The several Kinds of Cattle above-mentioned, shall pay the above Customs each Day they are presented to Market.

The Custom and Bught-mail, in the foregoing Table, it shall be paid, as well by Freemen as Unfreemen, by Burgesses as well as others, without Distinction; also all Buyers, who are Unfreemen, shall pay back Custom.

All Fleshers, or Drovers, are hereby prohibited to buy or sell the Cattle brought into the City or Liberties, any where else, as in the said Market, or on the Pasture where they have been sed, at least six Weeks; and particularly, from buying or selling them in Dalkeith, Musselburgh or Leith, under the Pain of being punished as Forestallers.

All Cattle or other Bestial bought, even by Freemen or Burgher-Fleshers, in any other Manner, as from the first Owner, and brought directly from the Pasture to the Place of Slaughter, shall pay Custom, as if they were bought in the said Markets.

All Bestial brought into the City by Persons who are neither Freemen-Fleshers, nor Burghers, shall pay the foresaid Custom, from whomsoever, or in whatsoever Manner they be bought.

The Tacksman is ordain'd to show a Table, sign'd by the Treasurer then in Office, to such Persons as require it, and is discharged to exact more than is stated in the Table, under the Penalty of Ten Merks for every Offence, and, in Case of Resulal, they are hereby declared free of Custom.
