Here are 35 Boys taught to read, write, and caft Account; as also 35 Girls, who are fur-ther taught to few, knit, and mark, *&c.* They are all inftructed in the Principles of Religion, and fupplied with Books, and other Neceflaries for the Service of the School; They are fully cloathed once a Year; there being yearly given to each Boy, one Coat, one Waiffcoat, and one Pair of Breeches, one Cap, four Bands, three Pair of Stockings, three Pair of Shoes, three Shitrs, and two Pair of Gloves; And the Girls are cloathed proportionably with every thing fit and convenient for them. And with every Boy and Girl that is put out an Apprentice, there is given conflantly a fair Bible, a Common-Prayer-Book, and the Whole Duty of Man. And the School allows 5 l. with every Boy, and 3 l. with every Girl, that is put out to Service or Apprenticellip. N. B. That fince September 1710, there have been put out 213 Boys and 124 Girls to feveral Services and Atternichtein; and othere have been put out 13 Boys and 124 Girls to feveral Services and Atternichtein and Service on Service or September 1910, there have been put out 13 Boys and 124 Girls to be sufficient.
