# OBJECT, CONSTITUTION, AND RULES OF THE SOCIETY.

## OBJECT OF THE SOCIETY.

It shall be the object of this Society to assist the families and dependents of patients being bread-winners, to give clothing, travelling expenses, or other needful help to patients on leaving the Infirmary, to endeavour to procure work for them, and generally to befriend and be of use to them as far as possible. Patients in the Edinburgh City Fever Hospital, and in Chalmers Hospital, shall also be entitled to the benefits of the Society.

## CONSTITUTION.

The Samaritan Society shall be under the patronage of the Managers of the Infirmary, and the Membership shall consist of all those who contribute to its funds a Donation of not less than  $\mathcal{L}_{10}$ , or who give an Annual Subscription of not less than ten shillings.

## Rules.

I. The Office-bearers of the Society shall consist of the following gentlemen, viz.:—A President, two Vice-Presidents, and a Secretary; of a Treasurer, who may be either a lady or a gentleman; and of the following ladies, viz.:—A Convener, a Superintendent, and a Manager of the Clothing Department; also of a Committee of twelve ladies (preference being given to Ward Visitors), two of

whom shall retire annually, and not be eligible for re-election till they have been a year out of office. All vacancies in the Management shall be filled up at the Annual Meeting of the Society, to be held on the last Tuesday of *October* yearly, but *ad interim* appointments may be made by the Committee.

- II. The Committee shall meet once every week, except during the months of July, August and September—and for the present this meeting shall be fixed for Tuesday at four o'clock.
- III. The sanctioned Infirmary visitors, and the Medical and Surgical Officers, shall be entitled to recommend cases for the consideration of the Weekly Meeting of Committee. The President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, and one selected Member of Committee, shall be entitled to afford limited relief in urgent cases at any time, but a note of these cases, with relief granted, must be laid before the first meeting of Committee for information and approval.
- IV. The Secretary shall keep a record of the transactions of the Committee, and of the Society, the names of the persons relieved, the nature of the relief granted, and such other particulars as may be deemed desirable.
- V. The Funds of the Society shall not be applicable towards any general treat or festival.
- VI. An Auditor shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting, unless the Accounts have been previously audited, and the Accounts of the Treasurer shall be regularly examined by the Committee.

## TWENTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT.

HE Committee of the Samaritan Society have pleasure in presenting their Annual Report to subscribers and friends. The beneficent work of the Society goes steadily forward. For twenty-three years, needful bread-winners in the Royal Infirmary have received benefits from it for themselves, and for their families and dependents. For shorter periods needful patients in the City Fever Hospital and in Chalmers' Hospital have shared in these benefits. While the bread-winners are in these institutions those dependent upon them are helped by money or otherwise; and on their leaving they themselves receive aid in various ways. Some have their fares paid to take them to their homes or to friends. Very many have clothes given them, and generally they receive a donation to help them till they are quite able to work again, or till some work is found. The Committee endeavour to find work for them, and also to get further help for them and for their families, when that is necessary, from Parochial Boards or charitable societies, or other quarters. The Committee acknowledge with thanks their special obligation in this way to the Destitute Sick Society, the Strangers' Friend Society, the Night Asylum, the St Andrew's Ambulance Association, Longmore Hospital, Dunlop Cancer Fund, and to the different Convalescent Homes. Several patients have been sent to Consumptive Hospitals, and also to the Devonshire Hospital in Buxton, some subscribers' admission tickets

Thanks are also due to railway companies and to their servants for kind consideration and help to patients going to their destinations, and requiring more than usual care. In its general features the work of the Society has no great variety, but almost every case has a special interest of its own, and it is very gratifying to be able to state that the patients are very thankful for the help they receive; and, indeed, some of the letters received are exceedingly affecting. As has been done in former Reports, cases are given along with this Report shewing the different ways in which the Society distributes its benefits.

The Committee are very grateful for the amount of money placed at their disposal. They can assure subscribers that every care is taken by the Almoner and by the Members of Committee in distributing funds. They also thank very heartily the ladies who do not grudge time and trouble in gathering subscriptions. This year they have the pleasing duty of recording their thanks to two warm friends of the Society for the very handsome donation of  $f_{100}$ . They have also to acknowledge a legacy of  $f_{150}$ , bequeathed to the Society by the late Miss Margaret Tawse. They have still also a small Reserve Fund, though it is becoming smaller every year. They are thus enabled this year, as in some former years, to meet the deficiency which has again arisen on the ordinary account. But it would be much more satisfactory if the ordinary expenditure could be met from year to year by the ordinary income. Indeed, though the ordinary income were considerably larger than it is, the Committee could make use of it without feeling that they were giving a penny too much.

The Committee desire to record their thanks to the

Rev. Robert S. Simpson, of the High U.F. Church, for kindly preaching the annual sermon on behalf of the Society on the 24th of March. The collection amounted to £16, 2s. 6d.

They have also to thank ministers of different denominations, missionaries, and others for giving them information as to the character and circumstances of persons they have enquired about, and for helping them to distribute the benefits of the Society to the best advantage.

The number of patients who have received assistance, either directly or through their families from the Society during the past year was 329. The Almoner paid 1036 visits to the families of patients in Edinburgh, and 70 patients received allowances for themselves or their families in the country, by their ministers or other friends. 60 patients had their fares paid to take them to their homes.

The late Councillor Pollard was a good friend of the Society, and the following is the Minute of Committee in regard to his dcath—"The Chairman said they should not allow the intimation of the death of Judge Pollard to pass without expressing their sense of the great interest the late Councillor had taken in the work of the Samaritan Society, and the important services he had rendered it. As Convener of the Committee of Public Health, Mr Pollard had frequently spoken warmly of the interest shown, and help given, to the families of patients in the Fever Hospital, and on behalf of the Committee he had repeatedly given donations to the Society in acknowledgement of that help. He had also taken part in the proceedings at their public meetings, and, indeed, at their last Annual Meeting he had seconded the adopting of the Report. The Chairman concluded

by moving that they place on record this expression of their feelings, and also their sincere sympathy with the widow and family in this great bereavement, and that they request the Secretary to send this Excerpt of their Minutes to Mrs Pollard, which was unanimously agreed to."

The providing of clothing for patients is a very important part of the Society's work. A large sum has been expended during the year on material for clothing. Four thousand seven hundred and forty-six articles have been given away to about one thousand patients. The Committee beg to thank the friends who have helped in this work, especially the Ladies' Association, and the various work parties throughout the city who have sent generous gifts of made-up clothing to the Society. They also thank the many ladies who individually make up material supplied to them by the Society. There is at present great need of a supply of clothing, old and new, for men, women, and children, especially men's clothing, and little garments for children. It is not generally known that in the wards of the Infirmary many of the patients are children, some from very poor homes, and greatly in need of clothing. It must be remembered that the clothes of patients have often to be destroyed, and others need to be supplied. It is also very important that patients should be warmly clothed when they are discharged from any of the hospitals. hospitals.

### NOTES OF CASES FROM ALMONER'S BOOK

With an Account of what was done for them.

#### I .- Assistance in Money or Food.

- W. M'I—, Shepherd, came to the Infirmary suffering from internal cancer. His wife and eight children were living at the head of Glenquaich, the two eldest in farm service and earning a small wage; the youngest about a year old. The quarter's wages earned by M'I— would not be paid for three months, and his somewhat expensive journey to Edinburgh had left the family straitened in means. 36 a week for three months was sent for them to the care of their minister, and on M'I—'s death a donation of £1 was granted for the widow, who wrote her heartfelt thanks to the Society.
- Mrs C—, a young woman suffering from Bright's disease, was under treatment in the Infirmary for some weeks. Her husband had deserted her a year before, and she had overtaxed her strength in working as a charwoman to maintain her children, twins of 2 years old, and a baby of 8 months. 3/- weekly was allowed her for 9 weeks to supplement Parish relief.
- M. L—, Slipper-maker, a Jew, came to the Infirmary with pleurisy, and was far advanced in consumption. His wife and 5 children (ages 10, 5, 4, 2, 1) were destitute, and the baby was very ill. His wife's old mother and her sister lived with them and worked at slipper finishing. They were very respectable people. Rent £10. An allowance of 4/- a week was given them for 9 weeks, and a donation of £1 when L— went home, to buy material for his work as he had no money.

### Longmore Hospital.

D. B—, Fireman—wages 22/. Had not worked for 6 weeks, and had been 3 weeks in the Infirmary with malignant tumour in the throat, for which he had an operation. He was a widower with 4 children. His eldest daughter of 18 had come home from service to keep house for her father, and 2 brothers were at school. The family had been wholly dependent on the kindness of their fellow-villagers since the father's removal to Hospital. 4/- weekly was allowed them for 16 weeks. D. B— was admitted to the Longmore Hospital. His daughter takes in washing to maintain her brothers, from whom she will not part. In a few years one of the boys should be a great help. This girl writes to the Superintendent of the Samaritan Society—"I write to thank you for the money you gave to us through the kindness of Mrs S—, to whose care you sent it, and I sincerely thank you from the bottom of my heart, for it was a great help to us in the time of need."

J. F—, an old Soldier of excellent character—homeless and destitute. He was in the Infirmary for a long time with paralysis, and, on the application of the Samaritan Society, he was admitted to the Longmore Hospital.

#### II. - Fares.

- Mrs S —, a Widow, highly-respected in her home in the country, came to the Infirmary with rheumatism and weak spine. She had completely lost the power of her legs, but could use her hands to wheel herself about in a chair. She had one daughter of weak intellect, who was able under her mother's directions to serve in a little shop, which was their only means of support. The Samaritan Society gave Mrs S—, when she was discharged from the Infirmary, a wheeling chair, and paid her fare home; also the return fare of the nurse who took charge of her.
- J. M'S—, Labourer—wages £1 a week. In the Infirmary with sciatica, and had been laid up at home for a fortnight previously. Wife and 5 children unable to work. They were Roman Catholics, and were well known to their priest. 3/6 a week for 13 weeks was sent to the care of their priest, and 5/- paid for fare to send M'S—— home.
- W. M—, a Tramcar Conductor in Edinburgh—wages 22. In the Infirmary suffering from rheumatism. A subscriber's line for admission to the Devonshire Hospital, Baxton, was got for him, and his return fare was also paid. He was the only support of his old mother. At first he had 10/- a week from a society, which was reduced to 5/-, and finally stopped. 26 a week for 8 weeks was allowed by the Samaritan Society for M—'s mother. He improved very much under the treatment at Buxton.
- J. L—, a young woman dying of consumption. She was in the Infirmary for a considerable length of time, and as her father, a fisherman in Shetland, was unable to send money to take her home, the Samaritan Society paid her fare, and made every arrangement for her comfort on the voyage.
- M. R——, a Patient in the Infirmary, had a course of electrical baths in Ainslie Place, which she was enabled to get partly by the help of the Samaritan Society. The good which resulted was very considerable, and there is no reason to doubt the permanency of the improvement. The Samaritan Society paid 30/- for cab fares to bring her back from the baths, and gave her 3/- a week for 8 weeks.

### III.—Chalmers' Hospital.

S. M——, a Dressmaker, had come to Edinburgh from Canada, and had fallen into great poverty. She was suffering in health from anxiety and want, and was admitted into Chalmers' Hospital. The Samaritan Society provided her with a complete outfit of clothes, and by the interest of one of the ladies of the Committee, she was after a time received into the House of Refuge, where she remained for 6 months. She has since been able to start a little business for herself, and is most grateful to those who befriended her.

- J. B—, Mason, suffering from tubercular abscesses. 3/- a week was given to his destitute family for nearly a year while he was in Hospital, where he continued till his death.
- A. D—, Warehouseman, suffering from Bright's disease. In no society. His wife not strong, and 3 little children very delicate and suffering from hooping-cough; a baby had died 6 months before. Mrs D—— had 3/- a week for a room she let and 3/- from the Destitute Sick Society. 3/- a week was allowed her from the Samaritan Society and was continued for 7 weeks.

#### IV .- City Hospital.

- B. B—, a young man in hospital with enteric fever. Supported his mother and sister; Roman Catholics. Their priest gave a good report of the family. An allowance of 4/- a week from the Samaritan Society was continued for 8 weeks.
- A. M'K—, Painter, had not worked regularly for 5 months. Rent 4,-a week. Wife and 7 children; only the eldest girl able to work; carned 4/-. In Hospital with erysipelas; had been ill at home for a week and had got into debt, and was in no society. 8/- a week was allowed them by the Parish. The house was clean and tidy. 4/- weekly was continued for 18 weeks.
- J. M'D——, Tinsmith—wages 30/-. Had 8/- a week from a trade society, which was their only source of income. In Hospital with searlet fever; wife and 2 children. 3/- a week was given by the Samaritan Society and was continued for 6 weeks.

# OBJECT, CONSTITUTION, AND RULES OF THE SOCIETY.

# OBJECT OF THE SOCIETY.

It shall be the object of this Society to assist the families and dependents of patients being bread-winners, to give clothing, travelling expenses, or other needful help to patients on leaving the Infirmary, to endeavour to procure work for them, and generally to befriend and be of use to them as far as possible. Patients in the Edinburgh City Fever Hospital, and in Chalmers Hospital, shall also be entitled to the benefits of the Society.

# CONSTITUTION.

The Samaritan Society shall be under the patronage of the Managers of the Infirmary, and the Membership shall consist of all those who contribute to its funds a Donation of not less than  $\mathcal{L}_{10}$ , or who give an Annual Subscription of not less than ten shillings.

# Rules.

I. The Office-bearers of the Society shall consist of the following gentlemen, viz.:—A President, two Vice-Presidents, and a Secretary; of a Treasurer, who may be either a lady or a gentleman; and of the following ladies, viz.:—A Convener, a Superintendent, and a Manager of the Clothing Department; also of a Committee of twelve ladies (preference being given to Ward Visitors), two of

whom shall retire annually, and not be eligible for re-election till they have been a year out of office. All vacancies in the Management shall be filled up at the Annual Meeting of the Society, to be held on the last Tuesday of *October* yearly, but *ad interim* appointments may be made by the Committee.

- II. The Committee shall meet once every week, except during the months of July, August and September—and for the present this meeting shall be fixed for Tuesday at four o'clock.
- III. The sanctioned Infirmary visitors, and the Medical and Surgical Officers, shall be entitled to recommend cases for the consideration of the Weekly Meeting of Committee. The President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, and one selected Member of Committee, shall be entitled to afford limited relief in urgent cases at any time, but a note of these cases, with relief granted, must be laid before the first meeting of Committee for information and approval.
- IV. The Secretary shall keep a record of the transactions of the Committee, and of the Society, the names of the persons relieved, the nature of the relief granted, and such other particulars as may be deemed desirable.
- V. The Funds of the Society shall not be applicable towards any general treat or festival.
- VI. An Auditor shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting, unless the Accounts have been previously audited, and the Accounts of the Treasurer shall be regularly examined by the Committee.

# TWENTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT.

In bringing before the public their Twenty-Fourth Annual Report, the Committee would again urge the Society's claims and lay stress on its usefulness.

The first object of the Society is to alleviate, by assistance in money or food, the cases of need which so often arise when the person on whom a family depends for support is compelled to seek refuge in the Infirmary or in a hospital. Among the vast number of men and women in the wards of our hospitals there are many of the poorest classes, and many also who by long illness have been reduced to poverty. It is a severe aggravation of a patient's sufferings when he has to brood over the privations which wife and children endure in his absence. A small regular allowance from the Samaritan Society for those at home lifts a load of care from the sick man and assists his recovery. Even when provision has been made for a time of sickness (which is too rare among working people) the allowances from a Sick Fund or Provident Society are reduced after a few weeks and there is need for further help to keep the family from sinking into poverty. The Samaritan Society in the past year made payments to the families of 267 patients.

Every case is carefully inquired into. The Society's Almoner visits the homes of the patients (1314 visits were paid during the past year), and the Committee meets every

week to consider the reports and to decide on the best way of befriending the family. When the patient comes from a distance enquiries are also made and the allowance is sent to the parish minister, the priest, or some friend who is interested.

A glance at some of the cases from the Almoner's note-book, which are quoted at the end of this report, will best illustrate the variety of cases which come before the Committee, and the ways in which the Society meets the wants of each. Letters from ministers, missionaries, employers and others testify to the good work which the Society is doing, while the gratitude of patients is often touchingly expressed.

A further object of the Society is to pay the fares for sending patients to their homes, to Convalescent Homes, or to places where they are likely to obtain work.  $\mathcal{L}_{19}$ , is. id. has been expended during the year for this purpose. Patients come to the Infirmary from the North of England and from various parts of Scotland who tramp all the way to Edinburgh, but after a long illness, or it may be after an operation, are unable to return to their homes on foot. There are also patients whose friends, at much sacrifice, have collected the sum needed to send them to Edinburgh by train or steamer, but who are too poor to pay the return fare.

