

# ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS

You will receive herewith a copy of the act 55th Geo. III. cap. 94. initialed, "An Act to continue and "amend several Acts relating to "the British White Herring Fish-"ery," which you will carefully and frequently peruse, so as to make yourself completely master of the provisions thereof, and of the alterations thereby made in the act of the 48th Geo. III. cap. 110. The duties you have to perform will appear from the act itself; but in order to assist you in the understanding thereof, I subjoin a short abstract of the provisions in which the officers are concerned, and in the execution thereof you will please attend to such directions as follow.

In consequence of the alterations now made in the act of the 48th Geo. III. cap. 110. corresponding alterations have been made in the Forms formerly used, and such new ones have been added as are necessary; and you will receive, in an Appendix hereto, copies of all such Forms, numbered from 1 to 25, both inclusive, which will fall to be used in future instead of those formerly ordered. The Forms from 1 to 17, both inclusive, bear the same numbers, and are applicable to the same purposes, as the Forms so numbered in the former Book of Instructions. Nº 18 is a new Form; and from Nº 19 to 25, both inclusive, the Forms now to be used come in room of those formerly numbered from 18 to 24, both inclusive.

You will observe, that, under the present act, the bounty on herrings is increased to 4s. per barrel-that Sect. 6. it is only to be paid upon such herrings, as, in addition to the requisites under the act of the 48th, &c. have been gutted, cured, and packed with- Sect. 18. in twenty-four hours after they were caught-that the curer thereof is to make oath that they were so gutted and packed, and that they have not Sect. 32. been already presented for bountythat a barrel of bung-packed herrings, or herrings repacked with Sect. 31. small salt, to be entitled to bounty, must contain at the least 235 libs. weight of fish, exclusive of salt and brine-that a barrel of herrings, repacked with great salt, to be entitled to bounty, must contain 212 libs. weight of fish at the least, exclusive of salt and brine-that to entitle bungpacked herrings to bounty, a space of Sect. 30. fifteen days must intervene between the day when they were originally cured and packed, and the day when

they were originally bung-packedand that in the case of herrings repacked with great salt, a similar space of time must have intervened between the day when they were originally cured and packed, and . the day when they were begun to be repacked. A provision is also made, by which it is declared that the full bounty is only to be paid on such herrings as have been gut-Sect. 33. ted with a knife, and that a deduction is to be made from the bounty on such herrings as have not been so gutted. This provision, however, does not take effect until the 1st of June 1816, and it is therefore not considered necessary at present to issue any Instructions for carrying it into execution-these you will be furnished with before the commencement of next year's fishing. In the meantime, the marks to be set on the barrels at the fishery are to be as follows:

The marks denoting the month and the day of the month continue the same as those mentioned in the former Book of Instructions, page 4.-the marks to denote that herrings were originally cured in barrels, and gutted and packed within twenty-four hours after they were caught, (being the only herrings upon which bounty is allowed), are to be two Roman letters, G. B .--the mark to denote that the herrings were originally cured in barrels, but were gutted and packed not within twenty-four hours after they were caught, is to be one Roman letter G .- the mark for ungutted herrings, originally packed in barrels, continues the same as formerly, viz. one Roman letter U.

Cod and ling are allowed to be Sect 7. taken by the crews of deep sea busses; but you will observe, that such cod and ling must be stowed in bulk, and that the salt for the curing thereof is to be taken on board for the purpose.

Sections 7th and 8th relate to the appointment of superintendants for the coast fishery ; and by the latter of these, every officer of the fishery is appointed a superintendant thereof within his own district. In executing the authority thus entrusted to you, it is impossible at present to give you specific directions for your conduct; much must always be left to your own judgment and discretion, although more particular instructions on the subject may afterwards be issued. The great object you have to attend to is to prevent depredations from being committed, and to preserve order at the fishery ; and to effect this, you will use every lawful means in your power. You are entitled to demand the assistance of every person who may happen to be at hand to enable you to accomplish this object; and if any flagrant offence is committed, it is

your duty to bring the matter before the Sheriff of the county, for the due punishment of the offenders. You will always bear in mind, that the authority thus given you, does not invest you with any judicial powers.

If herring nets are set or hauled see. 11. on Sunday in Scotland, they are forfeited.

