REFERENCES.

The direction in which the Radicals marched from Bonny Bridge to the Moor.

The direction in which the Cavalry pursued them.

- A. The Hill on which the Radicale rested before the Cavalry came up.
- B A substantial Stone Dyke-nearly & Feet high, extending about 300 Yards long; behind which
 the Radicals took their position when they saw the Cavalry advancing.
- C The place where the Cavalry halted, while bien, thodgson advanced to request the Radicals to lay down their Arms.
- +,+ Represent the distance between the Lieutenant and the leader of the Radicals when he first addressed him.
- D Is a gap at the east end of the Dyke, where the Cava'ry entered
