## STIRLINGSHIRE,

ONE of the most important and beautiful counties in Scotland, is situated partly in the Highlands and partly in the Lowlands; bounded on the east by the county of Linlithgow and the river Forth, on the south and west by Dumbartonshire, on the north by the shires of Perth and Clackmannan (which latter county touches it also on the east), and on the south and east by portions of Lanarkshire. Its boundaries are in many places distinctly marked by water-courses or lakes—the principal boundary line on the north being the Forth, the Avon on the east, the Kelvin river on the south, the Endrick water on the south-west, and Loch Lomond on the west. Its length from east to west is thirty-six miles; its breadth varies from twelve to twenty miles. The shire comprises an area of four hundred and sixty-seven square miles, or 298,579 acres.

The county, from its situation between the Firths of Forth and Clyde, and on the direct passage from the northern to the southern parts of the island, has been the scene of many memorable transactions; and there are few counties where monuments of antiquity are so frequently to be met with; neither does it yield to any point of modern improvements or in the beauties of scenery.

The county, as has been said, is partly Highland and partly Lowland. The former, which is the western quarter and adjacent to Loch Lomond, is a mountainous district; here the majestic Ben Lomond rises to the height of more than three thousand feet. East from this Highland part the land becomes flat, or gently inclining towards the Forth of the Endrick. In the centre of the county the ground is again elevated into a series of hills, of which those of the greatest altitude are from thirteen to fifteen hundred feet; from one of these eminences, in Kilsyth parish, there is obtained one of the finest views in Scotland; it is computed to embrace an extent of 12,000 square miles. Many of the hills in the central, and more especially in the southern division, have their sides and even their summits clothed with a fine grass sward, which affords excellent pasturage for sheep. The eastern division of the county consists of beautiful carse land, in many places quite flat, and in others presenting a succession of inclined planes, gradually rising towards the south from the rich valley of the Forth. Almost every variety of soil to be met with in Scotland occurs in Stirlingshire; but the most common and the most fertile in the county is the alluvial or carse land, which occupies many thousand acres on the banks of the Forth. In this species of soil there are beds of shells, clay, marl, and moss. In the western and central districts, on the banks of the rivers, the land is generally of a light and gravelly description; while patches of rich loam present their surface to the husbandman in other parts of the county. From the great variety of the soil, the system of agriculture in Stirlingshire naturally cannot be uniform, nor its produce equally abundant or limited to any particular species; large crops of wheat, barley, beans, peas, turnips, potatoes, &c., are raised; the culture of artificial grasses has also been very generally adopted in this county. The extensive ranges of moor in the upland district are exclusively devoted to the feeding of numerous flocks of sheep, which are of the old black-faced or Highland breed; there are but few cattle reared, the county being sufficiently supplied by the drovers from the Highlands. Stirlingshire is inferior to few districts of Scotland in the quantity and variety of its mineral productions, the most abundant of which are coal, ironstone, limestone, and sandstone. The principal coal pits are in the southern base of the Lennox hills; but this valuable article is also obtained in the eastern district, in the vicinity of the Forth and Clyde Canal. Ironstone, limestone, and sandstone are found in the same districts with the coal.

The Forth is the principal river in Stirlingshire; it takes its rise from a spring near the summit of Ben Lomond, and, after receiving in its course the Teith, the Allan, and the Devon, expands into that noble estuary called the Firth of Forth.

## STIRLING, CAMBUSKENNETH AND NEIGHBOURHOOD.

**S**TIRLING is an ancient town, the capital of the county and parish of its name, and a royal and parliamentary burgh; 35 miles W. by S. from Edinburgh, 28 N. by E. from Glasgow, 33½ S.W. from Perth, 11 N.W. from Falkirk, 7 W. from Alloa, and 6 S. from Dunblane. Like the old town of Edinburgh, Stirling is situated on the sloping ridge of a rock, the precipitous end of which, towards the west, is occupied by the castle. The prospects from hence are most delightful and extensive; towards the east, especially, they are enhanced by the windings of the Forth, and the ruins of the Abbey of Cambuskenneth, the tower of which has been renovated and ornamented at great expense, the Abbey Craig, with Wallace's monument on the summit, and the city of Edinburgh in the distance. While the situation of Stirling is thus one of the most pleasing and picturesque in the country, it is a place noted for its antiquities and the historical associations connected with them.

