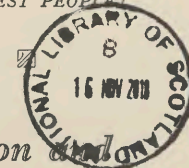

Hockey's All-Rounder.

SCOTLAND'S outside-right in Saturday's hockey international against England will be R. C. R. Kirkpatrick, of the Wimbledon H.C. Born in Delhi, Kirkpatrick went to a preparatory school at Eastbourne (St. Cyprians), where he won his colours for all games.

At Marlborough he played centre-forward for the hockey XI, and also represented the school at Rugger and cricket.

With the Gloves.

WITH the gloves Kirkpatrick was a great exponent, being unbeaten in the various school boxing competitions for which he entered. Since leaving school he has played cricket for Wiltshire, and is of course an Oxford Authentic. On leaving the Varsity in 1924 he went to America on business and is now on the London Stock Exchange.

NIGEL KIRKPATRICK Scottish Hockey Player for America

Next week Nigel Kirkpatrick, the well-known hockey player, is leaving for the United States, where he is taking up a business appointment, and Scotland thus lose their valuable centre-forward, who has gained in all fifteen "caps" against England, Ireland, and Wales.

Kirkpatrick, an Old Marlburian, won his hockey Blue at Oxford in 1924, a year after his brother, Colin, had earned similar distinction. Both got into the Scottish eleven that same year (1924), and have done valuable service in the front line for their country since. Like Scotland, the Wimbledon Club will suffer a severe loss by the removal abroad of Nigel Kirkpatrick. With him at centre, his brother Colin and C. Morley-Brown on the right wing, and another international, Dr. G. W. M. Mackay, in the side, Wimbledon have had a strong Scottish flavour for several seasons.

Nigel Kirkpatrick's place in the Scottish team against England on Saturday, March 9, will be taken by I. E. Brooks (Edinburgh University), who moves from inside left to centre-forward, and R. MacLeod (Edinburgh Northern), who played against Wales in 1925 and Ireland in 1926, will come into the side at inside left.

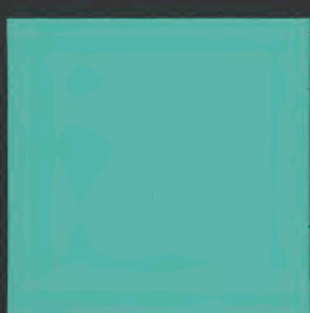
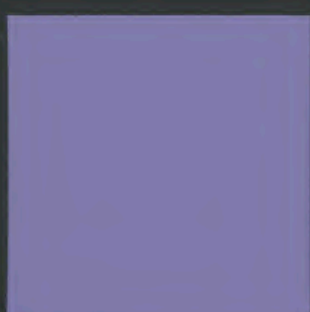
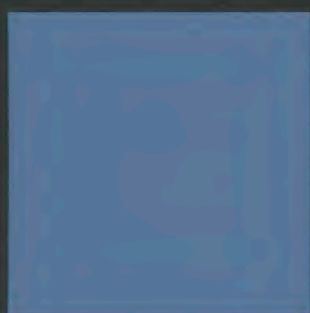
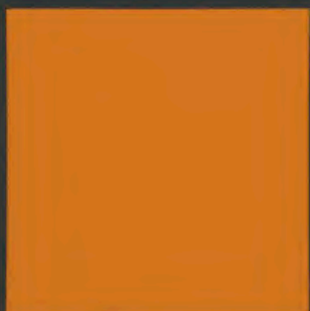
