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PREFACE

The completion of this calendar of papal letters relating to Scotland was begun during the tenure of a Ross Fund scholarship in the University of Glasgow from 166-68. A systematic investigation of the Vatican archives initiated under the auspices of that fund had led to the collection of the Scottish material relating to the pontificate of Benedict X111 (1394-1419). My principal task was to compile a calendar from the microfilm assembled in Glasgow as a result of that search, but all doubtful readings have been personally checked from the original volumes in Rome. If any problems remain unresolved, the microfilms from which the calendar was compiled are available for consultation in the department of Scottish History, University of Glasgow, where they form but a small part of a vast microfilm collection which now covers almost the entire per-Reformation period.

The publication of this calendar would have been impossible but for the generosity of the Ross Fund of the University of Glasgow which provided the resources for both the collection and calendaring of this material. It also owes much to the labours of others to whom I am under a deep debt of gratitude. In particular much was owed to the Reverend Francis Kennedy whose premature death earlier this year deprived the Church of a young and energetic priest, who, as a Ross Fund scholar, had collected much of the original material from the Vatican archives. In this he was assisted by the late Dr Annie I. Dunlop, and it is most appropriate that a volume to which she gave so much personal attention, both in the collection of material and in assisting with knotty palaeographical problems, should form part of the Scottish History Society's tribute to her memory. I am also indebted to Monsignor Charles Burns for so willingly checking points of detail in the archives, and to Dr D. E. R. Watt of St Andrews University for many corrections to my calendar which, but for his vigilance, might have remained unamended. Finally, I would like to record my gratitude to Dr Ian B. Cowan who has given assistance at all stages in the preparation of this calendar and, in association with Dr T. I. Rae, Secretary of the Society, to whom my thanks are also due, saw my manuscript through the various stages of publication.

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INTRODUCTION

ON 16 SEPTEMBER 1394 Clement VII, formerly Robert of Geneva, whose election to the pontificate on 20 September 1378 had brought about the Great Schism of the west, died. The cardinals at Avignon entered into conclave on the 26 September, but so swiftly had the news been carried to Paris that a message from Charles VI of France urging delay and the suspension of an election until the arrival of an embassy, was placed into the hands of Peter Corsini, cardinal of Florence, one of the last to enter the conclave. The cardinals, aware of the possible contents of the letter, resolved however not to open it until after the election, for if the message had been received it would have been difficult to reject the advice which it contained, and the Avignon papacy would have remained vacant while the 'anti-pope' Boniface would have continued to reign, intransigent as ever, in Rome.

With the conclave under way, the cardinal of Saluzzo proposed that the cardinals should either adjourn without electing anyone and thereafter, open negotiations with Rome, or else that they should elect Boniface IX outright. The former suggestion was opposed by Peter de Luna, cardinal deacon of St Mary in Cosmedin, on the grounds that a delay would merely strengthen the claims of the intruder Boniface, and the latter suggestion on the grounds that since Boniface and his anti-cardinals had been excommunicated they were under a canonical and legal disability from which only a new pope could free them. These arguments, in which may be traced the influence of Peter's training in canon law, were upheld by the other cardinals who resolved, therefore, to choose a new pope.

The actual election was, however, preceded by another dispute following upon the suggestion that all the cardinals present should take an oath, a summarised version of which runs thus: 'I promise upon the holy gospels, to work with all my strength for unity, and not to say or do anything which by its nature could impede or even delay the union. If I an elected pope, I will follow all suitable ways to union, including the way of cession if the majority of cardinals at the time, considers it appropriate'. Nevertheless with the exception of the three scrutineers the cardinals signed what is known as the 'cedula' of the conclave, and thereafter proceeded to the election.¹ On 28 September twenty votes from the twenty-one available were cast in favour of Peter de Luna, who after much resistance finally agreed to the election, taking the name Benedict of which he was the thirteenth in line of succession.⁸

Peter de Luna was born in 1342 in Illueca, a son of one of the noblest families of Aragon. During his youth it seems he intended to follow a military career and he took part in the battle of Najera in 1367, but subsequently he decided on an academic career. He specialised in canon law at the university of Montpellier at which he obtained his doctorate in Decreets, and where he taught as professor of both laws, canon and civil. As such he was in minor orders, and he rapidly obtained the archdeaconry of Valencia, canonries of Vich, Tarragona and Huesca, the archdeaconry of Andorra and the archbishopric of Palermo. Further preferment followed and on 20 December 1375 he was given the red hat by Gregory XI as cardinal deacon of St Mary in Cosmedin. On Gregory's death Peter took part in the election of Urban VI, and later he was one of the disaffected cardinals who moved to Fondi and elected Robert of Geneva as pope. He then returned to Avignon with Clement, by whom he was appointed papal legate to the Spanish kingdoms. In this role he was largely responsible for winning Castile, Aragon and Navarre to the Clementine cause. Even the

rival pope Boniface could not deny his obvious qualities and in 1390 Boniface had written to him from Rome exhorting him to work for the unity of the church.

Peter, before his election to the papacy, had thus accumulated political wisdom coupled with diplomatic ability and skill, and he arrived at the chair of St Peter's, albeita half share, preceded by a universal reputation. He was the first Spaniard to become pope and even his adversaries had to admit that his weaknesses were in the main nothing more than an excess of his obvious qualities. Nevertheless his cleverness could degenerate at times into cunning and slyness, his inflexible energy into obstinacy and his personal dignity and independence of character into unbarable pride.