As was the case with Edinburgh, Stirling arose as a suburb in contiguity with the castle. The latter stands on a basaltic rock, and around it is a pleasant walk, carried from the town, in many places cut out of the solid rock; and from this walk are several very interesting views, and it affords an excellent opportunity for examining the basaltic pillars of which the rock is composed. On the south side of the castle is a flat enclosed piece of ground, called the "Valley": it was the spot where tournaments were held, and on one side is a place where the ladies used to sit and witness the feats of valour of the combatants, which is still designated the ladies' "rock." This piece of ground is now tastefully laid out as a cemetery, and is quite in keeping with the beautiful scenery by which it is environed; it contains several handsome monuments, chiefly the martyrs of the Reformation. The palace, within the castle walls, is a stately structure, externally in the form of a square, and very richly and curiously ornamented with grotesque figures standing upon pillars or pedestals, in good preservation. For several centuries Stirling Castle was little else than a single tower; at the end of the 11th century it rose into consequence, and in the course of the succeeding century it attained the distinction of being one of the four principal fortresses in the kingdom. Such it continued during the sanguinary and protracted contest which Edward I. of England commenced for the subjugation of Scotland, when it was frequently taken and re-taken, after tedious sieges, and under circumstances which prove its great strength and importance at that period. In the course of that eventful struggle between the independence and usurpation, Stirling and its vicinity formed the theatre of some of the most brilliant achievements of Sir William Wallace; of these none were so remarkable as the battle of Stirling, fought on 13th September, 1297, in which the English army was signally defeated with great slaughter, and the eventual battle of Bannockburn, fought by Robert the Bruce, on the 24th of June, 1314. Stirling Castle first became a favourite residence of royalty about the reign of James I., whose son, James II., was born in it. Perhaps one of the most interesting places in the castle is a room in the west building of the quadrangle, known as the "Douglas Room," so called from being the apartment in which William, eighth earl of Douglas, was killed with a dagger by the hand of King James II. On the evening of the 18th of November, 1855, it was almost destroyed by fire, but since it has been as nearly as possible restored to its original appearance. From wood saved from the fire were made mementoes, which were readily bought by the tourist; and on the occasion of the visit of the Prince and Princess of Wales to Stirling in 1864, the Princess was graciously pleased to accept from the late Mr Crawford, bookseller, a copy of the "Lady of the Lake," handsomely bound in the oak of the Douglas Room.

Being the county town, the courts of the sheriff are held here, and are attended by a number of procurators resident in the place. The chief manufactures of Stirling are carpets, tartans, tweeds, wineys, and shawls, for which it has been long noted, and these branches engage a considerable number of weavers. There is also a large wool-spinning factory, and two coach-making establishments, which employ several hundred workmen. The other leading avocations are tanning, nail making, and agricultural implement making.

There has sprung up in Southfield and Spittals Park, the property of Spittals Hospital, what may be called the west end of the town. A large area is covered with beautiful urban villas, squares and crescents, and these all being in the immediate neighbourhood of the King's Park, renders them very pleasant places of residence. The approaches to the town, on every side, are truly grand, and probably equalled by few and excelled by none in Scotland; large sums have been expended upon the main streets, and to good purpose, for few towns are better paved, or lighted with purer gas, than Stirling; it is also well supplied with excellent water, brought to the town from a distance of about six miles; so that Stirling is perhaps one of the most pleasant towns for residence, as well as one of the most beautiful in the three kingdoms. New courthouses have been erected in Viewfield Gardens in a substantial and elegant style. The Stirling Tract Depot is a handsome building, erected at a cost of nearly £5000, situated at the corner of King Street and Murray Place.

