 the Protestant Succession in the Illustrious House of *Hannover*.

A N D as We cannot omit to Congratulate Your Majesty on the great  
 and uninterrupted Successes, with which it hath pleas'd the Divine  
 Goodness to bless Your Majesty's Arms, and those of Your Allies Abroad:  
 So We do with equal Joy and Gratitude, reflect on the Wisdom of Your  
 Councils at Home, so greatly tending to the Ease, Satisfaction, and Wel-  
 fare of Your People, and the Preservation and Maintenance of our most  
 Excellent and Happy Constitution.

*May the Almighty, as a Reward of Your Majesty's Piety, yet vouchsafe  
 such further Successes as may procure the Blessings of a lasting Peace.  
 And may Your Majesty long Live and Reign in the Hearts of all Your  
 People.*
