JUNIOR SECTION.

I.—WRITTEN COMPETITIONS.

NOTES.—The Secretary will send all test papers required for these competitions to the appointed supervisors, together with a supply of foolscap paper.

Every competitor will adopt a pen-name which will be noted opposite the competitors in the entry list.

Each written sheet must show competitor's Pen-Name at the top. (Neither competitor's name nor the name of the school should be entered on written sheets).

Entry lists must be sent to the Secretary not later than 30th March, 1946.

Written competitions will be held on Friday, 26th April, 1946, but special arrangements may be made for Groups D, E, F.

Group A.—Pupils in First Year Post-Qualifying Courses.

- (a). Translation of an easy passage of Gaelic prose into English.
- (b). Translation of simple sentences from English to Gaelic.

Ten book prizes will be awarded ; awards will be based on the total marks gained in (a) and (b). Time $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours.

Group B.—Pupils in Second Year Post-Qualifying Courses.

- (a). Reproduction in Gaelic of a short English story read twice by the teacher.
- (b). Translation of English sentences into Gaelic.

Prizes as in Group A Time $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours (after reading).

Group C.—Pupils in Third Year of Post-Qualifying Courses

- (a) Translation of an English prose passage into Gaelic.
- (b). Translation of a Gaelic passage (prose or verse) into English

Prizes as in Group A. Time $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours

I.—CO-FHARPAISEAN SGRIOBHTA.

Taghaidh gach co-fharpaiseach ainm-falaich agus theid so a chur mu choinneamh ainm aig am cur a steach nan sanasan.

Feumaidh ainm-falaich a' cho-fharpaisich a bhi air a sgrìobhadh air mullach gach duilleig. (Cha chòir ainm a' cho-fharpaisich no ainm na sgoile a bhi air an sgrìobhadh air a'phaipear sgrìobhta).

Buidheann C.—Sgoilearan anns an treasamh bliadhna thar an t-sreath dheasachail de am foghlum.

(a). Eadartheangachadh earrainn de rosg Beurla gu Gaidhlig.

(b). Eadartheangachadh earrainn de rosg no bardachd Ghaidhlig gu Beurla.

Group D.—Evening Continuation Classes or Special Classes

1. Reproduction in Gaelic of a short Gaelic Story read twice by the teacher. Time $\frac{3}{4}$ hour (after the reading). Prizes, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th, Books.
2. Writing from Dictation of a Gaelic prose passage. The passage will be read once by the teacher, and then dictated. Prizes—1st, 2nd and 3rd (Books) will be given in each Class competing.

Group E.—University or Training College Students.

1. Translation into English of a Gaelic prose passage or poem. Prizes, 1st, £1; 2nd, 15s.; 3rd, 4th and 5th, Books.
2. Gaelic Essay on a literary or an historical subject. (A choice of four subjects will be given) Time 1 hour. Prizes as for No. 1.

Group F.—Special Competitions (Conditions laid down by the donor of prizes).

1. FOR BOYS—Essay in Gaelic on the Life of Moses. The Essay will be written in school and certified by Headmaster or Clergyman to be the unaided work of pupils. Competitors must be between 12 and 16 years of age, and essays must reach the Secretary by 11th June, 1940. Prizes presented by the late Mrs. Stewart, Simla, India, 1st, £2 and Gaelic Bible; 2nd, £1 and Gaelic Bible.
2. FOR GIRLS—Subject, conditions, and prizes as in No. 1. Prizes presented by the late Mrs. Stewart.

Group G.

A book prize for each year of the Secondary Course beyond the Third Year will be awarded in every school presenting candidates in Gaelic for the Leaving Certificate. These prizes will be awarded on the marks gained in school examinations during the session.

II.—ORAL DELIVERY.

