Namesake of the late Fredric Duke of York, and decided his place of Burial in Jan. 1827. Second son of I. & E. Seear, of Middlesex County, is willing to grant Royalty at a Freehold Fee of 25 acres, per hundred or otherwise.

In the year 1854 notice given for all my claims 'soever by me, Mr. F. A. Seear, age 47, aforesaid, by writing and delivering fourteen hundred Letters, as follows:—Her Most Gracious Majesty, to the Lord President and Privy Council, Solicitor of the Treasury, Receiver of Crown Rents, Sir F. Palgrave and other authorities, including six hundred to the Members of the House of Commons, and a large number to the Peers, and ten registered letters advised to the following:—The Lord Chancellor, Judge of Probate, the two Justices of Appeal, Speaker of the House of Commons, the Master of the Rolls, Attorney and Solicitor Generals, and two Vice Chancellors. And in 1855—6—7 and 8, I wrote eighteen hundred Letters and directed and delivered in a similar way.
