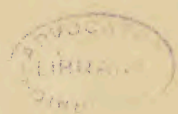


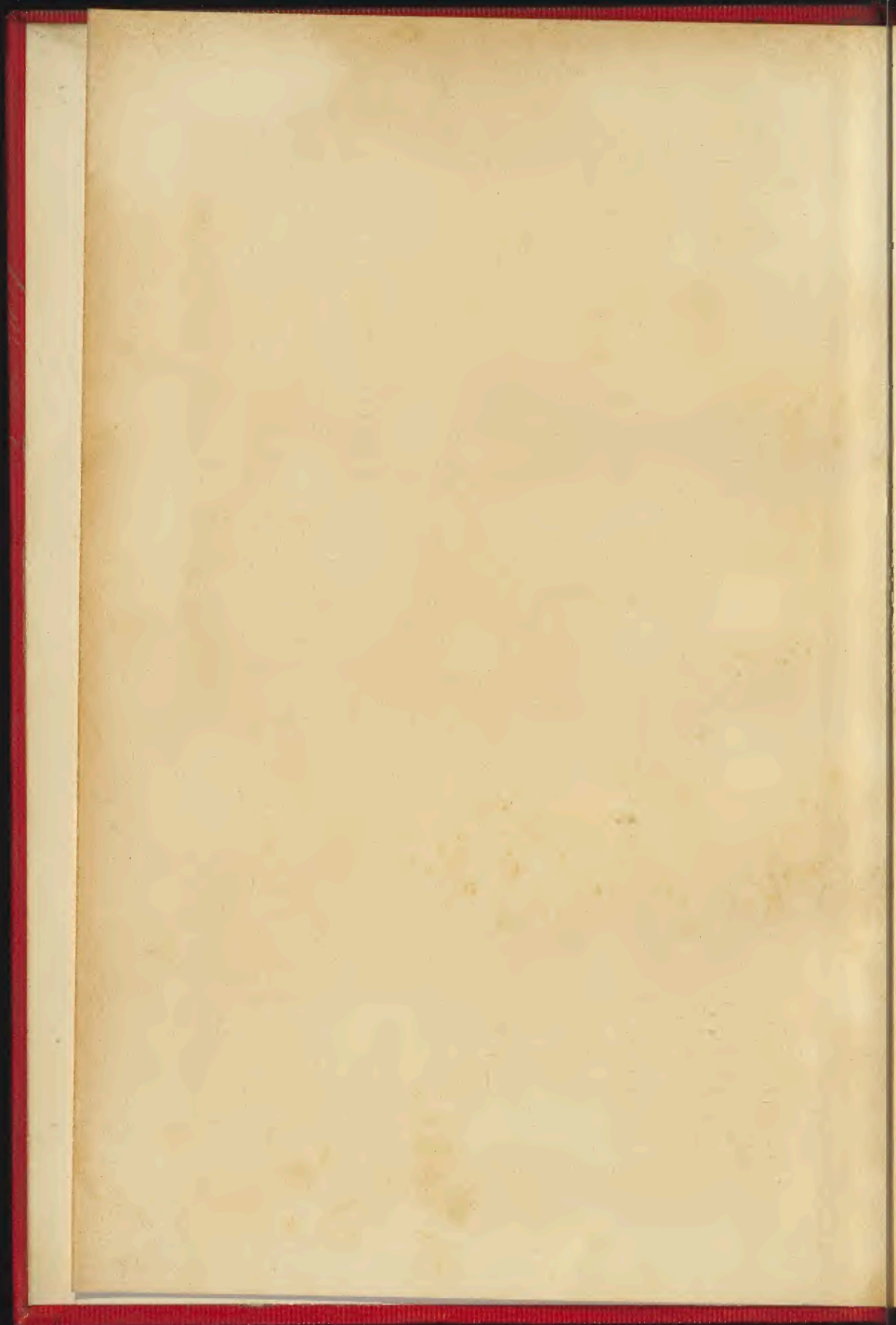

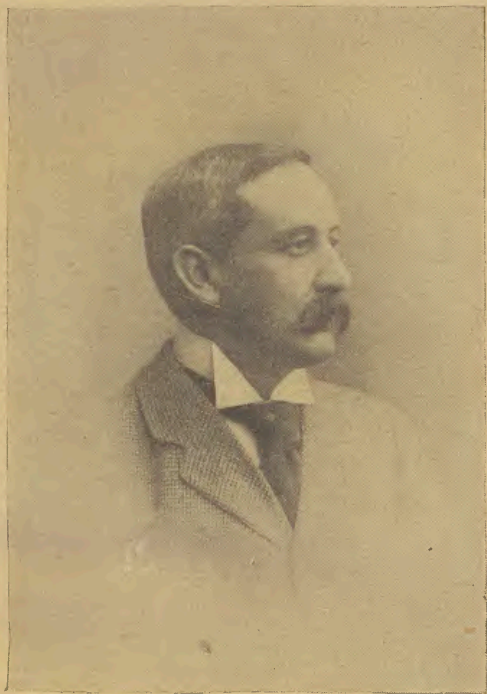

PREFACE.

For the opportunity of presenting this little reference work for public appreciation, I have to thank the proprietors of FOOTBALL CHAT. To know who's who in the football world is interesting to most enthusiasts of the pastime, and I have endeavoured to tell, briefly but clearly, who the men are that govern and play Association football, and also to record something about those who arrange for the playing of the games. The compilation has been done somewhat hurriedly, and though containing the names, addresses, and other brief particulars of more Association football men than any football publication issued, does not fully realise the anticipations I formed when obtaining the material for the various sections. The modesty of many "lights" of the football world is probably responsible for the omission of a number of biographies. In some instances information was declined with the explanation, "not famous in football." In a few cases (almost too few to be worthy of mention, I am pleased to say) payment was requested for the information. Biographical items of special value will be found on many pages of the volume, and with the assistance of my many friends in the football world, I will endeavour to considerably add to the number in the 1904 edition, to be published during September, 1903. I have striven, in the brief time at my disposal, to compile football facts, and I think it will be found that no other football publication ever contained more facts and figures relating to football men. Sincere thanks are tendered to the many famous officials and players who sent me information so readily. I hope they will find I have faithfully recorded from their material. The football enthusiasts who are often anxious to "throw bricks" at referees for their ignorance of football laws and customs, will, I fancy, be surprised if they read the pedigrees of the referees, for there they will find that the majority of the officials have not only been players, but in most instances been players of class club teams. It was my intention to illustrate the book with many portraits of football men, but I regret space only admits of a few of the many kindly lent me. In several instances great trouble was taken to supply portraits, and I am sorry it was impossible to extend the number of pages to allow of their presentation

Football Association Councillors and Association Men.

F.A. PRESIDENT.

LORD KINNAIRD. Born February 16, 1847. Commenced playing football at Eton, and at Trinity College, Cambridge, became an adept at "Soccer." Captain Eton Club, Cambridge, 1867, and member of Wanderers F.C. Played for Scotland (Scotsmen resident in England) v. England 1870. In 1873 represented Scotland in recognised match v. England. With English Cup winners (Wanderers) 1872-3, 1876-7, and 1877-8; with same club when Cup was won. 1878-9 with Old Etonians when they defeated Clapham Rovers. Won his fifth Final medal in 1881-2 season, when Old Etonians defeated Blackburn Rovers. Played until about 1893, and took nearly every position in the field, from goal to forward. Elected to committee of F.A. 1868, treasurer 1877, and president 1890. Address: 1, Pall Mall East, London, S.W.

VICE-PRESIDENTS.

ALCOCK, C. W. (Old Harrovians). Born at Sunderland, 1842. Played football at Harrow, and later with the Forest Football Club, from which sprang the Wanderers F.C. in 1864. Hon. sec. of the Wanderers, and captain when F.A. Cup was won in season 1871-2, Royal Engineers being defeated 1 to nil. In 1866 elected on F.A. Committee, and in 1870 appointed hon. secretary. In 1886, owing to growth of the Association, became paid secretary, and retained position until 1895. Elected F.A. vice-president in 1897. President of Surrey F.A., secretary of Surrey County Cricket Club since 1872. In the seventies attached to several London sporting papers, and in the eighties started "Cricket." Author of several works on football, and originator of the "Football Annual" in 1868. Address: Kennington Oval, S.E.

CLEGG, J. C. (Sheffield and Hallamshire F.A.). Born at Sheffield, June 15, 1850. Played for Sheffield Club, Sheffield Wednesday, and several minor organisations in Sheffield. Represented England in first International 1872. Connected with Football Association since 1886, elected vice-president in 1889, and chairman of Council in 1890. A clever and popular referee for a number of years. At present time active in connection with the duties of members of the International Selection Committee. A famous athlete from 1867 to 1874, and won 120 prizes. Held 600 yards record for some years. A life total abstainer

and non-smoker. Official Receiver in Bankruptcy for City of Sheffield, and partner of firm of Messrs. Clegg and Sons, solicitors. Member of Football League Appeal Committee. Address: Figtree Lane, Sheffield.

CRUMP, C. (Birmingham and District Counties F.A.). Born at Kingsland, Leominster, December 15, 1840. As a player was member and captain of Stafford Road Works Club (Wolverhampton) from 1872 to 1881, and won a number of medals in connection with Birmingham and District Cup, and other Midland Cup competitions. Elected to Football Association in 1883, and a vice-president in 1886. First president of the Birmingham and District Counties Association, an office still held. Active member of F.A. Emergency Committee, and member of Football League Appeal Committee. Holds an important position with Great Western Railway Company at Stafford Road Works, Wolverhampton.

HUGHES, C. J. (Cheshire F.A.), Central Offices, Northwich. Born at Northwich, Cheshire. Founder of the Northwich Victoria Football Club, and Cheshire Association. The latter in 1877, and secretaryship held since June of that year. Elected member of F.A. Council in 1887, and vice-president in 1902. For many years one of the busiest of first-class referees. Conducted four F.A. Finals, twelve Semi-finals, and many finals and semi-finals of cup competitions in connection with Midland district football. Mr. Hughes was elected F.A. vice-president in succession of the late Dr. E. S. Morley, of Blackburn, who was elected a vice-president in 1885, and held the position until his death in 1902.

SHERRINGTON, G. S. (Suffolk F.A.), 31, Bedford Row, London, W.C. Commenced football at Ipswich School, and later on was captain of Ipswich Town Club. During residence at Cambridge was one of the most prominent forwards playing "soccer," and missed his "blue" through an accident that kept him out of football for some time. After his Varsity days became attached to Brentwood and the Crusaders, also representing London F.A. and Suffolk County. Retired from playing in 1890. Linesman in many important games, including Internationals. Chairman of the Amateur Cup Committee, and a most energetic worker in connection with F.A. Commissions and general work of the F.A.

HON. TREASURER.

WOOLFALL, D. B. Formerly connected with Blackburn Rovers, now vice-president of Lancashire Association. Succeeded the late Mr. C. E. Hart (Clapton) as treasurer of Football Association in 1901. Previous to becoming hon. treasurer was F.A. divisional representative of the Lanca-

shire Association. Though little in touch with practical football, Mr. Woolfall has rendered immense service to the game by his labours in connection with its finance. By profession the F.A. treasurer is Clerk to the Commissioners of Income Tax for East Lancashire.

HON. SECRETARY.

WALL, F. J. Born in 1856. A playing member and hon. secretary of the Rangers F.C. (a club playing on the Balham Cricket Ground) from 1875 to 1888. Kept goal for L.F.A. Elected member of London Association Committee in 1881, and vice-president in 1892. Member of Middlesex Association in 1888, and hon. secretary and treasurer in 1890. In 1891 commenced to represent Middlesex Association on F.A. Council, and retained position until elected to succeed Mr. C. W. Alcock as secretary of the Association, August, 1895. The Referees' Association, which did so much to bring about the recognition of referees by associations, and ultimately led to the formation of Association Referees' Committees, and compulsory registration of all referees, was largely assisted at its birth by Mr. Wall, who was also first president. The Society of Referees (London), established 1902, elected Mr. Wall its first president.

F.A. COUNCILLORS.

ALBERT, J. (Kent F.A.), 27, Meadow Bank, Institute Road, Chatham. (See Secretaries of Associations affiliated to the English F.A.)

BENTLEY, J. J. (Lancashire Divisional representative), Acresfield, Bolton. Born at Turton, Lancashire. Played for Turton, a club that was prominent in Lancashire football previous to the birth of professionalism, at half-back and forward. Represented Lancashire in inter-county games. A busy referee in the League's best games for some years, and also in F.A. Cup-ties. Secretary of Bolton Wanderers for many seasons. Chairman of Football League 1st Division until 1894, when he was elected president, and has retained position to date. A member of the F.A. Council since 1888, and of the Lancashire Association since 1886. President Manchester and District F.A.; president Lancashire Amateur League; president Bolton and District Charity Cup Association; member of the Sheriff of London Shield Committee; president Manchester, Bury, Bolton, and District Referees' Association. The Football League owes much of its extraordinary progress to the energy of Mr. Bentley. Successful in defeating a F.A. resolution in May, 1894, which was to prohibit any club from receiving or paying monetary consideration for transfer of players. Carried neutral linesman proposition for F.L. games. Editor of "Athletic News" for many years. At present writes for "Midland Express," "North Mail," "Umpire," &c.; also

- a well-known writer on county cricket, and special contributor to the "Daily Express."
- BELLAMY, W. H. (Lincolnshire F.A.), 448, Cleethorpe-rd, Grimsby. Hon. financial treasurer Grimsby Town F.C.; Football League linesman; and F.A. linesman in important Association Cup games. For several seasons member of the Football League Management Committee.
- CURTIS, Captain, E. G. (Army F.A.).
- COOK, R. (Essex F.A.), White House Farm, Chelmsford. Born at Stratford, Essex. Hon. secretary and treasurer Essex County Football Association. Has occupied the post of hon. treasurer and hon. secretary since the formation of the association in 1882. Vice-president Chelmsford F.C. Hon. secretary and treasurer of the Essex County Cycling and Athletic Association. Member of committee of the Essex County Cricket Club. Represents Essex on the Councils of the F.A., A.A.A., N.C.U., &c.
- DAVIES, A. (Berks and Bucks Association), 59, High Street, Marlow. Born at Marlow, 1868. Clubs connected with: Hon. secretary Marlow F.C. since 1890; hon. secretary Berks and Bucks F.A. from 1895; member of F.A. Council last ten years; member of F.A. International Selection and Amateur Cup Committees; hon. secretary Berks and Bucks League.
- EVEREST, E. W. (Sussex), 16, Chatham Place, Brighton. Born at Brighton, Sussex, in 1865. Clubs connected with: Brighton Hornets in the past; none at present. Secretary Sussex Football Association for past eleven years, and member of F.A. Council for seven.
- FROWDE, M. C. (Dorsetshire Association). Address: Weymouth. Born at Devonport in 1870. Hon. secretary and treasurer of Dorset County Football Association since 1895. Formerly played for Weymouth F.C. and Dorset County.
- GREGSON, R. P. (Lancashire Association). Born at Clitheroe, Lancashire. Clubs connected with: Secretary Lancashire Football Association. Appointment commenced May, 1882. Address: Richmond Terrace, Blackburn.
- HATGH, D. (Sheffield and Hallamshire F.A.), 5, Park Station, Sheffield. Hon. secretary Sheffield and Hallamshire F.A. For many seasons member of F.L. Management Committee.
- HASKINS, W. H. (Gloucestershire F.A.).
- HEATH, W. (Staffordshire F.A.), 8, Eastwood Place, Hanley. Hon. secretary of Staffordshire F.A. One of the early referees of the Football League.
- HINES, A. G. (Notts F.A.), 129, Norton Street, Nottingham. (See Class I. Referees).
- HOLLAND, E. L. (Middlesex F.A.), 7, Wellington Street, Strand, W.C. Member of Middlesex Council since 1893; hon. secretary and treasurer since 1899. Chairman Division IV. London F.A., 1897 and 1899. Member of F.A.

Council from 1900 to date. Hon. secretary and treasurer of Civil Service F.C., 1892 to present time.

HOWCROFT, J. (North Riding of Yorkshire F.A.).

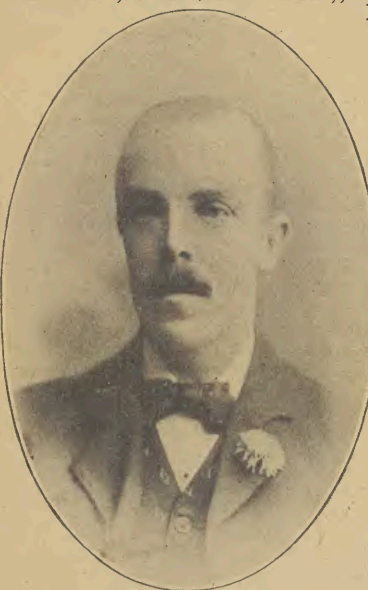
KINGSCOTT, A. (Derby Divisional representative). (See Class I. Referees).

KNOWLES, H. (Lancashire Divisional representative).

LYTHGOE, R. E. (Liverpool and District F.A.), 7, West Bank Road, Liverpool. Born at Warrington, Lancashire. Clubs connected with: Welsh Druids, Birkenhead, and Bootle. Hon. secretary Liverpool and District F.A. since its formation, 1882, and member of F.O. Council since that date. Hon. divisional secretary for first and second Divisions since formation, September 1888; hon. secretary for Reinstatement Committee since 1888 (commencement of reinstatement).

MCGREGOR, W. (Birmingham and District Counties F.A.), Summer Lane, Birmingham. Founder of Football League in 1888. Aston Villa vice-president, and one of its early-day workers. Great toiler for junior football in the Birmingham district.

NOTCUTT, S. A. (Suffolk F.A.), Anglesea Road, Ipswich.

PICKFORD, W. (Hampshire F.A.), Sunny Hill, Pokesdown, Bournemouth. Born at Bolton, Lancashire, and played for Bolton All Saints in 1881-3. Then for Bournemouth F.C. from 1883 to 1896. Originated Hants and Dorset F.A. in 1885, and founded Hampshire F.A. in 1887. Has been hon. secretary and treasurer of Hants F.A. since 1887, and played ten times for Hants and Dorset combined counties, and ten times for Hampshire. Captained Hampshire XI. in 1887-8 six times. Captained Bournemouth Club, 1888-9. Founded Hampshire Senior, Junior, and Minor Cup Competitions and Hampshire League. Member of the F.A. Council since 1888, and represented

Hants and Sussex on it, 1888-9, and Hampshire ever since then. He has been a member of the Amateur Cup Committee, and is now a member of the F.A. Consultation Committee, Rules Revision Committee, Benevolent Fund Committee, Referees' Committee, Reinstatement Committee, and International Team Selection Committee. Was vice-president of the Referees' Association, and drew out their referees' chart. Founded Hampshire Referees' Association, and was a Southern League referee for five years. Is a member of the Appeals Committee of the Southern League and Western League, and has won many prizes at swimming, water polo, and cycling. Founded Hampshire Water Polo Cup and Bournemouth Swimming Club, which he captained from 1890 to 1901. Held in one year offices of captain of Bournemouth F.C., Swimming Club, and Cycling Club, and vice-captain of Rowing Club.