On the Abbey Craig, a distance of two miles east from Stirling, has been erected the Wallace monument, a noble structure to the memory of Sir William Wallace, fitly built on the Craig on which Wallace's army encamped the night before the battle of Stirling Bridge. On the 24th of November, 1877, a monument to King Robert the Bruce, occupying a commanding position in front of Stirling Castle and overlooking the battlefields of Stirling and Bannockburn, was unveiled by Lady Alexander.

CAMBUSKENNETH is a small village in the parish of Logie, county of Clackmannan, situated opposite to Stirling, on the north side of the river Forth, on one of the peninsulas formed by the windings of the river.

## BRIDGE OF ALLAN,

WITH THE PARISHES OF LECROFT AND LOGIE, AND THE  
 VILLAGES OF CAUSEWAYHEAD, MENSTRIE, AND BLAIR  
 LOGIE.

BRIDGE OF ALLAN, a beautifully romantic and fashionable  
 watering place, is situate on the river Allan, about one mile and  
 a half from its confluence with the Forth, three miles from Stirling,

and nearly at the western extremity of the Ochil hills. A small portion of it is in the parish of Lecropt, and the remainder in that of Logie; and it is also situated in two counties—Stirling and Perth. It is a post town and a station on the Scottish Central Section of the Caledonian line. It is resorted to by persons from all parts of the world, as well for pleasure as for restoration of health, on account of the mildness of the climate, the beauty of the surrounding scenery, and the fame of its saline mineral waters. Prior to the discovery of these springs, the place was comparatively little known, and presented to the tourist the unassuming aspect of a small and quiet country hamlet, with a few whitewashed and thatched cottages embosomed in venerable trees, together with an old mill and an ancient public house, offering “entertainment for man and beast.” Since that period things have greatly changed, and Bridge of Allan is now a large and handsome village, consisting of well-built houses and tasteful villas. There are also several hotels, which for elegance and comfort are not surpassed in Scotland. In 1871 Bridge of Allan was made a burgh under the provisions of the Lindsay Act. Its municipal affairs are managed by nine commissioners, who, from their own number, elect a senior and two junior magistrates. The higher part of the village in the neighbourhood of the Wells of Coneyhill is of considerable elevation. It is, however, chiefly to its mineral wells that Bridge of Allan owes its principal claims to attention. These are situated on the Airthrey estate, the property of Lord Abercromby, and within a few minutes’ walk of the village. They are highly celebrated for their medicinal virtues, externally and internally, and have proved of great benefit to numerous invalids. There are convenient baths, and the hotels before noticed are admirably suited for the reception of families and other visitors; while the walks around are beneficial auxiliaries in improving the health of the invalids. Among the business establishments, besides the inns, are large bleaching and dye works, and a paper manufactory. The Bridge of Allan connects the parishes of Lecropt and Logie, at the confluence of the Teith and Allan, and is celebrated for the beauty of its scenery. Acreage of the parish of Lecropt, 2,968; population in 1871, 535. Bridge of Allan at the same period numbered 3,055 inhabitants. In 1881 the population of Bridge of Allan was 2,462.

LOGIE, or Blair Logie, is a parish situated on the Forth at a part where the counties of Perth, Stirling, and Clackmannan meet, a portion of the parish being situated in each of the three counties, the larger portion being on the north bank of the river Forth, opposite Stirling.

**CAUSEWAYHEAD** is a small village in the parish of Logie, about midway between Bridge of Allan and Stirling, situated in the counties of Stirling and Clackmannan, and at the foot of Abbey Craig—a detached portion of the Ochil range—which presents a precipitous front of about 560 feet above the level of the Forth. On its most elevated ridge, and almost perpendicularly over the village stands Wallace's monument. It is in the form of a Scotch baronial tower, surmounted by a crown, and is 220 feet in height. The foundation was laid June 24th, 1861 (the anniversary of the Battle of Bannockburn), with masonic honours, by the Duke of Athole. From the summit, which is reached by a spiral stair, the view is rich in natural beauty and historic associations. Population in 1871, 336.