These characteristics were to stand him in good stead during the years ahead. Almost from the moment of his coronation Benedict was involved in a struggle for survival. In 1308 the French withdrew their obedience, but as their example was not followed they reacknowledged Benedict as pope in 1403. In an effort to resolve the deadlock a general council of the church which met at Pisa in 1400 deposed both Benedict and his Roman rival Gregory XII and proceeded to elect Alexander y as pope. This 'Pisan' pope was recognised by France, which had again withdrawn from Benedict's allegiance in 1408. England and the Empire. The Roman pope was supported only by some Italian states while Scotland, together with the Spanish kingdoms of Aragon, Castile and Navarre and with the counts of Armagnac, Foix and Savoy, continued to recognise Benedict who had established himself at Peniscola in Aragon. The council called to end the schism had succeeded only in making matters worse. Bewildered Christians could now choose any one from three popes for spiritual guidance.

The enormity of this situation led to the calling of yet another general council at Constance on 1 November 1414. By this time, support for Gregory X11 had dwindled to the point of sole recognition by the lord of Rimini, many of his former supporters having transferred their allegiance to John XX111 who had been elected to the paper after the death of Alexander v on 5 May 1410. Benedict's strength however, remained undiminished and although the Pisan pope was deposed in May 1415 and the Roman pope was persuaded to abdicate in July of that year, the campaign to persuade Benedict's allies to withdraw their support was slow and tortuous. All efforts to persuade Benedict to negotiate proved abortive and this intransigency led to the withdrawal of support by Aragon, Castile, Navarre and Foix on 6 January 1416 Benedict's obedience in the formal sense was thereafter reduced to Peniscola the county of Armagnac, just north of the Pyrenees, and Scotland, but the difficulty which faced those trying to promulgate the withdrawal in various parts of Spain showed that Benedict still commanded a large measure of support in the peninsula. So it was that Philip de Molla who had been chosen to promulgate the withdrawal, found strong opposition in Barcelona, Segorbe and other places; but the delegate had been given such powers to enforce acceptance that gradually most of the opposition was crushed. The death of Ferdinand of Aragon on 2 April 1416 could do nothing to stop the momentum, and Castile, in spite of opposition from the archbishops of Toledo and Seville, also succumbed. On 6 July the withdrawal was published in Navarre and in August in Foix, and so the whole peninsula had abandoned Benedict, except for his castle at Peniscola

The way was thus opened for the deposition of Benedict, and after the necessary preliminaries and formalities had been carefully observed, this was duly effected by the council of Constance on 25 July 1417. To all intents and purposes the Great Schism of the west which had lasted for thirty-nine years, was over. Having now disposed of three popes, the council could apply itself either to reform of the church or to the election of a new pope. It chose to do the latter and so on 11 November, after months of discussion and argument over procedure, Oddo Colonna was elected pope, taking the name Martin v and as such presided over the dissolution of the council, which took place on 22 April 1418.

The deposition of Benedict by the council, in spite of the great solemnity and formality with which it was promulgated, was of no greater import to Benedict than that of Pisa's eight years previously, and he continued much as before, retaining control over much the same territory – Scotland and Armagnac. However the council had meanwhile determined to win Scotland from Benedict's obedience, and had sent John de Bienville, D.T.HEOL., abbot of Pontigny, to Scotland to plead its cause. This he attempted in a

general council held at Perth before Robert, duke of Albany and governor of Scotland. At the same time Sigismund, king of the Romans wrote to the governor and the three estates inviting them to send procurators to Constance. Benedict, however, was not ready to give in without a fight and he likewise wrote to Albany and the three estates exporting them to remain loval, a course which Albany seem to have favoured for he appointed a Franciscan friar of the English nation called Robert Harding to defend Benedict's cause. It was at this point that the university of St Andrews, seemingly forgetting to whom it owed its establishment, decided that support of the council was necessary for a united church and it came out in opposition to Benedict and his champion Harding. During the succeeding months disputations between Harding and the university continued, but the university's decision to withdraw was formally embodied in a meeting of the Faculty of Arts held at St Leonards on o August 1418, when with a few exceptions every Master of Arts formally withdrew his obedience from Benedict and transferred it to Martin. A deputation was then appointed to discuss the decision before a full meeting of the governor and the three estates. This meeting was held at Perth on 2 and 3 October 1418 where Harding fought desperately to save Benedict's position, being strenuously opposed by John Elwald, rector of St Andrews, and master John Fogo, monk, later abbot of Melrose. In spite of Harding's efforts, it was the counsel of the university which prevailed and it was decided that Scotland should formally be withdrawn from Benedict's obedience. This decision did not, however, settle the matter completely and Harding continued to work on behalf of Benedict. From October 1418 until January 1410 Scottish petitions were being granted by Benedict at Peniscola, including one on 11 December 1418 by which Walter. brother of Robert, duke of Albany, was provided to a canonry and prebend and the deanery of Glasgow.1 It is difficult, therefore, to say when Scotland finally renounced all allegiance to Benedict. On 11 July 1410, however, Martin issued a bull from Florence against Harding, empowering Laurence of Lindores as inquisitor for Scotland to seize and detain him. On the same day, a further bull thanked the doctors and masters of the university for their support

against Harding, and asked them to continue this support until he was silenced. It was not to be ecclesiastical judgement, however, which silenced Harding, but instead natural death which, according to Bower, 'came . . . over him in Lanark'.¹ With his death virtually all opposition to Martin in Scotland ceased, and in the same year a new formal withdrawal from Benedict was made and the adhesion to Martin confirmed.

Benedict thereafter found himself with his obedience further curtailed although the flame of hope still seemed to burn in his heart. The count of Armagnac early in 1418 had decided to submit to Martin, but a Burgundian victory had cost him his life before the submission was effected. His widow, Bonne de Berry, and the new count John IV, were forced to submit, but although Bonne persevered in her new allegiance to Martin. John gradually came round to recognition of Benedict for which he was warmly rewarded. Again, at one point, the duke of Gloucester petitioned Benedict for a dispensation: one of Benedict's envoys in France, Guignon Flandrin, had a meeting with the Dauphin, and the failures suffered by the French in their struggles against the English were imputed by many to the lack of lovalty shown by them to Benedict. But these were all as nothing set against the widespread adhesion to Martin, now at Rome, and so there was little need for general rejoicing when Benedict's death occurred on 29 November 1422.

