The Council ordains,

That all Fish coming to Edinburgh, and not for Sale, shall be free of all Custom.

That all Hucksters, or Retailers of Herring, or any other Fishes within this City or within any Part of its Liberties other than the Fish-Market, whether they be Burgesses or not, shall pay yearly to the Tacksman for every Barrel of Herring, or other Fish they shall happen to sell, Three Shillings Scots.

That no Kind of Fish be sold in the Fish-market-Closs or at the Fish-Market Closs Head, but only in the Fish-Market, Shell-Fishes excepted, under the Penalty of Ten Merks,

toties quoties, to be paid by the Contraveeners.

The Tacksman is ordained to shew a Table sign'd by the Treasurer then in Office, to such Persons as require it, and is discharged to exact more than is stated in the Table, under the Penalty of Ten Merks, toties quoties; and in Case of Resusal, they are hereby declared free of Custom.