By no means the least important part of the Society's work is to give clothing to needy patients. Not seldom it happens that a patient's wearing apparel has to be destroyed. Still oftener the Society meets with cases in which a patient is about to leave the hospital with clothing which is not adequate for a person recovering from illness. Warm clothing is in many cases essential for successful

convalescence. In the past year 5,368 articles were in this way disposed of. The Staff-nurses of the Infirmary come every Wednesday morning to the Samaritan Society's room to get the clothes that are needed in their ward, and the disappointment is sharp if the lady in charge is unable to meet the demands.

It is not generally realised that there are children in the wards of the Infirmary, some of them from very poor homes and much in need of clothing. Garments, new and old, boots and shoes are much needed at present for men, women and children, more especially for men and children. Parcels should be sent to Miss Hansen, Samaritan Society's Room, Royal Infirmary, or on receipt of a post card, they will be called for.

The Committee express their thanks to friends who have helped them in the Clothing Department, especially to the Ladies' Association, to the various work-parties, and to the individual ladies who have made up material supplied to them by the Society. Miss Hansen will be glad to send garments, cut and ready to make up, to ladies who will undertake the work. £44, os. 5d. has been expended by the Society during the year on material for clothing.

The Committee has now indicated the scope and nature of the Society's operations, and it remains to review the position of the finances. The year's work has been conducted on the very small income of  $\pm 387$ , 17s. 9d. This sum shows a slight improvement on the figures of last year, and the Committee is very thankful for the money placed at its disposal, but the amount has not proved sufficient for carrying out the objects of the Society. The utmost care and economy are exercised in distributing the funds, but for the past five years there has been an annual

deficiency. The small Reserve Fund, which at the commencement of 1898 amounted to about £330, has been drawn upon—this year to the extent of £,90, the year before of £,54, and the year before that of £,97. If things continue as they are the Reserve Fund will cease to exist at the end of next year. This regularly recurring deficiency is due to an increase in expenditure. The item "Payments in Money and Food" is alone £84 larger than in 1897. The Committee can assure the Society that of extravagance there has been none. On the contrary, the relief has been restricted to the barest necessaries, as the extracts from the Almoner's note-book will show. The position which confronts the Society is simply this: Either to increase the Annual Subscriptions by about £,100, or else to instruct the Committee to reduce its expenditure. The Committee earnestly hope that the latter alternative will not have to be resorted to.

A severe loss has been sustained during the year in the death of the Hon. Mrs Montgomery, who since the foundation of the Society has been the Convener of the Committee, and of Mr John M. M'Candlish, one of the Vice-Presidents. The Committee has recorded its sorrow in its minutes; on this public occasion it desires only to express a tribute to the unflagging interest which the departed took in the Society's welfare and to the value of the services they rendered.

The Committee desire to record their thanks to the Rev. H. A. Thomas, M.A., who preached the annual sermon in St Peter's Church. The collection amounted to 38/6.

A donation of £10 has been received from the Committee of Public Health as an acknowledgment of the help given by the Society to the families of patients in the Fever Hospital.

The Committee acknowledge as in former years the hearty co-operation of all with whom, in an official capacity, they have been brought in contact—the Managers, Superintendents, and the Medical Staff and Nurses of the Royal Infirmary. The applications from the Samaritan Society's Committee have always received attention from heads of Institutions, Charities, &c. They also desire to express their appreciation of the kindness of friends who have given Subscribers' recommendations for hospitals and orders on the Cheap Coal Society. Subscribers' lines to the Devonshire Hospital, Buxton, and to the Hospital at Harrogate, are of the greatest use to rheumatic patients, several of whom have had their fares paid by the Samaritan Society.

#### NOTES OF CASES FROM ALMONER'S BOOK

With an Account of what was done for them.

I.—Assistance in Money or Food. Edinburgh Royal Infirmary.

- John A—, Apprentice Printer, age 19—wages 12/- a week—had been in the Infirmary for a month with Rheumatic Fever, when his case was hrought before the Samaritan Society. His old mother, a widow, was almost entirely dependent on him, and when his wages stopped, she had only 3/8 a week from a Yearly Society to which he helonged. John was greatly distressed that he could not work for her, and the allowance of 3/- a week for 8 weeks for her from the Samaritan Society was a great relief to his anxiety. A donation of £1 was granted when he went home.
- G. R—, died suddenly in the Infirmary of Cancer, leaving a widow and a family of 18 children—8 by a first marriage and 10 by the second. He was a Farm Servant—wages 18/- a week, with free house, potatoes, and meal. The ages of the children at home were 18, 15, 13, 11, 8, 7, 4, 3, 2, 1. After their father's death they were allowed to stay on in the house as the two eldest girls were working on the farm, earning 14/- between them. The mother received help from a Burial Society, hut after funeral expenses, &c., were paid, she had little over. A donation of £2, 6s. was granted her by the Samaritan Society, and clothes were provided for the younger children.

- Mrs C—, Charwoman, came from the country and had a Tumour removed in the Infirmary. Her hushand was alive, but was in consumption, and quite unable to work. Mrs C— maintained him and her 4 childreu. She cleaned a church, for which she got £6 a year, which paid the rent. She earned besides about 8/- a week, but while she was in the Infirmary there was nothing coming in, and the family was badly off. 3/6 a week for 12 weeks was allowed, and a donation when Mrs C— went home to supplement the help which their church gave them. A lady in the place where Mrs C—lived was asked hy the Samaritau Society to befriend this poor family, and showed them much kindness.
- M. M——, a Servant, who had been obliged to leave her situation to keep house for her old mother, who was bed-ridden. M—— went out charing and nursing. For 3 months she did her work during the day and sat up with a sick woman at night. Sometimes she could make as much as 15/- a week, hut her health broke down, and for 2 months she was unable to work. She was admitted to the Infirmary with Anæmia, and was then sent to a Home at Dunoon. Her mother had 5/- a week from the Parish, but her daughter paid 10/- a week for her board, while she herself was in Hospital. 2/6 a week for 3 weeks was allowed for M——; and when she returned home, permanent work was procured for her as a cleaner in the University.
- J. C——, Ticket Collector on the Railway—wages 29/—came to the Infirmary suffering from very bad Heart Disease. He had a wife and 4 children (ages 6, 4, 2 years, and an infant of 6 weeks old). He was at one time in a Railway Society, hut on account of illness had not heen ahle to keep up payment. All they had was a little they had saved. They were superior people with a comfortable home; rent £15, 9s. They were allowed 4/-a week for 20 weeks, and on the death of J. C——, a donation was given to his widow to help her to remove to Gateshead-on-Tyne, where she had friends. She was most grateful for the timely help.
- J. G.—, an Italian, a well known street Harpist, sometimes earned as much as 18/- a week. He was in the Infirmary for many weeks with Cancer, and at length went home to die. He had 5/- a week from the Parish, and his son, a lad of 19, earned 10/- weekly as an apprentice cahinetmaker. There was a younger hoy at school, and Mrs G.— kept the house beautifully clean and tidy, and attended her hushand with great devotion. They were respectable, well doing people, and most grateful for the kindness shown them by the Samaritan Society. 5/- a week was allowed them for 6 weeks.

#### II. - Fares.

A. M——, a Lahourer—wages 22/- a week—was in the Infirmary with severe Rheumatism; had a wife and 6 children, the youngest an infant of a few weeks old; the eldest a message boy; earned 5/- a week, and they had 5/- a week from a Yearly Society. The family received £2, 15s. in weekly allowances while M—— was in the Infirmary. His fare was paid to send him to the Devonshire Hospital, Buxton, where he was under treatment for 6 weeks, and when he returned he was very much better and able to go to work.

- E. H—, a Servant, came to the Infirmary with Heart Disease. She will never be able to work again. Her mother was a widow, and there were 7 at home; 2 girls worked in a factory; four boys were all doing a little work, and there was one boy at school. Donation of £1 was allowed to include fare to Kirkcaldy.
- W. M'F-, was in the Infirmary for 4 weeks in advanced Consumption. He had been long ill and had no money. As nothing could be done for him he was sent home. His fare was paid and a donation given him. He was a widower and had 3 children, 2 were in Quarrier's Home, and the 3rd was sent there when F- died. He was a remarkably interesting patient.

#### Chalmers' Hospital.

- W. D—, a Labourer in a Brewery—wages £1 a week—had been off work for 7 weeks with a poisoned hand. The firm by whom he was employed allowed 5/- a week, and the Destitute Sick Society 3/- a week for the family, consisting of wife and 4 young children. The Samaritan Society allowed 3/- a week for 12 weeks, when D—— was able to return to work.
- W. J—, an old man, a Labourer in Skin Works, who earned only irregular wages as he was not able for constant work. He was burnt about the face and hands while at work, but got no compensation. His wife, who was blind. was allowed 3/6 a week by the Samaritan Society while he was in Hospital, and a friend was found who helped the old couple.

### City Hospital.

- J. W—, a Hairdresser—wages 26/- a weck—was suffering from Enteric and was also consumptive. He was in the City Hospital for 3 months, and his wife and 2 daughters, 10 and 12 years of age, were in want. They had had a comfortable home (the rent of the house £13, 10s.) and were rather superior people, but he was in no society and had no source of income but his wages. Mrs W— obtained employment in an hotel for 6 weeks, when that was done, she had no means of subsistence. 4/- a week was allowed them for 7 weeks, and when W— died a donation was granted to help the family to remove to Glasgow, where Mrs W—— found work. She was very grateful for the timely help given her, and wrote her thanks—"I do not know," she said "what I could have done without the 4/- a week during my husband's illness."
- J. F—, a Mason, in Hospital with Scarlet Fever and Bronchitis. He had been out of work for 5 weeks before he was taken ill, and his wife and 1 child, an infant (who had infant paralysis) were in great poverty. Mrs F—— could have maintained herself and child as she had been a laundress, but she could not take washing as she had broken her leg some months before, and could not stand on it for any length of time. She was pawning her clothes and furniture for food. She received 3/- a week for 11 weeks from the Samaritan Society, and 5/- a week for 4 weeks after her husband went home. J. F—— and his wife were very deserving and most grateful.

- H. D——, Dock Labourer—wages uncertain; rent 2/- a week—died of Typhus after being 11 weeks in Hospital. The widow and 5 children had the fever; the eldest girl did not take it. A boy of 16 lost his work on account of infection, and when the family came home there was nothing coming in. They were immediately assisted by the Samaritan Society, and coals given them. A final donation was also granted them and sent to the care of their priest, they being Roman Catholics.
- G. B—, a Mason—wages 34/- a week—had not worked for 3 months on account of illness, and had been in St Ninian's Hospital for 6 weeks. He was removed from there to the City Hospital with Erysipelas, and died there. 2/6 a week was granted for 11 weeks to supplement an allowance from a sick fund, for his wife and 3 little children.
- J. M'G——, Cellarman—wages 24/- a week—was off work for a fortnight with Typhus. He was in no society and had no source of income. When his wife and 3-of the children were discharged from Hospital, she was still very weak, and expected to be confined immediately. 5/- a week was given her for a month, through her minister, who recommended her to the Samaritan Society as a hardworking and deserving woman.

#### III.—Clothing Given.

- T. C——, an old man, who had not worked for several years. He was in the Infirmary suffering from Heart Disease, and was provided with a complete outfit of warm clothes.
- A. B—, a Soldier, who had suffered in the late war from sleeping on the damp ground, and was incurably ill. Was given warm flannels and a warm coat.
- Mrs D—, a widow. In the Infirmary with Bronchitis; was taken as a Stair Maid in the Infirmary, and as she had no money, she got an outfit of clothes from the Samaritan Society.
- A. R—, a lad of 17. His mother, a soldier's widow, got a weekly allowance whilst R— was in the Infirmary. R— was given warm underclothing and a greatcoat, and some very much worn articles were given to Mrs R—, which she made into neat little garments for her 2 younger boys. An old pair of men's knicker-bockers made a nice little jacket.

# REPORT OF ANNUAL MEETING.

  - "That Miss A. S. Dundas be appointed to the office of Convenership of Committee, vacant by the lamented death of the Hon. Mrs Montgomery; that Miss Wallace be appointed Superintendent in place of Miss Dundas; that Mr F. A. Brown Douglas be appointed Vice-President in room of the late Mr M'Candlish; and that Mr J. Row Fogo be appointed Secretary in room of Mr Scott Moncrieff Penney, who has had to resign in consequence of non-residence in Edinburgh."
- IV. Moved by Mr MACONOCHIE, seconded by Mr PENNEY-
  - "That this Meeting thank the Committee and Office-Bearers for their past labours; appoint Lady Cheyne and Mrs Dundas Members of Committee; and re-appoint the other Office-Bearers."

A vote of thanks to the Chairman, moved by Dr Wallace and seconded by Colonel Sconce, was cordially carried, and the proceedings terminated after the Rev. Dr John Smith had pronounced the Benediction.

# OBJECT, CONSTITUTION, AND RULES OF THE SOCIETY.

#### OBJECT OF THE SOCIETY.

It shall be the object of this Society to assist the families and dependents of patients being bread-winners, to give clothing, travelling expenses, or other needful help to patients on leaving the Infirmary, to endeavour to procure work for them, and generally to befriend and be of use to them as far as possible. Patients in the Edinburgh City Fever Hospital, and in Chalmers Hospital, shall also be entitled to the benefits of the Society.

#### CONSTITUTION.

The Samaritan Society shall be under the patronage of the Managers of the Infirmary, and the Membership shall consist of all those who contribute to its funds a Donation of not less than  $\mathcal{L}_{10}$ , or who give an Annual Subscription of not less than ten shillings.

#### RULES.

I. The Office-bearers of the Society shall consist of the following gentlemen, viz.:—A President, two Vice-Presidents, and a Secretary; of a Treasurer, who may be either a lady or a gentleman; and of the following ladies, viz.:—A Convener, a Superintendent, and a Manager of the Clothing Department; also of a Committee of twelve ladies (preference being given to Ward Visitors), two of

whom shall retire annually, and not be eligible for re-election till they have been a year out of office. All vacancies in the Management shall be filled up at the Annual Meeting of the Society, to be held on the last Tuesday of *October* yearly, but *ad interim* appointments may be made by the Committee.

II. The Committee shall meet once every week, except during the months of July, August and September—and for the present this meeting shall be fixed for Tuesday at four o'clock.

III. The sanctioned Infirmary visitors, and the Medical and Surgical Officers, shall be entitled to recommend cases for the consideration of the Weekly Meeting of Committee. The President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, and one selected Member of Committee, shall be entitled to afford limited relief in urgent cases at any time, but a note of these cases, with relief granted, must be laid before the first meeting of Committee for information and approval.

IV. The Secretary shall keep a record of the transactions of the Committee, and of the Society, the names of the persons relieved, the nature of the relief granted, and such other particulars as may be deemed desirable.

V. The Funds of the Society shall not be applicable towards any general treat or festival.

VI. An Auditor shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting, unless the Accounts have been previously audited, and the Accounts of the Treasurer shall be regularly examined by the Committee.

#### TWENTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT.

In presenting their Report on the work done by the Samaritan Society during the past year, the Committee are able to record much useful activity; indeed, they believe that the Society's labours are indispensable. The charitable object of caring for the sick is only partially attained by the actual cure in hospital. To complete the good work it is necessary—if the patients are poor—to secure their dependents from destitution, and often to perform certain small services when they are discharged from the hospitals. In the three great hospitals with which this Society is specially connected, the Samaritan Society is the only means of providing this kind of help.

(1.) The first object of the Society is to give relief to families which are deserving, but destitute owing to the breadwinner being in hospital.

Such assistance is trebly beneficial. It is a blessing to children and dependents who are temporarily reduced to want; it frees the patient himself from mental suffering; moreover, by relieving him from immediate anxiety, it removes a serious obstacle to his recovery. Both doctors and nurses pay earnest tribute to the value of this work, as the following statements will shew:—

"I am sure that every one of my colleagues on the Staff of the Royal Infirmary will bear me out when I say that . . . . no one who has been closely connected with the active work of the Infirmary for

many years can possibly have failed to appreciate the inestimable value of the work which is done by the Society."—[Extract from letter by Mr Cotterill, Surgeon to the Royal Infirmary.]

"Our Nurses tell me that they do not know how they could get on without the Samaritan Society.

. We cannot speak too gratefully in appreciation of your excellent work without which ours must to some extent suffer."—[Extract from letter by Miss Spencer, Lady Superintendent of Nurses, Royal Infirmary.]

