Rinneadh tuilleadh atharraichean air Bonn-stéidh a' Chomuinn agus b'e an t-atharrachadh bu chudthromaiche gun do dh'aontaicheadh aig a' Choinneamh Bhliadhnail mu dheireadh Fear-stiùiridh a chur os cionn obair a' Chomuinn. Chuireadh Comhairle Araidh air chois gu làn aire a thoirt do'n chùis agus an déidh sin rinn Comhairle Araidh na bu lugha gach ullachadh gu Fear-stiùiridh fhasdadh. B'e bhuil gun do mhol a' Chomhairle sin an dreuchd a thabhairt do Mhgr. Dòmhnall Iain MacAoidh agus ghabh an Ard Chomhairle ris an rùn sin. Tha dùil gum bi Mgr. MacAoidh a' dol ris an obair tràth 'san Fhoghar. Tha An Comunn buidheach dhaibhsan-buill, meuran agus comuinn dhàimheil a chur tabhartais an coinneamh an iarrtais a chuireadh a mach ag iarradh airgead air son Maoin Fir-stiùiridh. Fhuaireadh móran cuideachaidh mar tha ach tha cruaidh fheum air tuilleadh oir 's e tha 'san rùn an t-airgead seo a thasgadh a chum is gun seas an riadh gach cosgais. Feumar móran airgid fhathast agus tha An Comunn a' cur an cuimhne buill, meuran agus comuinn nach tug tabhartais fhathast gum bu chòir dhaibh sin a dhèanamh aig a' cheud chothrom. Aig an aon am thatar a' toirt gu aire gach neach aig a bheil ùidh 'san obair gu feum iad a bhith cuimhneachail air tabhartais a chur gu cunbhalach gach bliadhna. Tha gealltanas bho Ard Chomhairle an Fhoghluim an Dun Eideann gun tugadh iad suim gach bliadhna gu cuideachadh leis an aobhair. Thugadh cuireadh do'n Chomunn cuirm-chiùil uidheamachadh fa chomhair Féis a' Chomhlachdais a bhios air a cumail am Baile Ghlaschu 'san t-Sultain agus thatar an dòchas gu fritheil Gàidheil Ghlaschu agus an càirdean a' chuirm seo. Am bliadhna a rithist, air iarrtas Féis Dhun Eideann, rinneadh ullachadh gu cuirm a chumail 'sa' bhaile sin 'san t-Sultain agus 's e ar dùrachd gum bi móran an làthair as gach ceàrn. Rinneadh ullachadh cuideachd gu cuirm-chiùil a chumail ann an Sruighlea aig toiseach a' Chéitein.

Am measg buill a' Chomuinn a chaochail ré na bliadhna tha sinn a' cuimhneachadh gu h-àraidh air a' Bhean Uasal NicDhòmhnaill, Obaireadhain, bantrach Dhùghaill Mhic-Dhòmhnaill, agus Mgr. Dòmhnall MacPhàil. Bha a' Bhean Uasal 'na cùl-taic mhór do na Mòdan a chumadh 'sa' bhaile sin. Bha ùidh aig Mgr. MacPhàil an obair a' Chomuinn ré aireamh mhór bhliadhnachan, agus gu h-àraidh am Meur Dhun Eideann. Bidh sinn a' caoidh gach ball dileas nach 'eil leinn na 's mò.

ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Committee met on two occasions during the year.

Two items in particular engaged the attention of the Committee—firstly the Contract of Employment Act, 1963. Terms of employment were drawn up for full-time officials and staff and copies were given to each employee.

Secondly, the Committee are appreciative of a letter received from Mr. James Millar, Head of Programmes, B.B.C., as a result of a meeting with the President and Secretary. The letter outlined plans which the B.B.C. hopes to make effective during the coming months. There is a promise that the usual coverage, both by sound and television will be given to the National Mod in Largs. Plans are under serious consideration to broadcast Gaelic lessons and the B.B.C. intend to introduce a weekly programme for learners of Gaelic. The question of Gaelic broadcasts to schools is also under consideration.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

REPORT FOR YEAR ENDED 31st MARCH, 1965

The Finance Committee met four times during the year and they present Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 1965, Statement of Income and Expenditure for year ended that date and Account for Aberdeen Mod, 1964.

