Therefore, and for Remead thereof, we do hereby Statute and Ordain, That the several Officers of the said Company shall take a closs Inspection of all under their Command; That when they either hear, or it being made appear to them, That any of those aforesaid, are guilty of these Crimes laid to their Charge, That for each Oath, they stop One Penny Sterling out of their Pay, and put it into the Poors Box, in the faid GUARD; Certifying fuch, as are oftner than Thrice Guilty, and fo found irreclaimable by this Method, That they will be turned out of the CITY SER-We likewise Recommend to the Officers, to give a good Example to all Inferiors; And that the Soldiers may not pretend to be ignorant hereof, We order this ACT to be Read at the Head of the Company; and afterwards Affixt in the GUARD-HALL: And also, Appoints thir Prefents to be Printed; and an printed Copy hereof, to be delivered to every Centinel.
