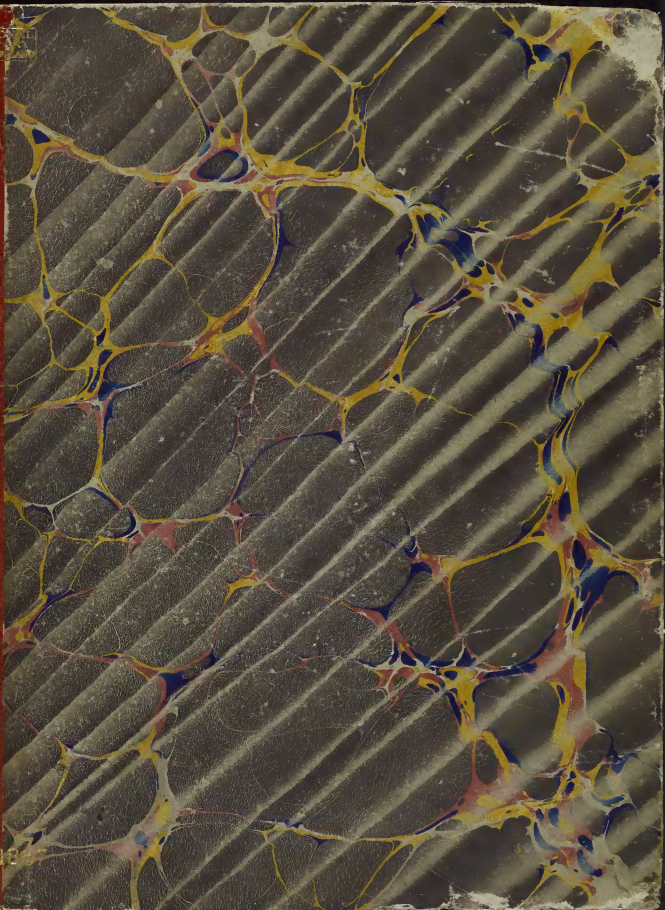

Medicina or Sprage Pudding

Two Eggs the weight of them in Flour

Tomato Sauce

Gather your tomatoes when quite ripe
& very dry, put them into an earthen
pan, & tie them down with brown paper
& put them into the oven after the
bread is drawn - Let them remain
all night then ^{peel} them through a

put half a pint of Chili Vinegar, a
little black cloves & long black pepper
& handful of beef suet & a stick of hennep

 yolks of six eggs beat them up, mix
all well together; put it in a mould
- Place the mould in a stew pan
with a little boiling water; let the
lid fit very tight & be careful not to
let any water get into the mould -
let it boil very gently for half an hour
on a slow fire or stove - Turn it
out of the mould while warm - then
cold pour hot currant jelly over it &

