CHAP. III.

Act against Robbing of the Packet.

THE Robbing or Seizing the Mail or Pendity Packet, or the Letters and Difpatches bing the going or coming by the Common Poft, Mail. or any other Exprefiles, is Robbery, and fhall be punifhed with Death, and Confifcation of Moveables.

CHAP. X.

An Act for eftablishing a General Poft Office for all Her Majefty's Dominions, and for fettling a weekly Sum out of the Revenues thereof for the Service of the War, and other Her Majefty's Occafions.

I. The Act of 12 Car. 2. Chap. 35. and the Act of the Parliament of Scotland, in 1695, Will. Parl. 1. Seff. 5. Ghap. 20. repealed.

II. There shall be One General Post Office established within the City of be erected, London, from whence all Letters and Packets may be fent into any Part of Great Britain and Ireland, the West Indies, or any of Her Majefty's Dominions, or into any other Country beyond the Seas ; and One Mafter of the

faid General Poft Office fhall be appointed by the Queen, by Letters Patent under the Great Scal of Great Britain, by the Style of Her Majefly's Poftmafter General; which Mafter and his Deputies, and their Servants and Agents, and no other Perfon or Perfons whatfoever, fhall have the receiving, carrying, and delivering of all Letters and Packets to and from all Places of Great Britain and Ireland, the Weft Indics, and other Her Majefty's Dominions, and alfo to and from all Countries where he fhall fettle Pofts or running Meffengers;

Except fuch Letters as fhall refpec-Exceptively concern Goods fent by common tions. Carriers of Goods, by Carts, Waggons, or Pack Horfes, and fhall be refpectively delivered with the Goods fuch Letters do concern, without Hire or other Advantage; and except Letters of Merchants, and Mafters of Ships or Veffels, of Merchandife, or any Lading therein, fent on Board fuch Ships, whereof fuch: Mafters are Owners, fo as fuch Letters be delivered without Hire ; and except Commiffions, the Return thereof, Affidavits, Writs*, Proceís, or Returns, iffuing A 3

iffuing out of any Court, and alfo Letters fent by private Friends in their Journey, or by Meffengers fent on Purpofe, concerning the private Affairs of any Perfon.

Carriers, &cc. not to carry Letters.

III. Nothing in the faid Exceptions fhall extend to, or give Authority to common Carriers of Goods, their Servants or Agents, to receive, collect, or deliver, with or without Hire, any Letters or Packets of Letters whatfoever, that do not concern Goods in their Carts, Waggons, or on their Pack Horfes; nor to any Owners or Drivers of Stage Coaches; nor to any Owners, Mafter, or Commanders of Paffage Boats, failing between any Part of Great Britain or Ireland, and any Parts beyond the Seas, or their Servants or Agents, nor to any Paffengers on Board fuch Veffels, nor to the Owners of any Veffel paffing on any River to and from any Parts of Great Britain and Ireland. or the West Indies, or other Her Majefty's Dominions, although fuch Drivers, Owners, &c. do not receive Hire or other Advantage for the fame.

Such Poftmafter General fhall a chief be at Liberty to keep One Chief Letter Office to Office in the City of *Edinburgb*, ano-^{bin} Erdinther in the City of *Dublin*, and other burgh, &cc-Chief Offices in Her Majefty's Provinces in *America*, and in each of the *Leeward Iflands*, and appoint Deputies under him for improving the Revenue hereby granted.

VI. * It thall be lawful for fuch Poftmafter General and his Deputies, for the Ufe of Her Majefly, to receive for the Portage of all Letters and Packets_{Rates} for directed on Board, or brought from on ^{Ship} Let-Board any Ship riding in any Port in Her Majefly's Dominions, 1d. over and above the Inland Rates.

X. It fhall be lawful for the Poft-potmafter General to fet up Crofs Stages medice to to and from any Place, and take for Staget. all Letters and Packets which he fhall convey in fuch Crofs Stages; as alfo for all By or Way Letters, the fame Rates, in Proportion to the Diftances of Places,

Provifo for Merchants. XIII. All Merchants Accounts not exceeding One Sheet of Paper, and all Bills of Exchange, Invoices, and Bills of Lading, fhall be allowed, without Rate in the Price of the Letters; and likewife the Covers of Letters, not exceeding One-fourth Part of a Sheet of Paper, fent by the Way of Vienna, Marfeilles, Venice, or Legborn, to be fent to or from Turkey, fhall be allowed to pafs without Payment for the fame. At Poft Towns, the Poftmafter to receive all Letters from on Board Ship.

XV. All Letters and Packets that by any Mafter of a Ship, or any of his Company or Paffengers therein, fhall be brought to any Port within Her Majefty's Dominions, (other than Letters before excepted), fhall be delivered to the Deputies, only of fuch Poftmafter General, to be fent Poft to the General Poft Office, to be delivered according to their Directions, upon Pain of forficing 51. for every Offence against this Act.

