# NOBILITY

CONNECTED WITH THE COUNTY OF FIFE.

---

1399.—GEORGE LINDESAY CRAUFURD, *Earl Craufurd*, Earl Lindesay 1633, Visc. Garnock 170 &c. ; died 1808, without issue. He was succeeded in his estates by his sister Lady Mary. It is understood there are three claimants to this Estate, viz. Henry Bethune of Kilconquhar, eldest son of Martine E. Lindesay. Lieut. Col. Campbell, eldest surviving son of the late John Campbell of Newfield, and grand-nephew of the Great Gen. John, 17th Earl of Craufurd and 4th of Lindesay, claims the title of the Earldom of Craufurd, as heir of line, in right of his grandmother Lady Mary Lindesay Campbell, sister of the above Earl. Lieut. Col. Lindesay, 39th Regiment, claims as the descendant of Patrick, 4th Lord Lindesay of Byres, ancestor of the Earls of Lindesay and Craufurd.—*Craufurd Priory, Fife.*

1457.—GEORGE WILLIAM EVELYN LESLIE, *Earl of Rothes*, Lord Leslie and Ballenbreich, (son of Henrietta Ann, Countess of Rothes, and George Leslie of Leslie, Esq. born Nov. 8, 1809 ; suc. his mother Jan. 30, 1819 ; a minor.—*Leslie House, Fifeshire Shrubhall, Surry.*

1457.—GEORGE DOUGLAS, *Earl of Morton*, Lord Aberdour, (Lord Douglas of Lochleven 1791,) K. T. Lord Lieutenant of the County, Col. of Fifesh. militia, and Lord High Commissioner to the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, (son of Sholto, last Earl, by Katherine, daughter of the hon. John Hamilton ; born in 1761, succeeded his father in 1774. Married, in 1814, Susanne, grand-daughter of Sir Francis Buller, Bart. Presumptive heir—George Sholto, his cousin.—*Dalmahoy, Mid-Lothian, Aberdour-House, Fife.*

1681.—FRANCIS STUART, *Earl of Moray*, Lord Doune, (Lord Stuart of Castlestuart 1796,) Lord Lieut. of Elginsh. (son of Francis, last Earl, by Jean, daughter of John, Lord Gray) ; born 1771, succeeded

his father 1810; married, 1st, in 1795, Lucy, 2d daughter of Gen. John Scott of Balcomie, who died 1798. Issue Francis Lord Doune, born 1795, and John; 2d, in 1801, Margaret, daughter of Sir Philip Innes. Issue James, Arch. George and Charles, and Ladies Jane, Margaret Jane, Anne Grace, and Louisa.—*Donibristle, Fifeshire; Darnaway Castle, Morayshire; Castle-Stuart, Inverness-shire; Doune Lodge, Perthshire; Drumsheugh, Edinburgh.*

1619.—THOMAS ERSKINE, *Earl of Kellie, Viscount Montrose, Lord Pittenweem*, (Premier Viscount of Scotland), Commander of the Swedish order of Gustavus Vasa, Vice Lord Lieutenant of Fife, (son to Sir David Erskine of Cambo), born 1745; suc. his nephew 1799. Married, in 1771, Anne, daughter of Capt. Gordon of Ardoch. No issue. Presumptive heir his brother, Methven Erskine of Airdrie. B.—*Kellie Castle and Cambo House, Fife.*

1633.—THOMAS BRUCE, *Earl of Elgin and Kinross, Lord Bruce*, a Privy Counsellor; K. C. Lieut.-General, (son of Charles E. of Elgin, by Martha, only child of Thos. White of London); born 1766, succeeded his brother Wm. Robert 1771. Married 1st, in 1799, Mary, only child of William Hamilton Nisbet, of Dirleton. Issue, Geo. Cha. Constantine Ld. Bruce, born 1800, and Ladies Mary, Matilda, Harriet, and Lucy; 2d, in 1810, Elizabeth, daughter of James Townsend Oswald of Dunnikier. Issue, two sons and a daughter.—*Broomhall, Fife.*

1633.—CHARLES STUART, *Earl of Traquair, Lord Linton* (Roman Catholic), son to John, last Earl, by Christiana, daughter of Sir Peter Anstruther of Anstrutherfield; succeeded his father 1779. He married Mary, daughter of George Ravenscroft, Esq. 1773, who died 1796. Issue, Charles Lord Linton, born 1781, and Lady Louisa.—*Traquair House, Peebles-shire.*