ROBERTS, M. T. (Derbyshire F.A.), Baseball Hotel, Derby. Hon. secretary Derbyshire F.A. for many years. An old player, umpire, referee, and linesman. Has done immense service for Derbyshire football, and is known in every corner of the county.

RADFORD, H. S. (Notts Divisional representative), Brougham Chambers, Wheeler Gate, Nottingham. With Nottingham Forest Mr. Radford first got in touch with football, and for many years he gave immense service to this club. During the term of his hon. secretary office with the Forest, he was elected an auditor to the Football League, and in 1898 became a member of the League Management Committee. In addition to the great service given to the Forest F.C., Mr. Radford has, for many years, been a consistent worker for the Nottinghamshire F.A., and all other football bodies in the lace city.

WHITTAKER, N. (Southampton Divisional representative), Born at Oswaldtwistle (Accrington), Lancashire. Clubs connected with: Church and London Hotspur. Hon. secretary of the Southern League since formation.

WILSON, W. J. (Surrey F.A.). Born at Brighton. Clubs connected with: Hotspur, Grosvenor, St. John's College. Appointment as hon. secretary Surrey County F.A. commenced March 1897. In addition to the arduous position Mr. Wilson holds in connection with the Surrey County F.A., he devotes a great amount of his leisure hours to refereeing and linesman duties. For four seasons Mr. Wilson was chairman, and eight seasons hon. secretary of the South London Schools F.A., founded in 1885, when Mr. Wilson first took office.

WHEELER, REV. W. N. CAMPBELL (Wiltshire F.A.). Mr. Wheeler was educated at Rossall School, where he stayed till 1875 under the Rev. Robert Henniker and Rev.

H. A. James, the present Headmaster of Rugby, he then gained an exhibition at King's College, Cambridge. From his earliest years, Mr. Wheeler has not only been "on the ball," but has been an all round man. At Rossall, he played in the eleven (1875) and in the Hockey Eleven (1874). At King's he was in the college cricket and football teams, and steered the college boat. He took his degree in 1879, and was ordained deacon on May 23, 1880, by Bishop Moberley at Salisbury Cathedral, being licensed to the Curacy of the Parish Church, Bradford-on-Avon, he was ordained Priest on June 12, 1881, by Bishop Moberley, at Salisbury. He remained at the Parish Church until the death of the late Canon Jones in 1885. After being left in charge of the parish until the appointment of the new Vicar, the Rev. S. G. Collisson, Mr. Wheeler went to Christ Church, Bradford-on-Avon, where he has remained. As in the pulpit and the parish so in the football field, Mr. Wheeler has always worked hard and dealt squarely, and the Wiltshire F.A. has made such progress under his guidance that the balance in hand has increased from £21 14s. 6d in 1900 (when Mr. Wheeler took up the hon. secretaryship) to £78 7s. 3d in 1903.

SIDNEY, T. H. (Staffordshire Divisional representative), Telford Place, Wolverhampton. Though only elected member of Football Association Council in 1903, Mr. Sidney has for many years been connected with football and several of its leading organisations. The Football League Management Committee has long had his assistance, also the Staffordshire and Birmingham and District Associations, but it is in connection with the Wolverhampton Club where Mr. Sidney perhaps does his greatest work for football. In 1893, when Wolverhampton succeeded in winning the Cup with a team consisting entirely of Englishmen, Mr. Sidney probably derived his greatest pleasure from the game; but any good exhibition of *real* football gives him intense pleasure, for it is a thorough appreciation of the pastime that causes him to devote so much of his time and money to its government and management. Writing of Mr. Sidney in 1899, a special contributor to FOOTBALL CHAT said:—"Mr. Sidney is one of Nature's gentlemen. Of kindly disposition, entirely devoid of fulsome flattery, possessed of goodness of heart and thorough conscientiousness, he has won the praise of men wherever he goes as a peacemaker. Honest, upright, and transparent as the day, he is destined to special honour. He approaches football from the purest of motives (the love of it), and has become persona grata in football circles."

SCRAGG, A. (Cheshire Association), 249, Walthall Street, Crewe. (See Class I. Referees.)

SIMMONS, G. WAGSTAFFE (Hertfordshire Association),

"Standard" Office, St. Albans. Born at St. Albans. Formerly hon. secretary St. Albans Town F.C., Hertford, and various other clubs. Appointment as hon. secretary Herts Association commenced August, 1901; hon. secretary Herts F.A. Referees' Committee, match secretary, Herts League secretary. Writing of Mr. Simmonds in November, 1902, the "Football Sun" (London) said:—"Hertfordshire finds in Mr. Simmons an ideal secretary. All his work is done without fee or reward, and no county could have its business transacted in a more businesslike way. With over a hundred clubs to look after it may be imagined that his correspondence is heavy, but in addition to the ordinary duties of the office he is likewise secretary of the Referees' Committee, manages the various Cup and League competitions, and is responsible for all the arrangements for inter-county matches. As an instance of the smartness with which his work is done, we may mention that on the day following a council meeting of his Association a printed report of the proceedings is always sent to every club and newspaper in the county, and some of these reports contain matter equal to two or three newspaper columns. He is general adviser to the Herts referees and clubs, all of them having in him a genuine friend. He is not a man with one idea. His tastes are cosmopolitan, as might be expected from a newspaper editor, and his colleagues in the profession have shown their opinion of his abilities by electing him a Fellow of the Institute of Journalists. The citizens of St. Albans evidently appreciate him, for he is senior elective auditor, and other honours might be his if he cared to accept the responsibilities which they bring. He founded, and is still hon. secretary of the St. Albans Chamber of Commerce, president of the St. Albans Short-hand Writers' Association, trustee of a local lodge of Odd-fellows, and vice-president of the St. Albans Debating Society. . . . Cricket finds in Mr. Simmons an enthusiastic follower. On numerous occasions he has played for the Gentlemen of Herts, and his place in the Herts Club and Ground team is assured whenever he finds it possible to play. He is a member of the Herts County C.C., and a member of its ground committee. His batting average for the club which during the 1902 season won the championship of the St. Albans and District League was a fraction under 40 per innings. . . . Mr. Simmons is a man of boundless energy and conspicuous ability. He is a lover of sport for sport's sake, and in proof of this it need only be stated that every office he fills in connection with sport is work undertaken as a labour of love. The more there are of such men the better for our national pastimes."

SQUIRES, CHAS. (London F.A.), "Iddesleigh," 72, Queen's Road, Leytonstone. Born at Bow, London, E.,

September 19, 1866. Connected with the London Football Association as follows: Councillor 1887, vice-president 1896, hon. secretary 1897, hon. treasurer 1902; Football Association: Councillor and on Consultative Committee since 1897; president of both Leytonstone Football Club and Metropolitan Amateur League; vice-president London Schools Football Association; active player of both Queen's Lawn Tennis Club and Leytonstone Hockey Club. Been captain of former for about seven years. Member of London Football Charity Committee and several appeals committees. Mr. Squires was a player for many years, doing good service for Old St. Paul's, a London club. He was not only a player but hon. sec., and generally ran three teams, sometimes four, and never had an assistant. With Old St. Paul's he played in the London Senior Cup and other leading competitions, and when he failed to retain the form required for the first team turned out for the reserves and played in the London Junior Cup-ties. After a period as centre-forward with the juniors, he commenced to referee, and for some seasons was busily engaged in Southern competitions of every description. He has experienced the usual penalty of a great referee—mobbing; the Chatham enthusiasts being responsible for this some years back after a Cup game with the Casuals. Other honours of field work have been two linesmen appointments in the Amateur Cup Final and two in the Blue Riband Final. The East End and Middlesex Associations had some experience of his energy as a councillor, being attached to the latter from 1887 to the present time, and with the former from 1897 to date. He has attended more London Association meetings than any other member of the Council, and has seen it grow from sixty to over 800 clubs. The immense character of the work of the L.F.A. is seen best by a reference to the official handbook, which is the greatest work on earth connected with any Football Association, containing every possible tittle of information concerning the management and work of the L.F.A. During 1902 Mr. Squires was presented by L.F.A. workers and friends with the most valuable testimonial ever given to an official of an Association, but richly merited.

- ATHAWES, E. B. (MIDDLESEX F.A.), 37, Mill Hill Road, Acton, W. Born at Acton, Middlesex, 1878. Club connected with: Acton F.C. Elected on Middlesex F.A. Council, September, 1902. Placed on Southern League Referees' List, May, 1902.
- BACON, H. (LONDON F.A.), 147, High Street, West Norwood, S.E. Born at West Norwood. Has been connected with West Norwood F.C. as chairman, secretary, and treasurer, the latter being the position now held. His membership of West Norwood dates from 1885.
- BARRETT, H. ROPER (SURREY F.A.), 7, Leadenhall Street, E.C. Born at Upton, in the County of Essex, on November 24, 1873. Clubs connected with: Casuals, Corinthians, Idlers, Weybridge, Reigate Priory. Still a member of Casuals and Weybridge. Appointed hon. match secretary to the Surrey F.A., 1901.
- BARNES, E. (LONDON F.A.), 145, Tottenham Court Road, W. Born at East Ham, Essex, 1872. Played various kinds of football for sixteen years. Present club: Clarence F.C. (Maple and Co.). Amongst the principal games taken charge of are the following: Amateur Cup Final, 1898, at Crystal Palace; North v. South in 1900 also at the Palace. Has not yet had the honour of refereeing the Final, but will do so this season. Has refereed the Final for Birmingham District and Counties Football Association Junior Competition for seventeen years in succession, and hopes to make it twenty-one. Runs Mr. J. Lewis with number of Football League appointments.

ALLEN, G. W., 159, Filbert Street, Leicester. Born at Leicester, September 21, 1873. Played for Aylestone F.C. (Leicester), for which he was hon. sec. three years. Commenced refereeing regularly September, 1897. Has taken matches in all local cup-ties, &c., and Midland League. Has been six years as linesman on Football League. Was on line in Sheffield United v. Sheffield Wednesday this season.

ALLEN, S., 36, Kent Road, Swindon. Born at West Bromwich (Staffs.). Connected with several Birmingham and District junior teams. Seven years director of the Swindon Town F.C. Resigned season 1901-2 for refereeing. Appointed secretary of Swindon, July 7, 1902.

ALWOOD, G. T., Ivydene, Clark Street, Wolverhampton.

ARMITT, T., 8, North Street, Leek, Staffs. Born at Leek (Staffs.). Connected with Leek F.C. as long as they had a decent team. Umpired for several seasons, training for referee. In 1887 commenced to referee first-class games. Elected Football League referee 1889, and been on list in all following seasons. Has had control of almost all the best games it falls to the lot of a referee to have. These include Scotland v. Wales (International), England v. Ireland (Inter-League), and three times in the Semi-final of the Football Association Cup. Has taken the final of many county cups.

ATHERTON, R., 8, Overleigh Road, Chester. Born at Seacombe, Cheshire. Entered Chester Training College; there

1884 and 1885. Played goal for College 1st team in 1885. After leaving played for Seacombe St. Paul's, which produced Montgomery and Roche, of now defunct Bootle. 1888 (April), Head Master of St. Mary's Chester. Became a member of Chester and District Football Association, with which he commenced refereeing, 1890. Afterwards secretary of City team, 1898-1900. Elected member of Executive of Football Combination. Elected secretary of Football Combination 1900. Football League linesman 1898-1901, and Football League referee 1902 and 1903. Officiated in Final Northwich Charity Cup, Semi-Final Cheshire County Senior Cup, afterwards refereed with the Football Combination and Lancashire Combination.

EVERY, A., 58, Threadneedle Street, London, E.C.

AYLING, H. A., Elmercroft, Southwick, Sussex. Born at Shoreham, Sussex, 1869. Clubs played for: Southdown, Shoreham, Southwick, Brighton Rangers, and Sussex County. Commenced refereeing 1886. Has been on the Sussex County Referees' Committee five years, and hon. sec. of the committee; also hon. sec. of the central sub-committee. Has officiated in some forty matches per season, including Southern League and South-Eastern League games. Many final and semi-final cup-ties (senior and junior), F.A. and Amateur Cup-ties (preliminary rounds), inter-league matches, and several county fixtures.

AYLOTT, J. E., Gas Works, Fulham. Born at Lavender Hill, London, Surrey, in July, 1867. Clubs played for: Stanley (now defunct), Imperial Rovers, and Fulham. Commenced refereeing October, 1892. Most important games conducted: County matches, S.L. games (Division I.), county cup semi-finals and F.A. and Amateur Cup-ties, &c.

BAHR, W. E., 39, Scholar Street, Smithdown Road, Liverpool.

BAILEY, J. W., Lyndene, Fosse Road, Leicester. Born Lissadel, Co. Sligo, Ireland. Played for Chester College F.C., Leicester Teachers' F.C., Woodhouse Eaves, F.C.; also represented Leicestershire against Derbyshire and Birmingham and District. Commenced refereeing September, 1895. Most important games conducted: Football League, Division I., Blackburn Rovers v. Sunderland, Sheffield United v. Everton, Bury v. Sheffield Wednesday, &c. Football League, Division II.: Woolwich Arsenal v. Bristol City, West Bromwich Albion v. Burton United, &c. Southern and United Leagues: Portsmouth v. Bristol Rovers, Luton v. Reading, &c. F.A. Cup-ties including Grimsby Town v. Newcastle United, Barnsley v. Chesterfield.

BARKER, A. J., 40, Marsh Street, Hanley. Born at Hanley, Staffordshire. Played for Newcastle Swifts. Commenced refereeing 1887. Has conducted League games, Test matches, F.A. Cup-tie, Southern League, Western

League, and every important class of game in Association football. Manchester Final four years in succession, Bass Charity Final three times, Cheshire Final twice, Birmingham Final, and minor finals innumerable. Two of his most important fixtures (to the clubs certainly) were Burnley v. Notts County, and Blackburn Rovers v. Burnley in the Football League test games, now no longer played.

BARROW, D., Quartermaster-Sergeant, R.E., Tidworth House, Tidworth, near Andover, Hants. Born at Rochester, Kent, July 29, 1866. Did very little playing. The club to which he had the honour to belong (Royal Engineers, Aldershot) had a very strong eleven, and it took a very good player to get a place in the team. Commenced in 1894 to referee in military matches at Aldershot, a good training ground, and in 1895 founded the Aldershot branch of the Referees' Association, and became hon. sec. of the Aldershot F.A. Conducted many important matches on every ground in the Southern and Western Leagues, and in the F.A. Cup, the latest in the latter competition being Woolwich Arsenal v. Luton in 1901-2. Has officiated in the final for the Hants, Gloucester, Dorset, and other cup-ties. Unable to officiate during 1902-3 season owing to military duties, but anticipates being in the fray during season 1903-4.

BARDWELL, R. F., Stone House, Ipswich. Born at Ipswich. Played for Cowells Athletic for upwards of twelve years. Won county colours for Suffolk as a half-back. Owing to an accident, which developed badly into "football knee," was forced to relinquish play, but a season's rest saw him back again in the field as referee. Commenced to referee in 1895. Has conducted many important cup-ties in the Eastern Districts, F.A. and Amateur Cups, Suffolk and Norfolk Charities, and the principal league and inter-county matches. Registered Class I. referee, season 1901-2.

BEARDSLEY, F. W., 8, Coxwell Road, Plumstead, London, S.E. Born at Nottingham. Played in goal with Notts Forest and Royal Arsenal, Woolwich. One of the founders of the Arsenal. Commenced to referee about 1895-6. Attached to the Football League, Southern League, Western League, &c. Most important games officiated in: Aston Villa v. Sunderland, West Bromwich v. Stoke, Tottenham v. Southampton.

BLACK, S. J., Calais Road, Horninglow, Burton-on-Trent. Born at Burton-on-Trent, February 27, 1864. Played for Burton Wanderers. Left Burton to finish apprenticeship at Manchester. Joined Newton Heath L. and Y. by invitation. With this club six years (captain four seasons), and played in Final Manchester Cup first year of existence. Captain of the Manchester F.A. v. Liverpool Association on two occasions, and played in most of the Manchester Associa-

tion matches when residing in Manchester. Had many good offers when playing, one from Blackburn Olympic the year they won the Cup, Mitchell's, Crewe Alexandra when they reached Semi-final, and others; but always considered club first. Never a professional player. Commenced refereeing in 1889. Many important games in all leagues. Had Forest v. Albion at Nottingham, when Forest were playing for top position, and Albion trying to escape bottom. During 1901-2 season officiated in forty-nine games.

BOLDISON, H., 105, Parliament Street, Stockton-on-Tees. Born at Middlesbrough. Played for Middlesbrough Rovers (Rugby) and Middlesbrough (Association). Commenced refereeing 1889. Most important games conducted: Sunderland v. Newcastle United, Easter Monday, 1902, in the presence of 35,000 spectators; the receipts being a record; Sheffield United v. Sunderland, and other games in F.L.; Portsmouth v. Grimsby Town (F.A. Cup-tie, 1901-2 season). Probably holds the travelling record for a referee in a Cup-tie, having travelled 846 miles to officiate in a match. Although frequently scores of miles away from home on Saturdays, Sunday will always find him at his seat at the organ at the appointed time at a village church three miles away from his home, so that he does twelve miles walking on a Sunday. Is a member of the North Riding Football Association, and was returned unopposed at the last election.

Late member Middlesex Association, late vice-president North Middlesex League, president Clapton and District League, late hon. sec. Referees' Association, late vice-president L.F.A.

BOYCE, A. E., Lancaster House, Newcastle, Staffs. Born at Bath, Somerset. Played for Bath, Clifton, Norwich, Somerset Rovers, Somerset, and Warwickshire. First refereed in 1887. Most important games conducted: Wolverhampton Wanderers v. Oxford University; Somerset, Surrey, Wilts, Gloucester, London, Middlesex, and Devon Cup-ties.

BRENTNALL, E. J., 80, Clarence Road, Wimbledon. Born at Riddings, Derbyshire, June 23, 1875. Clubs played for: Riddings, St. John's College, Battersea. Commenced refereeing, January, 1898. Most important games conducted: Southern, Midland, Kent, London Leagues; Derbyshire, London, Surrey Senior Cups, English Cup, Amateur Cup

(Competition proper); Finals: Derbyshire, Bolton, and South-Western Cups.

BRETNALL, G. H., Ash Bank, Riddings, Alfreton, Derbyshire. A busy worker for the Derbyshire Association both on the field and in the council chamber. Football League linesman for many seasons, and services much appreciated by clubs, players, and referees.

BRIGGS, A., 20, Holland Street, Blackburn. Born at Blackburn. Played for local amateur team. Commenced refereeing 1892, and has conducted Football League and F.A. Cup-ties.

BRIGGS, J., 104, Attercliffe Common, Sheffield.

BRODIE, J. B., Brewood, Staffordshire. Born at Wolverhampton. Clubs played for: Wolverhampton Wanderers, Saltley College (1881-2). Commenced refereeing 1892. Most important games conducted: Final Welsh Cup, Final Shropshire Cup, Final Manchester Cup, First-class League matches, F.A. Cup-ties.

BRUNT, J., 16, Jesmond Avenue, Bradford.

