NOBILITY CONNECTED with the COUNTY.

1399.—GEO. LINDSAY CRAUFURD, *Earl of Craufurd and Lindsay*, Viscount Carnock, died in 1808, without issue. He is succeeded in his estate by his sister Lady Mary but it is yet unknown who succeeds to the titles of *Craufurd and Lindsay*.

1457.—GEORGE WILLIAM LESLIE, *Earl of Rothes*, Lord Leslie, (son of George Raymond Evelyn, Esq. by Jean Elizabeth, Countess of Rothes,) succeeded his mother in 1810. He married, 1st, the Hon. Miss Pelham; 2d, Miss Campbell, daughter of Colonel Duncan Campbell of Dunoon. *Issue.*—(*Leslie-House, Fifeshire.*)

1457.—GEORGE DOUGLAS, *Earl of Morton*, Lord Aberdour, (Lord Douglas of Lochleven 1791,) K. T. Lord Lieutenant of the County, Lord Chamberlain of her Majesty's Household, born 1759, succeeded his father 1774. Married 1814, Elizabeth, daughter of Lady Buller. *Aberdour-House*.

1581.—FRANCIS STUART, *Earl of Moray*, Lord Doune (Lord Stuart of Castlestuart 1796,) son of Francis Earl of Moray, by Jean, daughter of Lord Gray; succeeded his father in 1810. Married, 1st, Lucy, daughter of the late General Scott; 2d, Margaret, daughter of Sir Philip Ainslie. *Issue.*—(*Donibristle, Fifeshire.*)

1619.—THOMAS ERSKINE, *Earl of Kellie*, Viscount Feuton, Baronet, one of the representatives of the Scottish Peerage, Commander of his Swedish Majesty's order of Gustavus Vasa, Vice Lord Lieutenant of the County; succeeded his nephew 1799. Married. *Kellie-Castle & Camba-House*.

1623.—DAVID WILLIAM MURRAY, *Earl Mansfield* 1792, Viscount Stormont; Heritable Keeper of the Palace of Scone, Lord Lieutenant of Clackmannanshire, born in 1777; succeeded his father in 1796. *Issue.* *Scone, Perthshire*.

1633.—THOMAS BRUCE, *Earl of Elgin & Kincardine*, Lord Bruce, a Privy Counsellor; a Major-General; born 1766; succeeded his brother 1771. *Issue.* *Broomhall*.

1641.—ALEXANDER LESLIE MELVILLE, *Earl of Leven & Melville*; Lord Balgonie, Comptroller General of the Customs; succeeded his father 1802. *Issue.* *Melville-House & Balgonie-Castle*.

1651.—ALEXANDER LINDSAY, *Earl of Balcarraw*, Lord Lindsay of Cammerland; a General in the Army; Colonel of the 63d Regiment of Foot; born 1752; succeeded his father 1768. *Issue.* *Haigh, Lancashire*.

1703.—JAMES HOPE JOHNSTONE, *Earl of Hope*

son, Lord Hope, (Lord Hopetoun 1809,) Lord Lieutenant of Linlithgowshire; born 1741; succeeded his father 1781. *Issue.* *Hopetoun-House, Linlithgowshire.*

1801.—JAMES ST. CLAIR ERSKINE, *Earl of Rosslyn*; Lord Loughborough; Baronet; a Lieutenant-General in the Army; a Counsellor of State to the Prince of Wales; and Director of Chancery in Scotland for life. *Dysart-House.*

1794.—THOMAS DUNDAS, *Lord Dundas*; Lord Lieutenant of Orkney. *Issue* *Aske and Upleatham, Yorkshire*; *Kerse-House, Stirlingshire.*

1797.—GILBERT ELLIOT, *Earl of Minto*; Visc. Melgund; Son of Gilbert, first Earl of Minto; born 1782, succeeded his father 1814. Mar. 1806, Mary, daughter of Mr Brydone of Lennel House, Roxburghs. *Issue.* *Minto, Roxbur.*

1814.—JOHN HOPE, *Lord Niddrey*; K. B. Lieut.-Gen. in the army, Col. of 92d foot, son of John, Earl of Hopetoun, by Jane, daught. of R. Oliphant, Esq of Rossie; born 1765; advanced to the Peerage May 1814. Mar. 1st, 1798, Elizabeth, daugh. of Cha. Hope Weir of Craigiehall, who died 1801 without issue; 2d, 1803, Louisa Dorothea, daugh. of Sir J. Wedderburn of Ballindean. *Issue, several sons.* *Niddrey, Linlithgowsh. & Rankeillour-House, Fifesh.*

REGULATIONS

For the FERRIES of KINGHORN & LEITH, &c.

