Y Order of the Lords and Gentlemen concerned in the Grand-Fishery of Great-Britain, I send you a Book with their Lordships Directions, for your receiving the Sum of Two Hundred Thousand Pound Sterling, which is to be added to the one

Million Sterling taken in London, which will make the Capital Twelve Hundred Thousand Pounds Sterling, to be applied for the carrying on the Grand-Fishery of Great-Britain. And for your Government herein, I have sent you down the Orders of the Lords and Gentlemen concerned in this Affair, viz.

ORDERED, That Mr. John Dickson of Edinburgh, Merchant, do lay this Book Open for taking in the faid Sum, and that you do keep it Open for the Space of Fourteen Days, and not longer.

You are likewise ordered, to let no Person subscribe more than Five Thousand Pounds, nor less than Five Hundred in his own Name.

ORDERED, That the Sum of Two Shillings and Sixpence Sterling for every Hundred Pounds that you receive at the Time of fubfcribing, be paid into the Bank at *Edinburgh*, till remitted into the Hands of Mefficurs Cox and Cleeve Bankers in London, in whose Hands the Money that was taken in for the Million was lodged.

You are likewife ordered, not to permit any People to fubscribe, but fuch as are of North-Britain.

THE Lords and Gentlemen have likewife ordered, That the Preamble for taking in the Subscription of Two Hundred Thousand Pounds by you at Edinburgh be the same, as is to the Book for taking in one Million Sterling in London, and which Preamble is as follows.

And we do likewife agree, to pay at the Time of our fubfcribing, the Sum of Two Shillings and Sixpence for every Hundred Pounds by us fubfcribed, in Part of the faid Subfcription ; which faid Sum of Two Shillings and Sixpence per Cent. is for defraying the Charge of taking out the faid Patent, and fuch other Expences as shall appear to be abfolutely neceffar for carry-ing on this Undertaking; and that the faid Two Shillings and Sixpence per Cent. fhall be paid in-to the Hands of Meffieurs Cox and Cleeve Gold-finiths in Cornhill, London, and that no Part thereof be isfued by them, but by an Order under the Hands of three of the Commitee, viz. *Richard Mead* junior Efq; Benjamin Collyer Efq; Thomas Burges Efq; and them only.