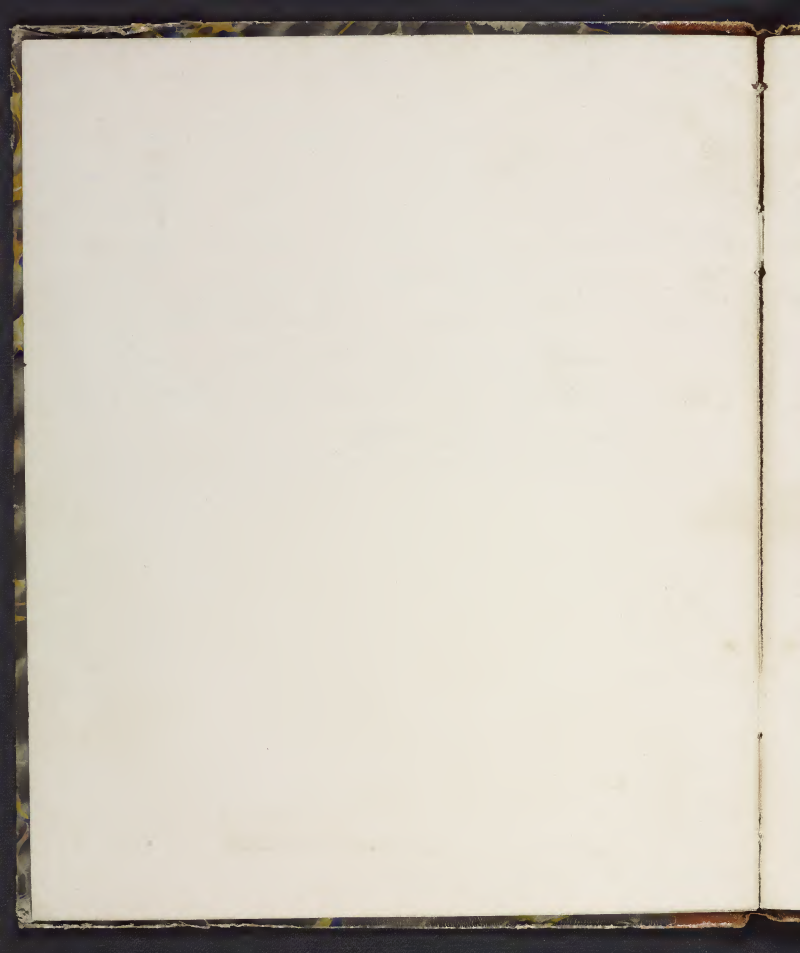

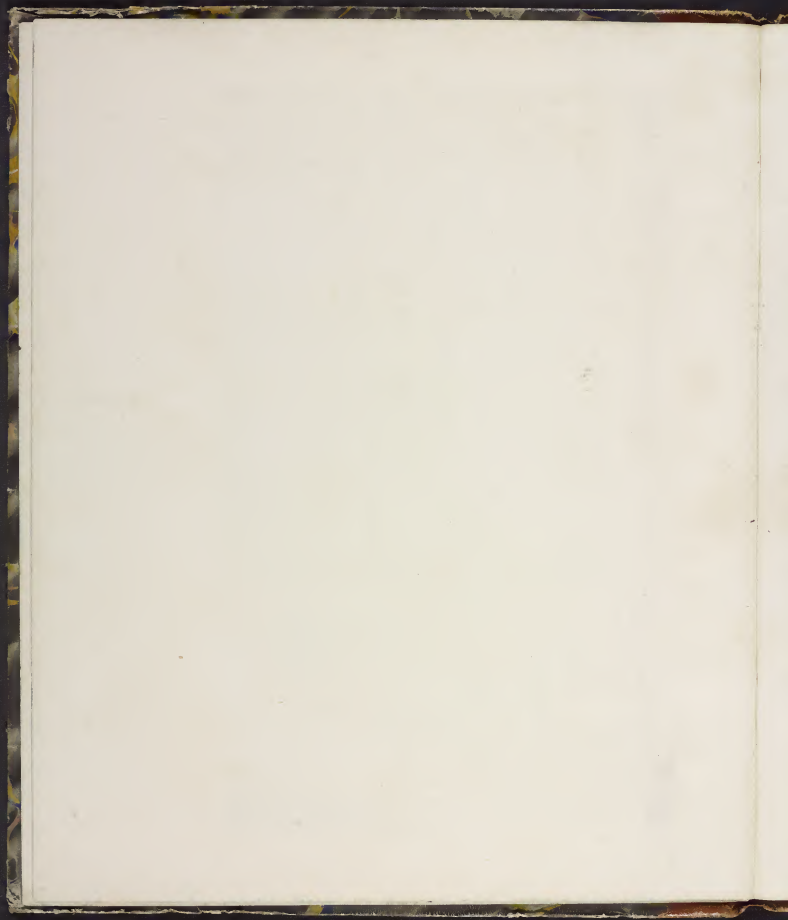

Toe putting Pleasants

A putting pot must first be prepared for each Pleasantry of an oval shape, either white or brown, following an inch above the Bird when in the pot. The reason ^{is that} why two Pleasants cannot be placed in the same time is that without they have both swelled at the same time the opening the pot to take out one, would let in the air, & spoil the other. You cannot seal your Birds too fast, too fast or too slow shot - You must keep them with the legs inside the bread, just as you would a fowl to broil, then make some force meats, or rather strange sorts meats, but you must not put any good herbs into it, only a little pepper, salt, & pounds of wine or adyve, & stuff the Birds with it - Then put the Birds into the pot, & setting care provisionally to shut the inside of them all round with thin slices of salt pork - Then go to breakfast Pork, & put a little red ochre powder, laying on the top of each bird two or three thin slices of fat Pork or Bacon, being to secure the Birds from burning, when in the Oven - The pans that prepare it, should be put into a slow Oven for about two hours, then take them ^{only 40 minutes} out ^{they} the next morning.



