An diugh, air feadh na duthcha, agus anns a' Ghaidhealtachd gu h-àraidh, tha cuisean ag atharrachadh cho luath 's gu bheil e doirbh cumail suas riutha. Agus gu tric chan eil na h-atharrachaidhean a chum ar leas. Uaireannan 's ann a tha iad fada 'nar n-aghaidh.

A dh'aindeoin de theirear air a' chaochladh, chan eil dad aig a' Chomunn Ghaidhealach an aghaidh na h-ola a tha, a reir coltais, 'na laighe fo ar casan agus mu thimcheall cladaichean ar duthcha.

Bha sinn riamh a' caoidh cion obrach anns a' Ghaidhealtachd, rud a bha a' toirt air ar daimh 's ar daoine a bhith a' fagail na tìre 'san d'fhuair iad am breith 's an arach agus a dhol a shìreadh beo-shlaint is beatha na b'fhearr ann an duthchannan ceine.

Feadh nan linntean rinn an imrich seo ar lagachadh gu mor mar shluagh. Cuideachd, gu tric, 's e na daoine a b'fhearr 's a b'adhartaiche a bha falbh agus an fheadhainn a bu mheata a bha fuireach. Dh'fhag sin an rathad reidh aig coigrich gu bhith a' gabhail seilbh air an fhearann agus gu bhith a' feuchainn ris an t-sluagh a chur fo smachd — ionnsaidhean a tha a' gabhail aite eadhon an diugh fhein fa chomhair air sul — ged nach eil na doighean a th'air an cleachdadh cho fìor fhollaiseach 's a bha iad uaireigin.

Ged is e rud math a th'ann gu bheil ola aig ar dorsan agus cothrom-cosnaidh anns a' Ghaidhealtachd nach robh innte o chionn iomadh linn, tha cunnartan mora a' tighinn oirnn an cois nan cothromhan ura a tha air an cur 'nar tairgse. 'S e'n cunnart as motha gum bruchd coigrich a steach air bailtean beaga tìr na Gaidhlig air dhoigh 's gun cuir iad as, chan ann a' mhaoin do ar canain, ach do ar daoine mar shluagh sonraichte.

Tha feadhainn ag innse dhuinn nach eil sinn cruaidh gu leor fa chomhair nan cunnartan a tha a' bagradh oirnn. Tha an fheadhainn seo gle choltach ri gillean beaga a bhitheas a' pìobrachadh chaich gu dhol a shabaid 's iad fhein nan suidhe gu socair air am masan. Chan eil ach da bhuidhean ann an raon na Gaidhlig — an fheadhainn a tha leinn 's an fheadhainn a tha 'nar n-aghaidh. Cha leig sinn a leas suim sam bith a ghabhail de na h-abhagan beaga a bhios a' sgìamhail aig ar sailean. Bha iad riamh comhla ruinn 's cha toirinn fead a' mhuncaidh air na tha iad a' deanamh a dh'fheum dhuinn. Na biodh ioma-cheist sam bith anns a' ghnothach seo: tha An Comunn ag oibreachadh taobh a staigh an lagha, gun eagal gun fhiamh, agus a' creidsinn gu laidir gur e cruas an fhacail reusanta as tairbhiche air a' cheann thall na faobhar a' chlàidheimh.

Bha Comhdhail Bhliadhnaile A' Chomuinn am bliadhna, gun teagamh sam bith, fad air thoiseach air gach Comhdhail a chaidh roimhe, agus tha Comhdhail araidh gu bhith air a cumail ('s docha mu teid seo an clo) gus beachdachadh air an oraid phògail chruaidh a fhuair, sinn bho Phroifeasair R. MacThomais. Tha e iomchaidh gum bitheamaid a' tighinn gu co-dhùndhean cearta agus gum bitheamaid a' cur an gnìomh na bha Proifeasair MacThomais a' moladh dhuinn.

An deidh moran cnusachaidh air bonn-steidh is doigh-obrach a' Chomuinn chaidh na co-dhùndhean a chur mu choinneamh Coinneimh Bhliadhnaile na bliadhna seo. An deidh beagan atharrachaidh an sud 's an seo, ghabh A' Choinneamh ris na chaidh a mholadh dhaibh agus tha sinn an dochas gum bi deagh bhuaidh an lorg ar n-obrach anns na bliadhnanach ri teachd.

Tha sinn a' cur failt air Earraghaidheal a tha a nise air a steidheachadh mar Roinn ur de'n Chomunn. An deidh Mod Inbhir-air — Mod cho soirbheachail 's a bha riamh aig A' Chomunn — tha sinn a' moladh oidhirpean mora Comhairle Ionadail Mod Dhun-deagh. Tha aobhar againn cuideachd a bhith an comain Iain Player agus a' Mhic airson a' chuideachaidh a tha sinn a' faighinn bhuapa. Tha an cuideachadh seo am bliadhna a' ruigheachd — chan ann a' mhaoin air co-fharpaisean nan coisearan mora 's nam pìobairean — ach mar an ceudna air na coisearan duthchail. Tha seo a' deanamh feuma.

