Being the Annual Amount of Pickings of the Peers and their Families, who voted against the Reform Bill, in the House of Lords, on Saturday, Oct. 8, 1831.

This list has been compiled with immense labour and expense, and although it is impossible to be completely accurate in all the calculations, yet the amount is rather under than over the mark. It must be observed that all the sums stated are received annually. With respect to the Bishops (the greatest of all the cormorants), we have had no means of calculating exactly the wages they receive. We have, however, taken each benefice at 500l. a year. There are many which are under this sum of annual worth we will allow; but there are more worth several thousands a-year each. Independent of the actual money the Peers receive, there is another snug little bit called Patronage, which although it is not bona fide money, is the same thing. To have the absolute power of giving 100l. a-year is to possess that 100l. a-year, for of course we give it to some relation, friend, or servant, to whom otherwise we should have been obliged to provide for our private purse, so in fact the value is enjoyed by ourselves. Yet in our list we have reckoned nothing for patronage. In short, we have only placed the known sums paid to these * * * * * * * * We will leave the world to judge whether this way of distributing the labour of the people is best calculated to do good or evil to the country. No doubt they dreaded the result of a reformed Parliament, therefore joined heart and hand to destroy the People's rights by opposing the Reform Bill.