To illustrate the variety of cases which come before the Committee an account of selected cases from the Almoner's note-book is appended to the Report. The total of new cases assisted during the year was 265. In dealing with each individual instance the most scrupulous care is exercised. The Almoner visits the homes of the patients and reports to the Society's Committee, separately on each application. The Committee meets every week, to decide on the best means of befriending the family. If the patient comes from a distance inquiries are also made from the parish minister or other person likely to be able to give information as to the character of the applicant.

When a case has been accepted by the Society the assistance in money or food is distributed to the family in weekly allowances either personally by the Almoner, or by a clergyman, priest, or friend who is interested in the patient. The visits paid in the past year by the Almoner alone were 1263. After the lapse of four weeks the case comes again before the Committee and is re-considered, before the allowance is renewed. No precaution which long experience has suggested is omitted in guarding against expenditure on unworthy applicants.

(2.) The next principal object of the Society is to pay the fares, &c., for sending patients to their homes, or to Convalescent Homes.

Patients sometimes come to be treated in Edinburgh from remote parts of Scotland or from the North of England and find themselves unable to return—either from poverty or from physical inability to undergo the fatigue of tramping. A letter from one of the House Surgeons in the Royal Infirmary may be quoted as a typical instance:—

"I wish to recommend a patient whose name is \* \* \* to your charity. He has had an ununited fracture of the humerus and, as the result of walking here from Carlisle, has developed slight dropsy from over-taxing his heart. He wishes to go back there now. I have forbidden him to walk, and therefore hope you will be able to pay his train."

In the course of the year 69 train, steamer, &c., fares were paid by the Society.

(3.) A modest, but highly important part of the Society's work is to give Clothing to needy patients.

How useful assistance of this kind may prove will be gathered from the following extract from a letter from Col. Warburton, Superintendent of the Royal Infirmary:—

"Many (patients) are so insufficiently and badly clothed that if discharged in the same condition they must not only suffer from exposure but, owing to their appearance, find it next to impossible to obtain employment."

Every Wednesday morning the Staff Nurses of the Infirmary come to the Samaritan Society's Room to get the clothes needed in their ward, and it is always distressing if it proves impossible to meet the demands. The ladies in charge of this department would be most glad to receive a larger supply of clothing. Garments, new and old, boots and shoes are much needed, more especially for men and for children. 5315 articles were disposed of in the course of the year. Parcels should be sent to Miss Hansen, Samaritan Society's Room, Royal Infirmary, or on receipt of a post card, they will be called for.

The Committee express their thanks to friends who have helped them in the Clothing Department, especially to the Ladies' Association, to the various work-parties, and to the individual ladies who have made up material supplied to them by the Society. Miss Hansen will be glad to send garments, cut and ready to make up, to ladies who will undertake the work. £39, 3s. 7d. has been expended by the Society during the year on material for clothing.

A donation of £10 has been received from funds administered by the Committee of Public Health, as an acknowledgment of the help given to the families of patients in the City Hospital. The annual sermon was preached in Morningside Parish Church by the Rev. R. H. Fisher, B.D., and an offertory of £7, 4s. 7d., was handed to the Society. One-half of the proceeds of the collection on Christmas Day in St George's Parish Church, amounting to £9, 8s. 1d., was also received as a donation. Further, the Society was presented with £15 from the funds of the Edinburgh Southern Light Opera Company. For all these sums the Committee are very grateful.

The most welcome sum of £171, 128.9d., was presented to the Society, as the nett proceeds of an amateur dramatic performance given in the Lyceum Theatre on the 4th of March. The Committee desire to record their sincere

thanks to Miss Clouston and those associated with her for the great trouble they took, and for the extremely successful result of their efforts.

This large accession to its funds has relieved the Society from immediate embarrassment; but, in presenting this Report to the public, it cannot be concealed that the new income has been of an exceptional nature, while annual subscriptions still fall short of the sum requisite for carrying on the Society's work.

The Society finally acknowledges its continued indebtedness for the hearty co-operation of the Managers, Superintendents, Medical Staff and Nurses of the Royal Infirmary, and for the kindness of friends who have furnished subscribers' recommendations for hospitals and orders for the Cheap Coal Society. Subscribers' lines to the Devonshire Hospital, Buxton, and to the Hospital at Harrogate, are of the greatest use to rheumatic patients, several of whom have had their fares paid by the Samaritan Society.

#### NOTES OF CASES FROM ALMONER'S BOOK

With an Account of what was done for them.

I.—Assistance in Money or Food.
Edinburgh Royal Infirmary.

W. H—, a Labourer—wages £1 a week. He had been off work for 10 weeks, and eame to the Infirmary with an abseess on his spine. He had a wife and 6 children, the eldest 12½, the youngest 18 months old. They were in the Gardeners' Society, from which they got 10/- weekly. A very good account having been obtained of the family from their Minister, 4/- a week was allowed for 16 weeks and was given by him. They were very grateful for the assistance.

- M. B—, a middle-aged woman, a Net-maker, entirely dependent on her own efforts for her maintenance. Had phthisis, and owing to her bad health was in arrears with her rent. Her Minister wrote giving her an excellent character. A donation of 10/- was allowed to her by the Samaritan Society when she left the Convalescent House and went home.
- J. H—, a Crofter and Fisherman in Shetland. Had been off work for 6 months with sciatica and lumbago. He had a wife and 2 children, 10 and 8, and a father who was quite helpless and dependent on him. The rent was £3, 12s. A most favourable account was got of the family from their Minister, who added, "I scarcely know how this family will get along during his absence." The Samaritan Society allowed 2/6 a week for 12 weeks.
- W. B——, a Miner—wages 35/. Coal fell on him and broke his leg in four places, and it had to be amputated. He had a wife and 8 children, the eldest 17, the youngest 4. The two eldest were trying to find work, but at that time they had no source of income. The Samaritan Society allowed 3/- a week for 16 weeks. Their Minister wrote—"This is a most deserving family, and well worthy of relief. It is difficult to overestimate the case."
- J. P—— died a fortnight after coming to the Infirmary, leaving a widow and 6 young children. On inquiry it was found to be a very needy and deserving case, and the Samaritan Society granted £1 donation.
- Mrs M'A—, widow, who kept lodgers, but had to send them away, as she was ill. She came to the Infirmary suffering from her stomach. She had 4 children, a boy of 17, earning 13/-, and one of 14, earning 7/-. Two little ones were 10 and 4 years old. Her home was in the country, and she had to pay a niece to keep house in her absence. An allowance of 3/- a week was granted for 8 weeks.
- J. D—, a Brassfinisher's Labourer—wages 20/. Fell 30 feet while cleaning windows, which he was doing in order to earn a little extra money for rent, as work had been very scarce for months. He had a wife and 5 children. 12, 9. 7, and twins, 5 months. Rent £9, 10s. They were in no Society. 4/- a week for 8 weeks was allowed, and when the last instalment was given, Mrs D—, while thanking for the help she had received, said she did not know what she would have done without it.
- D. H—, a Coachman—wages 25/- a week, but had not been able for anything but light work for a year, and his savings were exhausted. He came to the Infirmary with phthisis. He had a wife and 6 children, the eldest 17, the youngest 2. Mrs H— went out cleaning for several hours during the day, sitting up at night to mend her children's clothes. The eldest, a boy, was in a situation in the country, earning 12/- a week, and he paid the rent. The girl of 14 kept the house and children, and both were very clean. They were allowed 4/- a week for 16 weeks.

- J. M'G——, a Mason—wages 30/- on the average. Had been off work for 7 weeks, when he came to the Infirmary with bronchitis and Bright's disease. Had a wife and 8 children. The cldest, a girl of 21, earned 9/6 and gave her mother 9/-. The next, a girl of 19, was in service. A boy of 15 earned 3/6. The ages of the others were 10, 8, 5, and 2½ years. They got 9/5½ from the Rechabites Society, but it was reduced to 5/- two weeks after he came to hospital. The rent was £13. They were Roman Catholics and their Priest gave them a very high character. The Samaritan Society granted 3/6 a week for 24 weeks.
- W. W—, a Clerk—wages 25/. Had been on the railway getting 30/-, but lost his situation through bad health. He came to the Infirmary with enlargement of the liver, spleen, and cystic tumour. He had a wife and 4 children, and the wife kept lodgers when she could get them. The family was helped for 6 months, getting 3/6 a week. W—— recovered sufficiently to go home, but returned to the Infirmary in 10 weeks. The family then received 4/- a week for 4 weeks, when he died, and a donation of £1 was allowed. Application by the Samaritan Society was previously made and granted for one of the children to get into Miss Mary Murray's Institution, Prestonpans.

#### City Hospital.

Mrs S—, a widow with 5 children. Her husband died of typhoid fever and Mrs S— and 4 of her children were also ill. Mrs S—'s mother kept the baby of 6 months old, and the Parish allowed 2/6 a week. The Samaritan Society granted 2/6 a week also.

#### Chalmers' Hospital.

- F. F—, a Coalman—Roman Catholic—wages 21/-. Had been off work 6 weeks with rheumatism. He had a wife and 3 children—4, 2, and a baby 7 months. The Samaritan Society gave 3/- a week for 12 weeks and a donation of 15/- when F—— went home. He was still unable for work when the last instalment was given. Both F—— and his wife warmly expressed their thanks for all that had been done for them.
- J. S —, a Coal Hoist Man with the Tramway Company—wages 26/-A fortnight off work, and came to the Infirmary with rheumatism; in no society; a wife and child 18 months old, and another expected. Mrs S —— cleaned an office, earning 9d. a day. 2/6 a week was granted for 4 weeks by the Samaritan Society, but at the end of that time the man died. A donation of £1 was given to the widow. Later on the baby was born, Mrs S —— receiving help from the Lying in Institution.

#### II .- Fares.

T. B —, a Brewery Worker—wages 25/-. He had been off work for 3 weeks, and came to the Infirmary with rheumatism. He was in no Society. Had a wife and 7 children. The eldest earned 9/-, but she lived with an aunt and could not help her mother. The next, a

girl of 17, earned 7/- in a laundry; the youngest was 8 months old. Rent £8, 15s. The Parish allowed 8/-, and on inquiry it was found that they were getting some help from their Church. The Samaritan Society gave nothing at that time, but later T. B—'s fare was paid to send him to Buxton for treatment, and subscribers' lines obtained for him to admit him to the Devonshire Hospital there for 6 weeks.

- Mrs M—, from Sutherlandshire, came to the Infirmary and had an operation. She was very poor, as her husband, who fished for lobsters, had had nothing to do owing to stormy weather. She had 1 boy, 13 years of age. Her fare was paid when she went home.
- M. C-, a Sailor, who came to the Infirmary with incipient phthisis. His fare was paid to Newcastle, where he went hoping to get a ship.
- D. G—, a Scaman, came to the Infirmary with rheumatism. He took ill in England, and some people collected some money and sent him to Edinburgh. He belonged to Lerwick, and had a wife and family depending on him. Through the influence of a Member of Committee a free passage home was procured for him.
- J. R—, a Shoemaker from Shetland. His Minister wrote recommending the case, and asking that his passage might be paid home. This was done. His ticket cost 10/6 and he got a donation of 9/6 in addition.

#### III. - Clothing Given.

- T. M'D——, 18 years of age, orphan; some months in the Infirmary with consumption, abscesses, and other complications. Application was made to get him into the Longmore, and he was admitted about six weeks or two months ago. Patients have to provide their own clothing, and he got a warm outfit from the Samaritan Room.
- Mrs L—, Laundry Worker—12/- a week—came into the Infirmary suffering from insufficient nutrition and general debility. She has to support her husband, who is unable to work, owing to bad health. Got a good outfit of warm clothes, and a little light work was found for her. Rent 2/2 a week; house very clean and tidy.

#### REPORT OF ANNUAL MEETING.

The Twenty-fifth Annual Meeting was held in the Edinburgh Café, 70 Princes Street, on Tuesday, 27th October 1903,—Sir James Balfour Paul in the Chair.

The Meeting was opened with Prayer by the Rev. J. Morgan.

The Chairman requested the Meeting to hold the Committee's Report as read, and thereupon

The following Resolutions were adopted:-

- I. Moved by the CHAIRMAN, seconded by the Rev. Dr WHYTE—
  "That the Report now read be approved, printed, and circulated."
- II. Moved by Canon ROWLAND ELLIS, seconded by Dr W. ALLAN JAMIESON—
  - "That this Meeting, recognising the value of the work done by the Society, earnestly urge upon the public the need there is for giving it further support by annual Subscriptions and contributions of Clothing."
  - III. Moved by Judge Brown, seconded by Dr JAMES RITCHIE-
    - "That this Meeting thank the Committee and Office-Bearers for their past labours; appoint Mrs Campbell and Mrs Warburton Members of Committee; and re-appoint the other Office-Bearers."
- IV. A vote of thanks to the Chairman, moved by Mr Scott Moncrieff Penney, and seconded by the Secretary, was cordially carried, and the proceedings terminated after Dr Gray had pronounced the Benediction.

# OBJECT, CONSTITUTION, AND RULES OF THE SOCIETY.

#### OBJECT OF THE SOCIETY.

It shall be the object of this Society to assist the families and dependents of patients being bread-winners, to give clothing, travelling expenses, or other needful help to patients on leaving the Infirmary, to endeavour to procure work for them, and generally to befriend and be of use to them as far as possible. Patients in the Edinburgh City Fever Hospital, and in Chalmers Hospital, shall also be entitled to the benefits of the Society.

#### Constitution.

The Samaritan Society shall be under the patronage of the Managers of the Infirmary, and the Membership shall consist of all those who contribute to its funds a Donation of not less than  $\pm 10$ , or who give an Annual Subscription of not less than ten shillings.

#### RULES.

I. The Office-bearers of the Society shall consist of the following gentlemen, viz.:—A President, two Vice-Presidents, and a Secretary; of a Treasurer, who may be either a lady or a gentleman; and of the following ladies, viz.:—A Convener, a Superintendent, and a Manager of the Clothing Department; also of a Committee of twelve ladies (preference being given to Ward Visitors), two of

whom shall retire annually, and not be eligible for re-election till they have been a year out of office. All vacancies in the Management shall be filled up at the Annual Meeting of the Society, to be held on the last Tuesday of *October* yearly, but *ad interim* appointments may be made by the Committee.

II. The Committee shall meet once every week, except during the months of July, August and September—and for the present this meeting shall be fixed for Tuesday at four o'clock.

III. The sanctioned Infirmary visitors, and the Medical and Surgical Officers, shall be entitled to recommend cases for the consideration of the Weekly Meeting of Committee. The President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, and one selected Member of Committee, shall be entitled to afford limited relief in urgent cases at any time, but a note of these cases, with relief granted, must be laid before the first meeting of Committee for information and approval.

IV. The Secretary shall keep a record of the transactions of the Committee, and of the Society, the names of the persons relieved, the nature of the relief granted, and such other particulars as may be deemed desirable.

V. The Funds of the Society shall not be applicable towards any general treat or festival.

VI. An Auditor shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting, unless the Accounts have been previously audited, and the Accounts of the Treasurer shall be regularly examined by the Committee.

#### TWENTY-SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The Committee presents its Report for the past year. It will be seen that the salient feature is the large increase in the number of cases which have urgently required assistance. On the other hand a reference to the Accounts shews that this access of new work has been unaccompanied by a corresponding increase of revenue. A deficiency has thus resulted on the year's operations, for which it has been necessary to encroach on the Reserve Fund. This fund now amounts to only £243, and it is therefore plain that the Society must face the necessity of reconsidering its financial basis.

Your Committee has earnestly debated this matter, and sees plainly that in coming years it will be necessary either to curtail expenditure, or to obtain new subscribers. In view of the acknowledged usefulness of the Society, your Committee sincerely hope that the alternative of restricting the work of relief will be put aside as impracticable.

(1.) The first object of the Society is to give relief to families which are deserving, but destitute owing to the breadwinner being in hospital.

It is hardly necessary to dwell on the good which a Society like this is able to do in such cases. The patient's family is relieved from want, and the sick person is given a better chance of recovery by being freed from anxiety for his dependents. But at the present day, when we hear so much of the dangers of indiscriminate charity, it is necessary to point out with the utmost clearness, that the most systematic care is exercised by the Committee in bestowing the Society's funds. Applications for relief do not for the most part come from the patients themselves, but from the nurses, from visitors in the wards, or from other people known to the Society. When an application is received, the Society's Almoner, who has had long experience in her work, visits the home and makes a report. At the same time the Superintendent applies for information regarding the character of the family to the clergyman, or to anyone to whom the patient is able to give a reference. These reports are considered separately at the Committee's weekly meetings. When a case is accepted the allowance in money or food is distributed once a week, either personally by the Almoner, or by some one interested in the family. Every four weeks the case comes again before the Committee before it is renewed. Donations are also paid by weekly instalments.