If white herrings are packed in Sect 12. barrels made in whole or in part of fir,—or in barrels not half an inch thick throughout, or which do not contain thirty two gallons English wine measure, both fish and barrels are forfeited. You will observe, however, that this regulation does not take effect till after 1st June 1816.

A fixed standard for the herring Sect. 13 cran is also to be used after the same period,—with regard to which you will receive directions in due time.

You will further observe, that an Sect. 14 alteration has been made in the re-

gulations for clearing out vessels for the coast fishery, and that it is now lawful to ship salt, barrels, &c. without the presence of an officer of the fishery. It is not, however, intended that the officer shall never attend the shipping of such articles; on the contrary, when his other duty, or the dispatch necessary to be given to the adventurer, will permit it, the officer is expected to attend the shipment as formerly. Forms Nº 1 and 2 are made applicable to either mode, and you will fill them up accordingly, as the case may be. If the articles are shipped in your presence they will fall to be recorded in your coast fishery book. as directed in your former book of instructions, pages 38, 39, and 40. If they are shipped without your presence, they will fall to be entered in the same book, agreeably to the specification made in the shipper's declaration, distinguishing the different articles. and the quantities

thereof. It is not necessary that the entries should be made in your books by tallies, as required by the former book of instructions; it will be sufficient that such entries (in whatever book they fall to be made) should be made in figures. In carrying this regulation into execution, Sect 15. you will bear in mind that nets *shipped* under the regulated standard of mesh, are forfeited.

The regulations regarding the sect is clearing out and discharging of vessels are declared not to apply to boats, not exceeding the burthen of four tons.

The account required by the 32d sect 17. section of the act of the 48th Geo. III. cap. 110, is altered in so far as regards the salt used in the cure of herrings, the quantity of which used every day is not required to be distinguished in the account. The master has only to make oath of the *total* quantity used to the best of his knowledge and belief, upon the cure of the herrings mentioned in the account, and that no part of the salt carried out under the certificate of the fishery officer, was embezzled or sold.

Sect. 19.

The declaration required by the 83d section of the act of the 48th Geo. III. cap. 110, to accompany transhipped herrings, is also altered, in so far as, that the declaration, although not verified at the place of transhipment, is to be held to be good, upon the oath of the master arriving with the herrings. The necessary alterations have been made in Form N° 4, and you will take care that the declaration be filled up agreeably thereto, as the case may happen to be.

Sect. 20.

The account required by the 35th section of the act of the 48th, &c. to be kept by persons curing herrings on shore, is likewise altered, and the same distinctions are to be made therein as in account N° 3. required to be kept by masters of vessels at the fishery .--- To secure the production to the officer before removal, of herrings cured on shore, a penalty of £5 is imposed upon the curer who shall not comply with the regulations of the said 35th section, unless the quantity of salt

which he shall have stored, does not exceed thirty bushel. This you will therefore attend to; and you will further bear in mind, that unless the account is delivered to you, and the herrings produced to you before removal, the herrings are also not to be entitled to bounty, whether the curer shall have had a greater or less quantity than thirty bushels of salt in store. You will further observe, that you are not to deliver Sect. 21. to the curer a copy of any part of the account, but such as relates to bounty herrings, for which bounty has not been yet granted ; and that if the herrings, in whole or in part, shall be produced to be branded at the place of cure, after you shall

have delivered to the curer such copy of the account, you are, before branding, to receive the same back from him, and give him an extract of such part of the account as relates to the residue of the herrings cured with a view to the bounty, but which have not yet been branded. You will likewise observe, that no herrings cured on shore which shall have been brought from thence to any other station, are to be branded for bounty, unless they shall be accompanied (in addition to every other requisite) with a copy or extract of the before mentioned account.

Sect. 22.

A provision, you will observe, has also been made, by which bounty may be allowed on the surplus or *outcome* barrels of repacked herrings, and on substituted barrels, although they shall not have the marks which are required to be set on barrels at the fishery, provided the curer shall make oath as to the truth of the fact before the proper officer of the fishery. The necessary alterations for carrying this provision into effect, have been made upon the Request Note, Form Nº 17.; and you will take the oath of the curer as pointed out in the said Form, according as it may be applicable to the case in question; that is to say, after you have thoroughly examined the herrings, the curer is in all cases to take the first oath mentioned in the said Form, that the herrings were gutted and packed within 24 hours, and were not either in whole or in part in the same or in different barrels previously produced for bounty; and he is then, in the event of there being either surplus or additional barrels in the parcel, not having the marks required to be set thereon at the fishery, to take both or either of the other oaths mentioned in the Request Note, as the case may require. This

