This Order was first instituted at the Coronation of Henry IV. in 1399, since which Time it has been usual for Kings and Queens at their Coronation to create Knights: It was re-established by K. George I. in 1725, and made a military Order for ever for 38 Knights, besides the Sovereign. The Symbol is a Sceptre, three Imperial Crowns, with a Rose and Thistle, in a Circle of Gold, and this Motto, Tria juncta in uno; which Badge, with a Crimson Ribbon, is daily worn by the Knights of this Order.

KNIGHTS OF THE THISTLE.

This Order of St. Andrew, is said to have been first erected by Achaius, King of Scotland, and afterwards revived by K. James VII. whose Misfortunes preventing its full Re-stitution, Q. Anne was pleased to establish it in 1704. The Collar is composed of Thistles, interwoven and linked with Leaves of Rue, all Gold, with the Image of St. Andrew pendant, in a Vesture of Cloth of Gold. The Ordinary Badge of this Order is a Green Ribbon, whereat hangs a Thistle of Gold, crowned with an imperial Crown, with a Circle of Gold also, bearing the Motto, Nemo me impune lacessit.