Even then the schism was not quite over for Benedict had attempted to continue his line of succession by having his four cardinals agree to an election on his death, two of whom obeyed, electing as pope a certain Gil Munoz, canon of Barcelona, who took the name Clement VIII. He, however, submitted to Martin in 1429 although his cardinal electors refused to submit and were thrown into prison for their pains where they subsequently died. Another of Benedict's cardinals, Jean Carrier, who had not received sufficient invitation to the conclave which elected Munoz, elected a certain Bernard Garnier who took the name Benedict xiv. This Benedict died after having gained some supporters in the south of France, and was succeeded by Jean Carrier who took his name and place. Carrier refused to retract and he was imprisoned in Foix, where he died in 1433. Thus, although all the roots of the schism

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seemed to have been eradicated, the idea still found support and as late as 1467 a schismatical blacksmith was burned at the stake in Rodez. With the death of Benedict XIII, however, it could be seen that the Great Schism of the west was really over. He had outlived thirty-seven cardinals and five popes, and had remained to the end completely convinced of his own legitimacy. His honesty, uprightness and incorruptibility are amply witnessed by the failure of the council of Constance to find anything substantial in their charges against him, and it was on the trivial grounds of obstinacy that he was finally deposed.

During the long years of trials and tribulations. Scotland, until its final withdrawal in 1418, was the only kingdom which remained steadfastly loyal to Benedict. Even Benedict's native land of Aragon had wavered in its allegiance and in the end had joined in his final deposition. Although Scotland at this time was closely linked to France, yet the French withdrawals of obedience did not diminish Scotland's loyalty to Benedict. Throughout this period Benedict's provisions continued to run in Scotland, and he was still granting petitions from Scots even after her obedience had been withdrawn. Because of this determination to remain loval. Scotland was the object of numerous embassies intended to win this loyalty back to the Pisan and ultimately to the pope elected at Constance. That all these embassies were completely unsuccessful until the university of St Andrews changed its allegiance is perhaps surprising in the face of so much pressure and example offered by the rest of Europe. The reasons for this unswerving lovalty are not easily determined but some insight can undoubtedly be gained by an examination of the benefice policy of Benedict XIII in relation to Scotland.

The rules relating to papal provision and reservation of benefices, both secular and regular, were already so sweeping and all embracing before 1378 that neither Clement VII nor Benedict XIII appear to have added to them. The bulls issued by Benedict on I June 1414 to John, abbot of Balmerino authorising him to act as papal collector in Scotland clearly ennunciates the types of benefices reserved to the papacy and reveals no departure from what had been already established by successive popes from the mid-thirteenth century onwards.¹ In this respect it was virtually impossible for any type of benefice to claim exemption.

Theory and practice are, however, two different things and the extent to which these claims were translated into reality can only be assessed by an examination of the actual system at work. The following letters provide the opportunity for such a study and an analysis of the provisions that they contain points to the inescapable conclusion that notwithstanding the fact that the system of reservations covered practically every type of benefice and all foreseeable contingencies, in most cases papal provision was of secondary importance compared with the influence exerted on behalf of the nominee in Scoland.

This is true of all types of benefices. In bishoprics the majority of Benedict's creations were the result of royal nomination and it would appear in this respect that crown wishes were not seriously challenged by the papacy, whether through a coincidence of interest or superior royal power. Benedict's claim to reservation and rights of provision are usually stressed even to the point of nullifying chapter election, but in all but a few instances it would appear to be a formal rather than an actual right which is being retained. Nevertheless on three separate occasions it was papal rather than royal wishes which appear to have triumphed.

In particular at St Åndrews,⁸ where the bishopric fell vacant on the death of Walter Trail in 1401, the wishes of the chapter and the crown appear successively to have suffered setbacks. When on Walter's death the chapter on 1 July 1401, elected Thomas Stewart, archdeacon of St Andrews and an illegitimate son of Robert II, this apparently did not meet with royal approval, for when news of the election was to be transmitted to the pope, Thomas renounced his rights. The reasons for this renunciation are not entirelyclear, but as Walter de Danyelston was then postulated to the still vacant see as the result of an arrangement made between Danyelston, the king and the duke of Albany, it would appear that the original choice of the chapter had not been pleasing to the crown. The success of royal influence in this case cannot be fully assessed since Danyelston, who was a licentiate in arts and who had studied civil law at Avignon and was therefore not un-

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qualified for his new position, died without receiving papal confirmation although he apparently received the fruits of the hishopric until his death in 1402 or 1402 On Danvelston's death Gilbert Greenlaw hishon of Aberdeen and chancellor of Scotland was postulated to the see, and William Nory was sent to the papal court for confirmation: but this was refused. Instead Benedict provided and consecrated Henry Wardlaw, precentor of Glasgow, doctor of law and nephew of the late Cardinal Walter as hishop on 10 September 1403, Benedict's preference for Wardlaw may have stemmed from his kinship to the late cardinal, his undoubted excellent educational and administrative qualifications, or even personal friendship since Wardlaw probably shared Benedict's imprisonment at Avignon; but whatever the reason the royal candidate had undoubtedly been set aside. Any displeasure which may have been felt appears to have subsided rapidly, however, and Wardlaw was soon active in royal circles, taking a leading part in the education of prince James, who was left in Wardlaw's charge at St Andrews, and whom, subsequently, the bishop was to crown as king of Scots on his return from captivity many years later. Wardlaw's provision, although evidently unlooked for, was therefore not displeasing; and indeed the new bishop had much to commend him, being of noble birth and well educated through having spent many of his early years in France, during which time he acquired many benefices in Scotland while remaining at the curia gathering experience. Whatever the reason for Wardlaw's appointment, it was a particularly fortunate choice and one which was to stand the Scottish church in good stead.