The new cases relieved in the past year have numbered 312. The visits to patient's homes, which have been paid by the Almoner alone, have numbered 1385.

(2) The next object of the Society is to pay the fares, etc., for sending patients to their homes, or to Convalescent Homes.

Patients sometimes come long distances to be treated in Edinburgh, and by expending of the comparatively small sum of £15, 2s. 2d., the Society has assisted the return of many poor people whose slender means were exhausted and insufficient for taking them back.

(3.) A modest but most important part of the Society's work is to give clothing to needy patients.

Every Wednesday morning the Staff Nurses of the Infirmary come to the Samaritan Society's Room to get the clothes needed in their ward. Garments, new and old, boots and shoes are much needed, more especially for men and for children. 5558 articles were disposed of in the course of the year. Parcels should be sent to Miss Hansen, Samaritan Society's Room, Royal Infirmary, or on receipt of a post card they will be called for.

The Committee expresses its thanks to friends who have helped in the Clothing Department, especially to the Ladies' Association, to the various workparties, and to the individual ladies who have made

up material supplied them by the Society. Miss Hansen will be glad to send garments, cut and ready to make up, to ladies who will undertake the work. £36, 17s. 6d. has been expended during the year on material for clothing.

The Annual Sermon was preached in the Grange Parish Church by the Rev. Lewis Davidson, of Mayfield U.F. Church. The offertory of £11, 2s. 6d. was handed to the Society. A donation of £10 was received from a fund administered by the Town Council's Committee of Public Health, as an acknowledgment of help given to families of patients in the City Hospitals. Other donations will be found detailed in the Accounts. For all these sums the Committee is very grateful.

The Committee finally acknowledges its continued indebtedness for the hearty co-operation of the Managers, Superintendents, Medical Staff, and Nurses of the Royal Infirmary, and for the kindness of friends who have furnished subscribers' recommendations to hospitals, and orders of the Cheap Coal Society.

#### NOTES OF CASES FROM ALMONER'S BOOK

With an Account of what was done for them.

#### I .- Assistance in Money or Food.

#### Edinburgh Royal Infirmary.

- R. F—, a Joiner. Had not worked for a month. He came to the Infirmary and had one of his legs amputated—the other leg had been amputated 8 years before—in consequence of an accident. He had a wife and a grandson of 19, who was out of work. The Samaritan Society, having received a satisfactory account of the family from their Minister, granted them a donation of £1, and gave the loan of a Wheeling Chair for R. F——, paying the carriage to Newton Stewart, where his home was.
- J. W—, a Fitter—wages 30/. Had been off work for 6 weeks with rheumatism. His family had been living on his savings during his illness, paying a rent of 7/6 a fortnight. He had a wife and four children—7, 5 and 3 years old, and a baby of 2 months. His Parish had paid his fare to send him to the Edinburgh Infirmary (the first parochial relief he had ever received). The Samaritan Society gave an allowance of 3/6, for 12 weeks, for his family, which was kindly paid to them in weekly instalments by their Doctor in the country.
- Mrs F—, a Dressmaker—came to the Infirmary suffering from influenza. She had a son of 16, an apprentice brassfinisher, earning 4/- a week. He paid 4d a night for lodgings, without food. He was admitted into the Boys' Industrial Brigade Home on the application of the Samaritan Society. Mrs F——had her fare paid when she left the Infirmary to send her to a neighbouring village, where she had got a situation.
- A. M—, a Seaman—wages 30/. Off work for several months with jaundice. He had a wife and 2 children, 2½ and 1 year old. They were in no Society. Rent £7. The wife's friends helped as far as they could, also their Minister from Church funds, but they were reluctant to ask for Parish relief. An excellent account was received of them from their Minister, and 3/- a week was allowed for 8 weeks. M—— returned home no better, and a donation of £1 was given; also an application was made to the Dunlop Cancer Fund for him, but he died about 10 days later of malignant disease. The Minister wrote afterwards, saying how grateful M—— had been for the kindness he received while in Edinburgh and since going home. He said these were almost his last words.

- R. W—, a Window Cleaner, on his own account; average earnings £1 a week. He fell while cleaning a window and broke both legs, and afterwards one of his feet was amputated. He had a wife who washed towels for a shop, earning 3/6 a week. They lived in a furnished room, for which they paid 4/6 a week. The Samaritan Society granted 3/- a week for 20 weeks.
- J. J—, a Miner—wages 25/ a week. He had been off work for 7 months. He came to the Infirmary where he was operated on for malignant disease. Had a wife and 3 children—6, 4, and 1 year. Was in a Society, but having failed to pay the subscription, was getting no benefit. He got a little help from his father-in-law, and his wife earned a little by washing for the miners, when she could. Rent 3/7 a month. A very satisfactory account of the family was obtained from their Minister, and the Samaritan Society granted 3/-a week for 4 weeks. J. J—— then went home, and a donation of 15/- was given, application also being made for him to be put on the Dunlop Cancer Fund. Fortunately, this was successful, and later, letters of grateful thanks were received from the Minister and from J. J—— himself, who said the money was a "Godsend."
- W. M—, a Butcher—wages 34/- a week. Off work for 7 weeks. Came to the Infirmary and died there from pernicious anæmia, leaving a widow and 3 children—12, 3, 1½. Rent £13, 6s. On inquiry this was found to be a most deserving case, and the Samaritan Society granted £1, 5s. donation, and made an application, which was successful, for the boy of 12 to be elected to the Heriot Hospital Foundation.
- A. F—, an Oilworker—wages 27/- a week. He came to the Infirmary with phlebitis. Had been off work for a month, during which time his savings had become exhausted. He had a wife and 5 children—9, 8, 7, 5 and 1½, and he had to help his mother. The Parish allowed 8/- a week. The rent was 3/2 a week. The Samaritau Society granted 4/- a week for 8 weeks.
- Mrs M'D—, a widow, from Skye. She had 3 children—14, 12, 7, and an old father, with whom they lived. The eldest was very delicate. She came to the Infirmary with nervous breakdown, owing to shock at hearing of her husband's death, 2 years before. They were getting 5/- from the Parish. The Samaritan Society granted 3/- a week for 12 weeks.
- 3. G—, a Labourer—Roman Catholic—wages 18/-. Off work for 8 weeks. He came to the Infirmary with rheumatism. He had a wife and 7 children—11, 9, 7, 5, 3, 2, and a baby a week old. The Parish allowed 12/- a week. The Samaritan Society granted 3/- a week for 8 weeks.

- Mrs M'S—, came to the Infirmary dying of phthisis. Her husband, a marine fireman, had just gone with his ship to the West Indies. They had 7 children—4 girls and 3 boys—11½, 10, 9, 7, 5, 3, and a baby 6 months. They were living with their grandmother, but she was not able to keep them all. Mrs M'S—— said she would like the 3 boys sent to Tranent Industrial School, as their father was Roman Catholic. An application was made, which was successful, and the boys were taken to Tranent by the Almoner of the Samaritan Society, and 5/- was given for fares and a little food.
- Mrs C——, a widow, crippled with rheumatism, but improving, had through a friend of the Samaritan Society, two orders given her for Devonshire Hospital, Buxton, which enabled her to be there for 6 weeks. The Samaritan Society also granted a donation of 10/. Mrs C—— wrote a most grateful letter from Buxton, telling how much she appreciated what had been done for her.

#### City Hospital.

- P. M'N—, a Labourer, Roman Catholic, wages £1. Off work for 9 weeks—6 weeks in Hospital; also his wife and 4 children. Rent £7, 10s. When they went home the man was unfit for work. The Samaritan Society granted £1 donation.
- R. B—, a Collector for Singer's Co.—had been in smallpox shed for about 3 months. He was greatly troubled about his wife and son, the latter being an imbecile and not able to work. The wife earned a little, but not enough to maintain them. The Samaritan Society granted 3/- a week for 16 weeks.
- J. M'M —, an old soldier—main support of his widowed mother. The rent was £10, which was shared by a married sister. He went to the Hospital with typhoid and died there. A donation of 15/- was granted by the Samaritan Society for his old mother, who was left almost destitute.

#### Chalmers' Hospital.

W. B—, a Cabman—wages 18/- a week. Off work for many weeks, having had a stroke of paralysis. Hc had a wife and 3 children. The eldest, a girl of 19, earned 7/- a week; a boy of 18, a cab-driver, was out of work. He used to give his mother 12/- a week. The youngest was 15, but being delicate, was unable to work. Mrs B—let one room, for which she got 3/- a week, but out of that she had to provide coal and gas. The Samaritan Society granted 3/- a week for 8 weeks.

#### II. - Fares.

B. M——, from Thurso, a Servant, 47 years of age. She came to the Infirmary with a tumour. Would not be able to work for months. Had no friends to help her, but was going to live with a married sister. Her fare was paid and a donation of £1 was given through her minister's wife, who had written that it was a most deserving case.

- M. H—, from Shetland, a very deserving woman, who was in the Infirmary for 3 months with spinal trouble. Her father and mother were both over 70 years of age. The Samaritan Society granted £1, 5s. donation, which was to include her fare, and she also got clothing, which she received with tears of gratitude.
- M. H—, an elderly woman, who did a little charing, had her fare of 2/6 paid and 10/ of a donation given to enable her to have a few comforts when she went home. The Doctor said she hadn't been very well fed.
- Mrs W-, from Orkney, with cancer, was allowed £1 donation to include fare to her home.
- C. A—, a Printer, wages 30/, off work for 6 months, came to the Infirmary with bronchitis and rheumatic pains. He said if he could get back to Middlesbro', where he had worked last, he thought he could get cmployment. The Samaritan Society allowed 15/ for his fare, which was paid through the Stranger's Aid Society.
- J. R—, a Boiler Attender, from Workington, wages 36/a week. Had been for 14 weeks in Workington Infirmary and then came to Edinburgh Infirmary. He was suffering from internal trouble. Had a a wife and 2 children—ages 15 and 12. They were living with a niece and had been selling their furniture so as to live. They had no source of income. The Samaritan Society granted 10/ for farefor which R—— was most grateful.

# OBJECT, CONSTITUTION, AND RULES OF THE SOCIETY.

#### OBJECT OF THE SOCIETY.

It shall be the object of this Society to assist the families and dependents of patients being bread-winners, to give clothing, travelling expenses, or other needful help to patients on leaving the Infirmary, to endeavour to procure work for them, and generally to befriend and be of use to them as far as possible. Patients in the Edinburgh City Fever Hospital, and in Chalmers Hospital, shall also be entitled to the benefits of the Society.

#### CONSTITUTION.

The Samaritan Society shall be under the patronage of the Managers of the Infirmary, and the Membership shall consist of all those who contribute to its funds a Donation of not less than  $\mathcal{L}_{10}$ , or who give an Annual Subscription of not less than ten shillings.

#### Rules.

I. The Office-bearers of the Society shall consist of the following gentlemen, viz.:—A President, two Vice-Presidents, and a Secretary; of a Treasurer, who may be either a lady or a gentleman; and of the following ladies, viz.:—A Convener, a Superintendent, and a Manager of the Clothing Department; also of a Committee of twelve ladies (preference being given to Ward Visitors), two of

whom shall retire annually, and not be eligible for re-election till they have been a year out of office. All vacancies in the Management shall be filled up at the Annual Meeting of the Society, to be held on the last Tuesday of *October* yearly, but *ad interim* appointments may be made by the Committee.

II. The Committee shall meet once every week, except during the months of July, August and September—and for the present this meeting shall be fixed for Tuesday at four o'clock.

III. The sanctioned Infirmary visitors, and the Medical and Surgical Officers, shall be entitled to recommend cases for the consideration of the Weekly Meeting of Committee. The President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, and one selected Member of Committee, shall be entitled to afford limited relief in urgent cases at any time, but a note of these cases, with relief granted, must be laid before the first meeting of Committee for information and approval.

IV. The Secretary shall keep a record of the transactions of the Committee, and of the Society, the names of the persons relieved, the nature of the relief granted, and such other particulars as may be deemed desirable.

V. The Funds of the Society shall not be applicable towards any general treat or festival.

VI. An Auditor shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting, unless the Accounts have been previously audited, and the Accounts of the Treasurer shall be regularly examined by the Committee.

## TWENTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

The Committee has much pleasure in presenting an exceedingly favourable Annual Report. Members know, considerable anxiety has been felt of late regarding the financial position of the Society. Since its foundation twenty-seven years ago the Society has relieved cases in numbers which have increased from 150 to 312, and though annual subscriptions have also increased, they have not kept pace with expenditure. A continuous series of deficits arose which latterly could not be estimated at less than £75 to £80 per annum, and the always slender Reserve Fund was consequently reduced to a dangerously low amount. Last year, therefore, extraordinary efforts were made to bring about an improvement, and thanks partly to the exertions of collectors, partly to a most munificent contribution from an outside source, the probable income has been brought up to a sum which next year will nearly cover expenditure.

The thanks of the Society are due in the first place to the collectors for the increase in annual subscriptions which amounts to about £40, a sum representing net gain, undiminished by any commission paid to hired employees. Everyone who has undertaken similar work knows how extremely hard it is to find people who are prepared to become new subscribers to a Charity. They will recognise that this £40 represents hard-earned money, and they will appreciate at their true value the services which

have secured it.

Even more gratifying is the contribution received from a Sale of Work organised on behalf of the Society by the Lady Superintendent of Nurses of the Royal Infirmary, assisted by the Staff of Nurses. This sale, and a supplementary sale, resulted in the Society being presented with £1000, apart from what may yet be obtained from some unsold articles still in hand. \* At special request of the donors the money will be treated as Capital, and invested. Considered merely financially this donation is eminently satisfactory, for although no income accrues from it in the present year, it may be expected that in future the deficiencies in the accounts, if there are any, will only be small. But the Committee regards the matter in a wider light The larger part of the Society's work is done for patients of the Royal Infirmary, and if that work is as useful as the Committee believes it to be, no one can know this better than the Nurses. That they should have come forward of their own accord, without any solicitation on the part of the Committee, and not only undertaken this Sale of Work, but devoted to it all the energy and enthusiasm which were necessary to make it such a splendid success, this proves the value they place on the Samaritan Society. Recognition from such a quarter is recognition indeed. Nor was the interest in the sale confined to the present members of the Staff. Nurses who had long left the Infirmary, and were scattered over the globe, readily lent their assistance when they heard that an appeal to support the Samaritan Society was being made, so that from every part of the world contributions have been collected. The Committee hopes that this magnificent testimonial in support of our Institution will appeal to the public, and induce it still further to increase the support extended to the Society.

Lack of space forbids that all the other kind donations received in the course of the year, particularly the contribution from the Tragic Comedians' Dramatic Club, should be specially referred to in this Report. They will be found detailed in the Accounts, and the Society tenders its sincere thanks for such timely contributions. Marked as has been the improvement in the financial position, the efforts of every friend of the Samaritan Society are still required to maintain what has been achieved, and to provide for the inevitable increase of future demands on our funds.

The work of the year has been carried on as usual, and presents few special features. The sum expended on relief of destitute families whose breadwinners have been in hospital is slightly smaller as regards the payments in money and in food, and the number of new cases, which stands at 305, is also somewhat less. That this has not been due to any real falling off in the calls on the Society is shown by the fact that the visits paid to patient's homes by the Almoner

have risen from 1385 to 1519.

It will be seen from the Accounts that the sum spent on providing material for clothing is larger this year, while the number of articles given to patients on leaving the Infirmary stands at 5808, as compared with 5558 for last year. The Committee takes this occasion of thanking the friends who have helped in the Clothing Department, especially the Ladies' Association, the various work-parties, and the individual ladies who have made up material supplied them by the Society. It also expresses its thanks for the many parcels of old clothes received during the year. The assistance which the Society is thus enabled to give to poor patients can hardly be exaggerated. Not only are warm clothes in some cases essential for successful convalescence, but

patients who have gone through a long illness are often so reduced in circumstances that they cannot provide themselves with such respectable clothing as would enable them to find work. The approach of the winter has very much depleted the Society's store of clothes, and fresh supplies are urgently needed. Parcels would be most thankfully received, and should be sent to "Miss Hansen, Samaritan Society's Room, Royal Infirmary," or on receipt of a post card they will be called for.

The Committee finally acknowledges its continued indebtedness for the hearty co-operation of the Managers, Superintendents, Medical Staff, and Nurses of the Royal Infirmary, and for the kindness of friends who have furnished subscribers' recommendations to hospitals, and orders for the Cheap Coal Society.