8. READING WITH EXPRESSION a Piece of Prose or Poetry, by Native or fluent Gaelic Speakers. Competitors are to prepare three pieces supplied by the Secretary. They will be asked to read any one of the three the Judges may select, and may be asked to answer simple questions on the meaning of the words they recite. Prizes—1st, £1; 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th, Books (confined to children over 12 and under 16 years of age)
- 8A. As above (confined to children under 12 years of age).
9. READING WITH EXPRESSION a Piece of Prose or Poetry, by Learners. Competitors are to prepare three pieces supplied by the Secretary. They will be asked to read any one of the three the Judges may select, and may be asked to answer simple questions on the meaning of the words they recite. Prizes—1st, £1; 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th, Books (confined to children over 12 and under 16 years of age).
- 9A. As above (confined to children under 12 years of age).

11. **RECITING FROM MEMORY** “An Coileach” (Calum Cainbeul MacPhàil). Prizes—1st, 15s. and a copy of “Voices from the Hills;” 2nd, 10s. and a copy of same book; 3rd, a copy of “Voices from the Hills.” Open to all. Candidates may be asked simple questions on the meaning of the pieces they recite.
12. **VERSE SPEAKING** by groups of from 6 to 10 speakers. Prescribed piece “Na Gaidheil an guailibh a chéile.” Prizes—1st, £2 10s; 2nd, £1 10s; 3rd, £1.
13. **NARRATIVE** based on some local incident, tradition, or legend, to be followed by conversation on the subject of the narrative, between the competitors and the adjudicators. Prizes—1st, £1; 2nd and 3rd, Books. Open to all.
14. **FOR EXCELLENCE IN GAELIC CONVERSATION**, for Boys and Girls. Open to all. Prizes—1st, 12s. 6d; 2nd Book.
- 14A. **FOR EXCELLENCE IN GAELIC CONVERSATION**, for Boys and Girls. Confined to learners. Prizes—1st, 12s 6d; 2nd, Book.
15. For children under 12 years of age. **BOYS.** Repeating Micah Chap. IV. verses 1 to 5 or verses 25 to 30 of Chap. XI. of the Gospel of St. Matthew. Pupils will be asked to spell words from the chapter they repeat. Prizes—1st, £1 10s. and Gaelic Bible; 2nd, 15s. and Gaelic Bible; 3rd, 10s. and Gaelic Bible. Prizes from the late Mrs. Stewart, Simla.
16. **GIRLS.** Same as Competition 15.

21. **SOLO SINGING** of a Song. Boys. The songs prescribed are—"Mo Dhachaidh" and "Hug oireann o" (Orain a' Mhòid XVII.) Prizes 1st, £1 and the **SILVER MEDAL** of An Comunn; 2nd and 3rd, Books. Competitors may be called upon to sing either song.
22. **DUET SINGING** of the Song, "An Ribhinn Mhàlda" (Orain Càraid). Prizes—1st, £1; 2nd, Book.
23. **CHORAL SINGING** of two Songs, with or without chorus, in two part harmony. The prescribed songs are "Thug mi'n oidhche raoir sunndach" and "Maol Ruanaidh" supplied by the Secretary. At least 50% of the members must be able to converse in the Gaelic language. Prizes—1st, £5, retention for a year of the *Obun Times* Challenge Trophy; 2nd, £3. See page 26.
24. **TRADITIONAL SINGING** of an unpublished Gaelic Song. Prizes—1st, 2nd and 3rd, Books.

NOTE.—The following Solo, Duet, and Choral Competitions, 25 to 28, are confined to *learners of Gaelic, i.e.,* those who are acquiring the language, as distinct from native, or fluent speakers. Competitors in this Class must be tested by the Gaelic Judges on their knowledge of the meaning of the words they sing.

RULES AND CONDITIONS.

Literary, Oral, Vocal, and Instrumental Competitions.

ENTRIES. Competitors in all sections of the Syllabus must enter their names with the Secretary, on the Special Form provided, not later than the 13th day of July, 1946. Late entries and entries unaccompanied by Fees—when payable—will on no account be accepted. *No competitor whose name does not appear in the printed Programme will be allowed to compete.*

The Executive Council reserves the right to accept or reject any entry without assigning any reason.

The order in which Competitors shall appear before the Judges will be decided by ballot previous to the printing of the Mòd Programme, and any Competitor failing to appear when called may be disqualified.