I.—THE Boats to be numbered, and to have distinguishing Vanes, and the Master of each Boat to wear a Ticket on his Hat, with the number of his boat on it, to distinguish him.

II.—The Passengers in any Cutter, Pinnace, or Yawl, not to exceed the following number:—In Cutters, twenty; in Pinnaces, nine; in Yawls, six; and in Florying Yawls, nine; and the number of passengers allowed to go in the Coach Boat is restricted to fifteen; with power to the Superintendent or his Deputies to limit the passengers in any of these boats to a smaller number.

III.—The Coach Boat to be under the direction of the Superintendent.

IV.—The Master of each Boat, Pinnace, &c. to have absolute command, and to report, upon landing, any disobedience or improper conduct on the part of the Crew to the Superintendent or his Deputy; the former being authorised to punish according to the nature of the offence.

V.—That at Pettycur, during the day tides, (except on Sundays,) one boat shall be at anchor, weather permitting, and to sail for Leith, at one and a half hour's flood—a second to sail at two hours before high water—and a third at half an hour before high water, if the wind be at S. W. or S. E. or to the southward of these points; and at high water with other winds. When a spare boat is in the harbour, she may be freighted.

Pinnaces to sail when freighted, or to be dispatched by the Superintendent or his Deputies, at any time they may judge proper and necessary.

One Pinnace to be kept at Leith in moderate weather, especially at such times as large boats cannot sail, on account of the tide.

VI.—The Crew of the last Boat for turn is to attend to carry off the Passengers to the Anchor Boat, for which each passenger is to pay them twopence.

VII.—The Boats to Pettycur to sail from Leith every day (Sundays excepted) at the following hours, viz.

First Boat three hours before high water.

Second Boat one hour after the first boat.

Third Boat at high water, and, if the wind be to the northward, half an hour before high water.

Boats by night to be regulated by the Superintendent; and

One Boat three hours before high water ; and one Boat at high water ; excepting when the wind is contrary, when it is to sail half an hour before high water from either side.

VIII.—The two Cutters, as soon as ready, to be dispatched one from Pettycur, and the other from Newhaven, at 9 o'clock in the morning, from 1st April to 1st October, and at 10 o'clock betwixt 1st October and 1st April, and to return from the other side at 2 o'clock afternoon.

IX.—A Pinnace, and in bad weather a Deeked Boat, to sail bewixt Burntisland and Newhaven or Leith each day leaving Burntisland at 10 o'clock A. M. and returning from Newhaven at 3 o'clock P. M. Two Boats for Goods and Passengers to ply between Burntisland and Leith ; one of these to sail from each side every day's tide at an hour before high water.

X.—The first Harbour Boat from Pettycur and Leith each tide is fitted up with a first and second Cabin. Tickets for the first Cabin are to be had from the Superintendent or his Deputies ; and no person to be admitted into the first Cabin or into the Stern Seats, without such ticket.

XI.—No Stallion to be taken into a boat where other horses have been previously put without consent of the owners of the horses. Dogs are to be put in the Fore Peak, or some other safe place.

XII.—No Coach, Chaise, &c. or Horses, which are not intended to be sent across the ferry, to go further than the east end of the house at Pettycur presently occupied by Mrs Morrison.

XIII.—No Porter to go on board any of the boats when landing, nor till employed ; and no Hostler or Post Boy, or their employers, to go further than the Old Toll Gate at such times.

Passengers will have the goodness to report to the Superintendent or his Deputies any neglect or deviation from the above Regulations ; and it is requested, if they cannot attend personally, that they will leave a written complaint with the Superintendent.

XIV.—That the Master of each Boat, &c. keep constantly on Board a Copy of the foregoing Regulations, and Table of Freights.

N. B.—It is recommended to Passengers having Horses or Carriages to cross, to be down at the Ferry half an hour before the sailing of the Boat.