#### NOTES OF CASES FROM ALMONER'S BOOK

With an Account of what was done for them.

#### I .- Assistance in Money or Food.

#### Edinburgh Royal Infirmary.

- D. M—, a Cooper, 42 years of age—wages 30/- a week. Had been off work for 3 weeks with rheumatism. Had a wife and 8 children at home. The eldest, a young woman of 20, was unable to work on account of rheumatism. The next, a lad of 14, was learning to be a tailor, and earning 3/- a week. He was the only one of the family who was working. The youngest was two months old. They were freceiving 8/- from a trade society. Their rent was £7, 15s. An excellent account was received of them from their Minister, and 4/- a week was allowed them by the Samaritan Society for 4 weeks, and when D. M—— died a donation of £1 was granted for his widow.
- T. L—, a Metal Polisher—wages 26/-. Off work for 4 months with lung trouble. He was a widower with one child of 5 years old. His mother lived with him. His rent was £7, 10s. He was in two yearly societies, from each of which he received 4/-. He had nothing from the Parish. His mother was not strong; she had been in the Infirmary not long before, suffering from her heart. Her Minister wrote of her as being one of his oldest and most respected members and her case most deserving. The Samaritan Society granted her 2/6 for 8 weeks.
- Mrs M——, a Widow, had been in hospital for 6 weeks with a broken leg. She was a charwoman, and besides other work got regular employment at a school, for which she was paid 8/- a week. She had 3 children, the eldest boy a groom, but out of work; the next a girl of 11, and a boy of 6 years. The youngest was in the Sick Children's Hospital, but when he was discharged Mrs M—— had to lcave the Infirmary sooner than she would otherwise have done. Her rent was £6. Having received a good account of her from her Minister, the Samaritan Society granted 15/- donation.
- Mrs W—, a Widow, a Charwoman, earning 10/- a week for some regular work at the University. Had been off work for a fortnight coming to the Infirmary with pleurisy. She had 6 children, the eldest living in lodgings to be near her work. The next, a girl of 17, earning 5/-, and a boy of 14 earning 4/-. They had no other source of income. On inquiry this was found to be a most deserving case, and the Samaritan Society granted 3/- a week for 12 weeks.

- A. C——, a Blacksmith—average wage 35/-. Had been off work for 3 weeks with Bright's disease. He had a wife (who was ill with influenza) and 7 children, the eldest 13 and the youngest 2 years old. They were in no society. They had been in two, but owing to illness had been unable to pay and so ran out of benefit. They had no source of income, but the neighbours were kind to them. The rent was £14. An allowance of 4/-a week was granted for 4 weeks while A. C—— was in the Infirmary and a donation of £1 was given when he went home, as he was still far from strong. Some clothes were also given him. Mrs C—— wrote later—"My husband desires me to thank you all on his behalf. He says he cannot think enough of your kindness. We were strangers, yet you were kind and charitable to us with your good work. The help I have got from the Society has done much for me. I just got it when I needed it most, and it helped me over my difficulties. If ever I am able to give any little aid towards the Society I will not forget my duty."
- W. W—, a House Painter—wages 35/—fell from a window, while cleaning it, and fractured his leg. He had a wife and 7 children. A boy of 18 and one of 15 earned 6/- each. They had no other source of income. The other children were 12, 10, 8, 5 and 2 years old. A sum of 1/4 was paid weekly to a funeral society. The rent was £12. The Samaritan Society only heard of this case shortly before W. W— went home, but as he was still unable to work, a donation of £1 was granted.
- W. G——, worked on the railway—wages 21/-. He was in the Infirmary for 4 weeks with pneumonia and then went to the Convalescent House. He had a wife and 7 children. The eldest, a girl of 13, carried milk, for which she got 3/- a week; the youngest was 2 months old. They paid 5d. a week to a railway society, and they received from it 8/6 weekly. They had no other source of income. Their Minister recommended them as most deserving, and the Samaritan Society granted 5/- a week for 4 weeks and £1 donation when W. G—— went home, as he was still far from strong.
- P. C——, a Labourer—wages £1. Came to Infirmary with swelling in one of his legs. He had been off work for 8 weeks. He had a wife, and 2 children aged 5 and 2 years. They had 3/- a week from D.S.S., their only means of support, as they were in no benefit society. 3/- a week was allowed them by the Samaritan Society for 8 weeks.
- G. C.—, a Miner—earning 30/- a week—came to the Infirmary with Bright's disease. He had been ill at home for 10 weeks. He had a wife and 6 children. None of them were old enough to work. The Parish allowed 10/- a week. They had no other source of income. Their Priest having given a good account of them an allowance of 4/- a week for 8 weeks was sent to him for them.
- J. M——, a Carter—wages 25/- a week—was operated on for appendicitis. He had a wife and 5 young children. They were in

- no society. Their rent was £10. Mrs M—— had applied for Parish relief, but was not in receipt of any at that time. The Samaritan Society granted 4/- weekly for 8 weeks.
- D. G.—, a Labourer—wages £1. Had been off work for 7 weeks, and came to the Infirmary with hernia. He had a wife and 4 children—11, 7, 4 and 2 years old. They were in no society, but the Parish allowed them 8/- a week. Their rent was 3/-. The house was clean and tidy, and the children looked well cared for . 4/- a week was allowed from the Samaritan Society, and continued for 8 weeks.

#### Chalmers' Hospital.

J. A—— (22), an Apprentice Printer—wages 16/-. Off work for a week when he went into Hospital with rheumatism. He was his widowed mother's only support. Mrs A——, a most deserving old woman. received 1/- a week from the Old Woman's Society. 2/6 a week for 12 weeks was allowed her by the Samaritan Society while J. A—— was in Hospital, and after he went home a donation of 15/-was granted as he was not quite able for work.

#### City Hospital.

- W. B—, a Lorryman—wages 23/. Off work for 3 weeks. Was taken to the City Hospital, and died there a week later of typhoid fever. He was the only support of his widowed mother. Rent £9, 5s. In no society. Having heard on inquiry that Mrs B— was a thoroughly respectable woman and well deserving of help, the Samaritan Society granted £1 donation.
- C. R—, a Dairyman—wages 21/-. He had been off work for a week when he went into the City Hospital with diphtheria. He had a wife, and 1 child 5 months old. In no society, and nothing from the Parish. Rent £9. Having been out of work for a considerable time during the winter he had not been able to lay up much against sickness, and his wife had practically nothing to fall back upon. An allowance of 3/- a week for 4 weeks was granted, and continued for 8 weeks.
- T. G—, a Labourer—wages £1. Off work for 5 weeks. Is in City Hospital with typhoid fever. He has a wife, and two children 5 and 3 years old. In no society. The Parish allows 6/-, and the D.S.S. gives 3/- a week. Rent £5, 10/-. Mrs G—— being in a delicate state of health cannot work. The Samaritan Society granted 3/6 a week for 4 weeks. This case is still going on.

#### II. - Fares.

M. B—, a Servant, had been 5 weeks in the Infirmary suffering from her eyes. She is nearly blind. She had no home, but a cousin in Carlisle was willing to take her to live with her. The Samaritan Society granted 15/- donation to include her fare to Carlisle.

- A. Y—, a Labourer—wages 25/- a week. Had rheumatic fever. He had a wife and 5 children, the eldest 10 the youngest 1 year. In no society; the Parish allowed 5/-a week, The rent was 2/9 a week. Mrs Y—— did charing when she could get it. The Samaritan Society gave the family 4/- a week for 20 weeks, and when A. Y—— left the Infirmary his fare was paid to Saltcoats, where he went for further treatment.
- J. E—, a Hawker. The Samaritan Society was asked to pay his fare to Newcastle. He was able to go by boat, which cost 4/-. 2/- was also given for food and 5/- for a hawker's licence, for all of which the man was very grateful.
- J. J—had been in the Infirmary for five months suffering from his heart. Part of his fare to Manchester was asked for. Two ladies had given him 15/-. The Samaritan Society granted 12/-1 to supplement their gift.

#### REPORT OF ANNUAL MEETING.

The Meeting was opened with Prayer by the Rev. J. Mackenzie Gibson.



# OBJECT, CONSTITUTION, AND RULES OF THE SOCIETY.

#### OBJECT OF THE SOCIETY.

It shall be the object of this Society to assist the families and dependents of patients being bread-winners, to give clothing, travelling expenses, or other needful help to patients on leaving the Infirmary, to endeavour to procure work for them, and generally to befriend and be of use to them as far as possible. Patients in the Edinburgh City Fever Hospital, and in Chalmers Hospital, shall also be entitled to the benefits of the Society.

#### Constitution.

The Samaritan Society shall be under the patronage of the Managers of the Infirmary, and the Membership shall consist of all those who contribute to its funds a Donation of not less than  $\pounds$ 10, or who give an Annual Subscription of not less than ten shillings.

#### Rules.

I. The Office-bearers of the Society shall consist of the following gentlemen, viz.:—A President, two Vice-Presidents, and a Secretary; of a Treasurer, who may be either a lady or a gentleman; and of the following ladies, viz.:—A Convener, a Superintendent, and a Manager of the Clothing Department; also of a Committee of twelve ladies (preference being given to Ward Visitors), two of

whom shall retire annually, and not be eligible for re-election till they have been a year out of office. All vacancies in the Management shall be filled up at the Annual Meeting of the Society, to be held on the last Tuesday of *October* yearly, but *ad interim* appointments may be made by the Committee.

II. The Committee shall meet once every week, except during the months of July, August and September—and for the present this meeting shall be fixed for Tuesday at four o'clock.

III. The sanctioned Infirmary visitors, and the Medical and Surgical Officers, shall be entitled to recommend cases for the consideration of the Weekly Meeting of Committee. The President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, and one selected Member of Committee, shall be entitled to afford limited relief in urgent cases at any time, but a note of these cases, with relief granted, must be laid before the first meeting of Committee for information and approval.

IV. The Secretary shall keep a record of the transactions of the Committee, and of the Society, the names of the persons relieved, the nature of the relief granted, and such other particulars as may be deemed desirable.

V. The Funds of the Society shall not be applicable towards any general treat or festival.

VI. An Auditor shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting, unless the Accounts have been previously audited, and the Accounts of the Treasurer shall be regularly examined by the Committee.

# TWENTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT

The Report which the Committee presents this year shews the same record of useful work in alleviating the distress caused in poor families by ill-health and accidents, and also, unfortunately, the same inadequacy of income to meet expenditure to which all recent Reports have had to draw attention.

I. The assistance given in money and food to dependents of breadwinners whom sickness has for the time deprived of the power of supporting their families, called for an expenditure of £386, 2s. 6d. As the new cases relieved in the course of the year numbered 281, this gives approximately an average expenditure per family of £1, 7s. 6d., and although this is somewhat larger than the sum that was given last year, it is not easy to see how it could be substantially reduced. A reference to the cases extracted from the Almoner's Book, which are appended to this Report, shews that the Society can hardly be accused of excessive liberality. All

allowances have, as usual, been given weekly, and the visits paid by the Almoner in this connection numbered 1469.

II. The sum spent on material for making into clothing was £56, 11s., which is about £13 more than last year, owing to the fact that fewer gifts of left-off clothes have been received. In this department, also, reduction is not well possible. The clothing given to needy patients on leaving the Infirmary assists their recovery and, further, by helping them to look respectable makes it easier for them to obtain work. The expenditure of a comparatively small sum, together with gifts of clothing received, enabled the Committee to distribute 5627 garments in the course of the year. The thanks of the Society are due to the friends who have helped in the Clothing Department, especially the Ladies' Association, the various work-parties, and the ladies who have made up clothing supplied them by the Society. Parcels of old clothes will be most thankfully received, and should be sent to "Miss Hansen, Samaritan Society's Room, Royal Infirmary," or on receipt of a post card, directed to the same address, they will be called for. The Society's store is very much deplenished.

III. Railway and other fares paid for patients

returning to their homes, &c., required an outlay of £16, 11s. The Committee believes that this sum represents well spent money.

As the result of the year's transactions the Treasurer reports a deficiency on Ordinary Account of £89, 7s. 9d., about £45 more than the deficit of last year. This short-coming arises through increased expenditure: for revenue has remained the same, the additional income due to interest on the Nurses Fund being counter-balanced by a falling off in Donations. Fortunately the Reserve Fund, like the widow's cruse of oil, still holds out and supplies the annual deficit without becoming appreciably more or less, but the Committee must point out that the sums by which this small fund is periodically replenished are of the nature of wind-falls, and that the financial position of the Society is precarious until income is made to balance expenditure more approximately than it does at present.

The Annual Sermon was preached in West St Giles Parish Church, and the offertory of £9, 10s. was handed to the Society. The handsome contribution of £20 was sent by the Southern Light Opera Company, and a donation of £10 was received from a fund administered by the Town Council's Committee of Public Health as an acknowledgment of help given

to families of patients in the City Hospital. Other donations will be found detailed in the Accounts. For all these sums the Committee is very grateful.

The Committee finally acknowledges its continued indebtedness for the hearty co-operation of the Managers, Superintendent, Medical Staff, and Nurses of the Royal Infirmary, and for the kindness of friends who have furnished subscribers' recommendations to hospitals, and orders on the Cheap Coal Society.

#### NOTES OF CASES FROM ALMONER'S BOOK

With an Account of what was done for them.

#### I .- Assistance in Money or Food.

#### Edinburgh Royal Infirmary.

- J. C—— worked at the pit head—wages 3/- a day. He was suffering from an abscess, and had not been able to work for a month before his admission to the Infirmary. He had a wife and 6 children. The eldest, a girl of 16, earned 5/- a week. A hoy of 13 earned 1/6 by carrying milk in the morning. The ages of the other children were 11, 8, 2, and a baby of 9 months old. The Parish allowed them 5/- a week. The rent was 2/- weekly. The case was recommended to the Samaritan Society, and a grant of 4/- a week for 4 weeks was given them, and a donation of £1 when J. C—— went home.
- A. R—, a Labourer—wages 22/-. Came to the Infirmary with rheumatism. He had been off work for several months. His wife and 3 children at home were hadly off. The eldest, a girl of 15, had bad heart disease, but did her hest to look after the house. The mother was unable to work as she was paralysed. They had 5/-a week from the Destitute Sick Society and 3/- from each of two lodgers. The rent was £6, 10/-. Their Minister recommended the case, and the Samaritan Society allowed them 3/-a week for 4 weeks and a donation of 12/- when A. R—— was discharged from the Infirmary.
- Mrs B—, a widow—a Charwoman—had not worked for 18 months because of her bad health. She came to the Infirmary with heart and kidney trouble. She had 4 children. The eldest, a hoy, had heen out of work for a long time; the next, a hoy of 14, earned 5/- a week; a girl of 16 was earning ahout 9/-, but had to leave her work to take care of the youngest child, who had been discharged from the Infirmary, incurable, a fortnight hefore. The rent was £10, 9/-. The Samaritan Society granted 4/- a week, which was continued for 8 weeks. The case was a very deserving one, and Mrs B—— was most grateful for the help she received.
- D. M'B—, a Tailor—wages uncertain. He had been off work for several months and in the Infirmary with abscesses a good part of that time. He left the Infirmary and went to his sister's house to die. The sister, who was elderly and not very strong, made her living by keeping lodgers, but she had none at that time. The rent was £12. The Samaritan Society granted £1 donation.

- T. O—, a Picture Frame Maker. His wages when working full time were 32/-, but he seldom was able to make so much. He had not worked for a fortnight when he came to the Infirmary with bleeding from the lungs. His wife had been confined 6 weeks before and had been very ill since. Besides the new-born baby, there were 4 children, the eldest 11 years old and the youngest only 15 months. Their only source of income was 10/- from a Society. The rent was £18. Their Minister wrote that they were in every way most respectable and worthy of help. He said, "They greatly ueed help, but only a week or two ago I could not get them to accept money from me." The Samaritan Society allowed them 4/- a week for 4 weeks and a donation of £1 when T. O—— went home.
- J. K——, a Miner—wages 30/- to £2. Off work for 5 months and in the Infirmary for 3 weeks with paralysis. He had a wife and 8 children. The two eldest were girls, 18 and 15 years of age respectively. They each carned 8/- a week. Their Priest having given a good account of them, an allowance of 4/- a week for 8 weeks was sent to him for them.

#### Chalmers' Hospital.

A. M—— was in Chalmers' Hospital for 5 months with a bad knee. She had to go home as her bed was required. Her doctor ordered nourishing food, but her mother being a widow with 6 children, could not afford to give it her. The Samaritan Society granted her a donation of 10/-.