All Musical Compositions and all Literary Work must be sent to the Secretary, not later than 13th July, 1946.

Competitors may enter for more than one competition.

No fees are payable under the Junior Section of the Syllabus.

No Competitor can win the same Medal or Badge a second time.

The Fees payable under the Senior Section of the Syllabus are as follows:—Individual competitors, 2s 6d for one entry, and 1s for each additional entry; Duettists, 2s 6d for each individual not entered for another competition, and 1s for those so entered; Mixed Choirs, 5s; Ladies' Choirs, 2s 6d; Men's Choirs, 2s 6d; Quartette, 2s 6d.

AGE LIMIT. Competitors under the Junior Oral, Vocal and Instrumental Sections of the Syllabus must be under sixteen years of age at the date of the Mòd except Competition 31. Such Juniors are excluded from all Senior Competitions, excepting those under the heading "Literature" and "Instrumental music." (Violin and Clarsach Sections).

LANGUAGE. Senior Section. All written, spoken, and sung matter must be in the Gaelic Language, and Competitors using translations from the English, or any other language, in the Literary and Musical Competitions will be disqualified.

MUSIC. Competitors singing or playing airs which are not of recognised Gaelic origin will be disqualified. Competitors who may be in doubt as to the eligibility of certain songs or airs, may have their doubts resolved by timely application to the General Secretary.

JUNIOR SECTION : Papers will be written and returned in accordance with instructions sent to supervisors.

SENIOR SECTION : Competitors will write on one side of foolscap paper, and each sheet must bear competitor's *pen-name* at the top. The whole must be addressed to the General Secretary in a large envelope, in which should also be enclosed a small sealed envelope containing competitor's name, pen-name and address. The cover of the small envelope should show competitor's pen-name and the reference number of the competition.

PROOF OF THE GENUINENESS OF THE WORK. Competitors shall, if required, produce proof of the genuineness of their work— that in Literature and Music the papers are the original productions of those whose names are attached thereto.

Compilations of Melodies previously published will be rejected.

All work done in schools or in connection with classes held in other places, must be attested by the signature of the Local Examiner, besides that of the Schoolmaster or Teacher; which signatures must be affixed to each document sent in.

Unattested school or class papers will be rejected.

PROPERTY IN THE WORK. All works for which prizes are given shall become the property of An Comunn. Sections B.C.D. of Celtic Art Competitions excepted.

FOLK SONGS AND DISTRICT SONGS COMPETITIONS The songs submitted by successful competitors shall, if certain conditions are complied with, become the property of An Comunn. Competitors intending to sing songs by living authors, must obtain the author's permission in writing before competing, otherwise they will be held responsible for any infringement of copyright.

NOTICES TO VOCALISTS. Competitors in the Senior Section shall be prepared to sing two songs. They shall first sing one of these and, if called upon by the Adjudicators, they must sing the second song of their choice.

When Competitors have the option of choosing their own songs they must supply a copy, with an English synopsis, for use of the adjudicator.

JUNIOR CHORAL SONGS.

Junior Choirs must sing the two harmonised songs prescribed.

UNISON SINGING.

Choirs must sing all the songs prescribed in this competition.

The order in which Junior Choirs shall sing at the Competitions will be decided by ballot previous to the printing of the Mod Programme.

RESTRICTIONS. Junior Choirs must consist of at least 8 and not more than 24 voices. No Competitor is allowed to sing in more than *one* Junior Choir.

JUNIOR SOLO SINGERS are limited to 12 lines, or 16 lines when there a chorus.

OBAIR SGRIOBHTA.

EARRANN NA H-OIGRIDH : Theid paipearan a sgrìobhadh is a thilleadh a réir mar a thugadh seòladh do 'n luchd-coimhid.

