Covent-Garden Market,
On MONDAY, JUNE 29, 1818:

THE canvass throughout Westminster the whole of yesterday was active and unceasing. Banners were displayed in favour of the Ministerial Candidate, and processions also traversed the streets with the Flags of

SIR FRANCIS BURDETT.

In Bond-street a party halted dragging a Boat decorated with the colours of Sir Murray Maxwell, who were met by others in the interest of Sir Francis. A conflict ensued at the end of Great Russel street, the Boat was demolished—the crew were dispersed, and after receiving some hard knocks the fragments of the boat were carried off in triumph to the Hustings.

There were also several petty broils, in which the popular party maintained their ascendancy.

Yesterday evening, about seven o'clock, the disturbance was such at the Hustings, Covent-Garden, that the Guards were called out and paraded the streets to a late hour. Mr. Birnie read the Riot Act; and we are sorry to say, that one or two persons were severely hurt. One of them was struck by a Constable who was attacked.
