Tha faisg air ceud bliadhna a-nise bho bha a' chiad Mhòd ann. Agus 's dòcha gu bheil am Mòd andiugh gu ìre nas motha na bha e a-riamh roimhe a' gluasad fala ann an cuislean nan Gàidheal (agus nan Gall!) mar mheadhan mothachaidh air ionmhas sònraichte, chan e ionmhas faoin falbhach a' bhogha-froise, ach ionmhas làidir stèidhichte aig nach eil ceangal ri faoinsgeul. Am Mòd Nàiseanta — cha do mhùch na bliadhnachan e, 's cha do ghèill e don chàineadh 's do na buillean a dhèanaicheadh cuid a bhuileachadh air tro sheallsanachd fhalamh, stèidhichte air adhartas nach robh aca.

Tha cridhe ar sluaigh fhathast fallain, 's tha ar misneachd gun lùghdachadh. 'S ma tha teisteanas a dhith oirnn a chuireas taic ris an fhirinn sin, nach toir sinn sùil fhosgailte mun cuairt oirnn rè seachdain a' Mhòid seo ann am baile mòr Dhun Eideann.