EARRANN NAN INBHEACH : Sgrìobhaidh luchd-farpais air aon taobh de phaipear *foolscap*, agus feumaidh ainm-falaich a' cho-fharpaisich a bhì air mullach gach site. Theid an t-ionlan a chur a dh'ionnsaigh an Ard Rùnaire ann an cuairsgean mòr anns an bi mar an ceudna cuairsgean beag, seulaichte, le ainm a' cho-fharpaisich, ainm-falaich agus àite comhnuidh. Feumaidh ainm-falaich, a' cho-fharpaisich agus àireamh na co-fharpais a bhì air a' chuairsgean bheag.

IONRACAS NA H-OIBRE. Ma theid gairm orra gu sin a dhèanamh, feumaidh na Co-fharpaisich dearbhadh a thoirt air ionracas an cuid oibre, is e sin gu'n do dhealbhadh na pàipeirean litreachais agus ciùil leò-san a tha 'g an cur a steach.

Cha ghabhar co-chruinneachaidhean Fhonn a bhà roimhe an clò.

Feumaidh gach obair a theid a dheanamh ann an sgoilean no an co-cheangal ri buidhnean fhòghlumach an àiteachan eile, a bhì air a dearbhadh le ainm an Fhìr-cheasnachaidh a bha làthair, cho maith ri ainm a' Mhaigh-stir-sgoile no an Fhìr-theagaisg; agus feumaidh na h-ainmeannan sin a bhì ris gach pàipeir a chuirear air adhart.

Cha ghabhar pàipeirean sgoilean, no chòmhlàn fhoghlumach, nach bi mar so air an dearbhadh.

SEILBH ANNS AN OBAIR. Buinidh obair sam bith a bhuidh-inneas duais do 'n Chomunn, ach a mhàin buidhnean B.C.D. de'n Earrann Cheilteach.

MITH-ORAIN AGUS ORAIN DHUTHCHAIL. Buinidh na h-orain leisam buannaich co-fharpaisich duaisean do'n Chomunn, ma bhios cumhnantan sonraichte air an coimhlionadh. Ma tha am beachd cho-fharpaiseach oran le bàrd a tha maireann a sheinn feumaidh iad cead a' bhàird fhaotainn an sgrìobhadh mu'n seinn iad 'sa cho-fharpais. Mur dean iad sin bidh an t-uallach orra mu còir dligheach a' bhàird air obair fhéin.

SANASAN DO LUCHD-SEINN. Feumaidh na co-fharpaisich, a dh' fheuchas an Earrainn nan Inbheach an Seinn Orain Aon-neach, a bhì deiseil le dà òran. Seinnidh iad aon dhiubh so agus faodaidh na breitheamhnan iarraidh orra an dara òran a sheinn.

An uair tha roghainn òran aig na co-fharpaisich feumaidh iad a leth-bhreac, le gearr-mhìneachadh am Beurla, a thoirt do'n Bhrèitheamh.

ORAIN CHOISIREAN OIGRIDH.

Feumaidh Còisirean Oigridh an dà òran a chaidh a shonrachadh air son na co-fharpais so a sheinn.

SEINN AON-GHUTHACH.

Feumaidh Còisirean Oigridh na h-òrain uile a chaidh a shonrachadh anns a cho-fharpais so a sheinn. Theid an t-òrdugh anns an seinn Còisirean Oigridh a shocrachadh le crainn a thilgeadh mu'n clò-bhuailear Clar-iomairt a' Mhòid.

CUMHACHAN. Chan fhaod na 's lugha na 8, no os cionn 24 pearsa a bhì ann an Còisir Oigridh. Chan fhaod Co-fharpaiseach 'sam bith seinn ann an tuilleadh agus aon Chòisir Oigridh.

Cha sheinn Co-fharpaisich (Oigridh) Aon-ghuth os cionn 12 sreath, no 16 sreath far am bheil séist ris an òran.

SENIOR CHORAL SONGS.

Prescribed pieces must be sung in the key in which they are set.

The order in which Senior Choirs shall sing at the Competition will be decided by ballot previous to the printing of the Mòd Programme.

LADIES' CHOIRS and MALE VOICE CHOIRS must consist of at least ten voices, and not more than twenty-six voices.