XVI. Every Mafter or other Perfon, And to for every Letter or Packet he fhall de-Bonger liver unto fuch Deputies, fhall receive a Penny a L. he figning a Certificate of the Number of Letters delivered, and by what Veffel they came, and of the Time he delivered the fame, and giving a Receipt for fuch Pence as he fhall receive; which Certificate and Receipt fhall be by the next Poft returned to the Poftmafter General, together with the Letters; and the Deputy fhall have Credit for for much Money as he fhall pay on that Account.

XVII. No Perfon or Perfons what None to foever, or Body Politick or Corporate, ter but in Great Britain and Ireland, or Her the Poltmatter Majefty's Plantations in the Weft Index General and America, other than fuch Polt Oputies, mafter General and his Deputies, thall prefume to receive, carry, or deliver, any Letter or Packet, (other than as before excepted), or make any Collection of Letters, or employ any Foot B Poft.

Poft, Horfe Poft, Boat, or Conveyance whatfoever, for receiving, carrying, or delivering Letters or Packets by See or Land, or any River within Her Majefty's Dominions, on Pain of forfeiting 51. for every Offence, and 1001. for every Week they shall fo collect, carry, or deliver Letters, &cc.

Penalty.

Deputy Postmaster to account for By-Letters. XVIII. If any Perfon employed as a Deputy Pofmafter, or otherwife, fhall not duly account for all By or Way Letters, or fhall not on his Poft Bills mention all the By or Way Letters he fhall receive, or fhall embezzle or deftroy any fuch By-Letters or Packets, fuch Perfon fhall forfeit, as the Perfons herein prohibited fetting up other Pofts, or collecting or delivering Letters.

Penalties XIX. The faid Penalties fhall be rehow to be covered in any of Her Majefty's Courts of Record, the one Moiety to Her Majefty, and the other to fuch Perfons who fhall 'fue for the fame; and fuch Perfon informing fhall have Cofts.

Letters XXII. Nothing herein fhall prohibit from the carrying of Letters or Packets to or any Place from the next Poft Stage above Six next Stage above Six Miles

XXIV. If the Mail fhall be carried The out of Great Britain to Places beyond not to be the Seas, in any Ship which is not carried out of a free Ship, and navigated with fuch Great Bri-Seamen as by Law are required, the Foreign Postmaster General shall forfeit 1001. Ships. One Moiety to Her Majesty, and the other to him who shall fue for the fame in any Court of Record *.

XXV. The Deputy acting under the Poft-Poftmafter General within Scotland, and &c. how all Officers and Deputies acting under to qualify. him, on taking the Oaths of Allegiance and Abjuration, and fubfcribing the fame, with the Affurance appointed by any Laws of Scotland or of Great Britain, shall be qualified to exercise their refpective Employments.

XXVII. The Poftmaster General Postand his Deputies shall observe fuch mafters to Orders for the Settlement of Pofts and fuch Stages, as well for the carrying and as Her B 2 conveying

Debts for XXX. All Sums not exceeding 51. how to be that fhall be due for Letters or Packets, recovered or which shall be received for the Port of Letters, without paying the Monies to the Receiver General of the faid Revenues for Her Majesty's Ufe, shall be recovered before Justices of Peace, in the fame Manner as fmall Tithes are by the Laws of England; and fuch Debt shall be preferable in Payment before any Debt to a private Perfon. *

XL. No Perfon shall willingly open, No Letdetain, or delay, or caufe, permit, or ters to be fuffer to be opened, detained, or delay-detained. ed, any Letter or Packet, after the fame is delivered into the Post Office, or into the Hands of any Perfon employed forreceiving or carrying Poft Letters, and before Delivery to the Perfons to whom. they are directed or for their Ufe, ex-Excepcept by an express Warrant in Writing, under the Hands of One of the Principal Secretaries of State, for every fuch. opening, detaining, or delaying,-or except where the Party to whom fuch. Letter or Packet Shall be directed, shall refuse or neglect to pay the fame; and except Letters or Packets returned for. want of true Directions, and where the Party cannot be found ; and every Perfon offending in Manner aforefaid, or who fhall embezzle any fuch Letters or. B 3 Packets.

Packets, shall forfeit 201.; the faid Penalties for every fuch Offence committed in Scotland, to be recovered in the Court of Seffion or Exchequer there, by fuch Perfons as will fue for the fame, with Cofts; and over and above fuch Penalty, every Perfon fo offending, shall be incapable of holding any Office, Truft, or Employment, in the Post Office.

XLI. No Perfon shall be capable of be fworn. exercifing the Office of Poftmaster General, or any other Employment relating to the Poft Office, unless fuch Perfons shall first have taken the following Oath before fome Justice of the Peace for the Coanty where he refides.

