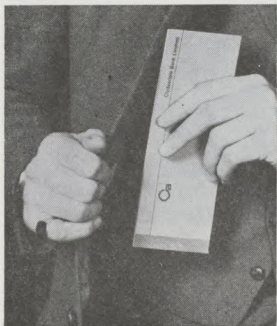

Facal o'n Cheann-suidhe

Bidh feadhainn a' cur as leth A' Chomuinn Ghaidhealaich nach eil e a' dèanamh mòran a bharrachd air a bhith a' cur mhòdan air adhart agus, a thaobh cor na Gàidhlig an coitcheannas, gu bheil sinn tuilleadh is riarachtaiche le cùisean mar a tha iad — nach eil sinn idir cho dìorrasach 's cho tuasaideach 's a bu chòir dhuinn a bhith.

Tha sinn eòlach gu leòr air beumadh de'n t-seòrsa seo. Riamh o'n a chaidh An Comunn a stéidheachadh bha luchd-comhairleachaidh 'nar measg a bha deimhinnean gun dèanadh iad fhéin na b'fhèarr. Agus 's dòcha gun dèanadh — nan éireadh iad bhàrr am màsan 's gun tòisicheadh iad air obair!

Chan eil sinn a' cluinntinn leth gu leòr mu'n fheadhainn a tha dèanamh na h-obrach — na Meuran a tha o'n dara ceann de'n bhliadhna chon a' chinn eile an sàs gu dìcheallach, gun duais gun tuarasdail, ann an aobhar ar cànan 's ar ciùil — a' teagasg chòisirean, a' cur chlasaichean Gàidhlig air bonn, a' cruinneachadh airgid, agus ceud rud eile. Agus, air a' mhodh seo cuideachd, na dèanamaid dìochuimhn air pàrantan a tha a' misneachadh 's a' brosnachadh na cloinne gu bhith a' gabhail ùidh 'nar cànan 's gu bhith a' frithealadh chòisirean, uaireannan ann an suidhichidhean a tha glé dhoirbh. A bharrachd orra seo uile, tha mòran eile a' toirt de'n ùine 's de'n tàlant, saor agus an nasgaidh, do'n obair a tha far comhair. Sin an fheadhainn ris am feum sinn èiseachd, oir mur b'e buaidh an obrach-san bhiodh cor na Gàidhlig truagh da-rìreadh. Tha am Mòd Nàiseanta gu h-àraidh feumail mar mheadhon air ùidh a bhrosnachadh ann an rùintean A' Chomuinn anns an fharsaingeachd, agus 's iomadh fear is té a chaidh gu ionnsachadh na Gàidhlig agus a dh'fhàs fileanta anns a' chànan ri linn tadhal air a' Mhòd.

Tha am Mòd air tighinn air adhart gu h-anabarrach. Tha seo 'na thoileachadh mòr dhuinn agus tha sinn an dòchas gu faicear am barrachd adhartais air fhathast. Tha e am bliadhna gu bhith air a chumail an ceanna-bhaile na Gaidhealtachd, agus dé bu fhreagarrach na sin? Chuige seo, chaidh naoidh Mòdan Nàiseanta a chumail an Inbhirnis agus tha sinn dearbh chinnteach gum bi am fear seo — an deichead fear — a cheart cho soirbheachail ris an fheadhainn a chaidh air thoiseach air. Tha deagh ainm aig Inbhirnis a thaobh a' Mhòid; chan eil ach sia bliadhna o'n a bha am Mòd Mòr ann roimhe seo agus tha sin fhéin a' dèanamh luaidh air freagarrachd a' bhaile seo.

Tha fios againn gun deachaidh Comhairle a' Mhòid an Inbhirnis gu uchd an dèidh gus soirbheachadh a chur an cois Mòd na bliadhna seo, agus fo stiùireadh Ruairidh MhicAoidh, Fear-gairme na Comhairle agus Iar Cheann-suidhe A' Chomuinn, chaidh obair mhòr a dhèanamh, agus tha sinn fada 'nan comain airson sin. Tha aobhar againn air a bhith an comain feadhainn eile cuideachd. Bh'o'n bhliadhna 1969 chum Iain Player 's a Mhic taic mhòr ri pìobaireachd inbheach aig a' Mhòd agus o'n uridh ràinig an taic 's an cuideachadh seo air na còisirean mòra — rud a rinn deagh fheum do'n Chomunn.