Senior Mixed Choirs must consist of at least 16 and not more than 26 voices. Choirs entering for the "Lovat and Tullibardine Shield," and "Lorn Shield" must consist to the extent of at least 50 per cent. of Gaelic speakers. Conductors are not allowed to sing with their Choirs.

Choirs are recommended to practise the rallying song of An Comunn Gàidhealach, "Suas leis a' Ghàidhlig" (Smieton's setting), for the evening concert. Copies of the music may be had from the Secretary. All choirs must use this arrangement of the song, and verses 1, 2, and 5 should be carefully practised; also the Gaelic version of the National Anthem (Mrs. K. W. Grant's Version). Both songs are in "Coisir a' Mhòid I." Choirs must be prepared to sing the "Invocation" in connection with the crowning of the Bard.

NOTE.—"Coisir a' Mhòid," 1/6; "Crain a' Mhoid," 1/- each, postage extra, will be supplied by Messrs Maclaren & Son, publishers, Glasgow, or by the Secretary. The price must be sent with order.

RECITAL OF "FRENCH."—Choirs are requested to practise the tune "French" (two verses), in view of its recital at the Mòd Grand Concert. In the event of a tie in the Senior Competition No. 55, choirs may be asked to sing this tune.

DUETS. Competitors are cautioned to use duets in which the second part has been well arranged by a competent musician. No competitor will be allowed to sing in more than one duet.

PIANOFORTE ACCOMPANIMENT. Pianoforte accompaniment will be allowed to soloists and duettists only. *Competitors are strongly recommended to avail themselves of the services of the Official Accompanist.* No accompaniment allowed in the Medal Series. Competitors desiring an accompaniment must provide a copy of the music of their song, written in the *staff notation*. Accompaniment is optional, and may be dispensed with without disadvantage to the competitor.

The music should be on a key to suit the voice. The accompanist cannot undertake to transpose at sight.

SENIOR SOLO SINGERS are limited to 28 lines.

Competitors entered for more than one of the singing competitions must sing a different song in each competition.

ORAIN CHOISIREAN INBHEACH.

Feumaidh na h-òrain a bhi air an seinn anns a' phong sgrìobhte.

Theid an t-òrdugh anns an seinn Còisirean Inbheach anns a' Chofhairpais a shuidheachadh le crainn a thilgeadh mu'n téid Clàr-iomairt a Mhòid a chlà-bhualadh.

ORAIN CHOISIREAN BHOIRIONNACH AGUS FHIRIONNACH.—Feumaidh, air a chuid as lugha, deichnear a bhi 's na Còisirean so agus gun os cionn sè-ar-fhichead.

Cha bhi na's lugha na 16 no os cionn 26 pearsa an Còisir Ioma-Ghuthaich Inbhich. Feumaidh dara leth de bhuill Chòisirean an co-fharpaisean 55 agus 57 a bhi comasach air Gaidhlig a labhairt. Cha'n fhaod fir-iùil Chòisirean seinn còmhla ri 'n Còisirean.

Tha e air a mholadh gu'n ionnsaicheadh na Còisirean òran-brosnachaidh a' Chomuinn Ghàidhealaich, "Suas leis a' Ghàidhlig" (an suidheachadh aig Smieton) air son na coinneimh-chiùil anns an fheasgar. Gheibhear ceòl an òrain o'n Rùnaire. Feumaidh na Còisirean gu léir an t-òran a sheinn a réir an t-suidheachaidh aig Smieton, agus bu chòir gu'm biodh na rainn 1 agus 2, agus 5 air an ionnsachadh gu cùramach; agus mar an ceudna "Laoidh na Rìoghachd" (Eadar-theangachadh gu Gàidhlig le C. W. Grannd). Tha an dà òran so ann an "Còisir a Mhòid I." Feumaidh na Còisirean an "Athchuinge" a sheinn an ám crùnadh a' Bhàird.

SANAS —Gheibhear "Còisir a' Mhòid, 1/6; "Orain a' Mhòid, 1/-, postachd a bharrachd; bho A. MacLabhrainn, Glaschu, no o'n Rùnaire. Feumar an t-airgid a chur leis gach òrdugh.

