Next week Nigel Kirkpatrick, the wellknown hockey player, is leaving for the United States, where he is taking up a business appointment, and Scotland thus lose their valuable centre-forward, who has gained in all fifteen "caps" against England, Ireland, and Wales.

Kirkpatrick, an Old Marlburian, won his hockey Blue at Oxford in 1924, a year after his brother, Colin, had earned similar distinction. Both got into the Scottish eleven that same year (1924), and have done valuable service in the front line for their country isnce. Like Scotland, the Wimbledon Club will suffer a severe loss by the removal abroad of Nigel Kirkpatrick. With him at centre, his brother Colin and C. Morley-Brown on the right wing, and another international, Dr. G. W. M. Mackay, in the side, Wimbledon have had a strong Scottish flavour for several seasons.