A thaobh Cunntas na Rìoghachd, tha e caran doirbh do dh'fheadhainn a thuigsinn ciamar a tha mìltean a bharrachd a' bruidhinn Gaidhlig ann an 1971 seach na bha ga bruidhinn ann an 1961. Ach gabhadh canain ionnsachadh ann an deich bliadhna agus cha robh riamh roimhe uidhir a dhaoine ag ionnsachadh Gaidhlig 's a tha ga h-ionnsachadh an diugh.

Bu mhat leinn an cothrom seo a ghabhail gus ar taing a chur an ceill do gach fear is te, gach buidheann is Meur, a chuidich leinn re na bliadhna chaidh seachad, agus tha sinn an dochas, a dh'aindeoin gach cnap-tuislidh a thig 'nar rathad, nach fannaich iad anns an obair ris an do chuir iad an lamh. Tha ar n-aobhar math. Nì sinn adhartas ma theid sinn an greim comhla.

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President's Remarks

Today, particularly in the Highlands and Islands, events are moving so swiftly that it is difficult to keep pace with them or to assess their significance.

The discovery of oil round our shores has already made a tremendous impact on our lives and must revolutionise our thinking. Whether we like it or not we have to accept the simple fact that in the Highland and Islands (even in Scotland) things can never be the same again. The oil situation has come to stay. We cannot ignore its implications or the potentiality of its effects.

Contrary to popular opinion, An Comunn Gaidhealach is not opposed to oil. Indeed, we have reason to be thankful that this source of wealth has been found in close proximity to our shores.

Throughout the years we have seen the ablest and best of our people leaving their homeland to seek a better and a fuller life beyond the seas - to say nothing of organised evictions and widespread clearances - all of which tended to destroy us as a people and provided alien landlordism with the opportunity of adding insult to the many injuries and injustices which Gaeldom has suffered throughout the centuries.

We hope that the new-found wealth around our coasts will serve to keep our people at home and perhaps bring back some of those who at present employ their skills and talents in foreign lands. We also hope that the emergent Highlands will be able to combat the ever-recurring threat of turning the whole of Gaeldom into a vast recreation park, reserved mainly for the sporting activities of hunters and fishers. Our vision of the Highlands (and indeed of the whole of Scotland) is one of thriving communities living satisfying lives in their own land and developing and preserving those cultural assets of language, music and song, which belong to us as a people. The danger to the Highlands is not from oil in itself but from the continuation of a system which for centuries has sought to submerge our language and culture in an alien way of life. In this connection, it is significant that the Welsh delegate, speaking at the Ayr Mod, characterised as "criminal negligence" the attitude of successive Governments to the Gaelic situation.

It was with these considerations in mind that at this year's Conference it was unanimously decided to convene a special Conference later in the year to study the situation in all its aspects and to make positive recommendations. Time is not on our side. The developing scene in the Highlands and Islands calls for urgent action. Our requirements must be clarified and pressed to acceptance.

At a very critical time for the Gaelic language, it is interesting to note that the Preliminary Census results showed the arrival on the Gaelic scene of some eight thousand Gaelic speakers as compared to the situation ten years ago. Whatever the final figure may be, the fact is that probably never before has interest in Gaelic been so deep and widespread. Learners of Gaelic are now counted by the thousand. Writing in the Press recently the Very Rev. Dr. Tom Murchison posed the question, "Has Gaelic made a comeback?" and he urges the Registrar General to supply the answer. It is high time the facts were known.

Summer schools of Gaelic at Sleat and Stornoway have been held this year again and Gaelic Drama continues to make pleasing progress. In co-operation with An Comunn the Post Office have produced a bi-lingual airmail letter which is available at all post offices.

Last year's National Mod at Ayr was an outstanding success and we are confident that this Mod at Dundee will be equally successful. We are grateful to the Dundee Mod Committee for excellent preparatory work over the last two years.

We are most grateful to Local Authorities throughout the country for their generous support of the work of An Comunn, both generally and for specific projects, notably the Correspondence Course. We should also like to express our gratitude to Messrs. John Player & Sons for continued financial support in the provision of prizes for Senior Choirs and adult Piping Competitions. We are very glad to note that this year Messrs. John Player & Sons are extending their sponsorship of prizes to take in the Rural Choirs. This is a very generous gesture for which we are very grateful.

We should like to express our thanks to all those who have worked with us and encouraged us throughout the year - Branches which ran Provincial Mods, Schools which included Gaelic in their curricula, teachers who devoted time and skill to teaching our language and song, parents who encouraged their children to use the language of our people and many others too numerous to mention.

The coming year is one of vital importance to Gaelic and we confidently ask the support of all our friends for the proposals which we shall certainly be putting forward. We now have four Regional Councils in An Comunn. The recent formation of the Argyll Region adds considerable strength to our forward move towards a better and more equitable deal for our language and our people.