AM FONN "FRENCH." Tha na còisirean air an earalachadh gu 'n ionnsaich iad gu cùramach am fonn (dà rainn) le sùil ri e bhi air a sheinn aig a' Chuirn Chiùil Mhóir. Ma thachras gu'm bi co-ionannachd eadar Còisirean Inbheach ann an co-fharpais 55 faodar gairm air na Còisirean am fonn so a sheinn.

ORAN CARAID.—Tha co-fharpaisich air an earalachadh iad a sheinn fhonn leis an dara earraid air ullachadh le fear-ciùil coimhionta. Chan fhaod co-fharpaiseach seinn ann am barrachd air aon cheòl dithis.

CO-CHEOL INNEIL. Ceaduichear co-cheòl a' "piano" a mhàin do luchd-seinn ceòl-aon-neach no ceòl càraid. *Tha e gu sònraichte air a spar-radh air Co-fharpaisich gu'n gabh iad am fear-inneil a theid a shuidheachadh le luchd-riaghlaidh a' Chomuinn.* Cha cheadaichear ceòl-inneil an co-fharpaisean nam Bonn Suaicheantais. Feumaidh luchd-seinn a tha a' cur feum a air ceòl-inneil, an t-òran a tha iad a' dol a sheinn a thoirt do'n fhear-inneil, air a sgrìobhadh anns an *t-seann dòigh*. Tha leasachadh inneil-chiùil roghainneach, agus faodar deanamh as eugais gun dochair do'n cho-fharpaiseach.

Feumaidh an ceòl a bhi air a sgrìobhadh air pong-stéidh a fhreagras do'n ghuth. Cha ghabh am fear-cluiche os làimh atharrachadh aig a' cheud sealladh.

Cha sheinn Co-fharpaisich (Inbheach) ann an òran aon-neach os cionn 28 sreath.

Feumaidh Co-fharpaisich a tha a' dol a sheinn ann an tuilleadh agus aon chòmh-stri, òran eadar-dhealaichte a sheinn anns gach co-fharpais fa leth.

EXCLUSION FROM THE COMPETITIONS. Unless otherwise stated, competitors who have taken a first prize for two years in succession in any competition shall be excluded from competing in the same competition in the third year; but they may compete in the year immediately following their exclusion. This rule does not apply to choirs, quartettes or duet combinations, and does not apply in the case of ties for a first place.

Gold medallists are excluded from the solo singing competitions Nos. 51 and 52.

Junior winners of Mod Silver Medals are not allowed to compete for these a second time.

No person whose principal vocation is professional singing will be allowed to take part in any of the singing competitions.

ADJUDICATORS AND THEIR POWERS. The decisions of the adjudicators shall, in every case, be brought out by numerical markings, the ratios of which will be determined previous to the Mod by the Committee. The adjudicators' decision shall be final.

The Adjudicators have power to divide, reduce, or withhold prizes where merit is insufficient. They are directed to give no second or third prizes in competitions for which less than five competitors have entered, unless in cases of exceptional merit.

The Adjudicators may at any time call upon a competitor to cease reading, reciting, narrating, or singing.

No reading or recitation shall exceed 10 minutes in delivery.

No narration or sgeulachd shall exceed 20 minutes.

In all competitions no prize will be given unless two or more compete.

PROTESTS. Protests against the eligibility of competitors must be made to the General Secretary before the judgments are announced; or, where possible, before the competition has been entered upon, and must be in writing, and must contain a clear statement of the condition infringed and the alleged disqualification. Each protest must be accompanied with a deposit of 2s 6d, which will be returned if the protest is sustained. The deposit will be forfeited if, on due inquiry, it is found that there has been no infringement of the conditions of this Syllabus. Protests can only be entered by those interested as competitors in the particular competition in connection with which the protest is raised. It shall be competent for the Secretary in consultation with such members of Committee as may be available to deal at any stage with any alleged breach of the conditions governing Mod competitions.

CONCERT—Competitors under the Musical Sections will be expected to give their services at the Rural Choir Concert on Thursday and the Grand Concert on Friday evening.