#### City Hospital.

- J. G——, a Labourer—wages £1. He had been off work for 5 weeks and during 3 weeks of that time he was in the City Hospital with typhoid fever. He had a wife and 2 children, 5 and 3 years old. They were in no Society. The Parish allowed 6/-, and the Destitute Sick Society gave 3/- a week. The rent was £5, 10/-. The Samaritan Society granted 3/6 a week for 4 weeks. This was continued for 8 weeks, and when J. G—— went home, as he was not able for work, a douation of £1 was given.
- J. T—, a Miner—wages 5/- a day, but he only worked for 3 or 4 days a week. He had been off work for 3 weeks when he was taken to the City Hospital with typhoid fever. He had a wife and 5 children—their ages from 9 years old to 15 months. The rent was £6. The Samaritan Society granted 4/- a week for 4 weeks, which was continued for 3 months. Mrs T. thanked the Society through her Minister "for its generous help in her hour of need."
- C. R—, a Painters' Labourer—wages 18/-. He had been off work for 3 weeks when he went to the City Hospital with enteric. He had a wife and 1 child. Mrs R— was in delicate health and quite unable to work. C. R—'s mother did what she could to help them, but that was very little, otherwise they had no source of income. The rent was £4, 15/-. The Samaritan Society allowed 2/6 a week for 12 weeks.

J. G——, an Italian, working in marble. Was in the City Hospital with diphtheria. He had been a long time without work, but just before his illness he had got into a good situation. He had a wife and 3 children. They were so young that Mrs G—— could not go out even to try to find work. A grant of 2/6 a week was made and continued for 16 weeks.


#### II .- Fares.

- S. H—— was in the Infirmary for over 2 mouths suffering from shock to the nerves caused by an accident some time before. He had 12/- a week compensation, but he had an invalid mother and sister depending on him. A donation of £1 was allowed, to include his fare, to send him home to Frizington.
- H. P—, a girl 13 years of age. She had been in the Infirmary for some months with tumour on the neck. She was going home, but was to return to the Hospital later for further treatment. The Samaritan Society granted her a donation of 15/- for her fare to Middlesborough.
- Mrs B— was going home to Cockermouth. She was not able to travel alone, but another patient, who happened to be going to Carlisle, took her with her. The Samaritan Society paid 10/ for her fare.
- C. M'D—, from Stornoway, had been in the Infirmary for 9 weeks with nervous trouble. Her sisters in the north, who had a little croft, were quite willing to receive her, but she had no money to take her home. The Samaritan Society granted £1, 10/-.
- A. B—, a Norwegian Sailor. Had been in the Infirmary for some months, and was returning home to Norway, but as he was still very unwell he was going first to the hospital at Christiansand. Through the kindness of the Norwegian Consul and the authorities of the hospital at Christiansand, his fare had been paid, but he was absolutely penniless. The Samaritan Society allowed him 10/-.



# OBJECT, CONSTITUTION, AND RULES OF THE SOCIETY.

#### OBJECT OF THE SOCIETY.

It shall be the object of this Society to assist the families and dependents of patients being bread-winners, to give clothing, travelling expenses, or other needful help to patients on leaving the Infirmary, to endeavour to procure work for them, and generally to befriend and be of use to them as far as possible. Patients in the Edinburgh City Fever Hospital, and in Chalmers Hospital, shall also be entitled to the benefits of the Society.

#### CONSTITUTION.

The Samaritan Society shall be under the patronage of the Managers of the Infirmary, and the Membership shall consist of all those who contribute to its funds a Donation of not less than  $\mathcal{L}_{10}$ , or who give an Annual Subscription of not less than ten shillings.

#### Rules.

I. The Office-bearers of the Society shall consist of the following gentlemen, viz.:—A President, two Vice-Presidents, and a Secretary; of a Treasurer, who may be either a lady or a gentleman; and of the following ladies, viz.:—A Convener, a Superintendent, and a Manager of the Clothing Department; also of a Committee of twelve ladies (preference being given to Ward Visitors), two of

whom shall retire annually, and not be eligible for re-election till they have been a year out of office. All vacancies in the Management shall be filled up at the Annual Meeting of the Society, to be held on the last Tuesday of *October* yearly, but *ad interim* appointments may be made by the Committee.

II. The Committee shall meet once every week, except during the months of July, August and September—and for the present this meeting shall be fixed for Tuesday at four o'clock.

III. The sanctioned Infirmary visitors, and the Medical and Surgical Officers, shall be entitled to recommend cases for the consideration of the Weekly Meeting of Committee. The President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, and one selected Member of Committee, shall be entitled to afford limited relief in urgent cases at any time, but a note of these cases, with relief granted, must be laid before the first meeting of Committee for information and approval.

IV. The Secretary shall keep a record of the transactions of the Committee, and of the Society, the names of the persons relieved, the nature of the relief granted, and such other particulars as may be deemed desirable.

V. The Funds of the Society shall not be applicable towards any general treat or festival.

VI. An Auditor shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting, unless the Accounts have been previously audited, and the Accounts of the Treasurer shall be regularly examined by the Committee.

## TWENTY-NINTH ANNUAL REPORT

The Accounts for the year which are submitted with this Report, shew a surplus on the Ordinary Fund of £30, 3s. 11d., and the Committee is able to increase the Special Fund, or Reserve, by this amount. Only once in the past ten years has such a thing been possible, namely in 1903, when £10, 5s. 6d. was carried to Special Fund, and the Committee fears that the satisfactory result for this year is exceptional. An examination of the current year's Accounts unfortunately indicates that this year's surplus can

no more be expected to be permanent than that of 1903. Analysing the figures it is seen that Revenue has on the whole increased by only £5, 6s. 2d. This is accounted for by Interest on the Nurses Fund and a donation from a new source, while Subscriptions, on the other hand, have fallen by £16, os. 6d. After all the trouble taken during late years by the Committee to increase the Society's regular Income, this result is extremely disappointing. Turning to Expenditure we find a decrease of £101, 16s, 10d. The decrease arises almost entirely on the weekly allowances to patients and their families, and is due to the exceptionally small number of applications received during the year. As the cases treated by the Society are confined to the families of deserving working men it is probable that the recent activity of trade has made want less prevalent among these classes, and led to fewer applications to the Samaritan Society. With a return to normal conditions and a slackening of employment it is to be expected that claims will increase and once more make the Society's resources unequal to the demand made upon them.

The Committee has had the subject of placing the finances on a stable basis under anxious consideration, and has decided, for the present and by way of experiment, to join the Charity Organisation Society. It is to be hoped that in this way new subscribers may be obtained. As regards existing subscribers, the Committee would point out that no alteration need be made in the collection of Subscriptions except in the matter of time of year. Societies joining the C. O. S. undertake to collect on their own account during ten months of the year only, and to leave January and February for the Organisation.

During the summer an inquiry was addressed to the Committee, through the Managers of the Royal Infirmary, as to whether the Samaritan Society would lend the services of its Almoner to assist in the administration of a bequest by the late Mr C. B. Black for behoof of Edinburgh patients who had been in the Convalescent House. After consideration the Committee proposed that applications for the benefits of the Fund should be dealt with in the same manner as cases presently coming before the Society, and the Committee placed its services at the disposal of the Managers. The offer was accepted, and satisfactory conditions have been arranged.

The work of the year shews no special features, except for the falling off in applications for relief in money or food. The new cases dealt with number 231, while in the three previous years the

figures were: during 1904—312, during 1905—305, during 1906—281. The Almoner's visits to the homes of patients numbered 1155.

The number of articles of clothing given away during the year is 5775, 148 more than last year. The thanks of the Society are due to the friends who have helped in the Clothing Department, especially the Ladies' Association, the various work parties, and the ladies who have made up clothing supplied them by the Society. Parcels of old clothes will be most thankfully received and should be sent to "Miss Hansen, Samaritan Society's Room, Royal Infirmary," or on receipt of a post card, directed to the same address, they will be called for.

The Annual Sermon was preached in North Berwick Parish Church, and a sum of £15 was collected and paid to the Society. £10 has also been received from a fund administered by the Town Council's Committee of Public Health, and £10 from the unappropriated subscriptions received by the Charity Organisation Society.

The Committee finally acknowledges its continued indebtedness for the co-operation of the Managers, Superintendent, Medical Staff, and Nurses of the Royal Infirmary, and for the kindness of friends who have furnished subscribers' recommendations to hospitals, and orders on the Cheap Coal Society.

#### NOTES OF CASES FROM ALMONER'S BOOK

With an Account of what was done for them.

#### I .- Assistance in Money or Food.

Edinburgh Royal Infirmary.

- J. M—, a Glasscutter, 26 years of age; wages 28/-. He had heen off work for 4 weeks with rheumatic fever, when the Samaritan Society was asked to give the family some help. He had a wife and 5 young children. Their only source of income was 10/- a week advanced out of his wages. The rent was £8, 14s. Having got a good account of them from their minister the Samaritan Society allowed them 4/6 a week for 4 weeks and a donation of 18/- when J. M— went home.
- Mrs L——, a widow, a Rubber Worker; wages 10/-. She had been off work for 10 weeks. She was in the Infirmary for a fortnight for an operation. She had 5 children; the eldest, a girl of 14, was earning 5/- a week, but she had to go home to look after the house. The Parish allowed them 8/- a week—the only source of income. The rent was £6. The Samaritan Society granted £1 donation.
- A. R—, a Miner; wages 25/-. He had a serious accident, and was brought to the Infirmary. He had a wife and 5 children, the eldest 9 years old and the youngest 14 months. Having made inquiries, it was found that the family was very respectable and thrifty, and that A. R— was likely to get compensation to the half of his wages in a few weeks. Pending this the Samaritan Society allowed £1 donation.
- Mrs D—, a widow, a Charwoman. She earned 10/- a week, but she had not worked for 8 weeks, having been in the Infirmary for 6 weeks with acute rheumatism. She had 4 children; the eldest, a boy of 17, earned £1 a month at a chemist's, where he was learning the business. He was attending classes at the Heriot-Watt Collego, his master paying for one class. A boy of 15 earned 6/- at a jeweller's; a boy of 13 was at home from school to keep the house; there was also a girl of 11. The Parish allowed them 3/- a week. The rent was £10, 9s. Mrs D—— was troubled about the arrears which were accumulating. The Samaritan Society allowed them 4/- a week for 2 weeks, and when Mrs D—— went home a donation of £1 was given her.
- D. F—, a Miner; wages 6/6 a night, but only working 4 nights a week. He had been off work a month, coming to Hospital with Bright's disease. His wife was in the Infirmary also. She had been there for 10 weeks with dropsy and heart trouble. There were 4 children at home; the eldest was a girl of 11, the others were 8, 5, and 3 years old. A nephew of 19 came to live in the house and keep the children. The rent was 10/- a month. Their Priest wrote that it was a most deserving case, and the Samaritan Society

- allowed 4/- for 4 weeks and a donation of 16/- when D. F—returned home.
- D. G—, a Railway Surfaceman; wages 18/6 a week. He came to the Infirmary with Bright's disease. He had a wife and 5 children, 13, 10, 6, 4, and a baby 10 months old. They were in no Society, and had nothing from the Parish, but they were applying to it for relief. The rent was £7. 4/- a week was allowed them by the Samaritan Society and a donation of 16/- when D. G—— went home. D. G—— wrote expressing the gratitude he and his wife felt for the help they had received in the time of their trouble.
- T. D—, a Cabman; wages 18/- a week. He had been off work for 6 weeks with skin disease. He had a wife and 2 children, 10 and 4 years. They were in the Shepherds' Society, from which they were getting 10/- a week, and Mrs D—— got a temporary lodger, from whom she got 12/- for board and lodging. The rent was £10, 9s. Their minister recommended them as most deserving, and said that Mrs D—— had had a hard fight with bad health and deserved all the help she could get. He enclosed 5/- for her. The Samaritan Society granted them 3/- a week for 9 weeks.
- S. M'K—, a Tailor; wages about £1. He had been off work for 3 weeks with pleurisy. He had a wife and 7 children. The eldest, a girl of 17, had been ill and not able to work for 18 months; a boy of 15 earned 5/6 as a message boy; the others were 13, 10, 9, 2 years and a baby of 9 weeks old. They were in no society, but had to pay 1/- a week to a funeral society. The rent was £11. Mrs M'K— was most anxious not to apply for Parish relief. A most satisfactory account of them having been received, the Samaritan Society allowed 5/- a week for 4 weeks, which is still going on.
- J. S—, a Charwoman. Her earnings averaged 10/- a week, but she had not worked for 11 weeks; for 6 weeks of that time she had been in the Infirmary with internal disease. She had partly to support her old mother, who had been bed-ridden for 15 months. She received 2/6 from the Parish, and a grandchild slept in the house with her. The rent was £4. On inquiry being made it was found that they were most deserving and worthy of help. The Samaritan Society granted 3/- a week for 8 weeks.

#### Chalmers' Hospital.

- J. S—, a Vandriver; wages 14/-. Being out of work he had to take this small wage. He was in Chalmers' Hospital with hernia. He had a wife and 4 children, 11, 8, 6, and 2½ years, Mrs S—— was in delicate health and unable for work. They were in no society, but they had 3/- a week from the Destitute Sick Society and their Church allowed them 2/6 a week. The Samaritan Society granted 4/6 a week for 8 weeks and a donation of £1 when J. S—— went home.
- R. S—, an Engine-keeper; wages 30/-. He had been off work for a month before he was admitted to Hospital. He underwent an operation for hernia. He had a wife and 4 children, the eldest 6 years and the youngest 18 months. They were in no society and had no source of income. The rent was £10, 5s. The case was

- recommended to the Samaritan Society, and a grant of 4/- for 4 weeks was given to the family and a donation of 16/- when R. Swent home.
- T. S—, a Baker; wages 28/-; 31 years of age. He was off work for 7 weeks, and for a fortnight had been in Chalmers' Hospital with rheumatic fever. He had a wife and 2 children, 3 years and a baby 8 months. They were in no society. At one time they were in the Rechabites, but had run out of benefit. The Destitute Sick Society allowed them 3/6 a week. Their rent was £10. A satisfactory account of them having been received, the Samaritan Society granted them 3/- a week for 8 weeks, and when T. S—— went home a donation of 12/- was given.

#### II. - Fares.

- H. C—, Newcastle, a Miner; wages £1. He had been off work for a year, when he came to the Infirmary with paralysis. Up to the time he took ill he was the support of his mother as well as his wife and 3 young children. The Parish allowed 10/- a week, they had 3/- a week from a benefit society. and Mrs C—— was in the habit of charing, but one of the children having taken measels she had to stop going out. The rent was 5/9 a week. H. C——'s fare to Edinburgh had been paid by his fellow workmen. Having heard from their minister that the family was very respectable and needy, and deserving of help, the Samaritan Society granted £1 donation, to include his fare home.
- J. M—, a Street Layer from Newcastle; wages 37/6. He had been off work for a year, when he came to the Infirmary with wry neck. He had walked all the way, taking a week to do so. He was the support of his mother and he had 2 sisters at home who were working. On inquiry a satisfactory account was received. A donation of 15/- was given, to include fare to Newcastle.
- J. H—. He had come from America to visit friends. He took ill and had to go to the Infirmary, but before his admission most of his money was spent. He was a Freemason, and through the kindness of the Lodges in Edinburgh £6 was subscribed to enable him to go home. The Samaritan Society granted £1 to pay his lodging for a fortnight while he was attending the Infirmary as an out-patient, and a further donation of 10/- was given as he had a long distance to go to get to his own home after landing.
- A. M—, a very respectable old man, who was in the Infirmary for 5 weeks. He lived in lodgings, but was unable to keep himself, and he was anxious to join his daughter in London, who was willing to keep him. £1 was allowed him as part fare, and he wrote afterwards telling of his safe arrival and expressing his gratitude for the help he had received.
- Mrs M'K——. She had once been in very good circumstances, but she and her husband were reduced to abject poverty and were mainly supported by friends. She had no money to take her home to Inverness when leaving the Infirmary, and the Samaritan Society granted her £1 donation, which she received with tears, saying she was not in a position to refuse it.



# OBJECT, CONSTITUTION, AND RULES OF THE SOCIETY.

# OBJECT OF THE SOCIETY.

It shall be the object of this Society to assist the families and dependents of patients being bread-winners, to give clothing, travelling expenses, or other needful help to patients on leaving the Infirmary, to endeavour to procure work for them, and generally to befriend and be of use to them as far as possible. Patients in the Edinburgh City Fever Hospital, and in Chalmers Hospital, shall also be entitled to the benefits of the Society.