The Oath. T A. B. do fwear, That I will not wittingly, willingly, or knowingly, open, detain, or delay, or caufe, procure, permit, or suffer to be opened, detained, or delayed, any Letter or Letters, Packet or Packets, which (hall come into my Hands, Power, or Cuftody, by Reafon of my Employment in, or relating to, the Post Office ; except by the Consent of the Perfon or Perfons to whom the fame is or shall be directed, or by an express Warrant in Writing, under the Hand

of One of the Principal Secretaries of State, for that Purpole; or except in fuch Cafes where the Party or Parties to whom fuch Letter or Letters, Packet or Packets, shall be directed, or who is or are bereby chargeable with the Payment of the Port or Ports thereof, fhall refufe or neglect to pay the fame; and except fuch Letters or Packets as fhall be returned for want of true Directions, or when the Party or Parties to whom the fame is or fhall be directed cannot be found; and that I will not any Way embezzle any fuch Letter or Letters, Packet or Packets, as aforefaid.

XLIV. No Poftmafter General, or No Offihis Deputies, or any Perfon employed err to inhis Deputies, or any Perfon employed retro to the termedule of the Poft in Elections. Office, thall, by Word, Meffage, or Writing, or in any other Manner whatfoever, endeavour to perfuade any Elector to give, or diffuade him from giving his Vote for the Choice of any Knight of the Shire, Citizen, Burgefs, or Baron, to ferve in Parliament ; and every Offieer offending therein thall forfeit 1001.; One Moiety thereof to the Informer, the other to the Poor of the Parifin where fuch Offence fhall be committed ; 20

to be recovered in the Court of Exchequer in *Scotland*; and every Perfon convicted on fuch Suit fhall become incapable of ever bearing or executing any Office or Place of Truft whatfoever under Her Majefty.

CHAP. XXXIII.

An Act for obviating a Doubt which hath arifen, concerning the ufual Allowance made upon the Delivery of Letters fent by the Penny Poft, to Places out of the Cities of London and Weftminsfer, and Borough of Southwark, and the refpective Suburbs thereof.

Penny Poft. Nothing in the Act of the 9th of Queen Anne, Chap. 10. fhall extend to reftrain any Perfon carrying Letters by The Penny Poft, from demanding or taking for every Letter originally fent by the Penny Poft, and not first paffing by the General Poft, and from thence transmitted by the Penny Poft, which shall be delivered to any Perfon out of the Cities of London and Weft-minfler.

An Act for the more effectually preventing the fraudulent Removal of Tobacco by Land or Water, and for the Eafe of the fair Trader in Tobacco; and for afcertaining the Rates payable for the Portage of certain Letters; and for amending and explaining the Laws relating to the Sale of Spirituous Liquors by Retail.

CHAP. XXIV.

An Act for preventing Frauds and Abufes in relation to the fending and receiving of Letters and Packets free from the Duty of Poftage.

I. That, from the 1ft Day of May No Letters or 1764, fo long as the Revenue arifing Pracets in the Poft Office thall continue to that be be carried to, and made Part of the arm both Aggregate Fund, no Letters or Packets fine has are fent by the Poft fhall be exempted from or to the paying the Duty of Poftage, except all Kingfuch as thall be fent from or to the King's moft Excellent Majefly.*

II. It shall be lawful for the Lord Commif-High Treafurer, or Commissioners of the Treathe Treafury, the Lord High Admifury, &c. may aural, or Commiffioners of the Admicertain ralty, The Principal Secretaries of State, Perfons in their re-The Secretary at War, The Poftma-Offices to fter General, and the Deputies of the frank Let-Postmaster General for Scotland, Irethe King's land, and America, to authorize certain Perfons in each of their Offices refpectively, a Lift of whole Names shall be transmitted by the Principal Officer authorizing the fame to the General Post Office in London, to make and fubfcribe an Indorfement upon each Letter or Packet which fhall concern the publick Bufinefs of their refpective Offices, lignifying that fuch Letter or Packet is upon His Majefty's Service, and to feal the fame with the Seal of the Office; and if any Perfon employed as aforefaid fhall knowingly make and fubfcribe fuch Indorfement, or procure the fame to be made, upon any Letter or Packet which does not really concern the Bufinefs of the Office, he fhall, for the first Offence, forfeit and pay the Sum of Five Pounds, to be recovered and applied as by the ninth of Queen Anne

is directed; and, for the fecond Offence, fhall be difinified from his Office.

Provided, that the Number of Limita-Perfons fo to be appointed to make Number. fuch Indorfement fhall not exceed Two in any One Office, except only in the Admiralty and War Offices; and that the Number to be appointed in the Admiralty Office fhall not exceed Eight in Time of Peace, or Twelve in Time of War; and, in the War Office, fhall not exceed Six in Time of Peace, or Ten in Time of War.
