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The following list of holiday courses is one of the fruits on the working co-operation between Universities which has been established through the annual meeting of Directors of National University Offices at the International Institute of Intellectual Co-operation.

In drawing up this list, side by side with those already existing, our special objects have been:

- 1° To publish as early in the year as possible, supplying all available material;
- 2° To cover as many courses as possible;
- 3° To include all detailed information likely to be of use;
- 4° To be scrupulously impartial between country and country.

We have confined ourselves to courses of University rank; in some cases the courses are organised expressly for the benefit of foreigners, while in others they are simply open to foreigners.

We are fully aware of the inevitable shortcomings of this first attempt. As we propose in future to publish this list annually, we shall welcome any details which would amplify or correct our information; suggestions as to the make-up of the list will also be gratefully received. Such communications should reach the University Relations Section of the International Institute of Intellectual Co-operation (2, rue de Montpensier, Paris 1°), not later than November 1 st, 1928.

We wish to state categorically that inclusion in our list implies no recommendation on our part, and that on the other hand, omission from it implies no adverse criticism.