# CONSTITUTION.

The Samaritan Society shall be under the patronage of the Managers of the Infirmary, and the Membership shall consist of all those who contribute to its funds a Donation of not less than £10, or who give an Annual Subscription of not less than ten shillings.

# Rules.

I. The Office-bearers of the Society shall consist of the following gentlemen, viz.:—A President, two Vice-Presidents, and a Secretary; of a Treasurer, who may be either a lady or a gentleman; and of the following ladies, viz.:—A Convener, a Superintendent, and a Manager of the Clothing Department; also of a Committee of twelve ladies (preference being given to Ward Visitors), two of

whom shall retire annually, and not be eligible for re-election till they have been a year out of office. All vacancies in the Management shall be filled up at the Annual Meeting of the Society, to be held on the last Tuesday of *October* yearly, but *ad interim* appointments may be made by the Committee.

II. The Committee shall meet once every week, except during the months of July, August and September—and for the present this meeting shall be fixed for Tuesday at four o'clock.

NOTE.—During the months of July, August, and September, cases are dealt with by the Superintendent and Almoner.

III. The sanctioned Infirmary visitors, and the Medical and Surgical Officers, shall be entitled to recommend cases for the consideration of the Weekly Meeting of Committee. The President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, and one selected Member of Committee, shall be entitled to afford limited relief in urgent cases at any time, but a note of these cases, with relief granted, must be laid before the first meeting of Committee for information and approval.

IV. The Secretary shall keep a record of the transactions of the Committee, and of the Society, the names of the persons relieved, the nature of the relief granted, and such other particulars as may be deemed desirable.

V. The Funds of the Society shall not be applicable towards any general treat or festival.

VI. An Auditor shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting, unless the Accounts have been previously audited, and the Accounts of the Treasurer shall be regularly examined by the Committee.

# THIRTIETH ANNUAL REPORT

The fear expressed by the Committee that last year's surplus on the Accounts would not prove permanent has unfortunately been realised. The year closes with a deficiency of £63, 4s. 11d., arising partly through a small falling off in receipts, amounting to £4, 2s. 8d., but principally through expenditure having reverted to a normal figure and being £89, 6s. 2d. larger than last year. The applications for relief received by the Society had fallen last year in a marked degree. Now they have risen again, the new cases dealt with numbering 315. The comparison with previous years is as follows:—

It will be remembered that last year the Committee decided, in the hope of obtaining new subscribers, to join the Charity Organisation Society. The experiment has not been unsuccessful, for 50 new subscribers have joined, while the amount realised is £17, 9s. 6d. The Hon. Treasurer has prepared a Report on this subject, which shows that out of a total of 680 subscribers 175 (or 25.7 per cent.) availed themselves of the Charity Organisation Society; while of the total received during the year by way of subscriptions, namely £382, a sum of £96 (or 25.1 per cent.) is collected by the Organisation. The revenue from subscriptions as a whole is £20 less than last year.

As a pleasant offset to the fruitlessness of their efforts to obtain an increased revenue from ordinary sources, which the Committee has had year after year to report, it is gratifying to announce that a substantial increase of Capital Funds will shortly take place. Intimation has been received from the Agents of the late Miss Catharine Isabella Murray, St. Margaret's Tower, Strathearn Road, Edinburgh, that by this lady's will the Samaritan Society receives half the residue of her estate, a sum which

may possibly amount to about £15,000. Some time will elapse before a distribution of funds can be made, but the new income will give a stability to the Society's accounts which they have not hitherto possessed. Miss Murray had during many years been a subscriber, and the Committee cannot be too grateful for the act which has so completely altered the Society's financial outlook.

The new cases dealt with during the past year were, as already stated, 315, and in connection with these the Almoner has paid 1,625 visits, 470 more than last year.

The articles of clothing distributed number 5009. The thanks of the Society are due to the friends who have helped in the Clothing Department, especially the Ladies' Association, the various work parties, and the ladies who have made up material supplied them by the Society. Parcels of old clothes will be most thankfully received, and should be sent to "The Samaritan Room, Royal Infirmary," or on receipt of a post card, directed to the same address they will be called for.

The Annual Sermon was preached by Dr Kelman in St. Andrews U.F. Church, and a Collection

amounting to £26, 7s. 8d., was handed to the Society. The usual donation of £10 was received from a fund administered by the Town Council's Committee of Public Health, and £10 was also received from the unappropriated subscriptions received by the Charity Organisation Society.

The Committee finally acknowledges its continued indebtedness for the hearty co-operation of the 'Managers, Superintendent, Medical Staff, and Nurses of the Royal Infirmary, and for the kindness of friends who have furnished subscribers' recommendations to hospitals, and orders on the Cheap Coal Society.

## NOTES OF CASES FROM ALMONER'S BOOK

With an Account of what was done for them.

## I .- Assistance in Money or Food.

## Edinburgh Royal Infirmary.

- J. W—, a Slater; average wages 24/- a week, had been off work for 4 weeks, coming to the Infirmary with Rheumatism. He had a wife and 10 children. The eldest, a girl of 15, was in service; the next, a girl of 14, earned 5/-; the youngest was 4 months old. They were in no Society, but had applied to the Parish. The Rent was £12, and money had been put aside for that, but they had been obliged to use it. A good account of the family was received, and the Samaritan Society granted them 5/- a week for 4 weeks, and when J. W—— went home a donation of £1 was allowed.
- W. D. C——, a Railway Guard; wages 22/-, though formerly 29/-. He had been off work for 3 weeks, coming to the Infirmary with internal Hemorrhage, from which he had suffered for over a year. He had a wife and 5 children—9, 6, 5, 3, and 2 years. Their only source of income was 5/- from the Rechabite Society, but out of that 6d. had to be paid weekly. Mrs C—— was not strong having overworked herself about a year before. With great reluctance she applied to the Parish for relief, and she received 9/- a week. An excellent report of them having been given by their Minister, 5/- a week for 4 weeks was granted by the Samaritan Society. This was given for 8 weeks, and when W. D. C—— went home from the Convalescent House he received £4 from the Charles B. Black Bequest. The Rent, £10, was nearly £3 in arrears.
- C. M——, a Coachman; Wages 27/- a week. He had been out of employment for a long time, but had been in a good situation for a year when he had to leave on account of illness. He went to the Infirmary and was operated on for Cancer, his tongue being removed. He had a wife and 7 children, the two eldest, girls, were in service. Five boys were at home; the eldest 16, carned 12/- a week working in a garden; the next 14, a telegraph messenger, earned 6/- a week; 2 were at school; the youngest, 4 years old, was very delicate. The Rent was £18. A Lady wrote recommending the case. C. M—— was just going home and the Samaritan Society granted him a donation of £2.
- J. S—, a widower, a Brassfinisher to trade; wages 26/- a week, but owing to failing eyesight had been a Volunteer Marker, earning 15/- a week. He had 5 children at home; the two eldest, 17 and 16 years of age, earned respectively 5/- and 4/- a week, the others were at school. The D. S. S. allowed 3/- a week. The Rent was £8. J. S—— came to the Infirmary with Bright's Disease. A married

daughter, who lived near, looked after the house for her brothers and sisters. On inquiry an excellent account of the family was received, and an allowance of 3/6 a week for 4 weeks was granted, and a donation of 14/- was given when J. S —— went home.

- W. G——, a Mason; wages 36/- when working full time, but he had been off work for 6 weeks with Heart and Lung trouble. He had a wife and 2 children; the elder, a girl of 16, earned about 7/- a week, but at that time she was at home with Influenza, and there was a boy 9 years old. W. G——'s mother-in-law, an old woman, lived with them, and she also had been ill. Mrs G—— was just recovering from Pneumonia The Rent was £10. The Samaritan Society granted 4/- a week for 4 weeks. This was continued for 12 weeks, and a donation of 16/- was given when W. G—— went home.
- Mrs T—, a widow. She kept 2 lodgers, one paid her 11/- a week for board and lodging, and the other 5/- for a bed sitting-room. She was in the Infirmary for 4 weeks with internal trouble, and for 3 weeks she was at the Convalescent House. She had a daughter of 25, who gave her 10/- a week, and a boy of 12 was at school. Her husband and 5 grown up sons and daughters had died in 18 months. Her Minister wrote recommending her highly, saying "She was most deserving of help." The Samaritan Society granted her a donation of £1, 10s. Mrs T—— was very grateful, and said her Rent would be cleared.
- W. B—, a Joiner, but owing to bad health had not worked at his trade for 2 years. He had a little shop and he sharpened saws. The earnings from the shop were uncertain; the saws brought in about 3/· a week. He had a wife and 7 children; the eldest had lately enlisted. A girl of 16 earned 5/·; 4 were at school, and a little one was at home The Rent was £15. Mrs B— kept a mangle, and when her husband was at home she sometimes went out sicknursing W. B— was in the Infirmary with Heart trouble. A good report was got of the family. The Samaritan Society granted 4/- a week for 8 weeks, and a donation of 16/- was given when W. B— went home.
- J. H——, a Jew, a Hawker; average earnings 16/- a week. He came to the Infirmary with Pneumonia and died in a few days, leaving a widow and 7 children. A boy of 14 had just gone to work, the others were 12, 8, 6, 4, 2, and a baby 7 months old. They had no source of income. The Rent was 4/4 a week. The Samaritan Society granted a donation of £1.
- D. S—, a Ploughman; wages 19/- a week. He had been off work for 12 weeks, coming to the Infirmary with Cancer in the Throat, for which there had been an operation. He had a wife and 4 children, 9, 7, 5, 2. The Parish allowed 8/- a week, their only source of income. Their Minister wrote that they were a very decent, deserving, respectable family, and always had a small wage. The Samaritan Society granted 5/- a week for 12 weeks and a donation of £1 when D. S—— went home. They were most grateful for the allowance.

## City Hospital.

H. R——, a Vanman; wages 16/-. He used to have more, but was out of work and was thankful to get that. He came to the Infirmary with Pneumonia, was there for a few weeks, but as he took Erysipelas he was sent to the City Hospital. He had a wife and 4 children, 6, 4, 2, and 3 weeks old. Mrs R—— was not strong, and two of the children had whooping cough. They were in no Society. The Parish allowed 5/- a week, and Mrs R—— had one lodger, who paid 3/6 for his room. The Rent was £8. The Samaritan Society granted 4/6 a week for 8 weeks, and a donation of £1 when H. R—— went home.

### II. - Fares.

- C. M'A—, Newcastle. He came to the Infirmary with Eye trouble, caused by an accident, and his sight was almost gone. He had a wife and 2 children, and all the money he had was 2/6. The Samaritan Society granted 8/- to make up the fare to take him home.
- J. H—, a Coachman. He came from Inverness suffering from Malignant Growth. He had a wife and 3 children, and he had no money to take him home. The Samaritan Society granted him a donation of £1. He had never required help hefore, and felt taking it very much.
- Mrs H—, a widow, with 4 children; the eldest in service, and the next, a girl of 16, going out to daily work; the others, 13, 11, at school. Mrs H—— did washing. Rent £3. The Parish allowed 6/- a week. Mrs H—— had undergone an operation. She had no money to take her home to Orkney. The Samaritan Society granted her £1.
- A. B——, Caithness, an Outdoor Worker, earning £12 a year. She came to the Infirmary to have an operation on her Eye, coming hy boat with a tourist ticket. As the time for using the return ticket had expired, and having no money she could not pay the necessary 9/- to make up the price of the ticket. The Samaritan Society granted her a donation of 15/- to include her fare.
- B. M'J——, a girl 11 years of age, who came from Thurso six months before with Abscesses. Her parents were very poor, with other 5 children, and they had no money to send her for her fare. The Samaritan Society granted B. M'J—— 12/6. She was seen on board the Steamer, and put under the charge of the Stewardess.
- J. G——. He had been in the Infirmary for a long time with Rheumatism and loss of power in one of his legs. He had not been able to work for two years, and was dependent on his old mother, whose only source of income was 4/- a week from the Parish. His fellow workmen had made a collection for him some time hefore, and he had been getting 5/- a week, but that was nearly done. The Samaritan Society was asked to pay a cab and his railway fare home. He was allowed 10/- to include fares.



#### THIRTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT

A General Meeting of the Society was held in Dowell's Rooms on 12th May 1909 for the purpose of adopting a new Constitution and electing Office-Bearers. It had long been felt that the somewhat informal Constitution dating from 1879 was inadequate, while the desirability of having a body of Trustees to hold the Society's investments made a change imperative. Occasion was taken at the same time to introduce certain, alterations suggested by experience, and, in particular, to take power to elect a wider body of Office-Bearers who, it is hoped, will help the Society to become more widely known and appreciated.

At this meeting public expression was given to the Society's deep sense of sorrow and loss occasioned by the death of the Rev. Dr Gray, who was one of the founders of the Society, and, as President for thirty years, laboured most devotedly in its interests.

On the working of the year just past the Committee regret to have to report a deficiency of £186, Is. Id. This arises partly from increased demands on the Society, partly from a falling off in receipts.

The increase which occurred last year in the applications made to the Society for relief has continued, as will be seen from the following figures:—

The expenditure of the Society has naturally increased under these circumstances, the payments in money and food to patients and their families being £78 more than last year, and the sum spent on clothing materials £13 more. The individual allowances made by the Committee remain much as before, but the time over which they extended was longer this year owing to the number of cases of tedious illness which occurred.

The ordinary revenue has not kept pace with this increase in expenditure and has, unfortunately, not even remained constant. Subscriptions, which last year fell £20, have still further declined by £7, while Special Donations are also less than last year by £35. The revenue from new investments has

not yet accrued, and consequently the deficiency already referred to has arisen.

Under ordinary circumstances this state of affairs would be very serious and would raise the question, which till lately was often before the Committee, whether the Society could continue on its present footing in the absence of adequate public support. Miss Murray's munificent legacy has averted this possibility, but the falling off in subscriptions is viewed with great concern by the Committee The Society, it is true, will next year have revenue sufficient to maintain itself under present conditions, but the current year shews how liable demands are to increase, while if subscriptions seriously diminish. the old state of affairs will, of course, return. Besides, the Committee beg subscribers to bear in mind that for a long series of years regularly recurring deficits have compelled the Society to cut down its expenditure to the lowest possible limit. A glance at the allowances quoted in the "Notes of Cases from Almoner's Book" should convince subscribers that the scale of expenditure is not such that the Society is in a position where it has ceased to require public support.

The articles of clothing distributed during the year number 4390. The thanks of the Society are due to the friends who have helped in the Clothing Department, to the Ladies' Association, the various work parties, and to those who have made up material supplied by the Society. In particular

the Society is indebted to the lady who, during the absence of Miss Hansen, extending over virtually the whole session, joined the Committee and undertook the very exacting duties of Manager of the Clothing Department. Parcels of old clothes will be most thankfully received, and should be sent to "The Samaritan Room, Royal Infirmary," or on receipt of a post card, directed to the same address they will be called for. The stock of clothes is at present very low, and gifts of such articles are urgently needed.

The usual donation of £10 was received from a fund administered by the Town Council's Committee of Public Health, and £10 was also received from the unappropriated subscriptions received by the Charity Organisation Society.

The Committee finally acknowledges its continued indebtedness for the hearty co-operation of the Managers, Superintendent, Medical Staff, and Nurses of the Royal Infirmary, and for the kindness of friends who have furnished subscribers' recommendations to hospitals, and orders on the Cheap Coal Society.

#### NOTES OF CASES FROM ALMONER'S BOOK

With an Account of what was done for them.

I .- Assistance in Money or Food.

Edinburgh Royal Infirmary.

- J. L—, a Baker, suffering from Bright's disease. For a long time he had had very irregular employment, and his family was in such destitution that but for the kindness of neighbours, who gave food to the children, they must have been in direst want. Mrs L—was in bad health, and the eldest daughter, a girl of 17, was very delicate and could not work. The other children at home were 12, 9, 7, and 4 years of age, and a baby of 4 months old. A Missionary recommended the case, and the Sanaritan Society gave 5/- a week for 12 weeks to supplement the parish allowance of 8/- a week, and when J. L—went home a donation of 30/- was granted by the Society, and paid in weekly instalments.
- J. B—, a Warper in a mill at Galashiels; wages between 20/- and 30/-. He had been entirely off work for a fortnight before he came to the Infirmary with Ascites. Before that he had been unable for regular work for many weeks, and his wife had been obliged to go to work in the mills, where she earned 6/- a week. This, with 3/6 a week from a Society, was their only source of income. They had two children, 9 and 5 years old. On inquiry it was found that the family was very respectable and well doing. An allowance of 3/6 a week was granted them for 24 weeks, and a donation of 14/- when J. B— went home.
- D. B—, a Brewer's Labourer; wages 12/6 a week. His right arm was amputated in the Infirmary on account of a malignant growth. On his recovery from the operation he was fit for work as a messenger in the brewery, but the Samaritan Society gave him 30/to help him to get an artificial arm, which would cnable him to do an ordinary man's work as labourer, with shovel, barrow, etc. He had been out of work for 13 weeks before he was admitted to the Infirmary.
- P. M—, a Worker for the Corporation; wages 25/-. He had been off work for 3 weeks with low fever. He had a wife and 8 children. A girl of 16 and one of 14 carned 9/- and 6/- respectively; the youngest was 3 years old. P. M—— was in no Society. The Rent was £12, 10s. Their Priest having reported well of the family (The St Vincent de Paul Society had given boots to the school children) the Samaritan Society granted 5/- for 4 weeks, and a donation of £1 when P. M—— went home.