**MENSTRIE** is a village partly in the parish of Logie, in the southern part of Perthshire, and partly in that of Alloa, Clackmannanshire.

FALKIRK,

BOTHKENNAR, CAMELON, CARNOCH, CARRON, CARRON  
 SHORE, LAURISTON, POLMONT, REDDING, AND SLA-  
 MANNAN.

FALKIRK is an ancient town, and the principal town of the east-  
 ern district of the county, as it is of the parish to which it gives  
 name. The extreme length of the parish is nine miles, its breadth five  
 and a quarter miles. It is bounded on the north by Denny and Larbert,  
 on the south by Slamannan, on the east by Polmont, and on the  
 west by Dumbartonshire. The town is twenty-four miles west from  
 Edinburgh, twenty-two north-east from Glasgow, eleven south-east  
 from Stirling, and three from Grangemouth. It is situated on the  
 face of an eminence, overlooking the broad expanse called "the  
 Carse or Kerse of Falkirk," and commanding a most extensive pros-  
 pect, which, for beauty of landscape, is scarcely surpassed in any part  
 of Scotland. The views comprise (besides the rich and fertile "carse,"  
 which is well cultivated and interspersed with villages and several  
 gentlemen's seats), the river Forth, with vessels passing to and from  
 the ports of Grangemouth, Alloa, Kincardine, &c., and also up and  
 down the great canal, which intersects the county about half a mile  
 north of the town, while to the south it is bounded by Callander  
 wood, shrouding a rising ground a short distance from the town.  
 Few situations more eligible for rendering a place handsome could  
 have been selected. As it is, the town has a very good appearance.  
 It consists of (excluding a number of back streets and lanes, or  
 wynds) one principal street, which is long and irregular. In general,  
 the houses are built of hewn stone, and the town is ornamented with

a steeple 146 feet high, in which are two bells and a clock, and immediately to the west of which an equestrian statue of the late Duke of Wellington was erected in 1854 by public subscription. It is of stone, and is a great ornament to the High Street. In the year 1859 a commodious Exchange or Corn Market was built on the north side of the parish church, in which a stock market is held every Thursday. The dues or customs from the market amount to about £170 per annum. The port of Grangemouth, situate about three miles to the north-east of Falkirk, is connected with the burgh by railway, formed by the Forth and Clyde Canal Company. A number of small villas are situated towards the north of the town; they form a street, about half a mile in length, uniting to the town Grahamston and Bainsford, and thereby forming a continuous double line of upwards of a mile in extent. The town is now governed by a provost, three bailies, and eight councillors. This body first came into existence in 1833, but for want of any power of raising money to carry on a municipal government, the powers of the magistrates were latent. This defect was remedied by an Act passed called the "Falkirk Police and Improvement Act," under which the magistrates assess the inhabitants for police and improvement purposes. The County Buildings, erected in 1868, in lieu of the old court-house, is situated in Hope street; the building includes court-rooms for the sheriff and justices, procurators' hall, &c. At the same time a new prison and county police office were erected. New Burgh Buildings were erected in Newmarket Street in 1878. The inhabitants of Falkirk have been long celebrated for a manly spirit of independence, both political and religious, combined with a liberality of sentiment and sociality of intercourse seldom witnessed elsewhere. Falkirk, as it is situate in a very populous district, with no large town in the immediate neighbourhood, commands an extensive inland trade, no market being held in the seven or eight surrounding parishes; and the various iron and other works (from which the town derives material support) render it the market town for between fifty and sixty thousand people. Under the head of manufactures, we may mention, in addition to the leather trade in tanning and currying, the making of fire bricks and tiles, with a distillery and several chemical works. Besides the famous Carron Works, which are the oldest and most extensive in Scotland, there are the Abbots Iron Works, the Falkirk Iron Works, the Gowan Bank Iron Works, the Grahamston Iron Company's Works, the Burnbank Iron Works, the Etna Iron Works, the Parkhouse Iron Works, the Camelon Iron Works, the Callander Iron Works, the Springfield Iron Works, and about a mile to the west are the Port Downie Iron Works, the Forth and Clyde Iron