An Comunn's gratitude must be given first to the Aberdeen Mod Local Committee who, by their enthusiasm and effort, produced the excellent result achieved. Without the Mod Surplus An Comunn's work could not go on as it does and the Finance Committee acknowledges their indebtedness to those who, year by year, at the venue of each succeeding Mod, give unstintedly of their time and substance.

Last year the Gaelic Lessons produced for use in Gaelic Evening Classes were responsible for f_{IIO} of expenditure and while the General Charges are relieved of that this year expense in connection with the Series of Gaelic Lessons in "An Gaidheal" are, in a measure, responsible for the increased deficit on the Magazine.

The decision of the Finance Committee to close several accounts and bring the credit balance into the Income for the year has made its contribution in attaining a surplus for the year.

The Committee's thanks are again proffered to one and all who have, in whatever capacity, assisted in the year's work of An Comunn and special mention is made of Mr. Graham, Mr. Hume and Mr. Mill for their invaluable help as advisors.

PUBLICATION AND EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Three meetings of the Committee were held during the year.

The introduction of a Higher Gaelic Paper for Learners in the Scottish Certificate of Education was taken up with the Scottish Certificate of Education Examination Board. A reply was received that the matter would be referred to the appropriate Subject Panel of the Board. The question of offering Gaelic as a subject in Civil Service Entrance Examinations was taken up with the Civil Service Commission and the reply indicated that before a subject in any written examinations could be included the Commissioners must be satisfied that it will provide a reasonable field of candidates. Entrants with the Scottish Certificate of Education are admitted to the Clerical Class without written examinations and Gaelic is recognised as a subject.

During the year efforts were made to increase the sale of "An Gaidheal" and initially this drive met with an encouraging response, especially during the winter months. It is regretted, however, that the sales figures have not been maintained. What is really required is individuals or agencies, representative of the whole country, who will undertake to sell certain quantities during the whole year. We are pleased to note an increased demand for the magazine from schools in Inverness-shire and Ross-shire. The illustrated series of Gaelic lessons in "An Gaidheal" is very attractive and the Committee expresses its gratitude to Mr. John A. MacDonald for his painstaking work.

At the time of writing only a relatively small number of members of An Comunn order "An Gaidheal" and again we appeal to all members to place their annual subscription for the magazine, still at 6s., high on their list of priorities.

The production of recorded Gaelic lessons is receiving serious consideration. A sub-committee met officials of Jordanhill College of Education so as to avoid any overlapping of the work which is presently being done in the College. It is hoped that concrete plans will be completed soon.

MOD AND MUSIC COMMITTEE

The Committee held five meetings up to the time of writing and further meetings will be held between now and the end of the session. The Music Sub-Committee met on two occasions to select songs for next year's Mod in Inverness. In selecting songs the Sub-Committee had regard to prescribing a number of the older songs for both senior solo and choral competitions.

Last year's Mod in Aberdeen was very successful. The Local Committee spared no effort in ensuring, not only the financial success of the Mod, but also in making adequate arrangements for stewarding. The halls were conveniently and centrally situated which helped the smooth running of competitions throughout the week. The Committee record sincere gratitude to the Local Convener, Mr. Iain A. MacSween, and his Committee for their untiring efforts in making the occasion such a success. Each year Mod Local Committees are faced with the formidable task of ingathering the Mod Fund, and while a stated sum is not laid down, nevertheless Local Committees realise that at least $f_{3,000}$ is necessary to meet An Comunn's needs. Gratitude is also expressed to all Branches, Affiliated Societies, members and others who responded to the Mod appeal for contributions. The Committee realise that there are many other calls on all concerned to support other interests, nevertheless we enjoin all concerned to do their utmost to support and add to the coffers of An Comunn through the Mod Fund. A larger support financially from members and regular visitors who enjoy each Mod would considerably lessen the burden of the Local Committee. What better way to support An Comunn than for regular visitors to the Mod, who as yet are not members, to join An Comunn by paying the annual subscription of ten shillings. This act in itself would be a token of their interest in the cause. An Comunn is again indebted to the B.B.C. for the extensive coverage afforded to the Mod both by sound and television, a service which is greatly appreciated by those in distant parts who are unable to be present at the Mod.

This year the Mod returns for the second time to Largs, and the Local Committee are working enthusiastically to ensure its success.

Next year's Mod will be held in Inverness and we look forward to a successful Mod in the Highland Capital.

