T is humbly to be prefumed, that there needs no eloquence or perfusion, to infufe into people, a belief of there being fuch a man as Enoch, the Roman Prophet for all on the greatell part of our News papers have taken notice of him for thefe feveral years. I wandered upon the Alps till I was ten years old, without any great exploits done by me, however I remembered, one day as I was contemplating the wonderful works of God in fuporiting the Sun, Moon and Stars, and this beautiful Glob, all which, I attributed to nature, I heard a voice in the Hebrew, faying, I am your Guide, and I will be your defender fear not: Upon this I turned about, and beheld a vifion refeabling an Angel flanding clofe by me, and faid. "The prayers of " thy Mother has been heard and thou halt " been miraculoufly preferved, thank Ged. " and praife his holy name, he has fnews: " fuch favours to you, ' You are defired to obferve, that till that time I had never feen any human creature, that I fhall remember, and of confequence not learned to fpeak. but my lips was immediately opered; and the ftrings of my tongue were loftd, fo that I could fpeak any language I heard. I was commanded by this vision, which has often attended me, to go and travel, and to preach the Gofpel which fhall be delivered by the hand of the Lord unto thee. and to preach it in both the Indies and the domin ons belonging to the Turks. I went as I was commanded and preached as by him directed. I was many times in everal nations, call into prifon, tried, and condemned, but always miraculoufly preferved by his angel, who never failed to be my deliverer, as he was from out of the hands of the Roman inquifition. for being taken up and put into the Inquifition, of Rome, for preaching fomething to the people as I was directed, by the angel, my usual Guardian, came the night before I wastobe executed, to the prilon where I was confined. - And lo ! the keepers being all fore afraid, fell as dead men to the ground, and the angel firikeing the prifon door with a wand it immediately flew open, and he led

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me out and guided me to the feafide where he put me into a fmall fhip, to my thinking, which in a thert time, from the nearest port in Rome, brought 'me to this place, where, and to whom i am directed to declare, the prophfey as follows

I am well affored, that whereas I myfelf live an abflemious hie, free from the fe banquets which the volupieous german dizing, epicures, who are too frequen by met withal in this corupt age. it has been for the benefit of my feul and bedy, ret but that I could be glad to be diffolved, and be in Heaven

But fill I have no right to haften my difolution, for that is directing of Providence, who-knows beter when to call for us. then we can pretend to do. It the age would leave off their luxurous ways they may talke of thefe fweets of life which I have done. viz. I can relifi herbs, fweet roots and truit, and can fill my be'ly, pleafe my appitite, and nourifh my body, and refresh my faint spirits with those nec-flaries of use which prolong the fame ; dainty diffee, tich and high feafoned fauces, are my antidote, and will be deftruffive to fuch as fallows them ; but I can't dwell any longer on this ful ject, for 1 am obliged to declare the following Precictions; but kefore I fpeak of those things which are to come, I think it not improper to acquaint

you, that I foretold the troubles of France, in the memory of Lewis the XIV; the wars between the Emperarand Turks in Hungary; the unfortunate rebelion in England, when that gracious good and pious Prince, was brought to the block; I alfo foretold the refloration of Charles the II. and the abdication of James the II. and the deplorable wars in glorious King Willia is reign, were foretold by me, and the peace of Utretch, i declared the glorions Queen Anns acceffion, and predicted hervictories and trophies: p'ainly foretold the death of Lewis XIV, and pious Anne and great George the First's acceffion to the throne ns alfo what happened in his reign ; laftly the death of the King of Poland; with the troubles that were like to enfue; and of George the IIId's glorious acceffion to the throne whom God long preferve, for he will, put an end to the wars,

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A certain Prince, reconed the greatest blood in the world will have a great part of this kingdom funk into a vaft gulph : another who bears a great figure in the world, will be banished by his subjects a haughty king who boafts of his vaft riches and fays, the fun ne er goes down in his territories endeavouring to curb 2 white horfe shall be thrice put to the foil and at lenghth laid in the dust. A famons republick shall be upited with the

firead eagle, and joined battle with the half moon. thall give them a total overthrow; a neighbouring country concerting with the allies, fl all become terrible to all thet oppose them : he further fays that the Britons with their allies will defiroy the French and Auftrians and they will become tiibutary to the English ; oud that the protestant religion will be et ablifhed in all nations of the world in Afia, Africa, Europe and America. And he further delared, as it has been revealed to him, that as there has been great fearcity in Great Britan and other parts there will be as great plenty as has been known ever fince thememory of the oldeft man living; for corn will be very cheap, and every thing will be proportionable to it; for the Almighty has heard the cries of the poor, and knows their wants, and will relieve them. He likewife mentions that all taxes duties and excife thall be taken off, and England fhallbecome a free nation. Now to convince people of the reality of his travels and prophecies, he produced a journal of all the metropolies of the world, which no man ever brought the like to England before.

He likewise declared a great many wonderful predictions which will shortly come to pass in England, Scotland and Ireland France and Germany, Spain and Italy, and all the dominions belonging to the Tarks, and that all nations thall turn to Cariff and thall live in unity one with another and the Jews will be called home, and they fhall ruturn to Jerufalem and dwell there, and it fhall again flourith as much as ever; but before the conclution of thefe things a dreadful batte will enfue; the temp e of Bel ona will be flut and people learn to war no more, but all the world will live in love and unity together; But I expect to give you a further account of Ensch the Reman Prophet, for he will flortily appearin Scripture, judgeme tsof Monnt Seir, for their hatred of Il eal, as you will find in the thirtieth chapter of Ezekiel.

Moreover he word of the Lord came unto me, faying Sun of man, fet thy face againft Mout Seir, and prophecy againft it, and fay unto it, thus faith the Lord God behold, behold, 'am againft thee and I will make thee moft defolate, becauie thou haft a perpitual hatred and has fhed the blood of the children of Ifreal, by force of fword in the time of their calamity: thus faith the Lord God when the whole earth rejoice at the inheritence of the uoufe of Ifreal; becauft it was defolate; for it I do unto thee, thou fhall be defolate to Mout Seir, and all Idumea, even a of it and they fhall know that I am the Lord, F I N I S.