Works, and the Gael Iron Works. There are various coal works in the vicinity, and extensive timber yards and flour mills. The Union Canal joins the Forth and Clyde Canal about a mile west from the town, but its trade is limited, it having been purchased by the Edinburgh and Glasgow Railway Company. About half a mile south of the town it passes through a tunnel 796 yards in length. Falkirk was created a burgh of barony in the reign of James I., afterwards a burgh of regality in the reign of Charles I., but no baron bailie has been appointed for many years. A body of "stent masters," chosen by the different trades of the town, formerly managed its affairs, but that body being abolished by Act of Parliament, their powers and property were transferred to the magistrates. Justice of peace courts and petty sessions are held as occasion requires. A sheriff court was first opened at Falkirk in 1834, for the eastern district of the county, comprising the parishes of Falkirk, Polmont, Muiravonside, Slamannan, Larbert, Bothkennar, and Airth. A fine block of stone buildings was erected in 1876, at the north side of the High street, styled the Glebe Buildings. There are five branch banks and a savings bank in the town. The old church, founded by King Malcolm Canmore in 1057, was some years since taken down, and a new one, of the Gothic order, erected on its site; a tower connected with the ancient structure was, however, permitted to retain its position. In the churchyard lie the bodies of Sir John de Graham (the friend of Wallace) and Sir John Stuart, who were slain on the memorable field of Falkirk, in 1298, whilst fighting for the independence of their country against Edward I.; two plain stones mark the spots of their interment. In the same cemetery stands the monument of two brave officers, Sir Robert Munro, of Foulis, and his brother, Dr. Munro, who fell in the second battle of Falkirk, January 17th, 1746. Various sects have places of worship in Falkirk and neighbourhood; the situation of each, with their respective officiating ministers, are given in a subsequent page. All the burial grounds being closed by order of the sheriff, a new cemetery has been provided for the entire parish; it embraces an area of eleven acres, and is situate about a mile west of Falkirk. There are three public schools, and a large academy and boarding establishment. A market for grain is held on Thursday. Seven fairs are annually held for cattle and horses, namely, the last Thursday in January, the first Thursday in March, the third Thursday in May, the second Thursday in June, the second Thursday in July, the third Thursday in August, and the first Thursday in November; besides two days for hiring servants (the first Thursday in April, and the last Thursday in October), called feeing Thursdays, which are numerously attended. The three Falkirk

trysts, supposed to be the largest cattle markets in the kingdom, are held in the neighbourhood on the second Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday in August, September, and October. The population of Falkirk, including Grahamston and Bainsford, was in 1871, 11,712, and in 1881, 13,175.

CARNOCK is a small district in the parish of St. Ninian, but in the postal delivery of Falkirk.

CAMELON is a village in the parish of Falkirk, situate on the road from Stirling to Falkirk, about a mile west from the latter town, on the line of the great canal; it consists chiefly of one tolerably well-built street.

CARRON is a village in the parish of Larbert, one and a half miles east therefrom; it is situated on the river Carron, and about two and a half miles from Falkirk.

## GRANGEMOUTH

**I**S a busy and thriving seaport in the parish of Falkirk, three miles from that town, twenty-seven from Edinburgh, and twenty-five from Glasgow. It is situated on the Firth of Forth, at the junction of the river Carron with the Clyde and Forth Canal. The formation of this place was commenced in 1777 by the late Sir Lawrence Dundas, for the accommodation of the shipping passing through the Canal to and from the Clyde and Glasgow, of which it is the natural eastern port. It is now a place of importance, and displays the enterprise of the British merchant, in an eminent degree, by its numerous and commodious quays, granaries, and warehouses for goods, and its capacious wet docks and basins for timber. It has also shipbuilding yards, a graving dock, ironfoundry, and timber-yard. Rope and sail making is extensively carried on, and there are sawmills and large collieries adjacent. The Commercial Bank of Scotland, Limited, and Bank of Scotland have branches here. There are two good school-houses—one erected by the Earl of Zetland, to which a library is attached, the other a public Board school, erected in 1875, at a cost of about £3,000, and now being enlarged at a cost of £1,200. The wet dock, opened in 1843, affording room for nearly 20,000 tons of shipping, being found too small for the trade, additional dock accom-