This disregard for royal wishes is, however, an almost isolated incident in all the provisions to major benefices during this period; but the setting aside of chapter elections, which may have reflected the wishes of a local magnate as distinct from the crown, is seen in the struggle for the bishopric of Galloway in 1415 and that for the bishopric of Ross in 1418.

In Galloway,¹ on the death of Eliseus Adougan, the chapter elected Gilbert Caven, rector of Kirkinner, but this election was declared null and void by Benedict who provided in his place on 14 June 1415, Thomas de Butil, papal chaplain and auditor of

appeals. It is unlikely that the chapter would have elected someone displeasing to the Douglas family, yet even so the election was overturned and a curialist appointed. If Gilbert employed local favour and support it availed him little in this instance and he had to rest content with the archdeaconry of Galloway and a canonry and prebend of Moray, demitted by Thomas. In this case papal wishes proved stronger than those of the chapter and possibly the local magnate. Thomas, however, had enjoyed the favour of both Clement VII and Benedict, a fact to which a long series of petitions on his behalf from 1388 to his ultimate provision to Galloway in 1415, bears ample testimony.¹ The number of these provisions granted motu proprio would seem to indicate personal influence with the popes, and in his official position as auditor of appeals Thomas' connection with the curia was obviously of the closest nature. These factors, combined with his educational qualifications as doctor of decreets, explain his preferment by the papacy, if not entirely explaining his triumph over local opposition.

While papal support for Thomas in Galloway is relatively easy to understand. Benedict's position in the struggle for the bishopric of Ross following the death of Bishop Alexander, is not quite so explicable.2 In this case John Bullock, canon regular of St Andrews, was provided on o March 1418, and faculty for consecration followed two days later: but the chapter had also elected a candidate in the person of Thomas Lyel who is referred to as 'bishop-elect of Ross' on 18 May 1418. The issue was further confused by the impending withdrawal of obedience from Benedict, as Martin y had provided yet another person called Griffin Yonge to Ross. In the circumstances Benedict might have been expected to placate local feeling by favouring Thomas Lyel, who in 1395 had been described as being of noble origin and appears to have been related to or to have served David de Lindsay, earl of Crawford and admiral of Scotland; but instead Benedict is to be found forwarding Bullock who had no apparent internal influence working on his behalf. Later Martin v was also to prefer Bullock to Griffin after the transfer of Scottish obedience, and he was reprovided to Ross by Martin on I February 1423 with the convenient fiction that Griffin had been translated to Hippo. Bullock's victory over Yonge

is not surprising, but much more so is his earlier victory over Lyel which seems to reveal papal determination in a seemingly weak position, to exercise full rights of provision in the face of local opposition.

If on these three occasions Benedict did apparently override royal and other wishes and appoint curialists, this in no way detracts from the general conclusion that royal influence was normally paramount and this in itself highlights the exceptional nature of these cases. All in all, royal and papal nomination secured the appointment of men of ability who were well qualified for their position. In this respect the period of the Schism reveals no change in the type of person being provided from those appointed in pre-Schism days. In favour of the ideals lying behind papal claims to provision, it may be suggested that the three distinctively papal appointments resulted in superior candidates gaining the day in Galloway, Ross and St Andrews.

This situation also prevailed in the appointment to other secular benefices, both important and unimportant. It is certainly true of the higher ranks of the church where influential connections and local backing appear to have been the necessary prerequisites for success. First and foremost amongst those provided to such benefices were royal kinsmen, upon whom benefices were being conferred from the beginning of Benedict's pontificate.1 Nevertheless, with the exception of a few who were minors, almost all were exceptionally well qualified from an educational standpoint and their appointments need not necessarily have been to the detriment of the church. This was also true of royal officials who were second only to those of royal blood in possessing latent advantages in the quest for benefices.² Indeed the only apparent exception to advancement through royal connection is provided by the case of John de Scheves, canon of Glasgow, kinsman of Robert, duke of Albany, and rector of the university of St Andrews, who was provided to the archdeaconry of Teviotdale on 15 June 1418.3 In the petition for this benefice, however, John is described not as kinsman of ¹ Below pp 2, 68-69, 78, 201. ² Below pp 265, 291-2. ⁸ Below pp 374-5.

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Robert but as his counsellor;¹ but it is impossible to say which was the more important consideration. John had been official of St Andrews for several years when he obtained this provision, but in spite of his obvious importance and influential connections he did not hold the archdeaconry for long, for he had possession only to resign it in favour of William Croyser on 7 September 1419. Whether the withdrawal of Scotland's allegiance from Benedict, in October 1418, influenced and led to Scheves failure to hold the archdeaconry cannot be easily ascertained, but what is clear is that Scheves remained in royal favour and gained papal favour when along with James Haldenstone, prior of St Andrews, and William Stephenson, bishop of Orkney and later of Dunblane, he brought news of Scotland's allegiance to Martin v at Constance.

If royal influence was not at hand noble connections could be equally effective, and throughout this period the puble families of Stewart and Lindsav were assiduous in obtaining preferment not only for kinsman and servants, but also for people with no obvious connection with them.2 Episcopal influence could work in much the same way as royal and poble influence and bishops were equally persevering in obtaining benefices for their family and servants.⁸ The most prominent case of nepotism is provided by the career of Henry Wardlaw, who on 20 May 1308, was provided to the archdeaconry of Glasgow.³ Henry was a nephew of Walter. late cardinal priest and a former bishop of Glasgow, and it is not difficult to see to whom Henry owed his accumulation of benefices. At various times during his career, Henry held the following benefices, many of them in plurality; in 1378, a canonry of Glasgow with expectation of a prebend; in 1388, a canonry of Aberdeen with expectation of a prebend, canonries and prebends of Glasgow and Moray, and the precentorship of Glasgow of which he had not then gained possession; in 1389, the church of Cavers; in 1393, a canonry of Glasgow with expectation of a prebend, and an indult to hold also the precentorship of Glasgow; in 1395 a canonry of Aberdeen and the prebend of Belhelvie, held along with the precentorship of Glasgow and the parish church of Cavers;4 in 1308, the archdeaconry of Glasgow, Cavers, the precentorship

of Glasgow, a canonry and prebend of Aberdeen and a claim to a canonry and prebend of Moray.¹ His career finally reached its apogee in 1403, when he obtained the bishopric of St Andrews.² Henry had been educated at the University of Orleans and he had spent some time at the curia, but this extraordinary accumulation of benefices must have been, in some way, owing to his relationship to Walter Wardlaw.