BULLEY, J. W., 31, Huddleston Road, Tufnell Park, London, N.

BURGESS, W., 190, Elsley Road, Lavender Hill, London, S.W. Born at Newark-on-Trent, Notts. Played for Newark (Midland League), Peterborough College (captain), London Grosvenor, London Teachers v. Hotspur (N.U.T. Charities), Woodford, Essex, &c. Commenced refereeing: South London Schools, 1887, London F.A., 1890. Playing also same year. Member of Referees' Association when first commenced. Most important games conducted: Preliminary Rounds of F.A. Cup, Semi-finals for Norwich Charity, Hertfordshire, London, &c.; Finals for Surrey Senior and Surrey Charity. Few Southern League matches, London and South-Eastern Leagues, Berks and Bucks Cup and League.

BYE, F., 66, South Grove Road, Sheffield. Born at Sheffield, near Bramall Lane Ground, and therefore a thorough "tyke." Played for East View, St. Mark's College, Old St. Mark's, London Hotspur, and Sheffield Wednesday. Twice selected to represent London. Commenced refereeing in Sheffield Association, 1890. Most important games conducted: International—Scotland v. Ireland. For several years F.A. Cup-ties to "anti-penultimate" round. Southampton v. West Bromwich, Villa v. Stoke, &c. Has acted in all important games in League, and during the past two years in Southern League. Two Finals and several Semi-finals in Amateur Cup. One season refereed in eleven different final ties.

Many finals of challenge cup competitions and all southern organisations' principal fixtures. Hon. secretary London League, South-Eastern League, and Society of Association Referees. Officiated on most grounds, and has been mobbed twice—once at Rossendale and once at Burnley. Has refereed three Internationals: Scotland v. Ireland, at Glasgow; Scotland v. Ireland, at Belfast; Wales v. Ireland, at Wrexham.

FALLOWFIELD, C.C., 52, Hailsham Avenue, Leigham Court, Streatham, London, S.W. Born at Preston, Lancashire, 1869. Played with junior clubs, later in College eleven at Westminster, 1890-91. Commenced refereeing 1896 with Lancashire Combination, Football League, 1899, Southern League, Western League, and Class I. Football Association, 1901. Most important games conducted: Blackburn Rovers v. Liverpool, Notts Forest v. Sheffield Wednesday, Bristol Rovers v. Portsmouth, Southampton v. Tottenham Hotspur (Western League), Tottenham Hotspur v. Corinthians (twice), Sheffield Wednesday v. Notts Forest, &c. Also several London Cup-ties.

GLASS, R., 42, Eleanor Street, Cullercoats.

GREEN, A., Tenscore Street, West Bromwich. Born at Aston. Played for Aston Viaduct and Wednesbury Old

Athletic. A twisted knee caused retirement. Commenced refereeing 1888. For many seasons one of the most frequently engaged Football League referees. Took test match, Notts County v. Burnley. F.A. Cup-ties: Notts Forest v. Sunderland, Southampton v. Everton (twice), Tottenham v. Southampton, Bury v. Southampton. Record attendance League match, 1902-3, Manchester United v. Manchester City, 52,000 spectators. Southern League matches. Sheriff's Charity Cup: Corinthians v. Sunderland. Final Herefordshire Cup, and several of the "Derby Day" games of the Birmingham League.

GREEN, C. H., 7, Nile Street, Sheffield.

GRANT, W. E., St. George's Villa, Ryde, Isle of Wight. Born at Southsea, Hants. Clubs played for: St. John's College, Battersea; Portsmouth F.C. (not the professional organisation, but an amateur club, now defunct), hon. sec. from 1888-1892, captain from 1892-1893; Hants County, player from 1889-1892 and acted as captain; Ryde F.C., hon. sec. from 1890. Present organisations other than clubs: Portsmouth F.A., founder and hon. sec. from foundation (1889) till 1899; hon. treasurer from 1899 till present time; Hampshire F.A., member of Council since 1890, vice-president since 1899; Portsmouth Referees' Association, one of founders, vice-president, examiner, &c. Referee F.A., Class I., Southern League, Western League, Hants League, Portsmouth League, &c.

HANTS, H. A., Churchfields, South Woodford, Essex. Born at Chigwell Row, Essex. Club played for: Woodford Bridge. Commenced refereeing 1890. Most important games conducted, Maidenhead v. Shepherd's Bush (F.A. Cup). Has also refereed at Grays, West Ham, Harwich, Colchester, Chelmsford, Saffron Walden, Leyton, West Hampstead, West Croydon v. Richmond Town (F.A. Cup). HALL, A., Accountant's Department, Midland Railway, Derby. Born at Kilburn, Derbyshire, December 26, 1861. Played for Derby St. Luke's for seven years (the last four captain). At that time this was one of the strongest clubs in Derbyshire. Knee fractured in F.A. Cup-tie v. Derby County the first year that club was formed, and was never able to play afterwards. United same day. Refereed first-class games every Saturday for many years. Been on every class ground in England. Finals in many Cup competitions, and twice in charge of F.A. Final at Crystal Palace, including record crowd match (114,000), Tottenham Hotspur v. Sheffield United. Member of the F.A. Council. Hon. sec. of Midland League.

KIRKHAM, T., 22, Sneyd Street, Burslem. Born at Burslem, October 28, 1869. From early boyhood took great interest in football, but great ambition was to referee rather than play. Played for Milton, where he served his apprenticeship as a pupil teacher. At the age of sixteen was invited to play for Burslem Port Vale. Played for the Vale four seasons. Commenced refereeing in 1891. For six years his experience was in junior games purely (the best possible training ground). Was entrusted with most of the local tit-bits, officiating at one time or other in all the final ties in all North Staffs Cup and League competitions. In 1897 commenced officiating in League football, his first engagement being at Small Heath (Mr. W. W. Hart, a member of the League Management Committee, after the game predicting that Mr. K. would some day have the honour of conducting F.A. Final, which prediction was realised April, 1902). First game in Division I. of the League was between Preston North End and Notts Forest. Since that time has handled games of every description, Staffordshire, Birmingham, Cheshire, Durham, and F.A. Cup-ties.

(as pupil teacher) 1877-1881; St. John's College, Battersea, 1882-1883; captain of Juniors 1882, captain of Seniors 1883; the "Hotspur," finalists London Cup; contemporary "Spurs," N. Whittaker, S. R. Carr, C. D. Crisp, C. Sutton, G. R. Wagstaffe; the Chamois F.C., Old St. John's F.C. (vice-captain). Position on field, left full-back. Operation on right great toe ended playing career in 1892. Collar-bone displaced by charge in back from W. W. Read (Reigate Priory), 1881, worst accident. Commenced refereeing season 1892-1893. Member of the R.A., Southern League, London League, Western League, Kent League, Berks and Bucks League. Most important games conducted: Kettering v. Chesterfield (1st round Competition Proper, F.A. Cup), Final Norfolk Cup (1901-1902), Semi-final Amateur Cup, 1901 (Norwich), Final Surrey Cup, Final Norfolk Charity Cup (1901-1902), Semi-final Berks and

Bucks Cup (1903), Chatham v. New Brompton (several times S. League and F.A. Cup), Southampton v. Portsmouth, Southern League test matches, &c. Headmaster, Lombard Wall Board School, Charlton, Kent.

LANGFORD, J. F., 50, Thorndale Road, Waterloo, Liverpool. Born at Liverpool, 1874. Clubs played for: Walton St. Luke's, Celtic, and Liverpool Pelican. Commenced refereeing junior matches 1891, and has missed not more than an average of three Saturdays per season since. Most important games conducted: Final Liverpool Senior Cup, Southport Central v. Blackpool; F.A. Cup. three matches; Stockport County v. Manchester United; Preston North End v. Doncaster Rovers, Football League; Cheshire v. Liverpool and District (1901-2), inter-county match. At present Hon. Sec. I Zingari Football League, three divisions (1899-1903); executive of Liverpool and District Football Association since 1895; chairman Liverpool and District Amateur Football League, 1894-1900.

LEANING, C. M., Holmesdale, Eltham, Kent. Born July 21, 1867, at Deeping St. James, Lincolnshire. Clubs played for: Holywell Football Club and Dartford F.C., Kent. Owing to serious accident with the latter club—comminuted fracture of the leg—in 1893, was afterwards unable to participate in the game. Commenced refereeing 1896. Most important game, Dartford v. Gravesend, on the first occasion in which the clubs met under the auspices of the Kent County League. Most sensational game, September, 1902, Clapton v. Leyton, when the former scored 3 goals in three minutes, five minutes before the finish. Has also refereed county matches, Middlesex v. Berks and Bucks, and Middlesex v. Hertfordshire, Woolwich Arsenal, Cambridge University, Casuals, Chatham, Maidstone, Sittingbourne, &c.

LEWIS, J., Old Grammar School, Blackburn. Born at Blackburn. Played for Blackburn Rovers, which he assisted to form in 1874, with a companion. In 1880 the "Football Annual" described Mr. Lewis as follows: "Strong forward; has been rather unfortunate, getting lamed on several occasions; been of good service to his club. What Mr. Lewis was to his club, so was he to the game in general, good service being rendered in many directions. For nearly a quarter of a century Mr. Lewis assisted the Rovers in various ways, and during the time he was playing represented Lancashire against London. After breaking down, through an accident on the ice, commenced refereeing, and has refereed in all classes of football, from Sunday-school teams to the highest honours in the game—F.A. Cup Finals. The latter has been conducted on three occasions by Mr. Lewis, and, in addition to these great annual contests, the Football League have for some seasons generally selected Mr. Lewis to take charge of games where there has been

a lot at stake, or local rivalry has run somewhat keenly. Though sometimes styled 'the autocrat of the football field,' and 'the Penalty King,' John Lewis is the best-liked official that ever blew a whistle on a football field. Many men have attempted to imitate him, but some have found that players will not let all men be John Lewises, and for the very good reason that it requires men of exceptional strategic brilliance to gain the power as a great leader of men; and of the few (very few, indeed) who have gained it thoroughly over the rank and file of professional football is John Lewis, the old Blackburn Rover. John Lewis climbed to his position slowly yet surely. For a time he was out of Football League games, but there was never the slightest reason for his withdrawal because of his election to the League committee, and clubs generally were pleased at the abolition of the rule that prohibited M.C. officials from referee work."

LINGHAM, J. B., Balmoral Villa, Dover Road, Northfleet. Born at Northfleet, Kent. Played "rugger" at school and "soccer" for Northfleet, as amateur always. Commenced refereeing in 1898. Has refereed two Kent County final ties, Kent v. Surrey; Kent v. Sussex; refereed every club in Southern League except Southampton. Received seventy appointments last season in F.A. Cup, Southern League, Kent League, Kent Cup, London League, South-Western League, and friendlies, and refereed thirty-eight matches during the present season. Has been a member of Kent County Committee for seven years.

LOCKYER, B. M., 1, Laurie Villas, Laurie Grove, New Cross, London, S.E. Born Woolwich, June 8, 1867. Played for Peckham, and member of Old St. Stephen's. Commenced refereeing season 1893.

LYTHGOE, R. E., 7, West Bank Road, Liverpool. (See F.A. Councillors.)

MACKLEY, W. O., 48, Lacey Street, Ipswich. Born New Cross, London, 1873. Played for Deptford Town and Royal Ordnance. Commenced refereeing 1892. Became member of Referees' Association (by examination) in November, 1893, the year of its formation. Has refereed matches wherein the following clubs amongst others have been engaged: Millwall, Thames Ironworks, New Brompton, Shepherd's Bush, Gravesend (now defunct), Northfleet (now defunct), Lincoln City, Lowestoft, Kirkley, Norwich Argus, Maidstone, West Norwood, and Clapton. Was founder of and hon. secretary for seven years of the West Kent and District Football League. Included on lists of Southern, Kent, Thames and Medway Combination, Middlesex, and various other leagues and county associations' lists of officials. Member of the Suffolk County Football Association Committee.

MADDOCKS, J., 35, Randle Street, Tranmere, Birkenhead. Born Mold, Flintshire, December 7, 1861. Played for St. Paul's School, Chester, 1872-1875. Captain and secretary, 1873-4, 1874-5. 1875, joined St. Paul's Church F.C., playing inside right, and later centre half. 1876, appointed secretary, and retained same up to 1880, when business took him to Cumberland. 1882, played Rugby with Workington Loco. Married 1884, and gave up playing. Removed to Birkenhead in 1891, where he took up position of secretary of the Birkenhead Loco's F.C., and holds same post still. 1893, appointed treasurer to the Wirral F.A. 1901, secretary added to it. Commenced refereeing 1894, the most important appointments being F.A. Cup-tie, Wrexham v. Burslem Port Vale, Wigan v. St. Helen's Town, and the Combination matches Bangor v. Buckley, and various Cheshire Cup-ties. As neutral linesman has had appointments with the best League clubs, the F.A., including the International, Wales v. England, 1902. Offices held at present time: Financial secretary Wirral F.A.; vice-president Wirral Football League; member Liverpool and District F.A.; vice-president The Combination; member Cheshire Football Association (chairman two years); financial secretary Cheshire R.C.; vice-chairman Liverpool R.C.; secretary Wirral R.C.; on appeals committee of four leagues. Well known in connection with "One Hundred Referee Questions and Answers"; also as a lecturer in the North, giving on an average four lectures per month, and as his lectures are free is much in demand.

MARSON, E. A., 51, Glenfield Road, Leicester.

MILLWARD, A., Danehurst, Vicarage Road, Leyton, Essex. Born at Kidderminster, and played with the first Association club in his native town—the Swifts. Later joined the Harriers, and played at left back. Was hon. secretary of the Olympic and other Kidderminster clubs. In 1891 commenced to referee in connection with the Birmingham and District League. Later he left for the South of England, and almost immediately became prominent in connection with southern football. Has taken charge of many important Football League and Southern League games, but has done little in connection with the F.A. Cup competition, considering his sterling abilities as a referee. Mr. Millward has represented Worcestershire in county cricket, and in August, 1900, in club cricket, scored 924 runs in eleven innings at the seat of Sir Francis Jeune. An elegant piece of silver-plate was presented to Mr. Millward for his extraordinary scoring.

MORGAN, T. H., 28, Cemetery Road, Crewe. Born at Crewe. Played for Crewe Alexandra, Hornets. Com-

- refereeing season 1894. Most important games conducted: Everton v. Edinburgh Hibernians; semi-finals, Welsh Senior, Shropshire Senior.
- MORTON, J., Station Road, Woodhouse, Sheffield. Born at Sheffield, and after playing with school club, St. George's, joined Hallam, at that time one of the leading clubs in Sheffield. Was two years in training college at York, and both years was captain of the football team. Returning to Sheffield, joined Wednesday and several of the leading clubs of the town. Later gave up playing, and commenced to act locally as referee, or umpire. Many years ago became a member of the Executive Council of the Sheffield and Hallamshire F.A., and has been chairman of all the various competitions, and at present is chairman of Senior and Charity Cup competitions. One of the senior vice-presidents of the association; also delegate to several of the affiliated associations. Not at present connected with any club. Great worker in Burslem district before going to York, where he built up big "soccer" Association. As "Rob Roy" written much concerning football for "Athletic News" and "Football Chat." Albion, East Riding Cup Final, Scarborough Hospital Final, York Senior and Junior Final, Westmoreland Cup Final, Lancaster Infirmary.
- MCQUE, A. W., 127, Athenlay Road, Nunhead, London, S.E. Born at Bannockburn, Stirlingshire, Scotland, October 5, 1871. Chairman of the North Middlesex League and Alliance. Late hon. secretary of that combination. During the time he was secretary, in one season organised the largest number of clubs (forty-nine) ever enrolled in a combination. Class I. referee. His name was on the first list. Record crowd experience, 12,000. Defender of the junior player and referees in general.

McVEA, ALEX. H., O.W.S., Maitland Park, London, N.W. Born at Carlisle. Played for Whitehaven, Penrith, Huddersfield, and Goole at Rugby game, and for Herne Bay at Association. Began refereeing under auspices of R.A. in 1896, and was on Council of that body 1899-1900. Now on committee of Society of Association Referees. Taken charge of games in First and Second Divisions of Southern League, Norfolk and Suffolk League, South-Eastern League, Middlesex Senior and Junior Cups, London Senior and Junior Cups, Cavalry Cup, and Army Cup. Been appointed to "line" in F.A. and Amateur Cup competitions. Taken such friendlies as Cambridge v. West Bromwich Albion, Oxford v. Wolverhampton Wanderers, Cambridge v. Southampton, London v. RAWLINSON, H., 8, Pasture View, Stanningley Road, Armley, Leeds. Born at Macclesfield, Cheshire, 1867. Got hurt whilst playing at school, and did not play any more. Started refereeing in 1891, at Macclesfield. Went to Middlewich, Cheshire, end of 1895, and became a member of the Middlewich Athletic Rangers A.F.C. Was appointed assistant-secretary in 1896-7, secretary in 1897-8, and continued as such until June, 1900, when he took up residence in Leeds. Joined the Hunslet A.F.C. in October, 1900, and

founded the Leeds and District Association in 1901, and was made hon. sec. Has refereed in the Crewe and District League, Cheshire League, and Cheshire Senior and Amateur Cup-ties; also in final of the Northwich Charity Association. Most important games conducted: Sunderland v. Sheffield United, when the clubs were running neck and neck for championship of the League. From season 1890-91 has officiated in 450 matches, and can still last games through equal to the majority of young referees. Senior vice-president of the Walsall and District F.A., and connected with the Association since 1879, thus nearly completing a quarter of a century's work with this body. 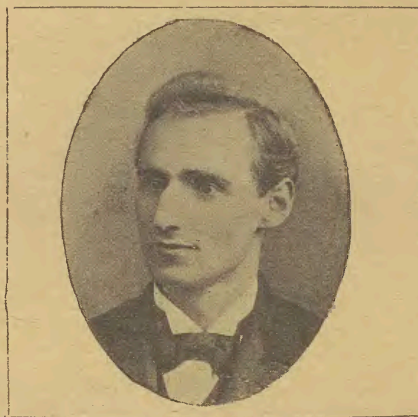
SCRAGG, A., 249, Walthall Street, Crewe. Commenced playing football with Goldenhill, North Staffordshire. At the

age of fifteen was playing for the senior local club, then one of the leading clubs in Staffordshire. At seventeen took up residence in Crewe and obtained all the possible honours in the well-known Crewe Alexandra club, representing both Staffordshire and Cheshire in the early eighties. Mr. Scragg received such injuries in the Cheshire Club final of 1884 that he was forced to doff his knickers and retire from active service. Next season, owing to the unexpected absence of the appointed referee at a certain match, he took to the whistle. Since then has acted in most of the finals of the county cup-ties, taken a prominent part in the "Derby" matches of the League, and was honoured in 1899 with the F.A. Cup final. In the same year Mr. Scragg officiated in the remarkable League final between Aston Villa and Liverpool, which was played on the very last day of the season, upon which rested the championship. The attendance was 41,357. Spends much time in examining budding referees and educating them by lectures. Has had some strange experiences in the course of his career. Remembers acting in one match between local rivals where a young lady rushed on the field and belaboured a player because he had unceremoniously bundled her sweetheart over. On another occasion he was refereeing an English Cup-tie, Chirk v. Old Brightonians, when the players burst every ball the former club possessed, five in number, and the match was actually finished with a ball borrowed from some boys playing half a mile away. That match took nearly two hours to complete! Mr. Scragg recalls another match in the Potteries, where the rival clubs were both of good standing, when the secretary of one, who was acting as umpire, rushed on the field and kicked the ball through the goal for his side. In 1892 Mr. Shelton published "The Referees' Handbook," a little book that had an immense circulation, and did good work in laws of the game explanation. In the introduction to the book

Mr. S. claimed twenty years' connection with the game. His brothers, Alfred and Charlie, both gained International honours, the former on six occasions.