modation was added. The growth of the port is no doubt attributable to the very moderate rate of charges, as well as to the facilities for vessels of the largest tonnage to enter the docks. The canal rates of toll are also low, and an abundant supply of lighters is always in the port. The area of basins for timber exceeds 17 acres. New docks were opened on the 3rd of June, 1882. The ground acquired for their construction amounted to nearly sixty acres, and nineteen and a half acres of this is the water area of the new docks and timber basins, the actual dockage area being about ten and a half acres. On the same date a new park, which covers eight and a half acres, kindly granted by the Earl of Zetland, was thrown open to the inhabitants. A branch railway, which join the North British at Falkirk, was formed in 1859, thus putting the port in connection with the railway system of the country. The Caledonian Railway Company have also a branch line, which joins the Scottish central section at Larbert. There are large imports of timber, grain, flax, &c., from Norway, Denmark, America, Prussia, and the Baltic in general, besides a considerable coasting trade. Steamers ply regularly to and from London, Rotterdam, Hamburg, Stettin, Dunkirk, Copenhagen, Middlesbro', &c. The advantages and cheapness of the port, and the readiness of communication by canal and railway with the populous manufacturing districts, and with inexhaustible supplies of iron and coal, combine to invest Grangemouth with unrivalled advantages for the above imports and other continental produce, as well as for the export of the mineral and other productions of the west of Scotland. Near the canal stands Kerse House, the seat of the Earl of Zetland. There are an Established church, two Free churches, and an United Presbyterian church. One of the Free churches was built three years ago, at a cost of about £4,000, and is entirely free of debt. It is a beautiful building. Opposite to it are the elegant new Town Buildings, built to competitive designs about two years ago, at a cost of close on £5,000. It comprises a large hall, capable of holding 1,000 persons, Town Clerk's offices, Commissioners' chamber, &c. Both of the foregoing fine buildings add very much to the appearance of the new town. The old town hall was sold and converted into shops and small halls for general purposes; this alteration enhances the appearance of the main street of the old town. The population of Grangemouth, in 1871, was 2,569, and in 1881, 4,424.

## KILSYTH, AND THE VILLAGE OF BANTON.

**KILSYTH** is a considerable town and burgh in the parish of  
its name, 35 miles s.w. from Edinburgh, 15 s. from Stirling,  
between 12 and 13 n. from Glasgow, nearly 12 w. by s. from Falkirk,  
and 4 from Cumbernauld; situated on the main road leading to the  
three first-named places. It is a straggling and irregularly built  
place; a considerable proportion of the inhabitants are employed in  
weaving for Glasgow houses and resident manufacturers. The  
parish is abundantly stocked with coal and ironstone, vast quantities

of the latter being supplied to the Carron Iron Works, near Falkirk and to Gartsherrie and Langloan near Coatbridge. The district is about seven miles in length, and three and a half in breadth. In form the parish is an irregular oblong; bounded by St Ninians and Fintry on the north, Cumbernauld and Kirkintilloch on the south, Denny on the east, and Campsie on the west. It is watered by the Carron and Kelvin rivers; it also contains one of the reservoirs of the Forth and Clyde Canal. In 1637, near the village of Kilsyth, the Covenanters, commanded by General Baillie, were defeated by Montrose. Kilsyth formerly gave the title of viscount to the unfortunate family of Livingston, attainted in 1715 for their attachment to the house of Stuart; in the burialplace of this family the bodies of the last Lady Kilsyth and her infant son lay embalmed for many years. About the middle of the parish is a hill which exhibits a fine specimen of basaltic columns. Railway communication with Glasgow was opened here in 1878, through the Blane Valley section of the North British Line. Besides the Parish Church there are places of worship for members of the Free Church, the United Presbyterians, Congregationalists, Wesleyan Methodists, and Roman Catholics. Branches of the Royal Bank of Scotland, and the National Bank of Scotland, Limited, are established in the village, also a Savings Bank. Fairs are held on the first Friday in April, and the third Friday in November. Acreage of the parish, 13,121; population in 1871, 6313, and in 1881, 6836, the town numbering 5300.

