ADVERTISEMENT.

Ix the Catalogue of the Library which was published at the commencement of the Institution, a brief statement of the contents of every book was subjoined to its title. The objects I had in view were .- First. The conveying to those members who were not familiar with the technical titles of scientific books, a clearer idea of what each volume treated of; and, Secondly, The giving the more advanced student some notion of the different methods of discussing a subject followed by different authors; that, thereby, he might be enabled to judge which of two or more works on the same branch of knowledge best suited his taste, or was most likely to supply the information of which he was in pursuit. The supplement which it became necessary to print in 1826, was compiled in the same manner: many of the members having expressed their opinion, founded on experience, that such a catalogue rendered the Library more useful .and, consequently, made the privilege of having access to it more valuable-than it would be were the only index to its contents a mere list of the books. In preparing a new edition of the Catalogne, -incorporating with the former one, and its supplement, six hundred volumes purchased, or received in presents, since 1826, - the same plan has again been followed; with this extension, that the place where each work was printed, and the number of plates and cuts with which it is illustrated, have now been added.

In the former Catalogue and supplement, the books were inserted in their alphabetical order; but, in the present one, an attempt has been made to classify them, and to give them a systematic arrangement: Thus, exhibiting at one view, what books in each division of knowledge are to be found in the Library. As the members are, in general, most likely to wish for information on a certain subject,—and, consequently, to be desirous of knowing what books in the Library treat of it, it is supposed this classification will be of considerable advantage, although the henefit should be somewhat lessened by the difficulty which may sometimes be experienced in finding any particular book, owing to the members not understanding the system of arrangement, or to the errors in Judgment of the compiler. To diminish this difficulty, an index is prefixed, which, the compiler. To diminish this difficulty, an index is prefixed, which,

if well studied, will facilitate the finding any book that may be wanted. The books are divided into eight departments, and in each of these are thus arranged. Those which treat of any department systematically, or that treat of several of its branches, are alphabetically arranged under the head of Systems. Those which treat of one of its branches only, are classed under their respective subjects,except, when there are only one or two works on a subject; in which case, these are associated with such as could not be placed in any of the other subdivisions, and are placed last in that department under the head of Miscellaneous. Under the title of each subdivision is a reference, in small type, to the Systems, or to other subdivisions. These references are intended to remind the reader. that each branch is treated of in the systematic works, or to point out that information on the same subject may be found under another head. Of those books of which the Library contains different editions, the latest edition, as supposed to be the best, is placed first. In some cases, great difficulty has been felt in determining in which department, or subdivision, a book should be introduced; some books being suited to more than one head, and some not coming fairly within the scope of any. The former have been placed where it was thought they would most likely be sought for ; and the latter are alphabetically arranged in the last department, called Miscellaneous. This has no subdivisions, and consists of Dictionaries, Periodicals not belonging to any particular department, and General Literature. The blanks in the Catalogue have been left for volumes of works in the course of publication, or which are to be published immediately. A list of these is affixed, and a card on the Library table will inform the members when they may enter them in the Catalogue. C. W. BOASE.

REGULATIONS.

MADE ON 7th MARCH 1825—AMENDED ON 3d FEBRUARY 1834.

1. The Library shall be open, every Tuesday and Friday evening, from seven till nine o'clock.

2. Before receiving books from the Library, each member must produce security to the following effect,* from some respectable inhabitant of Dundee, known to the Directors.

I hereby guarantee the safe and regular return of any books that , residing at , may get from the Library of the Dundee Watt Institution;

and in case of the book or books being lost or damaged, I bind myself to pay the value thereof, as determined by the Directors, to the Treasurer for the time being, as soon as called on by him so to do.

3. Every member, when getting out or returning a book, must produce his ticket.

4. No member shall have more than one volume in his possession at a time, unless it be a volume of plates belonging to the work. These will be marked in the Catalogue.

5. No book shall be kept out longer than a fortnight, under a penalty of threepence for every addi-

tional week it is detained.

Any member, keeping out a book for twelve weeks, shall be liable to be prosecuted, at the instance of the President, for the shop price of the book, and the amount of the penalties.

6. In order that the Librarian may be enabled to report the state of the Library, all the books shall be

returned into the Library once a year,—viz. on the second Friday in September (at which time the use of the Library ceases to those who have not taken out their tickets for the next session), under a penalty of one shilling for every week they may be retained beyond that period. The Library at that time shall be closed for a fortnight; after which it shall be reopened for giving out the books.

7. If any book is lost or damaged, the Directors shall determine whether the member losing or damaging the book shall pay the price thereof, or only

the amount of the damage.

Until the value of the book, or the amount of the damage is paid, the member shall not be again admitted to the lectures, or to the use of the Library.

Every member is recommended to purchase a Catalogue, as he cannot, by a burried glance at the one which lies on the Library table, perceive what a variety of works on each branch of science and how many instructive and entertaining books the Institution possesses. Nor can he well select the books which are best adapted to his particular line of study, or which are best suited to his taste, without having a Catalogue to peruse at leisure.

A list of the books which are added to the Library will be hung up in the Hall, so that the members may copy it on the clean paper, which for that purpose is stitched in at the end of the Catalogue.

It would facilitate the work of the Librarian and his assistants, if the members, when applying for books, would mark on a slip of paper the numbers of two or three books, so that in case the one they particularly want happens to be out, no time may be lost in supplying them with one they in that case would wish to have.