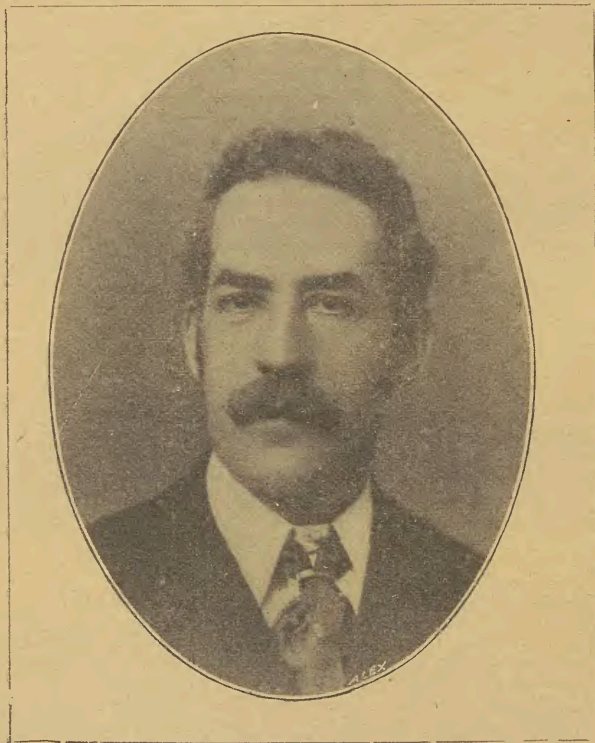

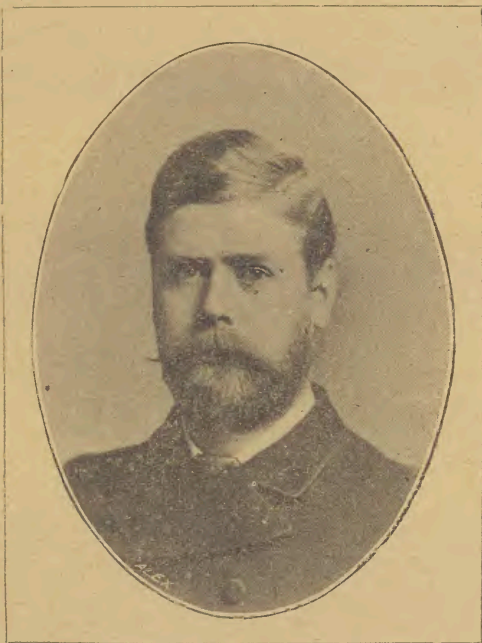

- FARRINGTON** (centre-forward), **WEST BROMWICH ALBION**. Born 1881. Height 5ft 9½in, weight 12st 10lb. Previous club: Hanley Swifts.
- FERGUSON, M.** (right-half), **SUNDERLAND**. Born Bells-hill, Glasgow. Joined Sunderland 1897.
- FERRIER, ROBT.** (right-half), **SHEFFIELD WEDNESDAY**. Born Dumbarton. Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st. Joined the Wednesday in 1895. Previous club: Dumbarton.
- FIELD, CHAS.** (inside-left), **SMALL HEATH**. Height 5ft 6in, weight 10st 7lb. Represented Hanwell, Royal Ordnance (Southern League, Division I., club now defunct), Brentford, and Sheffield United, first becoming a pro. with the last-named. Transferred to Small Heath in 1902.
- FITCHETT, J.** (right-half), **SOUTHAMPTON**. Height 5ft 10in, weight 11st 6lb. In 1897 went from junior club to Bolton Wanderers (five seasons there), and for English League v. Ireland. Released from Southampton in March, 1903.
- FITCHIE, T. T.** (inside-forward), **WEST NORWOOD**. A deadly shot. Successfully appeared for the Arsenal and Spurs, but business prevents his regular appearance. Became famous as a South London schoolboy.
- FLETCHER, D. J.** (back). Born at Stonebroom, Chesterfield, 1878. Started football with village team when seventeen, subsequently joining Chesterfield (then in Midland League).
- FLETCHER, H. H.** (forward), **GRIMSBY TOWN**. Resigned in 1902-3 after successful displays in 1901-2.
- FLETCHER** (forward), **READING**. One of the clever 1902-3 Reading quintet.
- FLYNN, J.** (outside-left), **READING**. Born 1875. Height 5ft 6in, weight 11st 12lb. With Bristol City in 1901-2.
- FOOT, H. T.** (half-back), **CLAPTON**. Fine amateur.
- FOSTER, R. E.** ("Tip") (inside-forward and goalkeeper), **OLD MALVERNIAN**s and **CORINTHIANS**. Born 1878. All-round Oxonian athlete; distinguished batsman. Prefers inside-right. Played in several English International matches. Helped the Old Malvernians to win Amateur Cup 1902, and, being injured, kept goal so brilliantly in the London Cup Final with Clapton that the Old Malvernians won same in March, 1903.
- FOSTER, H. K.** (back), **OLD MALVERNIAN**s. More famous as the Oxford University batsman, and champion racquet player for many seasons. Elder brother of R. E.
- FOSTER, B. S.** (forward), **OLD MALVERNIAN**s. A younger brother of R. E. and H. K.
- FOSTER, CAPTAIN W. L.** (half-back), **OLD MALVERNIAN**s and **CORINTHIANS**. Practically retired from football and

cricket since distinguishing himself in the Boer War. At Malvern College with his brother H. K. showed promise of a remarkable career.

FORMAN, FRANK (half-back), **NOTTS FOREST**. Born Aston-on-Trent 1875. Height 5ft 11½in, weight 12st. International. Débüt with Aston-on-Trent, subsequently joined Beeston and Derby County (as amateur), then Notts Forest.

FORMAN, FRED (outside-right), **NOTTS FOREST**. Born Aston-on-Trent, 1874. Height 5ft 11in, weight 11st 6lb. Brother of Frank Forman. Débüt with Aston-on-Trent, then Beeston and Derby County as an amateur. Joined Forest in 1894. Was, however, capped for England as outside-left.

FORREST, JAS. (half-back), **BLACKBURN ROVERS**. Gained five F.A. Cup winners' medals (a unique distinction).

FOSTER, J. (centre-half), **KETTERING**. Height 5ft 11in, weight 12st. Previous club: Northampton.

FOULKE, J. (goalkeeper), **BLACKBURN ROVERS**. Born 1881. Height 6ft, weight 14½st. Played for Wellington since thirteen years old, and transferred in 1903 to Blackburn. Brother to W. Foulke (Sheffield United).

FOULKE, WM. (goalkeeper), **SHEFFIELD UNITED**. Born Blackwell, in Derbyshire. Height 6ft 2in, weight 21st. Played for England v. Wales in 1897, and has gained two F.A. Cup winners' medals. Came to United from a Derbyshire colliery club. Has represented Derbyshire County at cricket. Is wonderfully active considering his massive build.

FRAIL, J. (goalkeeper), **LUTON**. Born Burslem, 1873. Height 5ft 11in, weight 13st 7lb. Played for Burslem Port Vale from 1893 for several seasons. Afterwards went to Glossop North End, Chatham, Derby County, and Middlesbrough till spring, 1902.

FRASER, J. (forward), **SOUTHAMPTON**. Previous clubs: Notts County, Newcastle United, Greenock Morton, Motherwell, and St. Mirren. Assisted Dumbarton in Scottish Cup Final v. Rangers 1897, for which he holds medal.

FREEBAIRN, ARCHIBALD (left-half), **BOLTON WANDERERS**. Previous clubs: Junior teams and Partick Thistle.

FREEMAN, BEN. (right-half), **QUEEN'S PARK RANGERS**. Born Small Heath, 1878. Height 5ft 10½in, weight 11st 7lb. Served in Warwickshire Regiment. Invalided March, 1897, and became a Small Heath professional. Engaged two seasons with Grays United.

FRENCH, J. (right-half), **NEW BROMPTON**. Previous club: Southampton. Left for New Brompton in 1902-3.

FRETTINGHAM (forward), **NEW BROMPTON**. Born Not-

- tingham. Joined New Brompton in the early days of professionalism in the South, and has rendered loyal service to New Brompton.
- FROST, S.** (inside-right and right-half), **MANCHESTER CITY.** With Bevan and R. Jones, also of Millwall Reserves, Frost left Millwall for Manchester in 1901.
- FRY, C. B.** (back and centre-forward), **PORTSMOUTH and CORINTHIANS.** Born April 25, 1872. Height 5ft 10in, weight 11st 13lb. The world's greatest all-round athlete. While at Oxford he captained the athletic, football, and cricket eleven in the same season; won 100 yards race Oxford v. Yale (U.S.A.); lowered world's record for long jump, and played Rugby, an injury alone preventing his obtaining a fourth Blue. Was champion batsman in 1901, and lowered cricket records. Represented England v. Australia at cricket. Is a brilliant writer on athletics. At Association football represented England v. Canadians, England v. Ireland in 1901. Obtained runners-up Final medal as an amateur for Southampton 1902, and was transferred to Portsmouth in 1903.
- FRYER, JNO. SPENCER** (goalkeeper), **DERBY COUNTY.** Born Cromford, 1877. Height 6ft 2½in, weight 11st 8lb. Joined Derby in 1897.
- FULTON, J.** (inside-left), **DERBY COUNTY.** Previous clubs: Sunderland and Bristol City.
- GARA, A.** (forward), **BRISTOL CITY.** Born 1875. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st. Previous clubs: Wigan County, Preston North End, and Notts Forest, being transferred to the latter in 1901-2. He was re-transferred to Bristol City in 1903.
- GARDNER, A.** (outside-left), **GRIMSBY.** Previously with Clyde F.C.
- GARDNER, ALEX.** (outside-right), **NEWCASTLE UNITED.** Born Leith, 1877. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 6lb. Left-half for Anglo-Scots, 1903.
- GARDNER, ANDREW** (forward), **NEWCASTLE UNITED.** Height 5ft 7½in, weight 11st 7lb.
- GARDNER, D.** (left-back), **GRIMSBY TOWN.** Born Glasgow, 1874. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 10lb. Previous club: Newcastle United.
- GARFIELD, W.** (left-wing forward), **BRIGHTON and HOVE ALBION.** Born 1873. Height 5ft 7in, weight 10st 3lb. Previous clubs: Burton Wanderers, West Bromwich Albion. International v. Ireland 1897-8.
- GARRATY, W.** (forward), **ASTON VILLA.** International v. Wales at Portsmouth, 1903, after being chosen but being too ill to play v. Ireland at Wolverhampton, 1903.
- GEARY, GEO.** (outside-right). Born 1876. Previous clubs: Notts Rangers, Notts Forest, and Long Eaton.

- Brother of Fred Geary, the old Evertonian. Joined Chesterfield in 1900-1.
- GEDDES (outside-left). Club previously with: West Bromwich Albion, in Bassett's time. Joined Millwall, then Bristol City. Very brilliant outside man on his day.
- GEE, E. (outside-left), NOTTS COUNTY. Born Grassmore, 1878. Height 5ft 6in, weight 12st. Previous clubs: Chesterfield and Everton.
- GEMMELL, JAS. (forward), SUNDERLAND. Height 5ft 9in, weight 12st 7lb.
- GEORGE, W. (goalkeeper), ASTON VILLA. Height 6ft 1½in, weight 13st 7lb. Played for Royal Artillery, Trowbridge, and Trowbridge Town. After long persuasion Aston Villa induced George to be bought out of the army. Has played county cricket for Warwickshire, Wilts, and Salop.
- GETTINS, E. (forward), GAINSBOROUGH. Previously played for a Gainsborough school and local teams.
- GETTINS, J. H. (forward), CORINTHIANS and MILLWALL. Born Middlesbrough. An amateur, but has fairly regularly assisted Millwall for some years. Has performed for Middlesbrough when in the North. Previous clubs: Borough Road College, Brentford, Richmond Association, and Corinthians. Numerous county honours. Assists Berks and Bucks.
- GHEE, T. (right-half), NEWCASTLE UNITED. Born Kilmarnock, 1873. Height 5ft 11in, weight 13st.
- GIBSON, KEN. (outside-right), CLAPTON ORIENT. Highly fancied by Millwall, but induced to remain with Orient. A veteran in their service.
- GIBSON, T. (back), BRENTFORD. Born 1881. Previous club: Aston Villa.
- GIBSON, WM. (half and back), LINCOLN CITY. Born in Scotland. With Sunderland in their best days for six years. Started with Flemington Thistle. When nineteen joined Cambuslang (Glasgow). After leaving Sunderland played half for Glasgow Rangers. Represented Scotland v. Ireland at full-back. Returned to Sunderland in 1895, then went to Notts County, helping them to rejoin First League.
- GILHOOLY, P. (forward), TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR. Born Blackwood, Lanarkshire, 1878. Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st 7lb. Previous clubs: Celtic (while there played for Scottish League, 1897-8) and Sheffield United. Transferred to Tottenham in September, 1901. Began football with Larkshall Thistle. Gilhooly showed such good form as a junior that Celtic signed him on when quite a boy, and before he was eighteen he had the privilege of playing in the select company of Jack Bell, McMahon, Campbell, &c. When with Celtic he represented the Scottish League v. English League, at Birmingham, in 1898-9. He was transferred to Sheffield United about the middle of season 1900-1,

GLOVER, J. (left-back), **LIVERPOOL.** Born 1877. Height 5ft 8in, weight 12st. Previous clubs: West Bromwich Reserves, Blackburn Rovers, and New Brompton.

GODDARD (forward), **LIVERPOOL.** Secured from Glossop late last season, and more than justified the high opinions. A fast winger and ideal shot.

GODDARD, GEO. W. (forward), **SWINDON TOWN.** Born 1880. Height 5ft 6½in, weight 10st 8lb. Previous team: Esen Swindon United.

GODSMAN, ADAM (centre-half). Born Inverness. Height 5ft 11½in. Has eleven medals and several county caps.

GOLDIE, A. (back), **SMALL HEATH.** Previous clubs: Liverpool and New Brighton.

GOLDIE, EDWARD (inside-right). Born Old Monkland, Lancashire, 1874. Height 5ft 6in, weight 10st. Previous clubs: Newton Thistle, Cambuslang, Motherwell, and Grimsby.

GOLDIE, HUGH (half), **NEW BROMPTON.** Born 1876. Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st 6lb. Previous club: Dundee. Plays centre or right-half.

GOOD, MICHAEL (centre-forward or half). Born 1877. Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st 10lb. Previous clubs: Airdrie Hill, Airdrieonians, Small Heath, and Watford.

GOODALL, ARCHIE L. (centre-half), **DERBY COUNTY.** Born Belfast. Height 5ft 7½in, weight 11st 9lb. His thirteenth season with Derby County, which he has captained several years. Has represented Ireland many times. Son of a soldier.

GOODALL, JOHN (forward), **GLOSSOP.** Born London, 1863. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 12lb. Learnt the game in Kilmarnock. English clubs assisted: Great Lever, Preston North End. Left Preston 1889. With Derby County about ten seasons. With New Brighton Tower 1900-1, Glossop 1901-3. Capped six times v. Scotland, seven times v. Ireland, and once v. Wales. Member of the Preston North End team when they secured their never-to-be-forgotten records. Was accorded a benefit by the Derby County committee in 1896 which realised £300.

- GOOING, WM. (centre-forward), WOOLWICH ARSENAL). Born Penistone, 1874. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st. Previous clubs: Penistone, Wath, Sheffield Wednesday, and Chesterfield (1898). Transferred to the Arsenal in 1901-2.

- GRASSAM, W. (inside-right), WEST HAM UNITED. Born 1878. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 6lb. Assisted Maryhill (Scottish cupholders). Played for Scotland v. Ireland while there. Also represented Burslem Port Vale.
- GRAY, E. (half). Born 1875. Height 5ft 6in, weight 11st 4lb. Played for Mexboro, Lincoln, and New Brompton.
- GRAY, P. (half), GRIMSBY. Joined Grimsby in 1898.
- GRAY, T. (forward), BURY. Born 1876. Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st 6in. Previous club: Queen's Park Rangers.
- GREAVES, J. (goalkeeper), BARNSELEY. Height 5ft 8in, weight 12st. Previous club: Sheffield Wednesday.

Previous clubs: Church, Blackpool, Bootle, and Everton (9 years), and while with latter a centre-half for England five consecutive seasons. Represented England v. Ireland and Wales on several occasions. Five times in Lancashire team without losing once. Represented England v. Germany.
- HOLYHEAD, J.** (half), **WOLVERHAMPTON WANDERERS**. Previously with Wednesday Old Athletic.
- HOLYOAKE, E. J.** (right back), **DERBY COUNTY**. Born Derby. Height 5ft 9½in, weight 10st 12lb.
- HORNER, F. Y.** (goalkeeper), **CHESHUNT**. Formerly assisted Oxford City. Coming to London he became one of the launchers of the Chiswick F.C. in September, 1901, whose career was meteoric. After its downfall he assisted Watford in Southern League till Christmas, 1902. Has

Oxford County honours, and is smallest goalkeeper in first class football. Is still quite young.

HOSIE, JAS. (half), MANCHESTER CITY. Born Glasgow, 1876. Height 5ft 11in, weight 12st 4lb. With Glasgow Perthshire, 1897, then Reading (also keeping goal) and Blackburn Rovers.

HOULKER, A. E. (left-half), PORTSMOUTH. Born Blackburn, 1873. Height 5ft 6½in, weight 10st 8lb. Previous clubs: Blackburn Park Road and Blackburn Rovers. Joined Portsmouth spring of 1902. International 1902, and again v. Wales at Portsmouth, 1903. Also voted the best half-back in North v. South English trial at Tottenham, 1903.

HOUSTON, ROBERT (centre or inside forward), TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR. Made a big reputation in Edinburgh with the "Hearts." Born at Leven (a great golfing centre), in 1877, and played first for the local club as a junior. St. Bernard's (an Edinburgh club), then induced him to join their ranks, and he played for them for three seasons, principally at centre-forward. He was transferred from that club to the Heart of Midlothian (one of the best clubs in Scotland), and was with them two seasons, helping them to win the Scottish Cup in 1900-1. Houston is a very powerful player. His play partakes more of the rushing than the scientific order, but his methods are most effective, and he gets many goals. He is also a very fine golfer. HUGHES, H. R. (centre-forward), SHEPHERD'S BUSH. First famous with the now defunct Hammersmith Athletic. Also assisted Queen's Park Rangers, Hammersmith Athletic (again), West Hampstead (when Middlesex Cup and League winners). Joined Shepherd's Bush season 1902-3. Gigantic forward.

