FINANCE COMMITTEE

REPORT FOR YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH, 1962

The Finance Committee met four times during the year and the Sub-Committee, composed of Mrs. Angus Whyte, Convener, Miss May Margaret MacMillan, Mrs. Edgar and Mr. John A. MacRae, met regularly to confer with the Treasurer and scrutinise accounts before payment.

The Committee present herewith Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 1962, and Statement of Income and Expenditure for the Year ended on that date, and the result of the year's workings is the substantial surplus of £2,309. Most outstanding is the revenue from the Mod which shows the exceptionally high amount of £6,120 and the Local Committee of Stirling and their friends have much reason to be well pleased with their efforts. The warmest praise is offered for the whole-hearted endeavour which stimulated Mod interest to the extent of bringing about such a result, and An Comunn's gratitude is here recorded. The late Mr. Iain M. Moffatt-Pender's contribution of £250 towards the grants made to Junior Choirs is gratefully acknowledged. This year's Mod surplus is £911 more than last year's but this is lessened in the year's workings to only £809 more than last year, principally by the Annual Subscriptions having dropped this year by about £67.

In 1959 An Comunn was notified that the late Mr. Murdoch McNeill, Kiloran, Colonsay, had bequeathed the residue of

his Estate to An Comunn, subject to a life-rent in favour of a friend. It was known that the late Mr. McNeill had intended to make provision for a Headstone at his place of burial, but, as his will made no mention of this, An Comunn's approval had to be obtained before the expense could be incurred. An Comunn having willingly consented, it is now reported that a Memorial Stone, of design and inscription to the wishes of all concerned, was recently unveiled in Colonsay cemetery, Mr. Hugh Macphee, President, having travelled to Colonsay to be present at and take part in the ceremony. Miss Young, Treasurer, was also present, as were many Colonsay friends of the deceased gentleman.

The Legacy of £2,000 left by the late Honourable Mrs. Esme Smythe to the late Mr. Angus Robertson and others for the advancement of Gaelic Culture has now been handed over to An Comunn and the suggestion that the legacy be used for the publishing of the late Mr. Robertson's Songs (as yet unpublished) is being considered.

At the Annual General Meeting it was decided to raise the Subscription for Annual Membership to 10/- as from 1st April, 1962.

To replace the Roneo Addressing Machine, which has been in use for over thirty years, a small Addressograph Multi-graph Machine was purchased.

The Northern Committee, having recommended that An Comunn pay for the installation, rental and business calls of a telephone at the Northern Organiser's house, in order to be able to continue the affairs of An Comunn beyond office hours, the Executive Council approved, the Secretary's telephone also becoming the responsibility of An Comunn. An Comunn's telephones in the North are Inverness 31226 and 32875—in the South, Douglas 1433 and 5108.

The Committee again offer sincere thanks to Mr. Graham, Mr. Hume and Mr. Mill in helping to guide the finances of An Comunn.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE

The Committee held two meetings during the year.

SUMMER SCHOOL.—During the year efforts were made to organise a Summer School of Gaelic to be held in Oban in July. Argyll Education Committee granted An Comunn the use of

Oban High School and Comunn Gaidhealach an Obain co-operated in finding accommodation for intending students. It is regretted, however, that a sufficient number (20) did not enrol to justify proceeding with the Course.

SCOTTISH UNIVERSITIES ENTRANCE BOARD (New Regulations, 1962).—The Committee expressed concern about the footnote to the effect that the Board will only recognise the paper (Ordinary Grade) set for native speakers and not that for learners of Gaelic. An approach was made to the Board to receive a deputation. Subsequently, a deputation met the Secretary of the Board and An Comunn's representatives presented their case. A request to meet members of the Board was made but has not been granted. In view of their Committee's attitude to the whole question, it is very doubtful if any useful purpose can be served in having any further dealings with this body.