being done you will cause the herrings to be branded, but not sooner. Sect. 23. A provision has also been made by which herrings repacked from bung-packed herrings formerly branded for bounty, are to be reexamined and re-branded, but no bounty to be allowed thereon. This provision is rendered necessary both for the security of the officer by whom the herrings were originally branded, and for the advantage of the repacker, who will thus have it in his power to get the bounty brand on the surplus or outcome barrels. When a curer signifies his intention to you of thus repacking bung-packed herrings already branded for bounty, you will supply him with a Request Note, agreeably to Form N° 18. which he will fill up, as the case may require. You will attend at the time and place specified, and examine the herrings and the barrels in the same manner, and with the same attention, as

if they had been originally produced to you to be branded. You will administer to the curer the oath mentioned in the Form; and if you shall be satisfied that the herrings are in every respect such as herrings entitled to bounty should be, you will cause the original barrels to be rebranded in your presence immediately under the middle of the crown brand, and close to it, with an hot iron applied in the form of a Lozenge; thus,

and you will also cause the surplus barrels to be branded in your presence with your own crown brand for repacked herrings, subjoining thereto the lozenge brand, in the form and manner above described.-The letters P. P. in the left section of the upper division of the lozenge, denote that the herrings were repacked,-the figures in the right section denote the year of repacking, -the letters in the under division are the initials of your name, being the officer by whom the examination of the herrings in a repacked state was made.-The entry of every such transaction is to be made in your Barrel Bounty Book, in the same manner, and with a similar certificate of the inspection made, as is required in the case of herrings originally produced to you to be branded for bounty. It will be proper to allot a separate portion of the Book for recording these transactions in. -You will constantly bear in mind

that no such herrings, whether original barrels or surplus barrels, are entitled to a second bounty; and you will at your peril take care not to grant any certificate for bounty thereon. Should the herrings not appear to you to be such as herrings entitled to bounty should be, you will be cautious not to rebrand them, and will recollect that they are liable to forfeiture in all cases in which herrings branded for bounty are liable. You will act therefore as the case may require, and will immediately report the matter fully to the Commissioners, with your proceedings therein, with the name of the officer by whom they appear to have been branded in a bung-packed state.

Provisions are made regarding Sections herrings cured in bulk, herrings 27, 82, 83, the refuse of the manufactory of red herrings, and herrings imported in barrels from Ireland, the Isle of Man, &c. which, as well as every other provision in the act, you will do your endeavours to see carried into execution. Bulk herrings imported are required, in certain cases, to be without delay packed into barrels marked with the word Bulk. The signification of the words without delay, must be left in a great measure to your own discretion. They embrace no precise period of time, but the meaning of them cannot be mistaken, and you have only to judge from the particular circumstances of the case, whether the intentions of the Legislature have been complied with by the curer.

You will further observe, that herrings cured in bulk in pickle, and afterwards packed into barrels, are not required to have the barrels branded "Bulk," nor are they forfeited if mixed with herrings cured otherwise than in bulk; but in order to prevent this indulgence from being abused, it becomes necessary to be particularly careful that such herrings have been actually cured in bulk in pickle, in pits, vats, &c. which are really and truly tight, and every way such as is meant in this provision. You will therefore, in the event of there being any pits or vats, &c. in your station, in which it is intended to cure herrings in bulk, make a frequent and careful inspection of them; and it is only in the event of their being perfectly tight, and every way fit to preserve the pickle of the herrings, that the herrings cured therein are to be considered entitled to this provision, or to be treated in any other manner than herrings cured in bulk not in tight vats, pits, &c. Should any herrings in barrels be imported at your station from Ireland, the Isle of Man, or other place referred to in the 28th section, they will fall to be recorded in your Coast Fishery Book; but as such herrings do not come under the law which affects herrings

caught in the British fishery, they should be recorded in a separate part of the Book allotted for that purpose. You are not called upon to examine the cure of such herrings, or the sufficiency or size of the barrels in which they are contained. All that you have to do with them, is to see that they are branded as the act requires,-that the marks are not removed from the barrels,-that they are not mixed with British herrings, &c. as therein mentioned ;-and you are to be particularly careful for the character of this service and of the British fishery, that the regulations regarding the importation in barrels, of herrings from Ireland or the Isle of Man, &c. be strictly complied with. A provision is made, declaring that the words required by this act to be branded on the bulge of barrels are not to be less than an inch and an half in length. These words are Bulk, Refuse, Irish, Manx, or

Sect. 29.

other word descriptive of the island or colony in the King's dominious, from which herrings are brought; and you will observe, that this provision does not apply to any other brands, marks, or characters, required to be set on barrels,—such as the curer's name,—the name of the port where, and the year when the same were cured, &c. which continue of the same size as formerly.