HULME, A. Born 1877. Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st 4lb. Played for Wellingborough.

HULSE, BEN. (forward), MILLWALL. Former clubs: Blackburn Rovers, New Brighton Tower. Learned football on Mersey's banks.

HUNT, FERGUS (outside-right), WOOLWICH ARSENAL. Born 1876. Height 5ft 8in, weight 12st. Previous clubs:

- Mexboro', Middlesbrough Ironopolis, Darwen, Woolwich Arsenal (first tenure), and West Ham United. Returned to Woolwich for 1902-3.
- HYDE, LEONARD (outside-left), WELLINGBOROUGH. Born Birmingham, 1876. Height 5ft 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ in, weight 11st 8in. Also plays outside-right. Previous clubs: Grimsby Town, Bristol St. George's and Tottenham.
- INNES, R. (right-half), NOTTS COUNTY. Previous clubs: Royal Ordnance and Gravesend United and New Brompton (1901-2).
- IREMONGER, J. (back), NOTTS FOREST. Born 1877, Norton, Yorks. Height 6ft 1in, weight 13st 7lb. Lived most of his life at Nottingham. Previous clubs: Wilford and Jardines. Played for England v. Scotland in 1901. Successful Notts County cricketer, and represented Players v. Gentlemen.
- JACK, ROBT. (outside-left), PRESTON NORTH END. Born Alloa. Previous clubs: Alloa Athletic and Bolton Wanderers (1895). Member of Players' Union executive.
- JACKSON, J. (left-back), WOOLWICH ARSENAL. Height 5ft 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ in, weight 11st 12lb. Born in Cambuslang, but acquired his knowledge of the game at the Antipodes, where at the Australian code, a cross between Rugby and Association in which twenty-two aside is played and times are rough, he acquired such fame as a "dare-devil" forward he was soon an inter-colonial champion. A kindly fate at eighteen carried him "hame once mair." He figured three times in the obscure ranks of Newton, but Cambuslang carried him off. Then the Glasgow Rangers secured him, and got a man whose name was soon in everyone's mouth as a half of the best class. Newcastle United heard of and wooed him. - JEWELL, PERCY. Captain of SOUTH LONDON SCHOOLS F.A., 1901-2; played right-half in both matches v. Edinburgh. A tower of strength to South London and Eltringham Street School. Played in the final of the Senior Competition in four successive seasons, and each time on winning side. A good all-round sportsman—capital swimmer, runner, cricketer, and cyclist.
- JOHNSON, F. (outside-right), STOKE. Born Stoke, 1877. Height 6ft, weight 12st. Assisted Stoke St. Peter's. Joined Stoke in 1895. English League International v. Ireland.
- JOHNSON, W. H. (right-half), SHEFFIELD UNITED. Previous club: Ecclesfield. International thrice for England in 1900.
- JOHNSON (inside-right), ASTON VILLA. Erratic player.
- JOHNSTON (right-half), BURY. From Stalybridge Rovers to Bury.
- JONES, A. (centre-half). Born Tipton, 1876. Height, 5ft 7in, weight 12st 6lb. Previous clubs: Folkestone, Camoron Highlanders, and West Bromwich Albion.
- JONES, J. (back), WOLVERHAMPTON WANDERERS. Born Wellington Salop.
- JONES, J. (inside-right), BRISTOL ROVERS. Born 1875. Height 5ft 6in, weight 11st 4lb.
- JONES, JOHN (outside-right), TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR. Born West Bromwich, 1875. Played for Small Heath when quite a youth, and was with them three seasons. Bristol Rovers then secured his services, and he did yeoman work for them, scoring about fifty goals for them in all matches in season 1901-2, and earned the name of being the deadliest forward in front of goal in the South. - McCURDY, W. (back), NEW BROMPTON. Born Bridgton, 1876. Height 5ft 10in, weight 12st. Played for Vale of Clyde, Luton, and Notts Forest.
- McDONALD, E. (half-back), NOTTS COUNTY. Born Newcastle-under-Lyme, 1876. Height 5ft 9½in, weight 12st. Played for Burslem Port Vale prior to joining the First Leaguers.
- McEACHRANE, R. J. (half-back), WOOLWICH ARSENAL.

Is a Scotsman and proud of his country. Learnt his football in the land of cakes, crossed the border, and played some of his finest games with the Thames Ironworks. Plays the half-back game to perfection, and, when he can, likes to have a shot all on his own. What is more, his effort very often comes off. A useful man to have on your side, and a dangerous one to be against you. End of season 1901-2 signed on for the Arsenal, much to the disappointment of the supporters of the West Ham United Club.

McEWEN, J. (back), BURY. Born Liverpool, 1875. Height 5ft 6in, weight 10st 10lb. Played for Lansdowne, Bootle, South End, Liverpool, Everton, Luton, and Glossop. Joined Bury, 1900.

MACFARLANE (goal), MIDDLESBROUGH. Played for Everton Combination, Grimsby Town, and Celtic. First season on the Tees. Expected to be an improvement on Frail.

McGAHEY, CHAS. (back), CLAPTON. Also assisted Tottenham Hotspur and City Ramblers. Last few seasons has preferred Essex County cricket to football.

McGUIGAN (forward), MIDDLESBROUGH. Secured from Liverpool, 1903. The latter had his services from the Hibs. One of the fastest forwards, but a succession of injuries kept him out of half the Liverpool 1901-2 games.

McINTYRE, JAMES ALFRED (forward), NOTTS COUNTY. Born 1881. Height 5ft 10in, weight 11st 4lb. Joined the Notts Club 1902, after short careers with Witton, Darlston Town, Wednesbury Old Athletic, and Walsall. Considered by some critics to be one of the most scientific players in the ranks of the professionals.

McINNES, T. (forward), LINCOLN CITY. Born Glasgow, 1870. Height 5ft 6in, weight 10st 11in. Has played with Cowlaers, Notts Forest, and Third Lanark. After a partial breakdown through injury was secured by Lincoln City when David Calderhead took office as secretary, and has done great service for Lincoln since 1900.

McINTYRE, R. (forward), BRISTOL ROVERS. Born 1879. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 6lb. Previous club, Paisley Abercorn.

McINTYRE (centre-half), PRESTON NORTH END. Born 1877. Hails from Glenbuck.

McKAY (forward), FULHAM. When Mr. Brettell raised Tottenham Hotspur into the front rank McKay was a leading forward. Left for Fulham in 1900.

McKENZIE, JAS left-half, STONEBRIDGE PARK ATHLETIC. Born 1866. With Queen's Park Rangers practically from their inception from about 1886. Amateur, and when Rangers embraced professionalism went to Stonebridge.

McKIE (forward), BOLTON WANDERERS. Came to Eng-

land from East Stirlingshire, first joining Darwen, and thence to the Wanderers. A very useful pivot, who makes plenty of openings.

McLATCHIE (forward), **GRIMSBY TOWN**. Born New Cumnock, Ayrshire. Height 5ft 10in, weight 14st. Was at Preston for short time, later with Sunderland for five seasons. Transferred to Grimsby Town 1903, but almost immediately departed from Grimsby.

McLEAN, J. (half-back), **BRISTOL CITY**. Born Greenock, 1875. Height 5ft 6in, weight 12st. Scottish club, Greenock Volunteers. English clubs, Grimsby and Liverpool.

McLEAN, JAS. (forward), **WEST BROMWICH**. Height 5ft 7½in, weight 12st.

McLEAN, TOM (back), **NOTTS COUNTY**, when he retired. A wonderful back for many seasons. Joined Notts prior to legalising of professionalism, and only for accidents would probably have still been playing. Native of Alexandra, the Vale of Leven district. Was generally termed "Surefoot" by the Notts supporters.

McLUCKIE (centre-forward), **ASTON VILLA**. Born 1877. Height 5ft 11½in, weight 12st 12lb. Joined Bury in 1898 from Jordanhill, a Glasgow team. With Bury when they defeated Southampton in F.A. Final April, 1900.

McNAUGHT, JAS. R. (centre-half), **TOTTENHAM HOT-SPUR**. Born Dumbarton, 1873. Height 5ft 6in, weight 10st 3lb. Played for Dumbarton and Newton Heath. Left latter for Tottenham May, 1898. A clever half-back.

McNICOL, D. (back), **WOOLWICH ARSENAL**. Born at Alexandria. Height 5ft 11in, weight 13st 3lb. Played for Vale of Leven for three seasons, which club held Scottish Cup three years in succession. Also Glasgow Charity and Dumbartonshire Cups several times. Three seasons with St. Bernard's—well-known Scottish League club. A sterling defender for the Plumstead club, but very unlucky during season 1901-2, and occasionally out of the team in consequence.

McPHERSON, J. (half-back). Born 1867. Height 5ft 7½in, weight 12st 8lb. After long service in Scotland joined Notts Forest, and assisted them to win F.A. Cup, thus adding English medal to the won he won for Scottish final. Won nine caps (two International) and sixteen medals, in addition to the two before mentioned. Was given a good benefit by Notts Forest before returning to Scotland.

McQUEEN, HUGH (forward), **GAINSBOROUGH TRINITY**. Born Harthill, Scotland. Height 5ft 8in, weight 12st 2lb. Played in England for Liverpool, Derby, and Queen's Park Rangers. McQueen at an early age obtained a place with Leith Athletic, of the Scottish League (Division I.). While with them the final of the Rosebery Charity Cup was reached

thrice, once with success, and they were also runners-up for the Edinburgh Shield. He next joined Liverpool as a professional, and was one of the famous team of Macs—so-called as there were eight of them—who won the Liverpool Cup and the Lancashire League Cup on the same days. The following season Liverpool took part in the League (Division II.), going right through the season without losing a single match, and obtaining fifty points out of a possible fifty-six. Newton Heath were met in the test match and beaten by 2 goals to nil. Two days prior to this McQueen had a narrow escape from drowning. The players were at Southport and, though not being able to swim, dived off the spring-board into deep water, and was rescued with difficulty. The following winter McQueen went over to Derby County as outside left, his favourite position. He has taken part in three F.A. Cup semi-finals and one final (Derby County v. Notts Forest), when he was presented with a gold medal by "Football Chat" as the best player on the losing side. McQueen is a total abstainer.

McROBERTS, R. (centre-forward), **SMALL HEATH.** Born Coatbridge, Scotland, 1874. Height 5ft 8½in, weight 11st 7lb. Joined Small Heath from Gainsborough Trinity, his only other English engagement. Scottish clubs: Airdrieonians and Albion Rovers.

McWILLIAMS (half-back), **NEWCASTLE UNITED.** Born 1882. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 3lb. Last with Inverness. First season on Tyneside, 1902-3.

McWHINNIE, W. G. (outside-right), **SHEFFIELD WEDNESDAY.** Born Glasgow. Height 5ft 10in, weight 11st. Previous club: Third Lanark.

MAHER, J. (inside-right), **BRENTFORD.** Born 1882. Height 5ft 8in, weight 10st 11lb. Formerly with Millwall.

MAINMAN, H. L. (centre half-back), **NOTTS COUNTY.** Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st. Was a Southern Leaguer at Reading prior to joining Notts in 1902. A popular player in the lace city, and valuable to his club.

MALLOCH, J. N. (outside-right), **SHEFFIELD WEDNESDAY.** Born Dundee. Height 5ft 8in, weight 10st 12lb. Third season with present club. Previously with Dundee and Brighton United.

MARRIOTT (forward). Transferred for £300 and consideration of friendly match from Wellingborough to Aston Villa in 1901-2.

MASKERY, H. (goalkeeper), **DERBY COUNTY.** Born 1883. Height 6ft, weight 13st. Previous club: Ripley Athletic.

MAWSON, F. (outside-left), **BARNSELY.** Born at Ecclesfield, a village near Sheffield. Height 5ft 6in, weight 11st. Previously played with Kettering and Mexboro'.

MAXWELL, W. S. (forward), **SUNDERLAND.** Born Arbroath. Only eighteen when secured by Stoke from the

- Hearts. In 1898 he was one of the Anglo-Scots chosen to play against England. Returned to Scotland and played for Third Lanark, but joined Sunderland in 1901.
- MAY, J. (right half-back), DERBY COUNTY. Born Dyke Head, N.B. Height 5ft 7½in, weight 11st 11lb. Played for Abercorn, Wishaw Thistle, and Paisley. Joined Derby County, May, 1898. A tower of strength to the Derby centre line, having splendid command over the ball.
- MEADE, TOMMY (forward), FULHAM. At times a brilliant player, always useful, and a clever shot. After years of service with Woolwich Arsenal was transferred to Tottenham Hotspur, but after short stay went to Fulham.
- MEARNS, FRED (goalkeeper), KETTERING. One of the best goalkeepers in the Southern League. Was understudy to Doig of Sunderland.
- MENHAM, R. W. (goalkeeper), SWINDON TOWN. Born North Shields, 1871. Height 6ft 1in, weight 13st 10lb. With the 3rd Grenadier Guards, Luton, Everton, and Wigan in turn. Kept goal for Everton in the Cup Final of 1897.
- MEREDITH, S. (full-back), STOKE. Born Chirk, 1879. Height 5ft 8in, weight 12st. Brother of Manchester City Meredith. International for Wales.
- MEREDITH, WM. (outside-right), MANCHESTER CITY. Born Chirk. Height 5ft 9in, weight 10st 9lb. Has played in the Welsh Internationals since 1895. Played for Chirk and Northwich Victoria.
- MESTON, S. (half-back), SOUTHAMPTON. Born Arbroath, 1871. Height 5ft 10in, weight 12st.
- METHVEN, J. (right full-back), DERBY COUNTY. Born Perth, 1869. Height 5ft 8in, weight 12st. Left for Derby, 1891. A cool defender, and probably the best back ever possessed by the Peak county club. From St. Bernards.
- MIDDLETON, FRANK (outside-left), DERBY COUNTY. From Whitchurch to Derby County, 1901.
- MIECZNIKOWSKI, W. L. (forward), WEST HAM UNITED and CLAPTON. After several years' service with Pemberton, joined Clapton. Signed on for Portsmouth as amateur. Has innumerable county honours, and, 1902-3, often centre-forward for West Ham United.
- MILLAR, ARTHUR (half-back), ASTON VILLA. Born 1877. Height 5ft 10in, weight 12st. Did splendid service with Millwall from 1896 to April, 1901.
- MILLER, JAS. (centre-forward), SUNDERLAND. Born Annbank, Ayrshire. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 12lb. Joined Sunderland, 1890. Returned to Scotland in 1896, and played for Glasgow Rangers to 1901. Won every possible honour, English and Scottish, with single exception of F.A. Cup Final medal.
- MILLS, F. P., LONDON WELSH. Born Knighton, Radnorshire. Appointed London Welsh member, 1898, vice-captain

- 1901-2. Previous clubs: Shepherd's Bush and London Welsh.
- MILNES, F. T. (back), SHEFFIELD UNITED. An amateur of the Sheffield Wycliffe. First played for Sheffield United in a football League match v. Wolverhampton Wanderers, March 21, 1903.
- MILWARD, A. (outside-left), NEW BROMPTON. Born Marlow, 1872. Joined Everton from Great Marlow in 1888. Commenced to show special ability when he had Edgar Chadwick for partner. First represented England in 1891. Played in F.A. Cup finals for Everton and Southampton. Leaving the latter club he joined New Brompton for season 1900-1.
- MOFFATT, R. (half-back), MANCHESTER CITY. Born Dumfries. Height 5ft 9½in, weight 11st 7lb. Joined Manchester in 1895.
- MOGER, H. H. (goalkeeper), SOUTHAMPTON. Born Southampton, 1879. Height 6ft 2in, weight 12st 7lb. Only club played for Southampton.
- MOLYNEUX, G. (back), SOUTHAMPTON. Born Liverpool, 1876. Height 6ft, weight 11st. First played with 3rd Grenadiers. Played with Stoke 1897-8, and later joined Everton. From Everton he journeyed south like so many other Stoke players, and has done great service for the Saints. Gained his first cap against Scotland, April, 1902.
- MONKS (forward), EVERTON. Born 1879. Height 5ft 6in, weight 11st 3lb. Played for Glossop, Stalybridge Rovers, and Bury. First term with Everton, 1902-3 season.
- MONTEITH, HUGH (goalkeeper), BURY. Born New Cumnock, Ayrshire, 1875. Height 6ft, weight 13st. Played for Parkhead Juniors, Celtic, Loughborough Town, Bristol City, and West Ham United.
- MONTGOMERY (goalkeeper), BURY. Born Chryston, Lanark. Formerly with Glasgow Rangers. Brother of Montgomery, Notts County back.
- MONTGOMERY, JOHN (back), NOTTS COUNTY. Born Chryston, Lanark, 1877. Height 5ft 8in, weight 13st. He originally figured with the famous Spurs of Tottenham, from whence he journeyed to Nottingham in 1899. It was not until 1901-2 season that Montgomery found a permanent place in the first team of the Notts Club.
- MOON, W. R. (goalkeeper), CORINTHIANS. A capital custodian when in training. Also plays for Old West-minsters. Scotland, 1888 to 1891. Wales, 1888 to 1890.
- MORAN, MARTIN (outside-right), MILLWALL. Born Glasgow, 1878. Height 5ft 5in, weight 10st 7lb. Previously played for Sheffield United and Middlesbrough. Played in a Junior International match for Scotland against Ireland. A great favourite at Millwall, where he is generally mentioned as "Mickey."

MORGAN (goalkeeper), BOLTON WANDERERS. Height 5ft 9in, weight 12st. Exchanged from Manchester United during season 1902-3.

MORGAN-OWEN, M. (centre-forward), CORINTHIANS and CASUALS. Welsh International, and a popular player on several London grounds, especially at Tufnell Park.

MORREN, TOM. (centre half-back), SHEFFIELD UNITED. Born Middlesbrough, 1875. Height 5ft 6in, weight 10st 10lb. First with Middlesbrough Victoria, afterwards the Ironopolis club, and thence to Middlesbrough. Transferring his services to Sheffield United in 1895, he has been "a second Needham" for United. Played for England against Ireland in 1898.

MORRIS (back), DULWICH HAMLET. A diminutive back whose partnership with Dwight (also a miniature performer) for many years has brought the Hamlet into great prominence.

MORRIS, J. J. (forward), NOTTS COUNTY. Born 1877. Height 5ft 6in, weight 10st 4lb. Like his namesake of Notts Forest fame, Morris is a smart forward, good shot, and a valuable man for his employers.

MORRIS, A. G. (inside-left), NOTTS FOREST. Born at Builth, Wales, 1877. Height 5ft 9½in, weight 11st 10lb. Has played for Aberystwyth and Swindon. Freely capped for Wales. One of the most successful goal-scorers in the Football League.

MORRIS, R. (centre half-back), CHIRK. Cap for Wales against England and Ireland 1900-01.

MORRIS, T. (half-back), TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR. Born Grantham, 1870. Height 5ft 9½in, weight 11st 12lb. Played for Grantham Rovers and Gainsborough Trinity before going to Tottenham. Represented South against the North, 1900.