Seniors who compete in learners' competitions are reminded of the rule introduced last year whereby they will only be allowed to compete in that category for five consecutive Mods with effect from the 1964 Mod. In that time learners are expected to improve their knowledge of Gaelic so that they will be able to pass either grade of the Gaelic test certificate A for fluent speakers which lasts for all time, or certificate B which entails an annual test until candidates acquire fluency in the language. This is an objective well worth achieving and learners are urged to give the matter serious consideration now. The following is a comparative summary of entries for the past five years :---

ART AND INDUSTRY

The Committee held two meetings during the year.

The hall for the exhibition at last year's Mod in Aberdeen was centrally situated and most suitable for the purpose. Consequently the exhibition attracted a large number of visitors. The Committee are grateful to those in the Senior Section who submit entries regularly and would ask those members to commend the competitions to their friends. Any suggestions as to enlarging the scope and variety of the competitions will be gladly received and duly considered by the Committee. The Committee are grateful to three Secondary Schools in Glasgow, two schools in Ross-shire, and Alloa Academy, all of which have entered pupils for a number of years. There are still a number of schools throughout the country which could very well take an interest in the competitions, details of which will be gladly provided.

Articles for sale at last year's Mod were received from craftsmen in Kilmuir, Dalriada, and Auchterarder.

Members and others attending this year's Mod in Largs are cordially invited to visit the exhibition which will be housed, as on the previous occasion, in the Clark Memorial Hall.

Competitions have been selected for next year's Mod and details of these will be available at the forthcoming Mod in Largs.

NORTHERN COMMITTEE REPORT

The Northern Committee met twice in 1964.

The School Libraries' Scheme has been continued and books will be supplied to the following Schools :---

Plockton, Dingwall Academy, Kilmuir, Sir E. Scott, Daliburgh, Castlebay School, Paible School, North Uist, Melness Primary School, Achtercairn School and Duncraig Castle School.

Canvassing for Agencies for "An Gaidheal" has been successful. There are now twenty-four Agencies selling the Magazine in the area. These include Achiltibuie, Moidart, Canna, Eigg and the Uists and Lewis.

Mr. Alex. Fraser for the Committee translated the following plays :----

"The late Miss Cordell" by P. Jonson.

"View to Matrimony" by J. Shaw Grant.

He has also had stencilled four original short plays :--

"Crò Chinn t-Sàile."

"Fasdadh le Foill."

"Là a Mhaslaidh."

"The Deserter."

All these are available from the Northern Organiser together with two new sketches :---

"Dómhnall 's an District Nurse," and

"The New Chief."

The Inverness Gaelic Drama Group played at Glenshiel and Inverness.

There are twenty-three Branches in the area and Mods were held at Kyle, Aultbea, Kingussie, Dingwall, Golspie, Portree and Stornoway.

SOUTHERN COMMITTEE

Two meetings of the Committee were held during the session.

The first task of the Committee was to resuscitate the

Glasgow Central Branch which had been disbanded due to lack of support. A meeting was convened early in January and a virile committee was formed consisting of former members and a good representation of younger members. During the remainder of the session the branch committee were fully engaged in making arrangements for the Glasgow Local Mod to be held in June.

As a result of an approach made by the Glasgow Central Branch to the Director of Education for Glasgow arrangements have been made to hold Gaelic classes for children of school age in the Boys' High School on Saturday forenoons next session. Parents are urged to send their children to these classes where they will have an opportunity of learning the language by modern methods.

Arrangements for An Comunn's stall at this year's Highland Show are again being made by the Edinburgh Branch and gratitude is expressed to this Branch for their enthusiasm in running the stall.

As a result of approaches made to the Dunoon Branch there are good prospects of a Mod for the Cowal area being held in Dunoon next year.

The main event of the session was the third Southern Area Conference which was held in The Highlanders' Institute in March, the guest speaker being Mr. John A. MacPherson, Gaelic Producer, B.B.C., who spoke on "The Gaelic situation as he sees it." His lucid and thought-provoking address brought lively comment from many of the representatives present. As an experiment the afternoon session was wholly devoted to a general discussion on matters of common interest when representatives were at liberty to discuss topics from a very wide field. Personally we feel that the experiment failed as it did not evoke a great deal of comment or discussion from those present. Now we are inclined to ask if a conference of this nature serves any useful purpose and it seems that some method will require to be devised so that everybody attending will be prepared to contribute to the proceedings. Action following each conference by Affiliated Societies, Branches and the Parent Body on recommendations made is of vital importance.