- M. B—, an orphan, her mother having been found drowned in the canal a year before. She earned 11/- a week as Layer on in Printing Works. She had been off work for 4 weeks with Neuritis. Her Miuister wrote of her as being "A nice quiet girl, well disposed and in real need." She paid 7/- a week for board and lodgings, but was still far from well, and would not be able to work for some time. The Samaritan Society granted her a donation of £1.
- J. M—, a Glasscutter; wages 25/-. He had been off work for 5 weeks, coming to the Infirmary with Rheumatism. He had a wife and 6 children—9, 8, 5, 4, and 3 years old, and an infant 6 months old. Mrs M——'s lungs were affected, and she went to Colinton Hospital for treatment, where she died. The infant also died. J. M—— was in no Society and he had no source of income excepting 10/- a week advance wages. The Rent was £10, 2s. The Samaritan Society allowed 5/- a week for 4 weeks. This was continued for 12 weeks, and when J. M—— went home, after being at the Convalescent House, he received a donation of £3 from the C.B.B. Bequest.
- W. G—, a Vanman; wages 25/-. He had been off work for 3 weeks, coming to the Infirmary with internal trouble. He had a wife and 6 children—13, 11, 8, 5, and 3 years old, and a baby  $3\frac{1}{2}$  months. Mrs G—— was not strong, only 6 weeks before she had been in Hospital with Bright's disease. All they had was 10/- a week from the parish. The Rent was £6. A Lady recommended the case, and the Samaritan Society granted 5/- a week for 4 weeks, and a donation of £1 was given when W. G—— went home.
- Mrs M'N—. Sewed for an old clothes shop, and earned from 7/- to 8/- a week. She had been off work for 3 weeks, coming to the Infirmary with heart trouble. She had left her husband five years before as he was addicted to drink. There were 5 of a family at home; the eldest, a girl of 25, had had Peritonitis, and not being strong euough for work, she was at home keeping house. The only one working was a boy of 19, he earned 10/-; the others were 11, 9, and 7 years old. The Rent was £9. The Samaritan Society granted 4/- for 4 weeks, and a donation of £1 was given when Mrs M'N— went home.
- P. C——, a Coal Merchant. He had had a business of his own, but owing to bad trade and bad bealth he was obliged to sell it. He had been operated on for Varicose Veins, and afterwards he had become paralyzed, with little hope of recovery. He had a wife and 4 children—13, 10, 8, and 4 years old. The child of 10 being paralyzed and weak minded made it impossible for his mother to go out to work. They had 10/2 a week from the Gardener's Society. On inquiry being made their Minister wrote recommending the family, but soon after the case was brought before the Samaritan Society, P. C—— died. A donation of 30/- was granted for his widow.

#### Chalmer's Hospital.

T. W——, a Mason's Labourer; wages about 23/-. He had been off work for 17 weeks, and be was in Hospital with a scalded knee, a kettle of boiling water having fallen over it nine weeks before. He had a wife, but no children. The D.S.S. allowed 2/6 a week. Mrs W—— looked after an old woman from whom sbe got her food. They had no other source of income. The Rent was £4, 12s., and they were four months in arrears. The Samaritan Society allowed 2/6 a week for 4 weeks. This was continued for 12 weeks, and a donation of 10/- was given when T. W—— went home.

#### City Hospital.

J. B—, a Mason; wages 8½d. an hour; work during winter very uncertain. He was entirely off work for 6 weeks, and went to the City Hospital with Phthisis. He has a wife and 2 children—5½ and 3 years old. They have 9/- from one Society, but nothing from the Parisb. The Rent is £12, 5s. Their Clergyman wrote recommending the case, and the Samaritan Society allowed 3/6 for 4 weeks. This allowance has been renewed, and is still going on.

#### II. - Fares.

- J. M—, a baby 15 months old. His mother brought him to the Infirmary from Berwick with tubercular leg. When he was to go bome his mother was asked to come for him, but she wrote saying she could not do so as her busband was out of work, and she bad no money for the fare. There were several other young children. The Samaritan Society granted 10/- for fare.
- A. N—, came from Nairn; 19 years of age. He was in the Infirmary for 3 weeks with Angioma. His mother was a widow, and he was her chief support. He was still ill, and his fare was asked so that he could go bome. The Samaritan Society granted a donation of 15/- to include fare.
- M. B—, from Anniker, County Donegal, Ireland. He came to Scotland for the harvest, and he sent part of bis wages to his wife and 2 young children. He took ill with Pneumonia, and was sent to the Infirmary. When recovered be was anxious to go home, but had no money to pay his fare. A donation of £1 was granted to include fare.
- J. M'—, Lower Rover. He came from Ireland to try to get work, but took ill with Inflammation of the Bladder. He had a wife and 4 children—9, 7, and 6 years, and one 18 months old, who had been helped by neigbbours. His fare was asked for as he had no money, and the Samaritan Society granted a donation of £1, 5s. J. M'— was unable to walk, but he was to travel with two men who happened to be going to the same place.



### THIRTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT

The Accounts for the year shew a surplus of £143, 12s. Id., as compared with a deficit last year of £181, 1s. Id. This result is due to the larger income which the Society now receives as the result of Miss Murray's munificent bequest. The surplus has been carried to Capital, and is set against the long series of deficits made in past years. The total deficits between 1898 and 1909 have amounted to £768, 14s. Id.

The Committee has thought it well to proceed very cautiously with the more liberal scale of expenditure which every member of the Society must be glad to find is now possible. Expenditure is not greatly altered. Payments in money and food are larger by £27, and expenditure on clothing by £10. The particulars extracted from the Almoner's Note Book, and appended to this Report, shew that in a few specially deserving and necessitous cases as large a weekly allowance as 7/6 has been made. In many cases 4/- and 5/- weekly has been given in circumstances under which only very much smaller allowances could have been afforded as long as the revenue of the Society was insufficient to meet all the claims made upon it. The Committee felt very keenly that small allowances were often mere doles and not truly helpful, and has gone on the principle of helping most substantially those families

which belong to a better class, rather than increasing the allowances of applicants who are likely to come within the scope of the Poor Law.

The articles of clothing given away during the year amount to 4722 articles. The Committee regrets that it has lost the assistance of one of the Associations which used to make up clothing, and it desires specially to draw the attention of those interested in the work of the Society to the needs of this department. It is impossible without undue expenditure to buy articles of the same wearing quality as many of the old clothes sent, a point which particularly applies to men's clothing, and to boots and shoes. The Committee also wishes to emphasize the practical economy of having some really old clothes available in the store. In the cases where assistance is given in money the

Committee believes that the system of thorough investigation and enquiry eliminates imposters and undesirables; but in the case of gifts of Clothing similar strictness is impossible. Patients may have had their clothes destroyed by the accident which brought them to the Infirmary, or may be otherwise so destitute that it is difficult for the lady in charge of the Clothing Department to refuse the appeal of the Ward Nurse. It is desirable to have articles available which meet the immediate necessity of these cases.

Parcels of old clothes will be most thankfully received and should be addressed to the "Samaritan Room, Royal Infirmary." Parcels will be called for if a post card is sent to the "Head Porter, Royal Infirmary."

The Committee records with deep regret the loss suffered through the death of Mrs Crum Brown, who for twenty years was a member of the Committee of Management and a most active supporter of the Society.

The Committee acknowledges with thanks a donation of £5 from the fund administered by the Town Council's Committee of Public Health, and also takes this occasion of expressing its continued indebtedness for the co-operation of the Managers, Superintendent, Medical Staff, and Nurses of the Royal Infirmary and other Institutions, and for the kindness of friends who have furnished subscribers' recommendations to hospitals, and orders on the Cheap Coal Society.

#### NOTES OF CASES FROM ALMONER'S BOOK

With an Account of what was done for them.

#### I .- Assistance in Money or Food.

#### Edinburgh Royal Infirmary.

- A. A—, an Aerated Water Bottler; wages 22/-. He had been off work for three weeks, coming to the Infirmary with Appendicitis. He had a wife and 7 children. The eldest was 12 years old, and the youngest 5 months. One of the little boys was a cripple, and was visited by the Cripple Society. They were in the Free Gardeners' Society, from which they received 9/6 a week, their only source of income. The Rent was £6, 10s. The family was well recommended to the Samaritan Society, and an allowance of 7/-a week was given for eight weeks, and when A. A—— went home a donation of £1, 8s. was granted.
- Mrs S—. Suffering from Heart Disease. She kept a small shop, but made very little by it, and while she was in the Infirmary it had to be closed. She had been deserted by her husband, who went to the war in South Africa, but did not return to her. Three sons, who were married, were not able to help her, and another son of 17, who lived at home, earning 14/- a week, was in the Infirmary with Pneumonia. He was discharged from the Hospital on the same day as his mother, but was still unable to work. The Rent was £6. Having heard from a Missionary that Mrs S— was both needy and deserving, the Samaritan Society granted her a donation of £1, 10s.
- J. T—, a Compositor; wages, 30/-. He had not been able for much work during the previous year, and was in the Infirmary with tubercular disease. He had a wife and seven children, the eldest, 13 years, and the youngest, 16 months old. Their only source of income was 10/- a week from the Gardeners' Society. The rent was £12, 15s. The Samaritan Society allowed the family 7/6 a week for four weeks. This was continued for twelve weeks, and when J. T—went home a donation of 30/- was granted.
- A. I—, a Miner; wages, 35/- when working full time, but he had been off work for eight weeks when he came to the Infirmary with kidney disease. He had a wife and seven children. The eldest, a boy of 14, worked in the pit and earned 9/- a week, from which 2/- a week was deducted for coal, 3d. a week for a doctor, and 3/6 a week for rent and taxes. The other children were 13, 11, 10, 4, 3, and a a baby 4 months old. They received 10/- a week from the Gardeners' Society, but that was reduced to 5/- a week. They had been in

another society, but it had failed, and they had lost all the money they had paid into it. The rent was 3/6 a week. The Samaritan Society, having got a good account of the family from their minister, granted an allowance of 5/- a week four weeks. This was continued for twelve weeks, and when A. I— went home a donation of £1 was given.

- W. C——a Labourer, at pithead wages, 21/-. He had not been able to work for three weeks when he came to the Infirmary with internal trouble. He had a wife and five children, 10, 8, 6, 4, and 2 years old. They were in no society, and had no source of income, but the Parish allowed them 10/- a week. The rent was £5. 5/-. The family was thoroughly respectable, and the Samaritan Society granted them 5/- a week for four weeks, and when W. C. went home a donation of £1 was given.
- M. S—a Mill Worker, earning between 12/- and 13/- a week. She had been off work for nearly three months, coming to the Infirmary with exophthalmic goitre. She was an orphan and had no relations. She had boarded for five years with a very respectable woman, who spoke most highly of her. She had no means of support except her daily work. She went to the Convalescent Home, and when she was leaving there the Samaritan Society granted her a donation of £2, which was given to her in instalments by a lady who was much interested in her case.
- T. L—, a Photographer. He had been in business for himself, but had to give it up, and he was working for some one else. He went to the Infirmary with rheumatic fever. He had a wife and 5 children, 8, 7, 5, 1½ years and an infant 3 months old. They had no source of income and Mrs I.— was selling her things. The rent was £15. Having received a most favourable account of the family from their minister, who said "he couldn't conceive of a more deserving or clamant case for help," the Samaritan Society granted 7/6 a week for 8 weeks. When T. L— went home a donation of 30/- was given.
- G. L.—, a Rubber-worker, wages 28/-. He had been off work for 5 weeks, coming to the Infirmary with rheumatism. He had a wife and 2 children, 5 years and 3 months old. They had no source of income. Their house was their own, G. L.— having bought it before he married. Feu-duty and taxes amounted to £5. Their minister wrote that "the case was a thoroughly deserving one, the family being most respectable. Had it not been for prolonged illness they would not have required help." The Samaritan Society allowed 4/- a week for 4 weeks, and 16/- was granted when G. L.—went home.
- Mrs R—, a Widow. She cleaned offices and keptalodger, who paid her 7/- a week, but when she became seriously ill with diabetes, her lodger had to be sent away and she went to the Infirmary, She had 5 children. The eldest a girl of 16 was an apprentice dressmaker and earned 4/- a week, but she had to come home to keep house; the others were 14, 12, 11, 6 years old. The rent was £14. They had no source of income. On inquiry being made a very good report of

the family was received, it being added that at each term for the past two years Mrs R—— had been given £1 for rent from the funds for the poor of the church she attended. The Samaritan Society allowed 5/- a week for 14 weeks.

#### Chalmer's Hospital.

A. P——, a Labourer; wages 17/-. He had been off work for 3 weeks when he went to Chalmer's Hospital to undergo an operation. He had a wife and 3 children, 7½, 5½ and 3 years old. They were in no society and had no source of income. Mrs P—— would gladly have worked but could not find any employment. The rent was £3, 16/-. On inquiry it was found the family was in great destitution there being neither coal nor food in the house. The children's grandmother gave them their meals but they had not sufficient clothing to attend school. The Samaritan Society allowed 5/- a week for 4 weeks, and when A. P—— went home a donation of £1 was given.

#### City Hospital.

- T. B—, a Miner; wages about 25/- a week. He had been off work for 3 months, going to the City Hospital with Phthisis. He had a wife and 1 child, 4½ years old. Mrs B— was looking for work, but meantime they had no source of iucome. The case was recommended to the Samaritan Society, and an allowance of 3/6 a week for 4 weeks was granted. T. B— died, and his widow was allowed £1 donation.
- T. M—, a Cab Inspector; wages 30/. He had been off work entirely for 5 weeks, and for some time before that he was not able for much work owing to bad health. He went to the City Hospital with Phthisis. He had a wife and 4 children, 12, 10, 7, and 6 years of age. Mrs M— was getting the half of her husband's wages, but that was not expected to continue long. They had no other source of income. The Samaritan Society allowed 6/- a week for 4 weeks. At the end of that time T. M— died. His widow was given a donation of £2.
- R. C. L—, a Dairyman; wages 27/- a week. He was taken to City Hospital with Scarlet Fever. He had a wife and 5 children; twins not 5 years old, the other children, 4 and 2 years old, and an infant of 6 months. The baby required 5d. worth of milk a day. They were in no benefit society, but were living on the money saved for rent, which was £3. The Samaritan Society allowed 6/- a week for 4 weeks, and when R. C. L— went home, a donation of 24/- was given.
- G. H—, a Chef; wages 25/- a week. He went to the Infirmary in January, suffering from Gastric Ulcer. He had a wife and 4 children, 9, 8, 6, and 4 years old. They were in no society, and had no source of income excepting 8/- from the Parish The Samaritan Society allowed 4/- a week for 8 weeks. In March G. H—— went to the City Hospital; the allowance of 4/- a week was continued, and is still going on.

#### II. - Fares.

- B. F—, a Dressmaker, from Inverness, who used to earn from 5/- to £1 a week, but had not been able for work for about a year, as she had to nurse her old mother before she died. Her own health then broke down, and she came to the Infirmary with internal disease. Her brother, who lived with her, had only one arm. He had just recovered from a long illness, and only earned 5/- a week. The Samaritan Society granted B. F—— a donation of 25/-, to include her fare home.
- J. S——, from Belfast, a Labourer; wages £1; but he had not had regular work for 18 months. He had a slight operation, and wished to go home to Belfast, but he had no money. The Samaritan Society allowed 9/-.
- J. H—, a Miner; wages 30/-; but he had been off work for 7 months. He walked from Durham to Fife to try to get work. He came to the Infirmary with a broken leg. He had a wife and 7 children. Two of them were working, earning between them 12/-. When J. H— was able to go home, the Samaritan Society granted him 13/-.
- P. H—— came to the Infirmary on 19th May suffering from pneumonia. He had walked from Sunderland to try to get work, and had arrived two days before. When he was able to travel home, the Samaritan Society granted a donation of £1, to include his fare.