Needless to say, influence at the curia could frequently be a greater aid to those who sought provision than ties of blood or service in Scotland, although the latter were far more favourably placed as to making good their claims or gaining possession. An outstanding example of a curialist's career being advanced by virtue of his position is provided by Symon de Mandeville.3 nephew of Mathew Glendinning, bishop of Glasgow, and Scottish representative at the Council of Perpignan. Symon had obtained the archdeacoury of Glasgow sometime in 1403, as in August of that year he was dispensed to hold it along with another benefice even if a major or principal dignity in a cathedral or collegiate church. During the succeeding years he acquired provision to various other benefices in Scotland, one of the most unusual being his provision to a canonry of the priory of St Andrews on 27 August 1408, by which time he had acquired a doctorate in both laws, and was a papal chaplain and auditor of appeals. This provision is unusual in that Symon was a secular cleric being appointed to a canonry in a house of regular canons, but the significance probably goes no further than simply illustrating another means of augmenting his revenues

If one factor unites the men who obtained their benefices in such diverse ways, the common bond is frequently their standard of education, and the importance of this can be seen in the fact that many who obtained benefices in this period apparently relied upon this factor alone.⁴ If difficulty of identification may in some cases mask odd exceptions to these rules the normal pattern of presentation to greater benefices in the church varies little from that established by provision to bishoprics. In general there is little evidence of conflict between papal interest and those of the

influential group of royalty, nobility and bishops in Scotland. Obviously the careers of such people as William de Spyny, Thomas de Butil and William Goldsmith,¹ indicate what might be achieved as curialists, but their successes are far outweighed by those of home Scots. In cases of dispute the odds seem to have favoured the latter group: for example, Symon de Mandeville failed to hold the prebend of Glasgow Primo against the opposition of William MacMorin who, although also a curial servant, was in Scotland at the time of the dispute.² Likewise the career of Robert de Moffet would appear to have prospered more when clerk to Archibald, earl of Douglas, than when he had been studying at Avignon.³

This pattern is equally evident in relation to lesser benefices. In such cases, papal provision was sought usually where reservations might have been effected under any of the many rules which applied. Papal confirmation became thus technically necessary, and was in fact a prudent insurance against any counter claims which might have arisen. More often than not, however, there were no such claims; but while presentation by the patron followed by collation by the ordinary was normally sufficient to effect possession, papal confirmation added strength to the position already achieved.

This was true whether the patron was lay or ecclesiastic and innumerable examples of this process are to be found in Benedict⁵. letters.⁴ In most instances papal provision was no more than a confirmation and recognition of a *fait accompli*. An exchange of benefices, usually rather straightforward transactions for which the consent of the respective patrons would normally be required, was another occasion where re-provision to both benefices would normally be sought lest certain rights should be lost.⁶ Sometimes difficulties di arise, however, which made this papal re-provision much more important, but here too papal provision had little effect on the final outcome.⁶ Suspected irregularities obviously stimulated a greater desire to have papal confirmation by way of provision; and on 28 July 1398, when Duncan Roderici was confirmed in possession of the parish church of St Molrune, it was stated that the church might have been vacant for so long that

delay in presentation by the lay patron might have allowed provision to devolve to the pope.1 In other cases irregularity in collation rather than in presentation may have been the motive force behind seeking papal provision or confirmation, this being particularly true where the bishopric was vacant or the bishop absent from his diocese. Thus on 2 June 1402. Thomas Hoppringil was confirmed in possession of the parish church of Livingstone.² Thomas had been presented by John, abbot of Holyrood, to James, prior of St Andrews, for institution as there was no bishop at this time. It is not surprising, therefore, to find Thomas doubting the validity of his title and seeking confirmation. In other cases, irregularity sprang from no other cause than suspicion of the validity of ordinary collation and here even more than with examples of presentation followed by ordinary collation, papal provision seems to have been little more than prudent insurance.³ Other types of irregularity springing from defects in the candidates own qualifications would seem to provide better reasons for seeking papal confirmation. which could also bring the additional advantage of setting aside the original disqualification. For example Stephen Bigly had been collated to the parish church of Methil by William, bishop of St Andrews, while not yet of canonical age, and not yet in priests orders, and which he had held for more than four years without a dispensation. By an indult of 26 December 1304, however, Stephen had all stain and inhability removed, although he was to demit Methil, but on the same day he was re-collated to the church which he continued to hold until some time in 1408 4

A further use for papal provisions is to be found in the settlement of internal conflicts over rights of presentation. Struggles over the patronage of the churches of Cavers Magna, Kinghorn-Easter and Tarbolton led the various claimants to utilise papal provision as a means of securing their rights but as the papacy indiscriminately conferred provision on such suppliants, this intervention was indecisive and the only ultimate effect was to prolong the struggle in question.5

As with the greater benefices it is fairly clear that influence at home was, more often than not, the most important factor in

obtaining a benefice whether it was in lay or ecclesiastical patronage. A few examples of such show that the type of influence being everted was not very different from that everted for the wealthier and more influential livings. Naturally enough of prime importance was the use of royal or noble influence on behalf of kinsmen or servants ¹ Bishops seem to have been equally aware of their duties towards their kinsmen and retainers in the struggle for these lesser benefices. Symon de Mandeville, nephew of Mathew, bishop of Glasgow, had an interest in the church of Cavers Magna and another nephew. William de Glendinning, had the church of Glencairn conferred on him by his uncle 2 The bishon of St Andrews. Henry Wardlaw, was equally quick in exercising his influence on behalf of his kinsmen.³ Episcopal influence was also exercised on behalf of retainers,⁴ but it must be equally stressed that even at this lesser benefice level, influence was only normally exercised on behalf of reasonably well-qualified men who were normally all university trained

Most provisions seem to have been occasioned by the desire for final confirmation of a right already locally acquired, often through influence of one kind or another, and when disputes did arise they were usually internal struggles in which papal provision or confirmation might be a valuable factor in tipping the scales in favour of one parton or another. On few occasions, however, did direct papal provision conflict with some form of local wish and where it did the outcome is of the greatest interest in determining the limits of papal power.