The places at which herrings are Sect 32allowed to be branded for bounty are also fixed by the act, viz. if cured on shore, they may be branded either at the place where they were cured, or in some other place within the same port, or at the next place without such port. For example, supposing herrings to be cured on shore in Caithness, they may be branded either at the original place of cure, or at some other place within the officer's district, or they may be brought to Leith, &c. to be branded. If the herrings shall be cured with salt carried out in a vessel cleared out for the fishery, and brought from thence either in the same or in another vessel, they can only be branded at the port or place where the vessel shall arrive with them.

With regard to the exportation of herrings, you will observe, that the certificate required by the act of the 48th, &c. to accompany repacked herrings sent coastwise for exportation to a place out of Europe, is now dispensed with, in so far as relates to herrings branded for bounty ;--- if they are not so branded, the certificate is required as formerly. You will also observe, that every barrel of herrings exported, whether branded for bounty or not, is required to contain the following weight of fish, exclusive of salt and brine, viz. If bung-packed or repacked with small salt, (and here it may be proper to observe, that herrings repacked with small salt are considered to be the

ect. 35.

same as bung-packed herrings, and that no herrings are held to be repacked, unless they are repacked with great salt) 235 libs. weight of fish at the least-if repacked and intended for exportation to a port or place in Europe, 224 libs. weight of fish at the least-and if repacked and intended for exportation to a place out of Europe, 212 libs. weight of fish at the least. In consequence of this provision, it becomes necessary that a more rigid examination. be made of herrings not branded for bounty intended for exportation than was formerly the case. With regard to bounty herrings intended for exportation, the examination will go on as mentioned in pages 25, 26, 27, 28, and 29, of the former book of instructions, and the entry thereof, (with the exception of the tallies) will be made in your exportation book as directed at page 46 of the former book of instructions; but in regard to herrings not branded

for bounty, you will, (in addition to the examination of the barrels formerly ordered), make such an inspection, by opening and weighing a sufficient number of barrels, as will satisfy you that the barrels contained the respective weights of fish before mentioned; and you will record the examination in your exportation book, in the same manner as is directed in regard to bounty herrings.

An alteration is made in the mode of settling disputes between you and the curers, by which you are authorised to name one of the arbiters; and it is hoped that this regulation will be attended with better effects than the mode formerly prescribed.

A provision is also made, by which the premiums granted under the former act for the encouragement of persons fitting out boats for the open sea fishery and fishing on the coast of Scotland, are extended to boats so fitted out from Scotland, and

fishing on the coasts of Great Britain and Ireland, or the Isle of Man.

It has also been judged necessary Sect. 38. to define what vessels shall be considered to be fitted out for the British herring fishery, and what herrings shall be considered to be brought from thence; and you will take care to clear out, by a certificate under your hand, no vessel other than such as comes under the meaning of this section. Vessels not coming within the meaning of this section are to be viewed in no other light than other vessels going coastwise, which fall to be cleared out by the officers of Customs; and in the same manner, vessels arriving with herrings not coming within the meaning of the said section, are to be viewed in no other light than as vessels arriving coastwise, and in like manner falling to be discharged by the officers of the Customs.

A provision has likewise been Sect. 39. made, by which the Commissioners

are authorised to remit penalties and forfeitures when they are satisfied no fraud has been intended. The introduction of this clause may be a proof to you that it is not meant to encourage the seizing of articles for trifling deviations from the law, which the Commissioners are satisfied may arise in many cases without design, and even when the curer is anxious to comply with the regulation to the utmost of his power. It is therefore recommended to you to be particularly careful not to make seizures wantonly or unnecessarily; and in the return of such seizures as are made, you will particularly specify the grounds of the seizure, and state your opinion as to whether the deviation from the law, for which the seizure was made, arose from fraud and design, or from accidental causes; but although it is thus recommended to you not to harass the trade wantonly and unnecessarily, by making

seizures of their property for trivial causes, the interest of the Revenue, as well as the reputation of the fishery, and of this service in particular, requires that no herrings shall be branded for bounty but such as are in every respect entitled thereto, under the provisions of this act, and of the act of the 48th, &c.