MORRIS (left-half), MILLWALL. Late of Burnley.

MORRIS, C. (left full-back), DERBY COUNTY. Born Oswestry. Height 5ft 10in, weight 12st 8lb. Secured from Chirk. One of the best backs in England. Has played on numerous occasions for Wales.

MORRIS (forward), LIVERPOOL. Joined 1901. Hails from Newtown, and holds his Welsh International cap.

MORRISON, THOMAS (outside-right), BURNLEY. Born Belfast, 1874. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st. Joined Burnley 1895-6. Also helped Glentoran and Celtic. After sojourn in Ireland returned to Burnley 1897-8. Invaluable coach to Burnley. Irish International.

MOUNTAIN, GEO. (right-back), GRIMSBY.

MUIR, R. (forward), BRISTOL ROVERS. Born 1880. Height 5ft 7½in, weight 11st. Previously with Kilmarnock 1901-2.

MUNDAY, HERBERT (inside-left), CHESTERFIELD. Born

- Eckington, Derbyshire, 1876. Height 5ft 10½in, weight 11st 10lb. Joined Chesterfield 1893, and now captain. Aston Villa wanted him.
- MURRAY (forward), WATFORD. Late of Aston Villa, 1901-2.
- MURRAY, PADDY (forward), CELTIC. Previous clubs: Preston North End and Notts Forest.
- MURRELL (half), NORTHAMPTON.
- NEEDHAM, ARCHIE (inside-left), SHEFFIELD UNITED. Introduced into the League team captained by Ernest Needham in March, 1903.
- NEEDHAM, ERNEST (half-back, &c.), SHEFFIELD UNITED. Born Whittington Moor, Chesterfield, 1873. Gained fifteen International caps for England; innumerable medals (including F.A. Cup winners). Height 5ft 5½in, weight 10st 8lb. Successfully appeared in Derbyshire county cricket.
- NEILSON, J. (half-back), BRISTOL ROVERS. Born 1874. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 6lb. Re-signed 1902-3 for the Rovers.
- NELMES, A. (half-back), GRIMSBY. Previous clubs: Middlesbrough. Joined Grimsby 1898-9.
- NELSON, ANDREW (left-half or back). Born 1876. Weight 12st. General utility man. Played for Cambusnethan F.C., Wishaw Thistle, Edinburgh Hibernians, and Reading.
- NEWBIGGING, ALEX. (goalkeeper and forward), NOTTS FOREST. Born 1880. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 3lb. Previous clubs: Paisley, Abercorn, and Queen's Park Rangers.
- NEWLANDS, GEO. (back), QUEEN'S PARK RANGERS. Born Glasgow, 1881. Weight 11st 7lb. Played for Parkhead Oaklea, Parkhead Reserves, Parkhead, Parkhead Athletic, Vale of Clyde. After joining Queen's Park Rangers in 1901-2, induced Ronaldson (Grimsby) to follow his example.
- NEYLAND, MARTIN (forward), BOLTON WANDERERS. Height 5ft 7in, weight 10st 12lb. Returned to North from New Brompton September, 1902.
- NIBLO, T. (inside-left), ASTON VILLA. Born Dunfermline, 1877. Height 5ft 8½in, weight 12st 4lb. Previous clubs: Hamilton Academicals, Linthouse, and Newcastle United. Also outside-left Anglo-Scots, 1903.
- NICOL, DAVID (centre-forward or inside-left), BOLTON WANDERERS. Born Arbroath. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 2lb. Rejoins Bolton Wanderers after staying in South.
- NIDD, A. (left-back), BRENTFORD. Born 1875. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 2lb. Previously with Watford.
- NOON (left-back), ASTON VILLA.
- NORRIS, R. (left half-back), NOTTS FOREST. Born Preston, 1875. Height 5ft 10in, weight 12st 2lb. Learnt foot-

ball with Blackpool, then members of Second League. He was recommended to the Forest by another old Preston-Blackpool player, and during the last four seasons he has proved a worthy member of the team.

NURSE, D. (right half-back), WEST BROMWICH ALBION. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 2lb. Feeds his front rank assiduously, and tackles very cleverly.

OAKLEY, W. J. (back). Born 1873. Height 6ft lin, weight 13st 10lb. Plays for Corinthians, and has appeared frequently for England. Played in his sixteenth International match in March, 1901, and at his best there is no finer back in England. His style is particularly neat and taking, and his great pace and coolness often get his side out of awkward positions.

O'BRIEN, JOSEPH (right-back), SWINDON. Born Glasgow, 1876. Height 5ft 8in, weight 13st. He first played for Bailleston (Glasgow), then Clitheroe (Lancashire League), from which place he went to Sheffield, and afterwards to Reading, with whom he played four seasons. Joined Swindon September, 1902.

O'BRIEN, PATRICK (inside-left), BRISTOL CITY. Born 1876. Height 5ft 5in, weight 10st. Is one of the pluckiest little players that ever stepped on a field. He has played with Elm Park, Glasgow Northern, and Woolwich Arsenal, with whom he stayed four seasons.

OGLE, G. E., GAINSBOROUGH. On occasion figures in goal in place of Bagshaw, and "kept" during that player's allegiance to Grimsby Town. Is a Lincoln man and an amateur. He played regularly for Lincoln Lindum for many years.

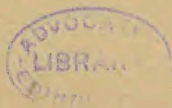
ORD, ROGER (goalkeeper), WELLINGBOROUGH. Born Northumberland, 1871. Height 5ft 10in, weight 11st 7lb. Began football as quite a small boy, and was twice in the team that won the County Junior Cup, following this by taking three medals for the Northumberland Senior trophy. Went to Middlesbrough as a professional, and from there to Hebburn Argyle. Woolwich Arsenal found him a good servant for four years before he wended his way to Luton in 1900-1. Roger is an enthusiast, and one of the smartest goalkeepers in the Southern League. Is the holder of six gold and one silver medals, the latter for cricket.

ORR, R. (inside-left), NEWCASTLE UNITED. Born Irvine, 1879. Height 5ft 5in, weight 11st 4lb. A young player of great promise; fast, and enthusiastic. Can also play on the right wing.

ORR, W. (full-back), PRESTON NORTH END. Joined Preston from Manchester City. He is a fine player, with experience and resource. Previously played for Glossop.

OTTY, W. (inside-left), NEW BROMPTON. Born 1876.

- Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st. Was last seen in the ranks of Liverpool. A capital shot and an unselfish player.
- OWEN, J. O., LONDON WELSH. Born Llanidloes, North Wales. Clubs helped: Llanidloes and London Welsh. Elected member 1898, hon. sec. 1899-1902.
- PANGBOURNE, T. (left-wing forward). Born 1873. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 10lb. Has played for Ashton North End, Bury, New Brompton, and the 'Spurs.
- PARSONS, E. (right-half), STOKE. Joined Stoke in 1896 from Stafford Rangers, and became a playing member of the first team in 1898, when the "Potters" ran into the semi-final of the F.A. Cup. He is a player of the vigorous stamp, and uses every ounce of his 12½st. He was born twenty-four years ago, and is 5ft 10in in height.
- PARRY (half-back), LIVERPOOL. Height 5ft 6in, weight 11st 7lb. Capped several times for Wales, played for Brighton United, third year at Anfield.
- PEARCE, J. (inside-right), BRISTOL ROVERS. Born Preston, 1878. Height 5ft 6in, weight 11st. Previously played for Preston North End.
- PEARSON (right-half), ASTON VILLA. Saltley College, near Birmingham, first team.
- PEDDIE, J. (centre-forward), MANCHESTER UNITED. Born Glasgow 1877. Height 5ft 11in, weight 12st 4lb. A clever dribbler with a tricky style, and a dead shot. Scored freely last season. Can also play outside-left. Previously was with Bentinck, Third Lanark, and Newcastle United.
- PEERS, E. (full back), BURTON UNITED. Born Wednesford, 1876. Height 5ft 9in, weight 12st 3lb. First played for Wednesford Rovers, from which club he migrated to West Bromwich Albion. At the end of his first and only season with the Albion he went to Walsall, with whom he remained two years. Possesses six gold medals.
- PEGG, A. (centre-forward), PRESTON NORTH END. Migrated to the famous old Lancashire club from Reading, for whom he played many fine games in season 1900-1. He has, however, an occasional off-day. Shoots hard and passes capitally. Can also play on the wing.
- PRICE, T. (centre-forward), LINCOLN CITY. Late of Whitwick White Cross.
- PELL, W. (half-back), GLOSSOP. Went there with D. Clarke from Northampton, 1901-2.
- PENNINGTON, H. (goalkeeper), NOTTS COUNTY. Born 1876. Height 6ft, weight 12st 8lb. Previous clubs: Chorley and Brentford. Also famous Lancashire cricketer.
- PEPPER, F. (centre-half), BARNESLEY. Height 5ft 10in, weight 11st 7lb. Previous clubs: Sheffield United and Newton Heath.
- PERKINS, W. H. (goalkeeper), LIVERPOOL. Born 1876.



- Height 5ft 11in, weight 12st. Previous clubs: Kettering and Luton.
- PERRY, T. (right half-back), ASTON VILLA. Born West Bromwich, 1871. Height 5ft 10in, weight 12st. Previously played for West Bromwich Albion. International v. Wales, four times in League International v. Scotland, and once v. Ireland.
- PHEASANT, E. (half-back), WOLVERHAMPTON WANDERERS.
- PICKEN, J. (inside-left), BOLTON WANDERERS. Previous club: Hurlford. Joined Bolton in 1900.
- PICKERING, A. (inside-left), KETTERING. Born 1879. Height 5ft 5½in, weight 11st 1lb. Assisted West Bromwich Albion in a moiety of matches 1900-1.
- PIERCE, J. (forward), PRESTON NORTH END. Born Preston, 1876. Weight 11st.
- PILGRIM, J. E. (back), CHESTERFIELD TOWN. Born Holmes, near Rotherham, 1879. Played half for Thornhill United (Yorkshire), Rotherham Swifts, and Sheffield United.
- PINNELL, A. (goalkeeper). Born 1874. Height 6ft 2in, weight 14st. Played for Burnley, Chorley, and New Brompton.
- PLACE, WALTER, sen. (half-back), BURNLEY. Born 1871. Joined Burnley 1888. Re-instated as amateur 1890, and assisted Burnley as such. Cousin to Walter Place, jun.
- PLACE, WALTER (forward). Height 5ft 10in, weight 12st 12lb. Previous clubs: Burnley and Woolwich Arsenal.
- PLANT, JOHN (outside-left), BURY. Born Bollington, Cheshire, 1872. Height 5ft 8in, weight 12st 4lb. Played for Bury, Reading, and Bury (again). Got first International cap v. Scotland. F.A. Cup Final Medal.
- PLATT, C. (goalkeeper), LIVERPOOL. Born 1883.
- PLATT, J. (forward), KETTERING. Born 1879. Height 6ft, weight 12st. Previous club: Preston North End.
- PLATT (goalkeeper), LIVERPOOL. First season. Has figured with Oswaldtwistle Rovers and Blackburn Rovers' Reserves.
- POPPITT, J. (forward), WOLVERHAMPTON WANDERERS.
- POTTER, ARTHUR (right or left forward). Born Nottingham, 1878. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 4lb. Notts County bought Potter out of the army.
- PRATT, THOS. (inside-right), PRESTON NORTH END. Born Fleetwood, 1875. Height 5ft 9in, weight 13st 1lb. Played for local team in Lancashire League, one season with Grimsby, three seasons Preston North End, and one season with Tottenham Hotspur. Returned to Preston in 1900.
- PRATT, WM. (left-back), SMALL HEATH. Born Birmingham, 1875. Height 5ft 8in, weight 12st.

PRAY, J. (right-half), BURY. Born Falkirk. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 10lb. Joined Glasgow Rangers.

PRESCOTT, T. G. (back), NOTTS COUNTY. Born Attercliffe, 1873. Height 5ft 7½in, weight 10st 12lb. Previously with Liverpool South End (now called South Liverpool). Helped to re-instate Notts County into First Division. Played for English League v. Scottish.

PRESTON, J. (forward), WOLVERHAMPTON WANDERERS. A local lad who has made a name in the Ironbridge Club before returning to his native town last season.

PRIEST, FRED. (inside-left), SHEFFIELD UNITED. Born Darlington. Height 5ft 8in, weight 12st 12lb. Gained his International cap in 1900 against Ireland as an outside-left, but for two years has played inside and made himself at home after one or two moderate games in that position. He played with South Bank, coming from there to Sheffield United. He was in the winning team for the Cleveland Cup, with the champion team of the Northern League, and has represented Sheffield against Glasgow.

PROUDFOOT, J. (centre-forward), WATFORD. Is the man in whom Blackburn Rovers showed so much concern five seasons ago, when he was "going great guns" with Partick Thistle, while still apprenticed to his trade. When he reached Blackburn in February of 1897 he was very disappointing, and though he lingered with the Rovers another season, was repeatedly relegated to the reserve, the directors transferring him to Everton, where he did much better. Can keep his wings in cohesion, and is a fine kick.

PRYCE, JOHN (inside-right). Born Renton. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 10lb. Has done excellent service with Sheffield Wednesday for the last three years. Previously played for Renton, Hibernians, and Glossop.

PUGH, DAVID HENRY (outside-right), LINCOLN CITY. Born Wrexham. In his school days joined a junior team called Wrexham Grosvenor, eventually as outside-right, a position he has occupied ever since. He stayed with the Wrexham F.C. for two seasons. While with Wrexham Pugh played no less than four times for Wales, against Scotland and Ireland each season. At the beginning of the season 1897-8 Pugh was captured by Stoke, and remained with the Pottery team until the following March, when Lincoln City secured him. Since then he has been a regular member of it.

PUMFREY, B. (half-back), GAINSBOROUGH. He played for two junior teams in the Small Heath district, as left half-back, until he found a place in the Reserve eleven. He took part in the test matches when Small Heath, after drawing at Stoke, got knocked out by Newton Heath. In October, 1894, he first played for Gainsborough; he has remained with the club ever since.

- PURNELL, CLYDE (centre-forward), CLAPTON. Went to London from Portsmouth. Captained Olympic several seasons, gaining many London and county honours. Assisted Clapton 1902 onwards.
- QUINN, DAVID (inside-forward), TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR. Born at Tyrone, in Ireland, 1882. Height 5ft 6½in, weight 10st. Excepting his first year, all his life has been spent in England. His first club was Hudsons', Bootle, and from there he went to Darwen, for whom he played two seasons. In 1901-2 he was credited with being the finest forward in the Lancashire League, and ere the close of the season he had tempting offers from Everton, Sheffield United, and other league clubs, but declined them all to come to Tottenham. Quinn is quite a youth, being only twenty years of age. He is exceedingly clever with the ball, and very effective when near goal.
- RABY, J. (inside-right), GAINSBOROUGH. Born Lincoln, 1876. Height 5ft 6in, weight 10st 6lb. Ten years ago joined Lincoln City Reserves, and later was played in the League team. He then played with Tottenham Hotspur Reserves, and subsequently for Wellingborough.
- RAINBIRD, H. A. (forward), TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR. Was protégé of Baron von Reiffenstein. Followed occupation of clerk while assisting the Baron's club, West Norwood, as amateur. Became pro. for the Spurs, 1902. Gained numerous London and county honours.
- RAISBECK, A. G. (centre-half), LIVERPOOL. Born Larkhall. Height 5ft 10in, weight 12st 9lb. A splendid half, whose merits only developed after leaving his native soil for England. Played for Royal Albert before going to the banks of the Mersey. Is particularly good at heading and placing to his forwards.
- RAISBECK, WM. (left half-back), NEW BROMPTON. Born Larkhall, N.B., 1876. Height 5ft 10½in, weight 12st 2lb. Brother of the Liverpool player. The Raisbeck family are in the possibly unique position of being able to place a full team on the field. Played at centre-forward for Larkhall Thistle, Royal Albert, and Clyde before being signed by Sunderland. He did duty for the Wearsiders both at forward and half-back, but latterly filled the left-half position permanently. Was last season with Derby County. Plays a strong and safe if not brilliant game.
- RALSTON, R. C. (right-back), LONDON CALEDONIANS and ASTON VILLA. Born in Scotland, 1881. Height 5ft 10½in, weight 12st. An amateur. Played several seasons for the Thistle, a club run in connection with the Regent Square Presbyterian Church, and for the last four seasons with the London Caledonians. Has played for Middlesex F.A. in representative matches eight times, and for the London Association on seven occasions.

