Bidh deich bliadhna air a' gheamhradh seo o choinnich an Comunn Leabhraichean Gàidhlig an toiseach is a shònraich e a' chiad tabhartas airgid airson leabhar Gàidhlig. Thathar air còrr is 120 a shònrachadh o'n uairsin, agus tha còrr is 100 dhiubh pàighte (luach £30,000) airson leabhraichean ùra a th'air nochdadh.



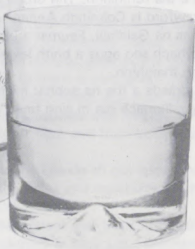

Bu mhath leam facal no dhà a ràdh ribhse aig a bheil Gàidhlig mar chainnt mhàthaireil, Cha leig mi leas a bhith bruidhinn mu dheidhinn luach na tha agaibh — is ann agaibh fhéin is fheàrr a tha fios. Ach dh'iarraibh oirbh dichioll a dhèanamh an ni seo a fhuair sibh gu nàdurra agus a nasgaidh a chophàirteachadh ri fheadhainn eile nacheil cho fortanach. The móran ann a tha deònach Gàidhlig ionnsachadh, no am beagan a tha aca a leasachadh, agus 's e an aon rud is motha a tha dhith orra cothrom a bhith seanachas ri 'r leithidse.

A thaobh na h-òigridh, tha fios againn cho farasda 's a tha e cànan sam bith a thogal aig aois na sgoile. Far a bheil na pàrantan a' leigeil fhaicinn gu bheil iad da-rìreadh ag iarraidh Gàidhlig anns an sgoil gheibh a' chlann an cothrom. Tha pàrantan anns an Eilean Sgiathanach agus ann an ceàrnaidhean eile a ghluais mu thràth a thaobh seo agus tha iad ri 'm moladh.

Is dòcha gur e mar a tha a' Bheurla a' sruthadh a steach do'n dachaidh, eadar reidio, telebhisean, paipearan naidheachd, leabhraichean is eile, an rud is motha a tha milleadh agus a' cur as do'n Ghàidhlig mar chànain. Cha urrainnear stad a chur air a leithid sin; thig iad a steach co-dhiù. Ach faodar fiachainn ri barrachd Gàidhlig fhaighinn 'nan cois.

Tha barrachd Gàidhlig 'ga sgrìobhadh 's ga clo-bhualadh an diugh na bha ann riamh roimhe. Ceannaicheamaid pàirt de na thatar a' cur a mach. Iarramaid barrachd Gàidhlig air reidio is telebhisean. Leigeamaid fhaicinn dé a chòrdas ruinn cho math ri dé nach còrd. A thaobh telebhisean gu sònraichte tha móran 'ga chur a mach anns a' Bheurla a bhitheadh sinn nas fheàrr as aonais. An àite an leithid sin cuireadh iad thugainn rud is fhiach anns a' Ghàidhlig agus gheibhear mar sin taghadh de na cuspairean is fheàrr anns an dà chànain.

Ach cha tachair a leithid seo gu bràth gun spàirn a dhèanamh air an son agus gheibh sinn cothrom a dh'aithghearr. Tha dùil ri Paipear Bàn bho'n Riaghaltas a leigeas fhaicinn dé a tha 'nam beachd a chur air adhart a thaobh reidio is telebhisean anns na bliadhnachan a tha romhainn. Tha droch amharus (a réir mar a chomhairlich Coimitidh Chrawford is Coimitidh Annan) gur e glé bheag a bhios anns a' Phaipear a riaracheas na Gaidheil. Feumar a bhith furachail agus sùil gheur a chumail air a' ghnòthach seo agus a bhith leigeil fhaicinn do na buill Pàrlamaid dé bu mhath leinn fhaighinn.

Tha móran a' tachairt an dràsda a tha na aobhar misnich — tha gluasad agus dùsgadh 'nar measg a tha gealltanach ma ni sinn feum de na cothroman a tha a nis a' tighinn thugainn.

President's Remarks

There is now reasonable ground for the hope that the process of deterioration and destruction of Gaelic as a spoken language is being halted. It is our duty as a Comunn, in common with other bodies in the Gaelic field, to strive in every way possible to make this hope reality. We must call in aid public opinion, the organs of central and local government and, not least, individual effort.

I believe there is today a vast amount of goodwill in the public mind towards the Gaelic language and the values that attach to it. But goodwill alone is too often latent and uninformed. The task of activating it and converting it into a well informed public opinion is a major task in which we are now engaged.

It is clearly important that the interest and support, moral and material, of both central and local government should be firmly engaged and maintained. In that connection An Comunn have recently been successfully strengthening existing contacts and establishing new ones.

The adoption of a bilingual policy by Comhairle nan Eilean is as courageous an initiative as has ever been taken by a local authority. We are now looking to the Highland Region to take such initiatives as are open to it towards promoting the language in the schools under its control. The canvassing of opinion in a number of areas in the Region has produced substantial majorities in favour of suitable provision being made. These results must be heeded in a democratic society where parents have a major say in determining the school curriculum.

Of those who attend this Mod in Oban the great majority will already be well informed on the Gaelic situation and many will be actively engaged in promoting the Gaelic cause. I would appeal to everybody for a bit of effort, or extra effort, even if it be only to make maximum use of the language in conversation and to be heard doing so. The very minimum support by way of taking out Comunn membership can surely be assumed.

The evidence is that Gaelic is no longer in retreat but beginning to advance and every extra ounce of effort counts.

The aims and objects of An Comunn are quietly supported by the numerous voluntary workers in branches, committees, Mods and so on. This is especially true of the National Mod Committees such as the one sponsoring and servicing this year's Mod — our debt to them is very great. Thanks are due to the many individuals who support the Association in a quiet unseen way. Our Members of Parliament continue to be sympathetic and helpful. Were it not for the help from the Scottish Education Department and from Local Authorities we could not carry on.

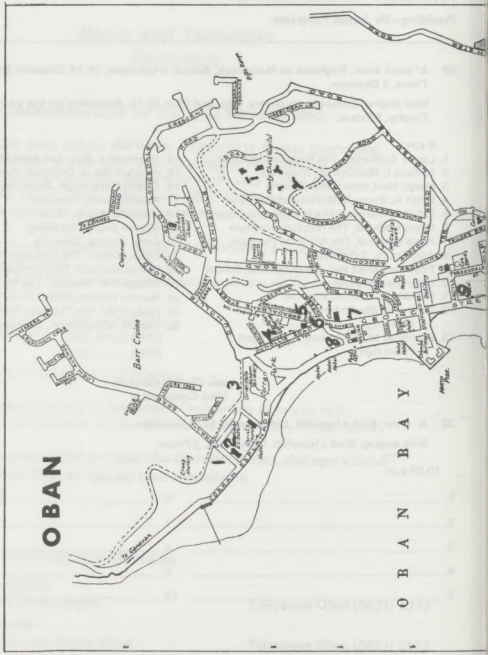

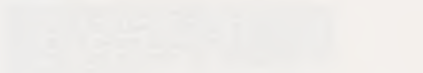


Figure 2: Projected trend over 20 years.

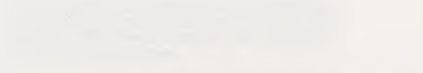


Figure 3: Projected trend over 20 years.

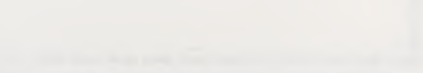


Figure 4: Projected trend over 20 years.
