detained at the request of the owners or persons in charge of the vessel, after his duties as pilot have been completed, shall (where not otherwise provided for in these regulations), in addition to receiving his provisions, be paid by the owner or person in charge of the vessel five shillings per day, and in like proportion for any lesser period he may be detained on board.