BANTON and HIGH BANTON are small villages, situated about two and a half miles north-east of Kilsyth, in that parish, and about six miles south-west from Denny; a parish church is at Banton, and also a public school.

## ST. NINIANS AND BANNOCKBURN,

WITH CAMBUSBARRON, EAST PLEAN, AND WHINS OF MILTON.

ST. NINIANS is a considerable village or town in the parish of its  
 name, about one mile from Stirling, situate on the road from  
 that town to Glasgow. The form of the parish is irregular in its extent,

but may be computed at about ten miles from east to west, and about six miles from north to south, bounded on the east by the parish of Airth, on the south by Larbert, Dunipace, and Denny, on the west by Fintry and Gargunnoch, on the north by the river Forth, which separates it from Kincardine, Lecropt, Logie, and Alloa (if a small space occupied by the parish of Stirling be excepted). It derives its name from the patron saint of the ancient parish church, the steeple of which still remains and is a distinguished curiosity. The church to which this fabric was formerly attached, being used as a powder magazine by the Highlanders in 1746, was accidentally blown up immediately before their retreat to the north. Though scarcely one stone of the body of the church was left upon another, the steeple remained uninjured. Population in 1871, 10,146, and in 1881, 10,506.

BANNOCKBURN is a prosperous manufacturing village in the parish of St. Ninians, one mile from that town, situate on both sides, but chiefly on the east bank of the Bannockburn rivulet, which here runs through a glen, and after a course of a few miles falls into the Forth. Few places of its size in Scotland have more rapidly improved of late years, in consequence of the manufactures that have taken their seat here; these consist of tweeds, tartans, and carpets to a considerable extent. Coal is obtained in the vicinity in great abundance, and a tannery has been established in the village for a long period. In this district the country is characterised by long descending braes, with a northern exposure to the Firth of Forth, and it was on one of these uplands, between this village and that of St. Ninians, that was fought on the 24th of June, 1314, the memorable and decisive battle of Bannockburn, the result of which was the permanent security of the independence of Scotland. In this conflict the army of the English was defeated with a loss of thirty thousand men and seven hundred knights. Bruce's forces were stationed along the front of an eminence called Gillies Hill, and extended from south-west to north-west, between the farm of Greysteil and the village of St. Ninians. About half a mile south from the latter, upon the summit of a commanding elevation called Caldan Hill, is a large stone, termed the "Bored Stone," having a hole in the top in which the Scottish King inserted his standard on the day of battle. The height called the Cat Craig Hill, from which the English King watched the progress of the battle, has been almost quarried away. Bannockburn, with Muir, contained in 1871 a population of 2,564, and in 1881, 4,331.

CAMBUSBARRON is a village in the parish of St. Ninians, situate one mile north-west from that place, and about the same distance west from Stirling.

DUNBLANE.

**D**UNBLANE stands on the river Allan, six miles north from Stirling. With its Hydropathic Establishment, picturesque surroundings, and salubrious climate, it entices numerous summer visitors. The streets are chiefly narrow, but the town is skirted with some nice villas. Its Cathedral, which was commenced to be built in the 12th century but not completed to the 16th, is one of the principal antiquities. The tower rises to a height of 128 feet, and the choir, which now forms the Parish Church, measures 80 feet long, 30 broad, and 48 high. The population, a great portion of whom are engaged in worsted spinning, numbers over 2,000. Sheriffmuir, the scene of the famous battle between the Royal forces and the Rebel army in 1715, lies on the hills to the east of the town. The chief seats are Keir and Kippendavie.

The villages of Kinbuck, Balhaddie, Buttergask, Greenloaning, and Rottearn lie in the parish of Dunblane, which has a population of over 3,000.
