EDINBURGH.

Whenever the most beautiful streets of the world are under consideration, Princes Street, Edinburgh, is sure to be mentioned. All visitors to the capital find themselves, sooner or later, confronted by its superb length and its magnificent setting. The Castle rises proudly beyond beautiful gardens that border one side of this famous street. Here the Scott Monument, Royal Institution and National Gallery are conspicuous. The opposite side is lined with luxuriously appointed shops and restaurants. Beyond is the Register House, facing the General Post Office, and dominating the east end is the Calton Hill, with the Nelson Monument most conspicuous.

Should time permit, it is well worth while to climb this monument; from the top the view of the city and its surroundings is magnificent! The City Observatory, National Monument, and monuments to Dugald Stewart and Playfair, eminent citizens, are other notable erections on the Calton Hill.

The Scottish War Memorial is fittingly placed on the highest platform of Edinburgh Castle, the fortress most intimately associated with the history of Scotland. On an outcrop of the natural rock stands the Stone of Remembrance, on which rests the cedar-lined steel casket, the gift of the King and Queen, holding the Rolls of Honour of Scotland's dead—over 100,000 names. No visit to Edinburgh is complete without entering The Shrine. Open daily, summer, 10 to 7; Sundays, 1 to 6. Winter, 10 to 4; Sundays, 1 to 4. The Castle, itself, with its Prison, Battery, Chapel, Mons Meg, The Crown Room and Queen Mary's Apartments, is of unbounded interest.

Old Edinburgh is centred round "The Historic Mile," an appropriate name for the thoroughfare that leads from the Castle to the Palace of Holyroodhouse. Along this route visitors should look out for St. Giles Cathedral, Canongate, High Street, Brodie's Close, John Knox's House and Lady Stair's House. The Palace is open to visitors, except when it is occupied by Royalty or the Lord High Commissioner. The Banqueting Hall contains De Witt's portraits of the Scottish Kings. The Ball given by Prince Charlie in 1745 was held here. Queen Mary and Darnley's apartment and the room in which Rizzio was murdered attracts countless visitors.

Beyond the Palace is Queen's Drive and the King's Park, a delightful place that includes the height of Arthur's Seat, from the top of which a magnificent view is obtained.

The New Town lies behind the buildings of Princes Street, with two fine thoroughfares, George Street and Queen Street, both running parallel to Princes Street. The Mound, formed of the rubbish removed at their formation from the northern streets and squares, connects the old and new Towns, and separates the East from West Princes Street Gardens. Here the Royal Institution and National Picture Gallery are beautiful buildings of classic design. The Scots-American Memorial in the West Gardens is worth seeing. Waverley Bridge and Waverley Market are quite near.

One of the finest halls in the country—the Usher Hall—is situated in Lothian Road. Other notable buildings are the University, covering the site of "Kirk o' Field" associated with Darnley's death; Antiquarian Museum; the National Library of Scotland; Central Public Library; Municipal Buildings.

Edinburgh is well supplied with theatres and luxurious cinemas and places of entertainment. Her special exhibit is the Scottish Zoological Park, at Corstorphine. Here animals and birds live as nearly as possible in their natural conditions. Open daily, 9 till dusk; Sunday, 2 till dusk. Admission: Monday, Thursday and Friday, 1/-; Tuesday, Wednesday and Saturday, 9d; Sunday, 1/-.

The Royal Botanic Gardens, entered from Inverleith Row, are famed for a Palm House and Rock Gardens. Sixty acres of ground are otherwise beautifully laid out.

Few cities equal Edinburgh in the facilities offered for out-of-doors enjoyment. There are no less than seventy-four tennis courts! Golf can be enjoyed at the Braid Hills, Craigen-tinny, Carrick Knowe, Saughtonhall and beyond at Portobello. The Municipal 18-hole courses only charge 6d a round! Bowling greens number over thirty, including the pioneer green in East Princes Street Gardens.