- RAMSAY, A.** (left-back), **MIDDLESBROUGH.** Born 1877. Height 5ft 7in, weight 12st. Again retained. He played with the East Benhar club when they were champions of the Lanarkshire Alliance.
- RANCE, A.** (goalkeeper), **CHESHAM GENERALS.** Is the captain of the team. A steady, reliable "keeper," especially good at stopping penalties. Is twenty-nine years of age, and weighs 11st.
- RANKIN** (forward), **EVERTON.** A useful combination winger, and occasionally drafted into League service. Chosen for North v. South, 1903.
- RAWLING, L. J.,** **SOUTH LONDON S.F.A.** Played right-back for London and South London; captain of Dulwich Hamlet football team (four years) and cricket team (three years); captained "East" team in the Oval match, and scored 39 (not out); proved himself the cleverest "kick" his school has ever possessed, and a capital all-round sportsman.
- RAMWELL** (half-back), **BURY.** First season. Hails from Birch Vale, Stockport.
- RAYBOULD** (centre-forward), **LIVERPOOL.** For two seasons past has headed Liverpool's goal scorers. A clever and reliable centre; secured from New Brighton.
- READ, H. A.** (right back), **MANCHESTER CITY.**
- READE, H.** ("Baby"), **W. NORWOOD** (forward).
- READER, JAS.** (goal), **WEST BROMWICH ALBION.** Born 1867 at West Bromwich. Height 6ft, weight 12st. Played England v. Ireland 1894. Participated in five inter-league games v. Scotland, and four v. Ireland.
- REILLY, J.** (goal), **PORTSMOUTH.** Previous club: Portsmouth R. Artillery. Joined new Portsmouth club in 1899. Played for Ireland v. England.
- REED** (forward), **BURY.** The latest recruit from Stalybridge Rovers. A young inside-left of exceeding promise.
- RICHARDS, G. H.** (inside-left), **DERBY COUNTY.** With Whitwick previously.
- RICHARDS, C. H.** (inside-right), **LEICESTER FOSSE.** Born Burton, 1873. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 7lb. Previous clubs: Gresley Rovers, Notts County, Notts Forest, and Grimsby. Played v. Ireland in 1898.
- RICHARDS, W.** (inside-left), **WEST BROMWICH ALBION.** Born West Bromwich, 1873. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 8lb. First played in the Standard (local junior club).
- RICHARDS, W.** (outside-right), **BURY.** Comes from Middleton, near Bury. Pursues occupation of master brick-setter.
- RILEY, J.** (right-half), **MILLWALL.** Born Isle of Dogs. Married March, 1903.
- ROBERTS, R.** (outside-left), **NEWCASTLE UNITED.** Born Redditch, 1878. Height 5ft 7in, weight 10st 2lb. Previous

- clubs: Redditch Excelsior and West Bromwich Albion. Joined Newcastle United 1902-3.
- ROBERTSON, JACK** (left-half), **GLASGOW RANGERS**. Born Dumbarton, 1877. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 7lb. Previous clubs: Greenock Morton, Everton, and Southampton. Had Scottish cap in 1898.
- ROBERTSON, S.** (back), **BRISTOL CITY**. Born 1873. Height 6ft 1in, weight 14st. With New Brompton many years. Joined Bristol City in 1902-3.
- ROBERTSON, T.** (right back), **SOUTHAMPTON**. Came from Liverpool in 1902-3 after two seasons there.
- ROBERTSON, W.** (half), **BRISTOL ROVERS**. Born 1874. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 7lb. Old servant of the Rovers.
- ROBINSON, H.** (goal), **SMALL HEATH**.
- ROBINSON, J. W.** (goal), **SOUTHAMPTON**. Born Derby, 1870. Height 5ft 11in, weight 13st 2lb. First gained English cap in 1897 when with Derby County. Also assisted New Brighton Tower. Joined Southampton in 1899.
- ROBINSON** (half), **NOTTS FOREST**. Born 1880. Height 5ft 10in, weight 11st 11lb. Joined Forest 1899.
- ROBOTHAM, H.** (half), **WOLVERHAMPTON WANDERERS**. Born Wolverhampton. Previous club: Hunslet, Leeds.
- RONALDSON** (forward), **GRIMSBY TOWN**. Newlands of Q.P.R. brought him south to that club in 1900. Left end of season 1900-1 for Grimsby.
- ROOSE, L. R.** (goal), **STOKE**. Amateur. Joined Stoke in 1901-2. Welsh International.
- ROSS, GEORGE** (left half-back), **BURY**. Born Melbairn, Scotland, 1871. Height 5ft 8in, weight 12st 3lb. Learned all his football in the Bury district. He is a remarkably adroit player, and Bury owe much of their status to his consistent play.
- ROSS, H.** (right-back), **BURNLEY**. Born Brechin, Forfarshire, 1881. Height 5ft 10in, weight 12st 2lb. Previously played for The Harp, Brechin.
- ROSS, J.** (inside-right), brother of the quite as famous N. J. Ross, the full back. He came to England from St. Bernard's, Edinburgh, and speedily won for himself a place in the Preston North End champion team. Thence he went to Liverpool, and afterwards to Burnley, and, later, to Manchester City. Had few equals in placing and shooting. He has shared oftener than any other player in test games, and has a record of class matches and cup-ties which is perhaps equalled by not more than half a dozen in the country who have not been Internationals. Died 1902.
- ROSS, WILLIAM** (centre), **NOTTS COUNTY**. Born Kiveton Park, Sheffield, 1876. Height 5ft 11in, weight 11st 8lb. First played for Chesterfield, and then with Sheffield United,

- Gravesend United, and Reading. He is very fast and shoots well.
- RUDDLES DIN, WILLIAM** (left half-back), **SHEFFIELD WEDNESDAY**. Born Birdwell. Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st. Previously played for Birdwell.
- RULE, ART.**, (centre-forward). Born 1873. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 10lb. For many years famous as the most dashing forward in the county of Kent, when he was the pet of the Sheerness crowd. Played many great games for Sheppey United, but was known as an individual rather than a combination player. He was asked to join a prominent League club, but preferred to go to Tottenham in 1899. Like a sensible man he combines business with football, and the former causes Rule to frequently change his place of abode and club.
- RUSSELL, JOHN** (outside-left), **BLACKBURN ROVERS**. Born Carstairs, 1873. Height 5ft 5in, weight 10st 2lb. Commenced with Glasgow Thistle, and afterwards appeared for Leith Athletic. He then joined the St. Mirren (First Division Scottish League). After staying with them two seasons he joined Woolwich Arsenal, and afterwards Bristol City.
- SAGAR, C.** (inside-left), **BURY**. Born at Turton, near Bolton. Height 5ft 11½in, weight 11st 0½lb. Is one of the finest forwards in the country. Was chosen for the Irish International in 1900, v. Wales, 1902, and the following season was given a place in the Inter-League match with Scotland. He is a splendid player with natural ability and rare judgment.
- SATTERTHWAITE, CHAS. O.** (inside-left), **NEW BROMPTON**. Born 1878. Height 5ft 10in, weight 12st. Very difficult to stop when on the run, and a dangerous man near goal. Previously with Liverpool.
- SAXTON, ARTHUR W.** (left wing). Born Long Eaton, Nottingham, 1876. Height 5ft 7½in, weight 11st 7lb. He found his way into the Glossop North End team in 1897, and helped them to win the Midland League Championship. From there he went to Stalybridge, and afterwards to Sunderland, for which club he played regularly in their First League matches for two seasons. He threw in his lot with Bedminster and afterwards played for Luton.
- SCHOFIELD, ALBERT J.** (outside-right), **NEWTON HEATH**. Born Liverpool. Has figured in several of the teams of that city. Played for Everton and earned a fair reputation as a wing player. Transferred to Newton Heath two seasons ago.
- SCOTT, FRANK** (inside-right), **LINCOLN CITY**. Born Lincoln. He learnt his football with Lincoln Adelaide, and was drafted into the Lincoln City reserve eleven six years back. He gradually worked his way into the first team.

- SCOTT, J. (forward), GAINSBOROUGH, is the most popular man in the eleven. Six years ago he was playing for Sheffield United, and prior to that was engaged in Scotland, first with the Cameron Highlanders, and then with Leith Athletic. As a reservist, he was "called up" to go to South Africa.
- SEELEY, G. Born 1879. Height 5ft 6in, weight 11st 7lb. Played for Southampton, New Brompton, and Queen's Park Rangers (the latter in 1901-2).
- SELLERS, W., BURTON UNITED (late of Whitwick). Very promising player.
- SETTLE, J. (inside-left), EVERTON. Height 5ft 6in. Secured International honours four seasons ago. Born in 1876 at Millom. From Bolton Wanderers Reserve he went to Halliwell Rovers in 1895, and attracted so much attention in his partnership with Grundy that Bury secured his transfer in 1897. This is his fourth season with Everton. Dribbles well, and shoots with deadly aim.
- SHANKS, T. (forward), WOOLWICH ARSENAL. Height 5ft 9½in, weight 11st. Played formerly for Wexford, Ireland, and Brentford (until New Year, 1903). Irish International v. Scotland (first victory over Scots for twenty years), 1903.
- SHARMAN, R. (goalkeeper), LINCOLN. Born Lincoln. Although his diminutive stature is against him, he holds an excellent record in League circles. He has been reinstated as an amateur. As a junior he played for Lincoln Adelaide and other local clubs.
- SHARP, A. (full-back), LUTON. Born 1878. Height 5ft 9½in, weight 11st 9lb. First showed his ability as a back when playing with St. Albans, with which club he remained three seasons. He was a similar time with Watford. A capable man in any position behind the front line, but shines best at full-back.
- SHARP, J. (outside-right), EVERTON. Born Hereford, 1879. Height 5st 7lb, weight 11st 7lb. Is the well-known Lancashire County cricketer who made his name in football with Aston Villa, which he became familiar with in 1897 after shining in Hereford Thistle, first appearing in the reserve. He played with the Villa a portion of two seasons, and reached Goodison Park in 1899. Dashing forward, with a true centre.
- SHARP, J. (right-back), READING. Born Jamestown, 1869. Height 5ft 7½in, weight 12st 7lb. One of the famous Preston North End men of the nineties. Secretary and manager of Reading five years. Gone to South Africa.
- SHAW, E. (full-back), MARLOW. Born 1870. Cool and clever, and a sure kick. Has played for South v. North,

- and captained the Berks and Bucks eleven for six years. Weight 11st 5lb.
- SHUFFLEBOTHAM, T. (right-half), BRENTFORD. Born 1881. Young and enthusiastic, this player, who previously was with Stoke, is likely to turn out a most useful recruit to the Brentford ranks.
- SHUTT, H. (full-back), ASTON VILLA. Born 1874. Height 5ft 10in, weight 12st. Like Millar, went to the Villa from Millwall. He formerly played for Swindon and Bolton Wanderers.
- SHERIDAN (forward), EVERTON. A smart young winger of promise from Cambuslang Hibernians. First season south of the Grampians.
- SIMMONS, C. (centre-forward), WEST BROMWICH ALBION. Born 1878, West Bromwich. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 6lb. Came from Worcester Rovers. With Albion from 1898.
- SINGLETON (forward), GRIMSBY TOWN. Joined Grimsby from Everton for 1902-3 season.
- SLATER, PERCY (full-back), MANCHESTER CITY. Comes from Chorley, and was one of the best backs in the Lancashire League. He had been signed as an amateur for the Blackburn Rovers, but was transferred to the City after some difficulty with the League.
- SLOAN, THOMAS (inside-right), THIRD LANARK. Born 1880. Height 5ft 11in, weight 13st. Hard worker and good shot. From Glasgow Perthshire, 1900.
- SMART, THOMAS, LUTON. Born Luton, 1878. Height 5ft 10½in, weight 11st. The understudy to Ord, who has appeared between the sticks for Luton in the practice games, is a native of Luton and is twenty-three years of age. He has not a long football record, his goalkeeping abilities having only been discovered two years ago when he played regularly for the Clarence. This local team secured the championship of the Luton Junior League, and Smart's play has been very well spoken of. He is an amateur.
- SMITH, "BUXTON" (centre-half), MANCHESTER CITY, so named to distinguish him from another "William." Hails from Buxton, which club he left in 1897 to join the City.
- SMITH, HERBERT (left-back), OXFORD CITY, READING, CLAPTON, and STOKE. Amateur. Played v. North at Tottenham, 1903. Brother of W. Smith. One of the best backs in the South.
- SMITH, W. (half), OXFORD CITY, READING, and CLAPTON. Amateur. Played v. North at Crystal Palace. Brother of Herbert Smith.
- SMITH, GEORGE (forward), NEW BROMPTON. Born

1880. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st. Came south from Aston Villa.
- SMITH, G. O. (centre-forward), CORINTHIANS and OLD CARTHUSIANS. England's greatest centre-forward. Amateur. Practically retired now. First capped v. Ireland in 1893. His appearance v. Scotland, March, 1901, was his twentieth International, and beat the record. Scored century in 'Varsity cricket match.
- SMITH, G. T. (outside-right), BOLTON WANDERERS. Born Stourbridge, 1881. Debüt in League 1900-1.
- SMITH, NICOL (right-back), GLASGOW RANGERS. Born Darvel, 1874. Height 5ft 9in, weight 12st 8lb. Scotch International.
- SMITH, STEPHEN (outside-left), PORTSMOUTH. Born Hednesford, 1874. Height 5ft 5in, weight 11st. Played v. Scotland 1895. Previous teams: Cannock Rugeley and Aston Villa.
- SMITH, W. (inside-left), PORTSMOUTH. Represented Portsmouth throughout their professional career. Partners his brother Stephen on left-wing.
- SMITH, T. (half-back). Born Lochgelly, Fifeshire, 1876. Height 5ft 11in, weight 13st 7lb. Played for Bolton, Chatham, Millwall, and Derby County.
- SMITH, TOM (outside-right), PRESTON NORTH END. Born Ashton-in-Makerfield, 1876. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 6lb. Played with Ashton Athletic, Southampton, and Queen's Park Rangers.
- SMITH, TOM (outside-right), TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR. Was the original T. Smith of Preston North End, and left them for Tottenham before his predecessor, T. S., journeyed to Southampton. Gained F.A. Cup medals. Retired to the North in April, 1902, relinquishing the game.
- SMITH, WALTER (inside-forward), LINCOLN CITY. Always played Lincoln football, beginning with Blue Star. Joined L.C. in 1900.
- SOMERS, PETER (inside-right), BLACKBURN ROVERS. Born Motherwell, 1878. Height 5ft 9½in, weight 10st 10lb. Joined Hamilton Athletic 1897, Celtic February, 1900. Played v. Irish League, 1899.
- SOULSBY, THOMAS (forward). Born Mickley-Square-on-the-Lynes, 1878. Height 5ft 5in, weight 10st 7lb. First played for Mickley, then Liverpool (two seasons).
- SPENCE, G. (half-back and forward), READING. Born 1876. Height 5ft 9in, weight 12st 9lb. Secured from Preston North End.
- SPENCER, H. (outside-right), NOTTS. Born 1873. Height 5ft 5in. Local player.
- SPENCER, HOWARD (back), ASTON VILLA. Played v. Scotland 1897, and v. Wales 1897 and 1900. Again repre-

- sented England in 1903. Health has prevented his regularly playing.
- SPENDIFF** (back), **GRIMSBY TOWN**. Reserve player from North Shields, 1902-3. Came as a back, but was most valuable in goal.
- SPICER**, T. (goal), **BRENTFORD**. Formerly played for Brighton United and Woolwich Arsenal.
- SPIKESLEY**, **FRED** (outside-left), **SHEFFIELD WEDNESDAY**. Born Gainsborough. Height 5ft 7in, weight 10st. Joined Wednesday, 1892; previously with Gainsborough Trinity. Several times capped. Represented English League in 1903.
- SPOUNCER**, W. A. (forward), **NOTTS FOREST**. Born Gainsborough, 1878. Height 5ft 8in, weight 10st 7lb. Joined Forest after leaving Gainsborough in 1898. Played for England v. Wales in 1900. Prefers outside-left. Spouncer commenced his football career at the age of twelve by playing for his school. Nature had allotted him his proper position in the field, for being left-handed and left-footed he at once found himself on the outside-left. In the season 1893-4 he was picked up by the Gainsborough Trinity Reserve, being drafted into the first team in 1895. Sheffield United had their eye on Spouncer, and signed him on as a League player; but when the Trinity left the Midland League for the Second League, the Sheffield United gave Spouncer a free transfer to his old club. There was, however, an evident intention on the part of the United to secure Spouncer, and in view of what the Gainsborough committee considered to be danger, the leading official of the Trinity F.C. offered liberal terms to Spouncer to continue with them. He was eventually transferred to Notts Forest, who have certainly found in him a player of the first flight.
- STAFFORD, HARRY** (right-back), **MANCHESTER UNITED**. Born Crewe, 1869. Played also for Southport Central, Crewe Alexandra, and Newton Heath, 1896.
- STALEY**, J. (back), **DERBY COUNTY**. Born Newhall. Height 5ft 7½in, weight 11st 8lb. Joined Derby in 1895. Previous club: Derby Midland.
- STEPHENSON**, G. (right-back), **BARNESLEY**. Born Padiham, Lancashire. Height 5ft 7in, weight 12st. Previous club: Liverpool (two and a half years).
- STEPHENSON**, J. W. (full-back), **TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR**. Born Leigh, Essex, 1877. Height 5ft 8½in, weight 11st 12lb. Played for Liverpool Reserve as amateur, then New Brighton Tower and Swindon.
- STEVENS**, R. C. (back), **TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR** and **WEST NORWOOD**. Formerly played for Fulham. Amateur.
- STEVENSON**, J. (forward), **WEST BROMWICH ALBION**.

- Born Scotland, 1875. Height 5ft 9in, weight 12st. Came from Dumbarton to Preston North End.
- STEVENSON, JAMES, NOTTS FOREST. Born 1882. Height 5ft 7½in, weight 11st 4lb. Played for Greenock Morton from 1900 till 1903, when transferred.
- STEWART, WILLIAM (centre-half). Born Cupar Angus, Perth, 1870. Height 5ft 11½in, weight 13st. Played for Dundee, Our Boys, Warwick Company, Newton Heath (six seasons), Luton, and Millwall.
- STEWART, W. (left-half and back). Born Arbroath, Forfarshire. Played for Arbroath, Scots Greys, Black Watch, Preston North End (who bought him out of the Army), Everton, and Bristol City. Has five Lancashire Cup winners medals. Played for Everton in F.A. Cup final.
- STEWART, W. G. (outside-right), NEWCASTLE UNITED. Born Glasgow, 1876. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 3lb. Gained International while with Queen's Park. Is an amateur.
- STODDART, JAMES (back), CHESTERFIELD. Born Rothesay, 1881. Height 5ft 10in, weight 13st 7lb.
- STOKES (forward), BOLTON WANDERERS. Played for Brierley Hill and signed for Aston Villa. Second season with the Wanderers. Small, but very tricky.
- STOKES, T. (right-back), READING. Born Burslem, 1881. Height 5ft 8in, weight 10st 4lb. Left Burslem for Reading. A brilliant back, but rather unfortunate.
- STORRIER, DAVID (left-back), MILLWALL. Born Arbroath. Height 5ft 10½in, weight 13st 7lb. Previous clubs: Celtic, Dundee, and Everton. With Everton in the 1896-7 F.A. Final v. Aston Villa. A real class back; only joined Millwall in season 1902-3. Has won International honours for Scotland three times.
- STRINGFELLOW, H. (half), PORTSMOUTH. Previously with Everton.
- STRUTHERS (left-back), BOLTON WANDERERS. Born Liverpool. Played for Gravesend and Portsmouth. Left latter in 1901.
- STUBBS, F. L. (goal), SHEFFIELD WEDNESDAY. Born Woodhouse, Eaves. Height 5ft 9in, weight 13st. Joined Wednesday in 1900. Previous club: Loughton.
- STURGESS (half-back), STOKE. Secured by Stoke 1902-3, with good local credentials.
- SUGDEN, S. H. (centre-forward), ILFORD, WEST HAM UNITED, and NOTTS FOREST. Refused offer from Aston Villa. Retains his amateur status. Came into great prominence and demand 1902-3.
- SUTER, E. (goalkeeper), NOTTS COUNTY. Born 1878. Height 6ft. Played for Southwell, then Notts County.
- SUTHERLAND, JAS. (inside-left), BURNLEY. Born Inverness, 1881. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 2lb.

SUTCLIFFE, J. W. (goal), **MILLWALL.** Born at Shibden, near Halifax, Yorkshire, 1863. First played Rugby with Bradford St. Thomas' when he was about fifteen. Assisted Kirkstall once or twice the same season. Was a full back then. Joined Bowling next season, but before the season was over he joined Bradford, and after being with them two seasons joined Heckmondwike. When Sutcliffe joined Heckmondwike he started to play centre three-quarter, and showed up so well in the Yorkshire Cup competition that he got all his caps that year (1888). He played for the county, for the North against the South, and for England against the Maoris. Was centre three-quarter, and A. E. Stoddart and Dicky Lockwood were his wings. They played the three three-quarter game then. In the autumn of 1889 was suspended along with his club for professionalism. Joined Bolton Wanderers, and first became Association forward, but, not succeeding, tried goalkeeping, and went right ahead, and was not long before he became an International under the rival code. Left Bolton in April, 1902, for Millwall. Played for England v. Wales, 1903.

SWIFT, GEO., NOTTS COUNTY. Born 1875. Height 5ft 9in, weight 13st. Other clubs played for: Wolverhampton Wanderers, Loughborough, and Leicester Fosse.

SWIFT, B. (forward), **WOLVERHAMPTON WANDERERS.** Left the Coseley club for Wolverhampton last season.