On the other hand the Committee wish to express their appreciation to the Educational Institute of Scotland and the Scottish Education Department for their co-operation in this and other matters dealing with Gaelic, and hope that their efforts to have both Ordinary Grades recognised will prove successful.

PUBLICATION COMMITTEE

Four meetings of the Committee were held during the session.

In its second year, it was decided to reduce the price of the children's quarterly, *Sradag*, from 1/- to 6d. per copy. It was hoped that this reduction would help to increase circulation but unfortunately it has not. Nevertheless, the publication is still popular and widely sold, mostly to schools in the Gaelic-speaking parts of the Highlands and Islands.

The Committee accepted with deep regret the resignation of Mr. Roderick Mackinnon from the Editorship of *Sradag* as from June, 1962. Tributes were paid to Mr. Mackinnon for his great work in connection with this novel publication. The question of a successor is being considered in case it is decided to continue the publication after the eighth issue in June, 1962.

Mr. James Thomson relinquished the Editorship of *An Gaidheal* at the beginning of the year. The Committee wish to record their appreciation of Mr. Thomson's services during

the four years he was Editor. By his efforts a high literary standard was achieved.

A warm welcome is extended to his successor, Mr. Donald Grant, a Vice-President of An Comunn. The task of the Editor can be considerably lightened if members and others support the publication by submitting regular articles. An earnest appeal is addressed to all readers to bear this in mind.

Last November the Executive Council accepted the recommendation that *An Gaidheal* be issued free to Ordinary Members, and at a reduced annual subscription of 5/- to Life Members, as from August, 1962.

Five meetings of the Gaelic Dictionary Committee have been held. This Committee consists of representatives of the Celtic Departments of three of the Scottish Universities and of the Central Gaelic Committee of the E.I.S., the President of An Comunn, the Convener of the Publication Committee, and a member of the said Committee.

The Committee has under consideration the preparation of an English-Gaelic dictionary similar to de Bhaldraithe's English-Irish work. An Editorial Council has been formed and various lines of enquiry are to be followed to seek grants in aid of the project. The Executive Council of An Comunn has already granted £100 for the initial work.

Reprints of the first two books and the initial order for the fourth book in the series of illustrated Gaelic readers were received during the year. A reprint of the third book, and of the fifth and final book, is expected shortly. The Committee records its gratitude to Mr. Donald Grant for adapting and preparing the Gaelic text of the readers for the printers.

On the recommendation of the Committee, the Executive Council agreed to the setting up of a Publicity and Sales Committee whose work will be to consider ways and means of bringing An Comunn's publications to the notice of potential customers.

PROPAGANDA COMMITTEE

Four meetings of the Committee were held during the year.

Early in the session Branches in the Southern Area were informed that members of Committee were prepared to pay courtesy visits with a view to encouraging Branches in their

work and show that the Parent Association had a keen interest in their activities. The response to this offer was most encouraging and as a result a large number of Branches were visited.

The response from Mod Gold Medallists and soloists, who are prepared to participate in a scheme to foster interest in An Comunn through organised ceilidh parties to remote areas and some of the more distant islands, was very gratifying. The Secretary visited the two Branches of An Comunn in Mull, accompanied by two soloists. The latter took part in a ceilidh organised by the Salen Gaelic Choir in aid of the Oban Mod Fund. Gratitude is due to these Branches and the Choir for giving hospitality to the soloists and the Secretary. Other tours of this kind are being planned for the summer months.

New Branches of An Comunn have been established in Aberfoyle, Ardrishaig and Tillicoultry. The last two Branches cover wide areas and consequently have been named as the Lochfyne and Hillfoots Branches respectively.

Two teachers of Gaelic singing, one in Ardnamurchan and the other in Sutherland, have been engaged. Valuable work is being done by these teachers in preparing soloists, duettists and choirs for the Local Mods.

An Comunn were given space for an information bureau at last year's Highland Show at Ingliston. A stance has been granted at this year's Show and it is hoped that more visitors will call at the bureau seeking information about An Comunn.