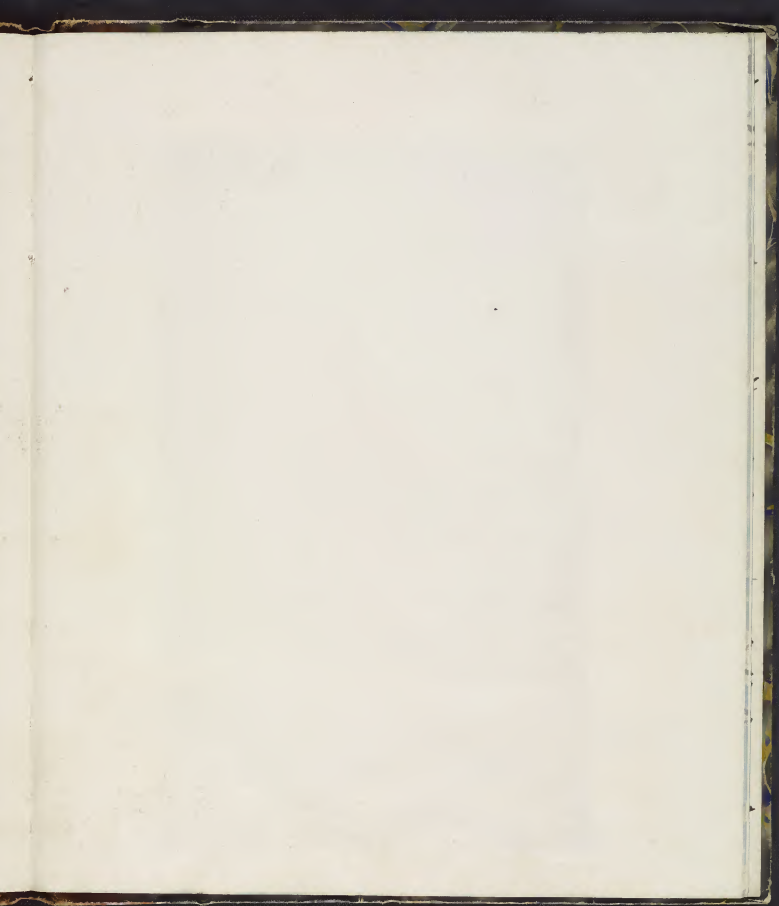
To make Bread without Yeast.

3 lbs of Flour; Half a pint of cold Water; $\frac{1}{2}$ an oz of Carbonate of Soda; 5 fluid Drachms of Hydro chlorid acid; a small quantity of Salt if required.

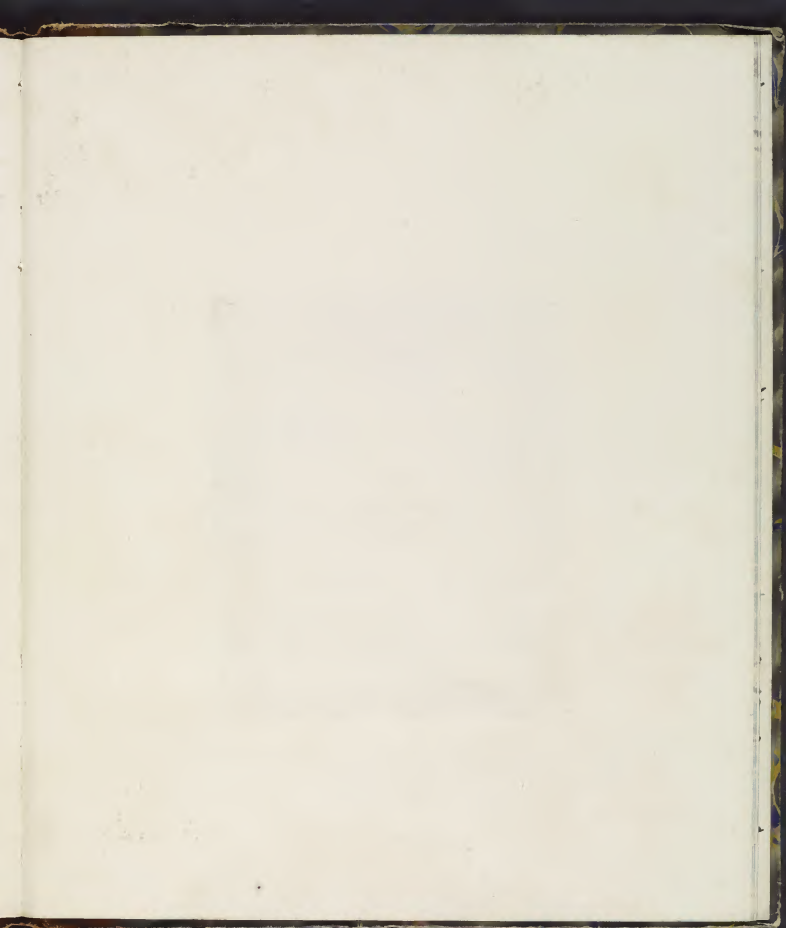
Mix the Soda well with the Flour, and the Acid with the Water, then the whole thoroughly & speedily together using a Wadded Spoon, in preference to the hand; it should be made into two loaves, & put into a quick Oven immediately; it will require about an hour & $\frac{1}{2}$ to bake: Observe, the Water should be as cold as possible, & this Bread requires a hotter Oven, and more time to bake than fermented Bread; the Acid must be put into the Water full twenty minutes before it is added to the Flour.
