EXETER.

The following Address to Mr. Justice Blencoe, Judge of Assize for this Place, was signed by all the Grand Jury, being three and twenty Gentlemen of great Value in the County of Devon, and by their Foreman Sir John Pole, Bart, this day made to his Lordship in open Court.

My Lord,

bent on us, to defire your Lordship to affure His Majesty, that this County hath a deep Sense of His Majesty's extraordinary Goodness, Wisdom and Valour, and the Great Things he hath done for us; and that we rejoice under his Government, endeavouring and wishing nothing more than that his Reign over us may for the future, be as easy to him as it hath been hitherto Glorious, and every way Happy to us.

We have not Confidence enough to think we can direct His Majesty, or his Great Council the Parliament. We acquiesce in every thing they have done, and should be extreamly concern'd that any Device should be set on foot to divide this Nation in the Reign of the Best of Kings, and when we have the best House of Commons, except that which brought His Majesty to the Throne,