The second Conference of representatives from Branches in the Southern Area was held on 20th January, 1962, and twenty-two Branches sent delegates. A review was made of recommendations made at the previous Conference and the success or otherwise, with which these had met in practice. Branches were encouraged to vary their programmes and make a departure, however small, from ceilidhs by introducing, *e.g.*, short talks, story-telling, and films of documentary Highland interest.

NORTHERN COMMITTEE.

The former Northern Area Propaganda Sub-Committee became a standing committee of An Comunn following the

Annual General Meeting in 1961. The new committee met three times during the last year and the former sub-committee once. The committee adopted the recommendations of the former committee arising from the Conference. To deal with some of these recommendations sub-committees were appointed as follows—School Library Scheme, Informal Education, Poster Propaganda and Drama.

Branches have given sympathetic response to the circular letters in connection with the School Library Scheme and Informal Education. The Gaelic Drama group has been reformed in Inverness and it is hoped that other branches will take up this activity. Informal Gaelic classes have been held in various branches in the area.

Provincial Mods were held in Stornoway, Portree, South-West Ross, Wester Ross, Sutherland, Badenoch and Strathspey and Fort Willam, and the continued success of these is almost entirely due to the hard work of the committees and others who run these Mods.

The Area Conference was held at Cnoc nan Ros in March and was attended by branch delegates, Comunn na h-Oigridh leaders, members of the Committee and a number of guests. The principal speaker was Mr. Hywel Roberts from Cardiff who spoke on the Welsh Youth Movement and Publicity for the Welsh Language. Mr. Murdo Macleod, Gaelic Supervisor for Inverness-shire, gave a report on the Inverness-shire Education Scheme and Mr. Derick Thomson of Aberdeen University spoke on "New approaches in the Western Isles." A full report has been prepared and will be submitted to the Executive Council.

MOD AND MUSIC

Six meetings were held during the session and the Music Sub-Committee met on several occasions to select songs for competition.

The National Mod held in Stirling last year, after an absence of fifty-one years, was very successful. As a centre Stirling proved a very suitable venue for the Mod. Hall accommodation was good and competition sessions and concerts had excellent attendances. The Committee would like to record its thanks to the Provost, Magistrates and Councillors for their kindly welcome to Mod visitors and for the

generous hospitality given to office-bearers of An Comunn. Besides, these gentlemen showed a keen interest in the preparatory work undertaken by the Mod Local Committee, an interest which was sustained right on to the end of the proceedings.

The Committee records sincere thanks to the Mod Local Committee, under the able Convenership of Mr. A. McCaskie, for working so efficiently and with such enthusiasm to raise such a creditable sum for the Mod Fund. An Comunn is also indebted to Branches, Affiliated Societies, and countless individuals for contributing so generously.

The Committee would also like to thank the children who compete, the teachers who train them so well, and all senior competitors, individuals and choirs. Entrants who withdraw from competitions and did not notify the office caused delay in completing the competitions.

This year the Mod returns to its birthplace—Oban—and we look forward to a successful week there.

ART AND INDUSTRY COMMITTEE

The Committee held two meetings during the year.

A gratifying feature of the Stirling Mod was the substantial increase in the number of entries received from

The number of entries from Seniors was the same as for the previous year, and the Committee would welcome an increase.

The Committee is indebted to all competitors and exhibitors, those who helped to erect the cottage and arrange the exhibition and those who were in attendance during the week. Demonstrations of woodcarving, basket-making, carding and spinning, were of special interest. A cordial invitation is extended to those attending this year's Mod in Oban to visit the exhibition which will be staged there.

Details of competitions for the 1963 Mod are now available and may be had on request, and it is hoped that Juniors and Seniors will find the work prescribed interesting and to their liking. The Art and Industry section, the promotion of which is one of the stated aims of An Comunn, is commended to all members.
