President's Remarks

An Comunn's role in the Western Isles is in the melting pot and it may turn out to be lesser than before. That is not a matter for shame or apology but rather for thankfulness for it seems that the institutions for which An Comunn has always pressed have at last come about.

On the Mainland its role may be changing but it is still very great. It is sometimes thought that it must be exclusive but this is not so. More agencies are required if Gaelic is to survive and develop. The new national interest in the language needs far more opportunities, formal and informal, for learning it. Its place in Mainland schools, particularly in the Argyll and Highland Regions, seems to be less secure than before and considering the demand this could very well be a serious dereliction.

During all these difficulties the aims and objects of An Comunn are quietly supported by the numerous voluntary workers in branches, committees, Mods and so on. This is especially true of the National Mod Committees such as the one sponsoring and servicing this year's Mod—our debt to them is very great. Thanks are due too to the many individuals who support the Association in a quiet unseen way. Our Members of Parliament continue to be sympathetic and helpful. Were it not for the help from the Scottish Education Department and from Local Authorities we could not carry on. Finally we must record our gratitude to our sponsors who in spite of these difficult times continue to support us and especially the National Mod; they are—
