ACT for Maintenance of the Poor within the Parishes to which they belong, and punishing idle and vagrant Beggars.

T Drumfries, the Twenty ninth Day of October, One thousand seven hundred and thirty seven Years, The Justices of the Peace met at their Quarter-Sessions held this Day by Adjournment, having taken into their Confideration the Complaints made to them from the several Corners within their Jurisdiction; That notwithstanding the many good Laws made for the Maintenance of the Poor, and the suppression of Beggars, Vagabonds and idle Persons; Yet, that this Shire is grievously oppressed by Multitudes of strange and idle Beggars and other Vagabonds, and that the Poor who live within the several Parishes are not duly provided for: AS ALSO, having

taken into their ferious Confideration, the Report made by a Committee, appointed to confider the Cafe of the Poor within the Shire, and to report their Opinion concerning proper Regulations to be proposed in Parliament, for the Sanction of the Legislature, where the Laws in Being appear to be defective with regard to Vagrants and Maintenance of the Poor; THEY hereby approve of the faid Report in all the Heads thereof, with fome Observations; and particularly, that an immediate Course should be taken with regard to Vagabonds and Stranger-Poor, their begging within the County, and for maintaining of the Poor, who, according to the feveral Acts of Parliament made in that Behalf, ought to be provided for within the feveral Parifhes where they have for fome Time refided : And for that End, and for preventing the many grievous and notorious Diforders and Abufes by the faid Vagabonds and other Beggars, wherewith honeft Houfholders, and Others within the Shire, have of late been much afflicted, and which are likely daily to increase (the neighbouring Counties having of late applied themselves to have the Laws put in Execution, to keep their several Jurisdictions clear of Vagabonds and Strangerpoor, whereby they will be naturally led to run in upon this County, and grievoufly oppress the same, it some speedy Remedy fhall not be put to the growing Evil; DO, in Virtue of the Powers committed to them by Law, Order and Appoint all idle and sturdy Beggars, Gypfies, Vagabonds, Sorners, Minstrels, Songsters, Fortune-tellers, Jugglers, Shipmen, alledging themselves to be Ship-broken (without they have sufficient Testimonials) and Others, described by the 74th Act, Parl. 6th, James VI. intituled, Act for punisbing strange and idle Beggars, and Relief of the Poor and Impotent, to depart forth of this Shire betwixt and the first Day of January next, and to repair to the several Parishes where they were born, or where they have had their Dwelling or Refidence for three Years last past, and to keep the ordinary Highways to the fame; with Certification, that all fuch idle, or stranger poor Persons, as shall be found begging within this Shire after the faid First Day of January next, shall be feized as Vagabonds, imprisoned, and fed with Bread and Water; and if found begging a fecond Time, shall otherwise be severely punished, agreeable to the Directions of Law in that Behalf; and all House-keepers, and others within this Shire, are firstly prohibited to give any Alms to fuch begging Vagabonds, other than Bread and Water; and every Perfon or Perfons are hereby difcharged, under Pretence of Charity, or any other Colour whatsoever, to give Money, Lodging, set Houses, or grant Relief to any such Vagabonds, under the Pains and Penalties to be inflicted according to Law. And in order to the better Execution of the Law for repressing of Vagabonds and idle Beggars, all Constables are hereby required and commanded to seize and apprehend such Persons, wherever they are found within this Shire, and bring them before the next Magistrate, Justice or Justices of the Peace, to whom it is recommended, that if he or they shall find the Person or Persons so brought before them, upon Trial taken, to fall within the Description of the Law, to grant Warrant for imprisoning the faid Person or Persons within the Tolbooth of the Royal Burgh, locally fituated within the Presbytery where the faid Vagabond, strange or idle Beggar, shall be feized, there to remain, and to be fed upon Bread and Water, until they be liberate in due Course of Law. And in Regard fuch Vagabonds fo imprison'd, may become a Burden upon the Burgh where they are imprisoned, the Justices do declare that there shall be paid to their respective Keepers of the Goals, Two-pence per diem for every Vagrant that shall be imprison'd, in Pursuance of the Directions of the Laws and Acts of Parliament, upon which this present Act is founded, and that Constables and others, upon Application made to the Quarter-sessions, and sufficient Vouchers produced, that they have been at extraordinary Trouble and Expence, shall be gratified and encouraged, according to the Nature of the Service performed by them. And for the Provision of the Poor within the County, do hereby appoint, That exact Lifts be made up within every Parish of the aged, impotent and indigent Persons, who have neither Means to support themselves, nor are in Condition to earn their Bread by Industry and Labour; and that after Trial taken into their Condition and Wants, the Perfons intitled to Maintenance shall either have Badges, or proper Certificates, given them by the Heritors and Kirk-Sessions, or fuch Person or Persons as they shall appoint, whereby they shall be authorized to ask Alms for their Subsistence within the Bounds of the Parish only, or otherwise the Parish may in their Option stent and assess themselves according to Law, for the Support of the faid Poor; with Certification, that if any Poor shall go begging without their own Parish, they shall forfeit the Benefit of the Maintenance to be allowed to them; AS ALSO, that if any who are put into the Charity Rolls of the Parish, keep their Children at home, without going to Service, when they are capable of it, they shall be struck out of the faid Rolls : And the Justices of the Peace do hereby earnestly recommend it to all Heritors, Kirk-Seffions and others, to join in having this Act put to due Execution, and from Time to Time to lay before the Quarter-Seffions, fuch Propofals as to them shall seem reasonable for attaining the laudable and good Ends proposed by this Act, which the Juffices will examine, and be ready to concur with, in as far as by the standing Laws they are enabled: And the Justices do appoint this Act to be printed and published at the respective Market-Crosses of Drumfries, Annan, Lochmahen, and Sanqubar, and Copies to be fent to the Ministers of the several Parishes within this Shire, to be read by the Precentors before the Diffolution of the Congregation from the Forenoon's Sermon; and ordain the feveral Precentors to report a Certificate of their Diligence, with Certification, &c.
