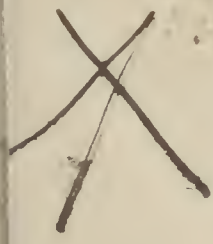

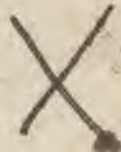

This book was the property of Mr David Cockburn in the year 1502, as appears from fol. 102. from whence we may conclude, that it was much more ancient than that period: From a comparison of the writing, this conjecture acquires additional strength. This copy of the Regiam Majestatem differs in many places from the printed copies; as it contains a number of things chiefly relating to history and chronology, which are not to be found in other copies. The latter part of this volume was written, as already mentioned, by a different and unknown hand. Although both these parts are now bound together, they made formerly two distinct volumes.