One of the more interesting cases is that of the disputes surrounding the church of Kilmelfort where Celestine Celestini, despite presentation by the lay patron, papal provision and restitution by order of the pope, was forced by the determined opposition of Bean, bishop of Argyll, and an apparent change in the patron, to relinquish the benefice to a candidate supported by the bishop.⁶ Even where papal provision was backed by support of the lay patron the determining factor frequently appears to have been

episcopal power. For example the parish church of Kilmonvaig lay in the presentation of the lord of the isles, but when Alexander, lord of Lochaber, had presented Cristine Neachtain, called Macalpen, to John, bishop of Argyll, for collation, this was refused. This church had become vacant on the collation by ordinary authority of Bean Johannis Andree, former rector to the deanery of Argyll. On 31 October 1395, Cristine received papal provision to the parish church, but even this proved to be of little use in achieving the desired object. For in 1400, Nigel Colini is to be found petitioning for this church which Bean had continued to hold along with the dearery, and which he had even refused to give up on becoming bishop of Argyll.¹

Yet in 1402 there is to be found the beginnings of a case in which the papal protégé appears to have emerged victorious. On 20 October of that year a papal mandate was issued to settle a dispute between John Knight and Alexander de Bonkil over the parish church of Fearn, vacant by the death of John Gray, John Knight had claimed Fearn by virtue of papal letters, whereas Alexander had been collated to it by the ordinary authority of Robert. bishop of Dunkeld, and in the mandate Alexander is said to be detaining the church to the grave hurt of John. At any rate John appears to have won, for three years later, on 20 August 1415, he was confirmed in possession of Fearn, and this document reveals that his earlier papal letters had been issued at the curia under the seal of Ferdinand, cardinal priest of the basilica of the Twelve Apostles. In these letters he was described as priest which he was not at the time, so he had sought the above confirmation. An interesting point to emerge, however, is that ostensibly in 1394, but more likely in 1401-2. Robert, duke of Albany, had petitioned for a benefice in the gift of the bishop, dean and chapter of Dunkeld. on behalf of John, his chaplain. So even in this instance of papal provision contravening episcopal wishes, the resultant papal victory may have been aided by royal influence.2

If the bishops' own financial interest were at stake, however, a dispute seldom went against them. A long bitter struggle over the parish church of Kilmonivaig between the pope and Bean, bishop of Argyll, who seems to have been a thorn in the side of papal

pretensions at this period, found the bishop ultimately victorious.¹ If a bishop cared to dig in his heels and be obstinate, there was very little the pope could do to enforce his wishes without resorting to deprivation or any of the more severe spiritual sanctions of the church.

There are likewise singularly few instances of the right of lay patronage being ignored by the pope. Indeed, the chances of these rights being ignored by the diocesan bishop appear to have been even greater. Disputes such as those over Cavers Magna and Tarbolton allowed papal provision to carry some weight where patronage rights were in dispute.² but in most cases it would appear that this provision was more of a formality allowing legal rights to the papacy but leaving the substance of victory to the patron. Where the patronage lay with a monastery, however, Benedict seemed less reluctant to override the wishes of the patrons. An instance of this occurs in 1401 and the protagonists in this case were Thomas de Butil and Thomas, the abbot, and the convent of Sweetheart, Thomas, archdeacon of Candida Casa, provost of the chapel of Maybole, had exchanged Maybole for the parish church of Kirkcolm held by Gilbert Adonane. This exchange had been effected on 16 February 1398, by their procurators Patrick de Huiston and John Triche at the hands of Peter, cardinal deacon of St Angelus. The patronage of the church of Kirkcolm, however, had been granted to Sweetheart Abbey in 1273 by Devorgilla de Baliol, and the church itself had been granted to the uses of the abbey by Adam, bishop of Galloway 1363 × 79, this being confirmed by Archibald, earl of Douglas, in 1401. It was at this point seemingly that Thomas de Butil and Thomas, the abbot, had run foul of each other, the upshot being a mandate granted on 13 October 1401, whereby Thomas de Butil was to be restored to full possession of Kirkcolm which by right belonged to him, and of which he had been unjustly deprived by the abbot and convent. So in this instance the wishes of the patron and rightful possessors of this church had been flouted on behalf of a curial favourite.3

A somewhat similar case occurs on 17 May 1413, when John de Loudan was confirmed in possession of Kilpatrick despite his defect

of birth as the son of a priest and an unmarried woman. This vicarage had been held by Robert de Dryden, who exchanged it for John's vicarage of Forgan, this being effected by Henry, bishop of St Andrews, then papal legate. John had doubted the validity of this transaction as the consent of the abbot and convent of Paisley, patrons of Kilpatrick, had not been obtained. Benedict conveniently ignored this fact and confirmed John in possession of the vicarage.¹ These two examples seem to show that whereas the pope seemed to find difficulty in enforcing his authority over obstinate bishops or even lay patrons, the task was much easier when he was opposed by monastic houses.

