## To the READER.

**I**T is humbly to be presumed, that there needs no eloquence or persuasion, to infuse into people, a belief of there being such a man as Enoch, the Roman Prophet for all on the greatest part of our News papers have taken notice of him for these several years. I therefore only beg leave, to acquaint my Readers, that, for some prophecies he made at Rome, concerning the people he was put into the Inquisition; yet the night before he was to be executed, he was wonderfully delivered, and brought from Rome to Portsmouth, by an Angel, in a nights time: as you will find in the following narrative of his life, delivered by his own mouth.

I wandered upon the Alps till I was ten years old, without any great exploits done by me; however I remembered, one day as I was contemplating the wonderful works of God in suporing the Sun, Moon and Stars, and this beautiful Glob, all which, I attributed to nature, I heard a voice in the Hebrew, saying, I am your Guide, and I will be your defender fear not: Upon this I turned about, and beheld a vision resembling an Angel standing close by me, and said, "The prayers of

“ thy Mother has been heard and thou hast  
 “ been miraculously preserved, thank God,  
 “ and praise his holy name, he has shewis  
 “ such favours to you,” You are desired to  
 observe, that till that time I had never seen  
 any human creature, that I shall remember,  
 and of consequence not learned to speak. but  
 my lips was immediately opened; and the  
 strings of my tongue were loosed, so that I  
 could speak any language I heard. I was  
 commanded by this vision, which has often at-  
 tended me, to go and travel, and to preach the  
 Gospel which shall be delivered by the hand  
 of the Lord unto thee. and to preach it in both  
 the Indies and the dominions belonging to the  
 Turks. I went as I was commanded and preach-  
 ed as by him directed. I was many times in  
 several nations, cast into prison, tried, and con-  
 demned, but always miraculously preserved by  
 his angel, who never failed to be my deliver-  
 er, as he was from out of the hands of the  
 Roman inquisition. for being taken up and put  
 into the Inquisition, of Rome, for preaching  
 something to the people as I was directed, by  
 the angel, my usual Guardian, came the night  
 before I was to be executed, to the prison where  
 I was confined. - And lo! the keepers being  
 all fore afraid, fell as dead men to the ground,  
 and the angel strikeing the prison door with a  
 wand it immediately flew open, and he led

me out and guided me to the seaside where he put me into a small ship, to my thinking, which in a short time, from the nearest port in Rome, brought me to this place, where, and to whom I am directed to declare, the prophesie as follows

I am well assured, that whereas I myself live an abstemious life, free from those banquets which the voluptuous gormandizing epicures, who are too frequently met withal in this corrupt age, it has been for the benefit of my soul and body, yet but that I could be glad to be dissolved, and be in Heaven

But still I have no right to hasten my dissolution, for that is directing of Providence, who knows beter when to call for us, than we can pretend to do. If the age would leave off their luxurious ways they may taste of those sweets of life which I have done, viz. I can relish herbs, sweet roots and fruit, and can fill my belly, please my appetite, and nourish my body, and refresh my faint spirits with those necessaries of use which prolong the same; dainty dishes, rich and high seasoned sauces, are my antidote, and will be destructive to such as follows them; but I can't dwell any longer on this subject, for I am obliged to declare the following Predictions; but before I speak of those things which are to come, I think it not improper to acquaint

you, that I foretold the troubles of France, in the memory of Lewis the XIV; the wars between the Emperor and Turks in Hungary; the unfortunate rebellion in England, when that gracious, good and pious Prince, was brought to the block; I also foretold the restoration of Charles the II. and the abdication of James the II. and the deplorable wars in glorious King William's reign, were foretold by me, and the peace of Urretch, I declared the glorious Queen Anns accession, and predicted hervictories and trophies; plainly foretold the death of Lewis XIV. and pious Anne and great George the First's accession to the throne ns also what happened in his reign; lastly the death of the King of Poland; with the troubles that were like to ensue; and of George the III'd's glorious accession to the throne whom God long preserve, for he will put an end to the wars,

A certain Prince, reconed the greatest blood in the world will have a great part of this kingdom sunk into a vast gulph: another who bears a great figure in the world, will be banished by his subjects a haughty king who boasts of his vast riches and says, the sun ne er goes down in his territories endeavouring to curb a white horse shall be thrice put to the soil and at length laid in the dust. A fatuous republick shall be united with the



spread eagle, and joined battle with the half moon. shall give them a total overthrow; a neighbouring country concerting with the allies, shall become terrible to all that oppose them; he further says that the Britons with their allies will destroy the French and Austrians and they will become tributary to the English; and that the protestant religion will be established in all nations of the world in Asia, Africa, Europe and America. And he further declared, as it has been revealed to him, that as there has been great scarcity in Great Britain and other parts there will be as great plenty as has been known ever since the memory of the oldest man living; for corn will be very cheap, and every thing will be proportionable to it; for the Almighty has heard the cries of the poor, and knows their wants, and will relieve them. He likewise mentions that all taxes duties and excise shall be taken off, and England shall become a free nation. Now to convince people of the reality of his travels and prophecies, he produced a journal of all the metropolies of the world, which no man ever brought the like to England before.

He likewise declared a great many wonderful predictions which will shortly come to pass in England, Scotland and Ireland France and Germany, Spain and Italy; and all the do-

minions belonging to the Turks, and that all nations shall turn to Christ and shall live in unity one with another and the Jews will be called home, and they shall return to Jerusalem and dwell there, and it shall again flourish as much as ever; but before the conclusion of these things a dreadful batt'e will ensue; the temple of Belona will be shut and people learn to war no more, but all the world will live in love and unity together; But I expect to give you a further account of Enoch the Roman Prophet, for he will shortly appear in Scripture, judgements of Mount Seir, for their hatred of Israel, as you will find in the thirtieth chapter of Ezekiel.

Moreover the word of the Lord came unto me, saying Sun of man, set thy face against Mount Seir, and prophecy against it, and say unto it, thus saith the Lord God behold, behold, I am against thee and I will make thee most desolate, becauic thou hast a perpetual hatred and has shed the blood of the children of Israel, by force of sword in the time of their calamity; thus saith the Lord God when the whole earth rejoiceth. I will make the desolate as thou didst rejoice at the inheritence of the house of Israel; becauic it was desolate; so will I do unto thee. thou shalt be desolate O Mount Seir, and all Idumea, even a of it and they shall know that I am the Lord.