MARKS.—Competitors cannot be supplied with an extract of their marks until one month after the Mod. No competitor is entitled to be informed of the marks of any other competitor. All applications for information should be accompanied by a fee of one shilling.

Any Competitor found to be knowingly transgressing any of the conditions for competitors will be debarred from further entry for Mod prizes for a period of five years.

Cha mhò a tha i a' buntainn ri socrachadh prìomh-àite choionannach.

Tha muinntir a bhuidhinn buinn shuaicheantais òir air an dùnadh a mach bho na co-fharpaisean Seinn Aon-Neach, 51, 52.

Cha cheadaichear do òigridh a choisinn suaicheantais airgid a' Mhòid feuchainn airson nan duaisean sin an dara uair.

Cha cheadaichear do neach air bith aig a bheil seinn mar dhreuchd choitichinn cuid a ghabhail ann an co-fharpaisean sam bith air son seinn.

NA BREITHEAMHNAN AGUS AN CUMHACHDAN.—Theid breith nam breitheamhnan anns na co-fharpaisean gu léir a shocrachadh a réir cunntas chomharan, agus socraichear luach nan comharan sin leis an luchd-riaghlaidh mu'n tòisich am Mòd. Tha co-dhùnadh nam Breitheamhnan do-atharraichte.

Tha còir aig na Breitheamhnan air na duaisean a roinn, a lughdachadh, no a chumail air an ais, far an meas iad nach 'eil an obair làn-airidh. Tha òrdugh aca nach toir iad dara no treas duais ann an co-fharpaisean anns nach gabh éòignear cuid, na's lugha na bhios an obair comharraichte math.

Faodaidh na Breitheamhnan òrdugh no sanas a thoirt do cho-fharpaiseach sgar a leughadh, a dh' aithris, a dh' innseadh sgeulachd, no a sheinn, aig ionad sam bith d'a obair.

Cha'n fhaod Leughadh no Aithris maireachduinn na's fhaide na deich mionaidean.

Cha'n fhaod Aithris Eachdraidh no Sgeulachd maireachduinn na's fhaide ann na fichead mionaid.

Cha toirear duais an comh-fharpais sam bith, mur bi dithis no triuir

SANAS-GHRABAIDH. Feumar sanais-ghrabaidh an aghaidh luchd-farpais a chur gus an Rùnaire mu'm bi breith nam breitheamhnan air a cur an céill; no, far an comasach e, mu'n tòisich a' cho-fharpais; feumaidh iad a bhi sgrìobhte, agus feumaidh iad a nochdadh gu soilleir ciod an cumha a theid a bhristeadh, agus an bonn air am bheil am bacadh air iarraidh. Feumar leth-chrùn a chur leis gach litir ghrabaidh; theid a chur air ais na theid aontachadh le iartras na litreach. Mur faighear dligheach, ceart e, cumar an leth chrùn mar ùbhla. Cha ghabhar ri sanais-ghrabaidh ach a mhàin bho muinntir a tha iad fhéin ag gabhail cuid anns a' cho-fharpais shònraichte d'am buin am bacadh. Bidh e ceadaichte do'n Runaire, an comhairle ri buill Comhairle a' Mhoid 'sa Chiùil a dh' fhaodas a bhi an lathair, buntainn aig am sam bith ri ceistean a thaobh briseadh nan cumhnantan a tha a' riaghladh co-fharpaisean a' Mhoid.

COMHARAN.—Cha toirear fios sgrìobhte do cho-fharpaisich air àireimh an cuid comharan gu ceann mìos an déidh a' Mhòid. Chan 'eil còir aig co-fharpaiseach air bith air fios fhaighinn mu chomharan co-fharpaisich eile. Feumar tasdan a chur an cois gach iarrais de 'n ghnè so.

Bidh co-fharpaiseach sam bith a dh' fheuchas le dheòin ri bhi a' briseadh aon sam bith de Riaghailtean nan co-fharpaisean air a bhacadh bho bhi ag gabhail cuid ann an co-fharpaisean a' Mhòid fad chòig bliadhna.
