Where to the Number of Ninty Eight Perfons were brought to be Tryed: Sixty Eight Confessing the Fact upon their Arraignment; and the other Thirty Pleaded Not Guilty to Their Indi&ment ; and upon their Tryals Twenty Nine was fouud Guilty, and One Acquitted.

These pleading not Guilty, put them felves for their Tryal upon God and their Country; the Jurors all able fubftantial men, being charged with them to try the lifue : The Indictments were read a fecond time, and the Witneffes produced, who proved the Treason plain against all but Saunders who was acquitted: Most of them appearing to have been taken in the immediate purfuit, and the Remainder known to be concerned in that Rebellion by good and credible Teftimony, whereupon having nothing material to offer in their own Defence, that being mostly made up of trivial Excuses and endeavoured Evalions; they after a fair hearing, were leverally found Guilty by thole Perfons, on whom they had put themselves for Tryal, to the Number of Twenty Nine, and thereupon received Sentence of Death, as Rebels and Traytors against His Most Sacred Majelty, and were accordingly ordered to be Executed as fuch, on the 7th. Instant.

The other Sixty Eight Confessed their Indictminets; remaining at that time to receive Judgment.