Half barrels are entitled to half  $_{\text{Sect. 40.}}$ bounty, and must contain half the weight of fish that a barrel must do. They are also subject to the same rules, &c. as a barrel of herrings.

It is the wish and the hope of the Commissioners, that the official brand of the officers of the fishery shall be considered as a sacred pledge, upon which the public may implicitly rely; and as this can only be obtained by the utmost attention on the part of the officers, and a firm determination not to apply the brand in any case but such as the law permits, the Commisjoners enjoin the strictest attention on your part in the branding of such herrings as may be presented to you. The increase of the bounty renders it probable that every attempt will be made to obtain it; and it therefore becomes more necessary than ever that the officers be vigilant in their exertions to prevent its being improperly obtained. One great check will be the presence of the officers at the time of cure; and you are therefore, whenever you have a moment to spare from your other duty, to be constantly going about the curers' yards, to overlook and make your remarks upon what is going forward; and if you observe any improper practices, to take notice thereof, by putting marks upon the barrels, or otherwise, as you may think best fitted for the purpose, so that if such herrings shall be afterwards presented to you for bounty, you may be at no loss to distinguish them, and to know how to act .---

If the fishing is carried on in vessels in your district, it is your duty to go frequently on board of them, and to see what is going forward; and if you shall observe any improper practices, from which you are led to suspect that bounty may be attempted to be obtained for herrings contrary to the meaning of the act, you are to give notice thereof to the officer of the fishery at the port where the vessel was cleared out, or where you think it likely she may return for her discharge ; specifying particularly, for his information and caution, what you may have observed, and what marks you may have put on the suspected barrels.

If shore curing is carried on in your district, you will attend as much as you possibly can in the fish curers' yards, and proceed as before mentioned, giving notice to the officers at such ports as you think it likely the herrings may be removed to before branding, and being upon the alert in case' such herrings should be presented to yourself for inspection. To enable this most essential part of the officer's duty to be better attended to than formerly, additional officers have been appointed at the principal curing stations, and marts for cured herrings.

In addition to the attention and skill of the officers, a further security is to be found in administering the oaths required to be taken by the masters and curers. It is not sufficient that the parties shall make oath without being aware, in a manner, of what they are swearing to. You will therefore question them as to the nature of their accounts, &c .- will sift them thoroughly as to the different entries therein made,-will explain to them (if necessary) the nature of the oath, and endeavour to make them sensible of the consequences that will assuredly await them, if they shall be detected in making a false oath. These, and any other means that may occur to you as likely to prevent fraud or detect imposition, you will make use of, before ever the oath is administered; and if, after all this examination, the party is still ready to take the oath, you will administer it with due solemnity, and not in that rapid and careless manner which is too often used on such occasions.

If you shall detect any person in making a false oath, you will report the matter to the Commissioners, with the evidence by which the fact can be proved, that measures may be taken for raising a prosecution against him for the pains and penalties attending perjury.

Some of the officers have been in the practice of keeping a private book, in which they enter the quantity of herrings cured for

bounty, or that may be considered entitled to be presented for bounty, which is received by each curer in the district. This they bring to a total; and by deducting therefrom the herrings branded for the same curer from time to time, an additional security is obtained against fraud in regard to bounty. Much benefit has been derived from this practice, and the adoption of it is therefore recommended to you. Reference should be made in the book to the date and number of the accounts which relate to the herrings; and by comparing these accounts with the herrings you are requested to inspect for the purpose of branding, you will have the greater facility in detecting any at-tempt at fraud. A variation between the quantity received and the quantity presented for branding will no doubt frequently arise, as the herrings may happen to be bung-packed or re-packed after

they are brought from the fishery; but by making due allowance for this, you will be able, it is believed, to come pretty near the truth. Experience may suggest to you many improvements in the mode of carrying this hint into execution; and it is confidently expected, and peremptorily ordered, that you shall use every lawful method which ingenuity and practice may suggest, to prevent bounty from being improperly granted.

These instructions you will copy into the book, intitled on the back, "Orders."