These appear to have been the only real successes which the papacy enjoyed during this period. For the rest, however, unless the papal nominee was acceptable to the ordinary and the patron, then he was more or less doomed to inevitable failure. Nowhere and at no time was a papal provision regarded as being a final decree and whereas in many cases it acted as a confirmation, it would appear that the average clerk had a much better chance of gaining preferment from the local patron or bishop, rather than hope to enforce a papal provision which might contravene their wishes with consequent small chance of successful accomplishment. The fact that the two recorded papal successes in this field relate to monastic foundations is, however, interesting and raises the more general question of papal policy in relation to religious houses.

Here too it is clear that there had been no hiatus in papal claims relating to the provision and reservation of monastic houses during the schism. Thus in Benedict's pontificate provision was made to no fewer than nineteen Scottish religious houses of all orders and of widely differing valuations, an incidence which seems to suggest that a general rule of reservation relating to all monastic houses was being applied.

While these rules of reservation and provision were being applied, it is equally clear from a study of the provisions thus made, that though the formality of papal rights was being protected, there was little effective interference with royal and baronial patronage in this period. As a result most examples of such provisions are relatively straightforward. Only in one instance was there any marked

departure from this norm. The dispute over the abbey of Newbattle is of particular interest because of the light which it sheds on the whole system John Guygi who also possessed certain rights in the abbey of Balmerino,¹ claimed to have been provided to Newbattle. and had been granted the administration of the goods by Robert III. king of Scots, from whom they were held in fee, but Donald, claustral prior of Newhattle and the convent had refused to admit John to the monastery. After a long legal hattle during which time Donald and the convent had been threatened with interdict from which they had appealed only to have their appeal rejected by Guy, bishop of Palestrina, finally on 27 May 1306 the bishops of St Andrews and Dunkeld were commanded to effect John's provision with the aid of the secular arm if necessary. In the event, therefore. John and the king triumphed over the wishes of the convent and John evidently held Newhattle for some years. Later David, abbot of Melrose and father-abbot of Newbattle, along with other abbots of the Cistercian order charged John with wasting and alienating the goods of the monastery, and subsequently after an appeal by the monks of Newbattle to David who as father-abbot had the right of visiting Newbattle and correcting abuses, he sentenced John to be deprived. John, however, with the aid of 'powerful friends' maintained his possession of the abbey and continued to dissipate its goods and, while on 6 February 1412 papal mandatory letters were issued that if this were true John was to be deprived and William Manuel, elemosinary of Melrose, was to be provided to Newbattle, it was death rather than deprivation which extinguished John's interest in the abbey. Thereafter the convent elected William 'in ignorance' of a papal reservation and, while this election was annulled, he was subsequently provided on 2 May 1413. A number of points may be deduced from this case. In the first instance, the convent was comparatively powerless against royal wishes in what appears to have been an attempt by the convent to hold a really free election: secondly, as in a similar dispute over Balmerino, papal provision supported the confirmatory and discretionary power exercised by the mother houses;2 thirdly, in each case the person supported by papal provision emerged triumphant, but in both instances other support had been forthcoming, John

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Guygi being championed by the king and later William Manuel by the tacit acceptance of the king. But even in this case where papal provision played a more positive part than elsewhere, it was only effective because some form of local support was forthcoming and at no time did papal provision successfully stand on its own.

The acquisition of benefices was thus predetermined, except in a handful of cases long before papal provision was sought or granted. Why then did nominees seek panal provision? In certain cases the the reason is obvious. Provision might be sought to regularise illegal tenure of benefices. This was most likely to be the case where provision was granted to a minor, or where the stigma of illegitimacy could have been turned to advantage by a rival but less easily so after papal provision had been sought and granted. In other cases provision might be sought where genuine doubt existed as to the legitimacy of local presentation, and in the few cases where local influence was divided, papal provision could be the decisive factor. The search for provision in such cases was clearly exceptional. however, and in the great majority of cases no such difficulties were present. In these circumstances the quest for provision seems to have stemmed solely from the desire to make assurance doubly sure. Moreover, as the papacy was unwilling to desist from making multiple provisions, and the crown was apparently unable to prevent the practice, such assurance became necessary if the benefice holder was to free himself from endless litigation at the curia, and the constant threat of dispossession if events turned against him. In the long run, therefore, security of tenure became the overriding reason for seeking papal provision. Once this had become accepted the system could not lightly be discarded as he who chose to ignore it might be the first to suffer. Consequently the effective struggle for the maintenance or discardal of the system could only take place at the highest level between crown and papacy.

The time was not opportune for such a struggle during the pontificate of Benedict XIII. After the Schism had been healed James I was to initiate such a struggle, the point at issue being essentially authority over the church. James, however, sought to clothe the issues in a financial guise, the very point at which the papacy was most sensitive and most likely to resist. A system so entrenched as demonstrated in this survey could not, however, be overturned at once and not until 1487 was the struggle to be resolved. Local influence was then recognised as decisive by the papacy, and although as part of the bargain papal provision was retained both as a face-saving device and as means of ensuring the continued payment of the promotion taxes the upshot was to give complete security to those selected for appointment at home Ironically while provision and reservation had possessed little practical application in the fourteenth and fifteenth centuries, the operation had prevented over-exploitation of the church's wealth. With that control removed, the church rapidly degenerated from the position which it had occupied during the period examined in this study. Provision and reservation thus fulfilled a function albeit not the one which it was principally directed towards. The system may also have kept patrons on their toes, as most candidates for benefices were singularly well qualified to hold them. Once again it was only after the relaxation of such control that unqualified persons come to hold benefices in increasing numbers. It would be too hold an assertion to claim that the system of provision and reservation was a source of strength to the medieval church in Scotland, but whatever the drawbacks or merits of the system during the pontificate of Benedict XIII at least, the Scottish Church showed itself to be still in remarkably good shape.