Tha sinn cinnteach gum bi mòran sluaigh as gach cèarn a' cruinneachadh a dh' Inbhirnis airson a' Mhòid. Tha seo 'na mhisneach 's 'na thoileachadh dhuinn uile. Tha sinn cinnteach cuideachd gum bi aoigheachd bhlàth agus toil-inntinn mhòr r' am factainn anns a' bhaile chàirdheil bhregha seo.

Seo an cruinneachadh as motha a th'againn mar Ghaidheil fad na bliadhna. Dèanamaid deagh fheum dheth. Mar as motha ch'inn de chéile 's ann as cinntiche bhios ar gnòthach. Coma leinn de na tiolpairean: ni sinn an gnòthach as an aonais — ach 's e b'fhèarr leinn gun tigeadh iad còmhla ruinn. O'n Fhear-stiùiridh a nuas tha sgioba comasach dìcheallach fo thuarasdail againn. Cumamaid taic riutha agus gun teagamh sam bith ni sinn adhartas. A' fàgail gach eusaontachd is cònsachadh as ar déidh, chan eil ni a cuireas bacadh oirnn ma ghluaiseas sinn air adhart còmhla.

President's Remarks

An Comunn Gaidhealach is sometimes accused of devoting most of its endeavours to the promotion of National and Provincial Mods and that, in confining most of its activities to this limited field, the wider issues of preservation of our language are overlooked. We are told that we are much too complacent in a situation which calls for a very determined demonstration of militancy as the real answer to our needs.

This sort of gratuitous appraisal of its work is not new to An Comunn. Indeed, ever since its inception, An Comunn has had the benefit of this form of advice from people who felt — perhaps quite sincerely — that they could make a much better job of it. And they might quite well be able to do so — if they get off their pedestals and started to work! The field is wide and there is plenty of scope for constructive effort. From time immemorial the easy way out was to sit on the fence and proffer counsel to those on the job. It leads nowhere.

Let us be quite clear about this: we in An Comunn Gaidhealach make no apology for running successful mods. Indeed, far too little is heard of those who do the work — the Branches who, from year to year, with no thought of material reward, devote time and energy to the many difficult tasks which confront them — training of choirs, formation of Gaelic classes, raising of funds and scores of other informal activities which go to enrich the life of a community. We have much reason also to be grateful to parents for encouraging their children to take an active and purposeful interest in our heritage of language, music and song. And there are many others who give freely of their time and talents to the advancement of our cause.

These are the people who have a right to speak up and to whom we ought to be listening for, without their co-operation, An Comunn would be weak indeed.

The National Mod is particularly helpful in the wider promotions of the aims and objects of An Comunn. Many people have been drawn into the Gaelic movement through the impact of the National Mod.

This year the Mod is being held in the Capital of the Highlands — a most suitable and agreeable venue. Already, nine National Mods have been held at Inverness and we are quite satisfied that this one — the tenth — will be in every way as successful as its predecessors. Inverness is deservedly popular as a home for the Mod: the last was held here only six years ago.

With Rory Mackay, Vice-President of An Comunn, as its Convener, the Local Committee, quickly and unobtrusively, has done great work for the 1972 Mod. We have good reason to be grateful to them for their achievements. There are others also to whom we owe a deep debt of gratitude for support and encouragement. Sponsorship of prizes, by John Player & Sons, Ltd., for adult piping and senior choir competition has greatly helped our efforts. We acknowledge this with thanks.

Many people from far and wide will converge on Inverness for the 1972 National Mod. We look forward to this. We are quite certain that a very warm welcome awaits us all in this friendly and beautiful town.

The Mod is the greatest gathering that we Gaels have throughout the whole year. Let us enjoy it and use it as a means of bringing as many people as possible into an active participation in our work. From the Director downwards we have a highly competent and devoted administrative staff. Let us support them. Nothing can hold us back if we sink our differences in unity of action and move forward together.