TAIT, ALEXANDER, (left full-back), **TOTTENHAM HOT-SPUR.** Born 1873 at Glenbuck, Ayrshire, a village that has produced such famous players as Blyth, Muir, Brown, and McConnell. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 10lb. Played for Ayr, Royal Albert, and Motherwell, before leaving Scotland. Since crossing the border has played with the famous Preston North Enders (where he was associated with the veteran International, Bob Holmes) and Tottenham Hotspur.

TAYLOR, JOSEPH (centre-half), **BURNLEY.** Born Burnley, 1874, and has played for the team for the past nine years, previous to which he figured in the ranks of a local junior team. He played his best games in 1900, when Burnley had such an uphill fight. Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st 5lb.

TAYLOR, J. D. (inside-right), **EVERTON.** Has had an extended stay at Everton, to which he came in 1895 from St. Mirren, where he had only been part of a season. He played originally for Dumbarton, the team connected with the town of his birth. Born 1875. Height 5ft 10in, weight 11st 8lb.

TAYLOR, S. S. (inside right), **CORINTHIANS** and **CAMBRIDGE UNIVERSITY.** Height 5ft 10in, weight 11st 8lb. Previous club: Aldenham School and West Herts (now called Watford).

TAYLOR (forward), **BOLTON WANDERERS.** Also plays half-back. Went to Bolton with big reputation in 1901-2.

- TEAGLE, H. G.** (back), **QUEEN'S PARK RANGERS.** Born 1871. With Queen's Park Rangers soon after formation. Captain for many seasons. Presented with gold watch on marriage, and plays very rarely now. Bonâ-fide amateur.
- TEMPLETON R.** (forward), **NEWCASTLE UNITED.** A very speedy winger, rather inclined to be selfish, but a splendid player at his best. Capped for Scotland against England, 1902. The Newcastle club paid a £400 transfer fee to Aston Villa for Templeton.
- TENNANT, JAMES** (outside-left). Born 1878. Height 5ft 6½in, weight 11st 4lb. First played for a junior team at his home, Parkhead, called the Linton Villa, which did not lose a single match in his time. Then he joined Parkhead, with whom he remained two seasons, during which time the club was successful in winning the Glasgow Junior Cup, and also the Junior League Championship. In addition to three inter-City caps Tennant gained an inter-League cap against Ireland. With St. Bernards prior to joining Woolwich Arsenal. Left the Arsenal for Middlesbrough.
- TENNANT, W.** (goalkeeper), **GRIMSBY TOWN.** Born Wolverhampton, 1864. Height 5ft 11½in, weight 14st. Had also played Rugby. Kept goal for Wolverhampton Wanderers and Walsall prior to joining Grimsby.
- THACKER, FRANK** (left-half), **CHESTERFIELD TOWN.** Born Sheepbridge, Derbyshire, 1877. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 4lb. Learned all his football in the district. He first played with Sheepbridge Works, but on that club becoming defunct he transferred to Sheffield United six years ago. He remained at Sheffield two seasons, and then joined Chesterfield.
- THICKETT, H.** (back), **SHEFFIELD UNITED.** Learnt his football at Hexthorpe, near Doncaster, and was induced to join the United. For a season he left the club and joined the then Rotherham Town team, but afterwards returned to his old love, and has since played with them. Thickett has played in numerous Inter-City games of the Sheffield Association, has also played in Inter-League games against Ireland and Scotland, and Internationals against Scotland and Wales. Has F.A. Cup final medal.
- THOMPSON, FRED** (goalkeeper), **BOLTON WANDERERS.** Born Wearside, 1875. Height 5ft 8½in, weight 11st 4lb. Played as reserve man for Sunderland. Was with Bury since 1897. Was played in all the more important F.A. Cup-ties, and had no small share in the final triumph of the Bury team against Southampton at the Crystal Palace. Has now gone to Bolton.
- THOMPSON, PETER** (goalkeeper), **CHESTERFIELD TOWN.** Born Rothesay, 1878. Height 6ft, weight 13st 7lb.
- THOMSON, ROBERT** (left-back). Born 1876. Height

- 5ft 7in, weight 11st 7lb. From Hamilton Academy and Celtic, 1898.
- THORNLEY, JOHN (centre half-back), GAINSBOROUGH. Joined Gainsborough at the beginning of the 1899-1900 season. He had previously had experience with Notts Forest.
- THORPE, FRANK (centre half-back), BURY. Born 1881. Height 6ft, weight 11st 8lb. Joined Bury from Stalybridge Rovers. Previous to that had been with Newton Heath.
- THORPE, HARRY (full back), CHESTERFIELD TOWN. Born Barrow Hill, Derbyshire, 1880. Height 5ft 8½in, weight 11st 2lb. A promising young player.
- TIMMINS, SAMUEL. Born 1879. Height 5ft 8½in, weight 11st. He is an excellent half-back associated with Nottingham Forest. He formerly played for Walsall.
- TIERNEY, THOS. T. (inside left). Born Cheshire, 1875. Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st 3lb. Played for Whittam Albion, Chorley, Blackburn Rovers, New Brighton, Chorley (again), New Brighton (again), and Luton in 1901.
- TOD, G. (half-back), PRESTON NORTH END. Born 1875. Weight 12st. Previous club: Linthouse, leaving there in 1901.
- TOMAN, W. (forward), EVERTON. Born, 1878, Bishop Auckland. Height 5ft 10in, weight 11st 11lb. Previous clubs: Burnley, Everton, Aberdeen Strollers, Victoria United, Dundee, and Southampton, leaving latter for Everton in 1901. Fractured leg, September, 1901, prevented his playing for a great part of 1901-3.
- TOONE, G. (goalkeeper), NOTTS COUNTY. Played for Notts County, Bedminster, and Bristol City (Bedminster being amalgamated with Bristol City), and Notts County again. Has now retired.
- TRACEY, W. (outside left), BOLTON WANDERERS. Born 1878. Played formerly for Shrewsbury. Joined Bolton in 1900.
- TUFT, W. (back), BRISTOL CITY. Born 1874. Height 5ft 9in, weight 12st. Formerly with Walsall.
- TURNBULL, PETER (inside-left). Born Sanquhar, 1875. Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st 5lb. Played for Glasgow Rangers, Burnley, Blackburn Rovers, Glasgow Rangers (again), Millwall, Queen's Park Rangers, and Brentford. Capable of very clever football when in the mood.
- TURNER, ARTHUR (outside right), NEWCASTLE UNITED. Born Farnborough. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 10lb. Capped for England in 1900 and 1901. Left Southampton, his first prominent club, end of 1901-2 for Derby County. Transferred to Newcastle in 1903.
- TURNER, E. (back), PORTSMOUTH. Came from Northampton.
- TURNER, HARRY (back), PORTSMOUTH. Previous clubs:

Portsmouth Royal Artillery, Portsmouth, and New Brighton Tower.

TURNER, JOSEPH (outside-left), SOUTHAMPTON. Born Burslem, 1873. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 9lb. Previous clubs: Newcastle Swifts (1893), Dresden United (1894), Southampton (1898), Stoke and Everton (April, 1900). Returned to Southampton 1901. Has played for England.

TURNER, P. (forward), MIDDLESBROUGH. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 4lb. Formerly with Woolwich Arsenal.

TURNER (centre-forward), BRENTFORD. Born 1880. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 9lb. Formerly with Wellingborough.

TYLER, W. H., NOTTS COUNTY. Born 1880. Height 5ft 6½in, weight 10st 4lb. Came from Newton Stewart.

VASSALL, G. C. (outside-right), CORINTHIANS. Also assisted Old Carthusians, Yeovil, and Oxford City. When at Oxford University was chosen for England, but could not accept the invitation. Good all-round athlete.

VERNON, C. (back), SWINDON. Born 1878. Height 5ft 6½in, weight 10st 4lb. Came from Newton Stewart.

WADDINGTON (forward), LIVERPOOL. First season. Hails from Chorley, and figured prominently with Liverpool Reserves at close of season 1901-02.

WALKER, WM. (outside-left), KETTERING. Born 1878. Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st. Assisted Cowes until they were extinguished. Afterwards aided Crewe Alexandra.

WALKER, L. (outside-left), BRENTFORD. Born 1879. Height 5ft 6in, weight 10st. Joined Brentford from West Ham.

WALLACH, THEO. (inside-right), CHESTERFIELD TOWN. Born Castle Douglas, 1881. Height 5ft 9½in, weight 10st 6lb.

WALLER, WILFRID H. (goalkeeper), RICHMOND ASSOCIATION. Height 5ft 11in, weight 12st 10lb. A very useful full back. Captained Richmond Association, but is in great demand among many first-class clubs, having played for Queen's Park (Glasgow), Tottenham, Bolton Wanderers, and Southampton.

WARDROPE, W. (inside-right), 3rd LANARK. Born 1875, Motherwell. Height 5ft 6in, weight 10st 3lb. Played inside-left for the Dalziel Rovers, and while in that team in 1894 he played for Scotland against Ireland in a Junior International match. Went to Newcastle United some seven years ago, and from that club to Middlesbrough. Transferred to aid the old "Volunteers."

WARNER, A. (forward), TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR. Born Nottingham, 1880. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st. Played as a junior for Notts Rangers and Nottingham Olympic. When only nineteen years of age he went from the latter club to Notts County, and secured his place at once in the League team. He did three years' service for them, and in 1900-01

season scored eighteen League goals, being second on the list of League scorers for all matches. He is very clever with the ball, and has proved himself a great shot and become a big favourite at Tottenham.

WARRINGTON (outside-right), **DERBY COUNTY**. Born Macclesfield. First with Derby Cedars. Derby County, 1901.

WARREN, ARNOLD (outside-right), **BRENTFORD**. Is the clever winger who appeared at frequent intervals in the Derby County ranks last season. His capture is regarded with satisfaction in Brentford. Is the Derbyshire cricket bowler.

WARREN, B. (half-back or forward), **DERBY COUNTY**. Born Newhall. Height 5ft 8in, weight 12st 3lb. Joined Derby County, 1898.

WARREN, FREDK. (forward), **NOTTS FOREST**. Height 5ft 10½in, weight 12st 6lb. He made an excellent name with Derby St. Luke's and Derby Hill's Ivanhoe, and is a promising player.

WATKINS (forward), **STOKE**. Born Oswestry, 1880. Joined Stoke 1899-00. Welsh International.

WATKINS (half and outside-left), **MILLWALL**. Grand shot. Welsh International. Late of Aston Villa and Grimsby. Well-built.

WATSON, JAMES, (left or right-back), **SUNDERLAND**. Born Larkhall, Lanark, the "home of the Raisbecks." Height 5ft 10in, weight 12st 4lb. Before joining Sunderland played for the Clyde. A Junior International.

WATSON, JOHN (left-back), **TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR**. Born Dundee, 1877. Height 5ft 8½in, weight 12st. A sterling back, and has done good work in Scottish and Football League before joining the Spurs. Should build up greater reputation at Tottenham.

WATSON, JOHN (back), **NEWCASTLE UNITED**. Born Clyde, October, 1902. Height 5ft 11in, weight 12st 7lb.

WATTS, C. (goal), **NEWCASTLE UNITED**. Height 5ft 8½in, weight 12st 3lb.

WATTS, E. A. (centre half-back), **READING**. Born Wolverhampton, Berks, 1874. Height 5ft 10in, weight 12st 9lb. A sterling centre-half, and a capital captain. An old soldier, but a grand football exponent. Principal clubs: Notts County and Reading. Played for Berkshire County Cricket eleven, and holds the R.H.S. certificate for life saving. Chosen South v. North, 1903.

WEBB, I. (goalkeeper), **WEST BROMWICH ALBION**. Had an excellent reputation when he was induced to leave Mansfield for Lincoln, and has since enhanced his fame. One of the tallest goalkeepers in the League, 6ft 0½in.

WELCH, C. F. (outside-left), **RICHMOND ASSOCIATION**

- F.C. Previous clubs: Harrow Town and West Hampstead. Considered one of leading amateur forwards. Chosen for most metropolitan and county matches in 1902-3.
- WHITE (forward), BOLTON WANDERERS. Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st 2lb, age 20. Plays either inside or outside-right. First season at Burnden. Last with Hurlford Thistle.
- WHITE, FRED (half-back), LUTON. Born Dunstable, 1880. Height 5ft 7in, weight 10st 4lb. A local player. Can play either back or half.
- WHITE, JACK (back), QUEEN'S PARK RANGERS. Born Droylesden, near Manchester, 1880. Height 5ft 9in, weight 11st 4lb. Former clubs: Openshaw United, Grays Anchor, Swanscombe, Grays United.
- WHITE, J. W., NOTTS FOREST. Height 5ft 9½in, weight 13st 10lb. Successor to the departed Peers. Proved a worthy companion for Iremonger in the "Reds" first team, 1901-2 season.
- WHELDON, G. F. (inside-left), PORTSMOUTH. Born Langley Green 1871. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 7lb. Three times International, and twice against Scotland and Ireland Inter-League. A speedy forward and capital goal-getter. Previous clubs: West Bromwich Albion, Aston Villa, Queen's Park Rangers.
- WHITEHOUSE, JAMES (goalkeeper), MANCHESTER CITY. Born 1873. Height 5ft 10½in, weight 11st 7lb. A good goalkeeper, but failed to come up to expectations formed in 1898. Been in both divisions of F.L. football (Grimsby and Aston Villa).
- WHITLEY (goalkeeper). The Villa reserve goalkeeper. Rarely found a League opportunity in seasons 1901-2 and 1902-3. Formerly of Darwen.
- WHITTAKER, ARNOLD (outside-right), BLACKBURN ROVERS. Born Blackburn, 1880. Height 5ft 5½in, weight 10st. Played for Queen's Park, 1898, Accrington Stanley, April, 1899.
- WHITTAKER, WALTER (goalkeeper), GRIMSBY TOWN. Born Manchester, 1878. Height 5ft 11½in, weight 13st 5lb. A capital goalkeeper, with few bad days. Represented Newton Heath, Grimsby, Reading, and Blackburn Rovers. Very popular in Grimsby.
- WIGMORE, WALTER (half-back), SMALL HEATH. Height 5ft 9in, weight 12st 3lb. Made his reputation in the front line; but clever almost anywhere, and a great worker. Represented Sheffield United and Gainsborough Trinity.
- WILKES, A. (right half-back), ASTON VILLA. Height 5ft 6½in, weight 12st. Joined the Villa from Walsall, and has won International honours against Scotland and Wales, and been reserve against Ireland. A plucky persevering player. Also inside-left.

- WILKES, THOMAS H.** (goalkeeper), **STOKE**. Born Redditch, 1886. Height 6ft, weight 12st 8lb. A clever and plucky custodian. Left Redditch to join the Villa when eighteen years of age, and gained F.A. Cup medal whilst representing the Birmingham club. Very popular in the Potteries. Joined Stoke 1899.
- WILKIE, THOMAS** (left-back), **PORTSMOUTH**. Fine kick and good tackler. With Heart of Midlothian to 1895, then migrated to Liverpool, and made great reputation with Liverpool.
- WILKINSON, BERNARD** (half-back), **SHEFFIELD UNITED**. Born 1879. Height 5ft 6in, weight 10st 6lb. A pocket Hercules. A needle-like and sparkling little man, always on the right spot. Joined United 1901-2.
- WILKINSON, W.** (forward), **SHEFFIELD UNITED**. Brother of the half-back, but three years younger.
- WILLIAMS, CHARLES** (goalkeeper), **TOTTENHAM HOT-SPUR**. Born Woolwich, 1876. Height 5ft 11½in, weight 12st 3lb. A clever custodian, and would make a big name if he had a regular position in a prominent team.
- WILSON, ASTON VILLA**. Height 5ft 8in, weight 11st 2lb.
- WILSON, NORTHAMPTON TOWN**. Height 5ft 11½in, weight 12st 7lb.
- WILCOX** (forward), **SMALL HEATH**. Born Bristol, and one of the finest players the Rovers ever had. Transferred in March, 1903, to Small Heath. Intense surprise created in Bristol over the transfer.
- WILSON, TOM** (outside-left), **QUEEN'S PARK RANGERS**. Born Preston, 1879. Height 5ft 6in, weight 11st 6lb. One of the best outside-lefts in the south. A great favourite at Swindon, Millwall, and Kensal Rise.
- WILSON, A.** (centre-forward), **SHEFFIELD WEDNESDAY**. Height 5ft 11in, weight 13st. Previous clubs: Irvine Meadow, Clyde, Sheffield Wednesday (1899).
- WILSON** (half-back), **EVERTON**. Fourth season 1902-3. His League appearances were very rare in 1901-2 owing to injuries.
- WOLSTENHOLME, S.** (right half-back). Born Little Lever, Bolton, 1878. Height 5ft 9½in, weight, 12st. Left Farnworth Alliance 1896, Horwich 1897.
- WOMBWELL, R.** (centre-forward), **BRISTOL CITY**. Born Nottingham. Height 5ft 7in, weight 9st. Commenced with Bulwell in Notts League, and advanced to Midland League through Ilkeston Town. After a spell at Ilkeston Derby County arranged transfer, and had Wombwell's services for two seasons. Bristol City was his next change, and with the City he has been immensely successful.
- WOOD, A.** (centre half-back), **ASTON VILLA**. Born 1885. Height 5ft 10½in, weight 11st 4lb. Learnt his football with a junior "Pottery" team named Smallthorne Albion, and

played two seasons with Burslem Port Vale as inside-left forward. Went to Stoke in 1895, and succeeded Cowan (Villa).

WOOD, HARRY (forward), SOUTHAMPTON. Born Wall-sall, 1868. Height 5ft 10in, weight 12st 10lb. Commenced with Wallsall Swifts, which club he left in 1887 for Wolverhampton Wanderers. Gained his first International in 1890, in which year he played against Scotland and Wales. Left Wolverhampton in 1893 for Southampton, and has retained his position constantly in the Cup and League team. Still dribbles and passes in his early eighties form.

WOOD, W. (inside-right), BURY. Born Middlesbro', 1878. Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st 6lb. Resembles Settle in height, weight, and style.

WOODWARD, VIVIAN J. (centre-forward), TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR and CHELMSFORD. Amateur. His rise to fame in 1903 was phenomenal. Played for Spurs Reserves in 1901-2, and given his opportunity for the first eleven in the autumn of 1902 made substantial progress each week, culminating in his selection for South v. North at Tottenham. The outcome of the latter was Woodward represented England v. Ireland and Wales, and is regarded as G. O. Smith's successor.

WORTON, T. (forward), WEST BROMWICH ALBION. Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st 7lb.

WRIGHT, JOHN (inside-left), BOLTON WANDERERS. Born Hamilton. Height 5ft 7in, weight 11st. A very great favourite in Sheffield. Fine left-winger, inclined to individual work, but frequently successful with sole efforts. Many friends in Bolton.

YORK, C. (inside-right), DERBY COUNTY. Born Edinburgh, 1882. Height 5ft 8½in, weight 10st 6lb. Was secured from Reading, and has proved a splendid understudy for Bloomer since 1902.

YOUNG, A. (centre-forward), EVERTON. Born Slamannan, 1880. Height 5ft 8½in, weight 11st. Left Paisley St. Mirren, 1900; Falkirk, 1901.