The letters calendared in this volume are drawn, with three exceptions,¹ from seventy-two volumes of the Avignon Registers (Reg Aven 278-349) and twelve Vatican Registers (Reg Avat 321-332). Both of these series are preserved in the Vatican archives. For a discussion of the relationship between these registers and the style and format of the letters which they contain, reference should be made to the introduction to the Calendar of Papal Letters to Scotland of Clement VII of Avignon.⁸ It should also be noted that in common with the registers for Clement VII, he Avignon Registers covering the pontificate of Benedict XIII also contain a considerable number of financial entries. This material has not been published in this volume, but a calendar of such entries from this and other

cameral series may be consulted in the Department of Scottish History University of Glasgow. Of the letters themselves, this collection is clearly incomplete, the most serious biatus occurring during pontifical years five, six, seven and eight, when only twenty letters relating to Scotland in all and several of these of marginal interest remain on record.¹ The period covered by these years between 1308 and 1402 was a particularly difficult one for Benedict. From 15 September 1308 he was beseiged by the French in his palace at Avignon, and although military operations were eventually suspended. Benedict remained a virtual prisoner at Avignon until his escape on 3 March 1403 to Château Renard in the hospitable territory of Louis of Anjou.² Some registers for this period are evidently missing, but in the nature of events much less curial business was inevitably transacted during this period than on either side of it.3 By contrast, as Benedict's remaining adherents withdrew their allegiance. Scottish entries become more and more numerous as his active pontificate drew nearer to its end. In this respect Scotland's untiring devotion to Benedict's cause is not only of interest in its own right, but fortuitously provides an unparalleled opportunity to study the Scottish Church at the turn of the fourteenth and fifteenth centuries

Then a certain Thomas Curant, calling himself a familiar of William, bishop of Glasgow, took down the letters of excommunication from the nave; and John Forestar still contemping the letters of excommunication refused to demit the archdeaconry on the grounds of various appeals to the pope, to the hurt and scandal of William de Glenndonwyne and John Stewart who therefore likewise appealed. The pope, at the petition of the aforesaid duke, declares the marriage to be valid, the children legitimate and dispenses Elizabeth and Robert to live together as husband and wife.

At the instance of the said abbot and convent the case had been committed for settlement to master Toribio Garsie de Sanctofacundo. archdeacon of Alcaraz in the church of Toledo, papal chaplain and auditor of appeals, who found for Henry and so mandatory letters were sent for the annexation to be suspended and Henry provided to Monyfriche; but it had been claimed on behalf of the abbot and convent that their procurator had been unlawfully detained from pursuing their case and therefore Henry is to be summoned and examined and if this is true then the abbot and convent are to be restored to their position in the case before the decision against them.

REPORT

of the 88th Annual Meeting

The 88th Annual Meeting of the Scottish History Society was held in the Rooms of the Royal Society, George Street, Edinburgh, on Saturday, 13 December 1974, at 11.15 a.m. Professor G. W. S. Barrow, President, was in the Chair.

The Report of Council was as follows:

The Council is pleased to report that the tenth volume of the Fourth Series, William Melrose in China: 1845-1855; letters of a Scatish tea merchant, edited by Hoh-cheung and Lorna H. Mui, was issued to members early in the year. It was received well by members, and has attracted considerable attention outside the Society, especially from economic historians interested in trade with south-east Asia.

The national political and economic crisis at the beginning of this year delayed the printing of the next volume to be issued to members, *Scottish Electoral Politics: 1832–1854*, edited by Jain Brash. It is, however, now in the final stages of production and will be available early in 1975. Members will recollect that this volume, drawing on documents relating to Midlothian county politics during this period, illustrates the Conservative party reaction in Scotland to the 1832 Reform Act and the development of electoral management techniques.

The publication to be issued to members thereafter will be in the form of a tribute to Dr Annie I. Dunlop, who before her death last year was such a prominent benefactor to this Society. The work will be a *Calendar of Papal Letters to Scotland* taken from the Vatican Archives, and will be in two volumes, the first, edited by the Right Rev. Monsignor Charles Burns, consisting of letters of Pope *Benedit XIII*, 1394–1418. The first volume will also contain a memoir of Dr Dunlop by Dr I. B. Cowan, Honotary reassure of the Society. The two volumes, for the years 1974 and 1975, will be issued together, and, provided that there are no extraordinary delays, will bring the issue of volumes to members in line with their annual subscription sonce again.

The Scottish Academic Press, in carrying out the reprint programme announced in last year's annual report, has also suffered from the difficulties of the earlier part of this year. The first batch of reprints, however, are confidently expected to be available early in the spring of 1975; further details will be circulated to members as soon as possible.

Members of Council who retire in rotation at this time are Mr Ronald G. Cant, Mr John G. Dunbar and Mr Donald J. Withrington, The following will be proposed to the Annual Meeting for election to Council: Mrs Marjorie O. Anderson, Dr John R. Hume, Dr David Stevenson.

During the past year twelve members have died, thirteen have resigned, and three removed from membership for non-payment of subscription; twenty-two new members have joined. The total membership, including 23 libraries, is now 730, compared with 736 in 1973.

In presenting the Annual Report, Monsignor David McRoberts drew attention to the measures being taken to bring the publications programme up to date. He also pointed out that decreasing membership in conjunction with continuously rising costs was likely to create a serious situation for the Society. This could be met only by increasing membership substantially or by finding more economical methods of production, and Council were eivine their attention to this.

The Hon, Treasurer reported a satisfactory balance, but confirmed the problem of production costs. He expressed his gratitude for the grant awarded by the Carnezie Trust, and for a donation of L too to the Society.

Mr A. Cameron, seconded by Dr Charles Haws, moved the adoption of the Annual Report, which was approved.

Dr Marinell Ash, seconded by Rev. H. R. Sefton, nominated for election as ordinary members of Council Mrs M. O. Anderson, Dr J. R. Home, and Dr D. Stevenson, and they were duly elected.