1641.—DAVID LESLIE MELVILLE, *Earl of Leven and Melville*; Viscount Balgonie, &c. a Captain in Royal Navy, (son to Alexander, last Earl, by Jane, daughter of John Thornton of Clapham, Surry, (who

died 1818); born 1786, succeeded his father 1820 unmarried.—*Melville-House & Balgonie-Castle, Fifeshire.*

1651.—ALEXANDER LINDSAY, *Earl of Balcarres*, Lord Lindsay of Cumberland; a General, Colonel of the 63d foot, (son of James, last Earl, by Anne, daughter of Sir Robert Dalrymple); born 1752, succeeded his father 1768. Married, in 1780, his cousin, Elizabeth, daughter of Charles Dalrymple, Esq. who died 1816. Issue, James Lord Lindsay, M. P. for Wigan, born 1784, (mar. 1811, Hon. Maria Frances Pennington, daughter of John Lord Muncaster. Issue five children) Charles Robert, Richard, and Edwin and Ladies Elizabeth Keith Heathcote, and Ann Wardlaw.—*Haigh, Lancashire; Earlsferry Abbey, Fifeshire.*

1703.—JOHN HOPE, *Earl of Hopetoun*, Viscount Aithrie, Lord Hope, (Lord Hopetoun 1809, Lord Niddry 1814); Lord Lieutenant of Linlithgowshire, G. C. B. Gen. Col. of the 42d foot, and Governor of the Royal Bank, Capt. General Royal Company of Archers, &c. (son of John, Earl of Hopetoun, by Jane, daughter of Robt. Oliphant, Esq. of Rossie, born 1765; and succeeded his half-brother, James Hope Johnstone, last Earl, 1816. Married, 1st, in 1798, Elizabeth, daughter of Chas. Hope Weir of Graigiehall, who died in 1801 without issue; 2d, in 1803, Louisa Dorothea, third daughter of Sir John Wedderburn of Ballindean. Issue, John Lord Hope, James, Charles, Alexander, George, and other four sons and a daughter.—*Hopetoun-House, Linlithgowshire; Ormiston Hall, East-Lothian.*

1621.—DAVID WILLIAM MURRAY, *Earl of Mansfield* 1792, Viscount Stormont; Heritable Keeper of the Palace of Scone, Lord Lieutenant of Clackmannanshire, born in 1777; succeeded his father in 1792. Married, 1797, Frederica, daughter of his Grace, Wm. Markham, D. D. Archbishop of York, and has issue.—*Scone, Perthshire; Comlongon Castle, Dumfriesshire; Shaw Park, Clackmannanshire; Caenwood, Middlesex.*

1801.—JAMES ST CLAIR ERSKINE, *Earl of Ross*

1805; Lord Loughborough, G. C. B. Director of the Chancery in Scotland, Colonel of the 9th dragoons, and a General, (son of Sir Henry Erskine, by Janet, sister to the late Earl of Rosslyn); succeeded his uncle 1805. Married Harriet, daughter of the hon. Edward Bonverie, and cousin to the Earl of Radnor, who died 1810. Issue, James Alex. Lord Loughborough, born 1802, Henry Francis, and Lady Janet. B.—*Dysart-House, Fifeshire; Rosslyn Castle, Edinburghshire; and Laigle, Yorkshire.*

1813.—GILBERT ELLIOT, *Murray Kyninmonth. Earl of Minto; Visc. Melgund*; (son of Gilbert, first Earl, by Maria, daughter of Sir Geo. Amyand, Bt.); born 1782, succeeded his father 1814. Married, in 1806, Mary, daughter of Pat. Brydone, of Lennel, Berwickshire. Issue. B.—*Minto, Roxburghshire.*

1794.—DUNDAS.—LAURENCE DUNDAS, *Lord Dundas*, (son of Thomas Lord Dundas, by Lady Charlotte, sister of Wm. Earl Fitzwilliam, succeeded his father 1820; married Miss Hale, daughter of General Hale. Issue, Thomas, M. P. for Richmond; and other children.—*Aske and Upleatham, Yorkshire; Kerse-House, Stirlingshire.*

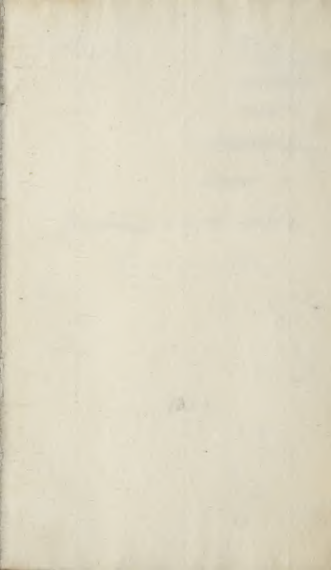
